Productivity shows gain, costs drop
WASHINGTON (AP) ity grew in the third quarter
of 1999 at the fastest rate in seven years, while labor costs declined - a recipe for low Productivity, defined\$as the amount of output for each
hour of work, rose at a 4.9 percent annual rate from July through September, the Department said today.
That was revised upw from a previous estimate of 4.2 percent, to reflect an even oigger rebound from the secity growth had slowed to 0.6 percent.
Unit labor costs declined at a 0.2 percent annual rate -
the biggest drop since the spring of 1997 .
A previous estimate had third-quarter labor costs rising slightly, by 0.6 percent.
The report was good news for investors wary of signs of inflation that could trigger further interest rate increases from the Federal Reserve. inflation is supposed to come from under (these) circumstances," said Gerald D.
