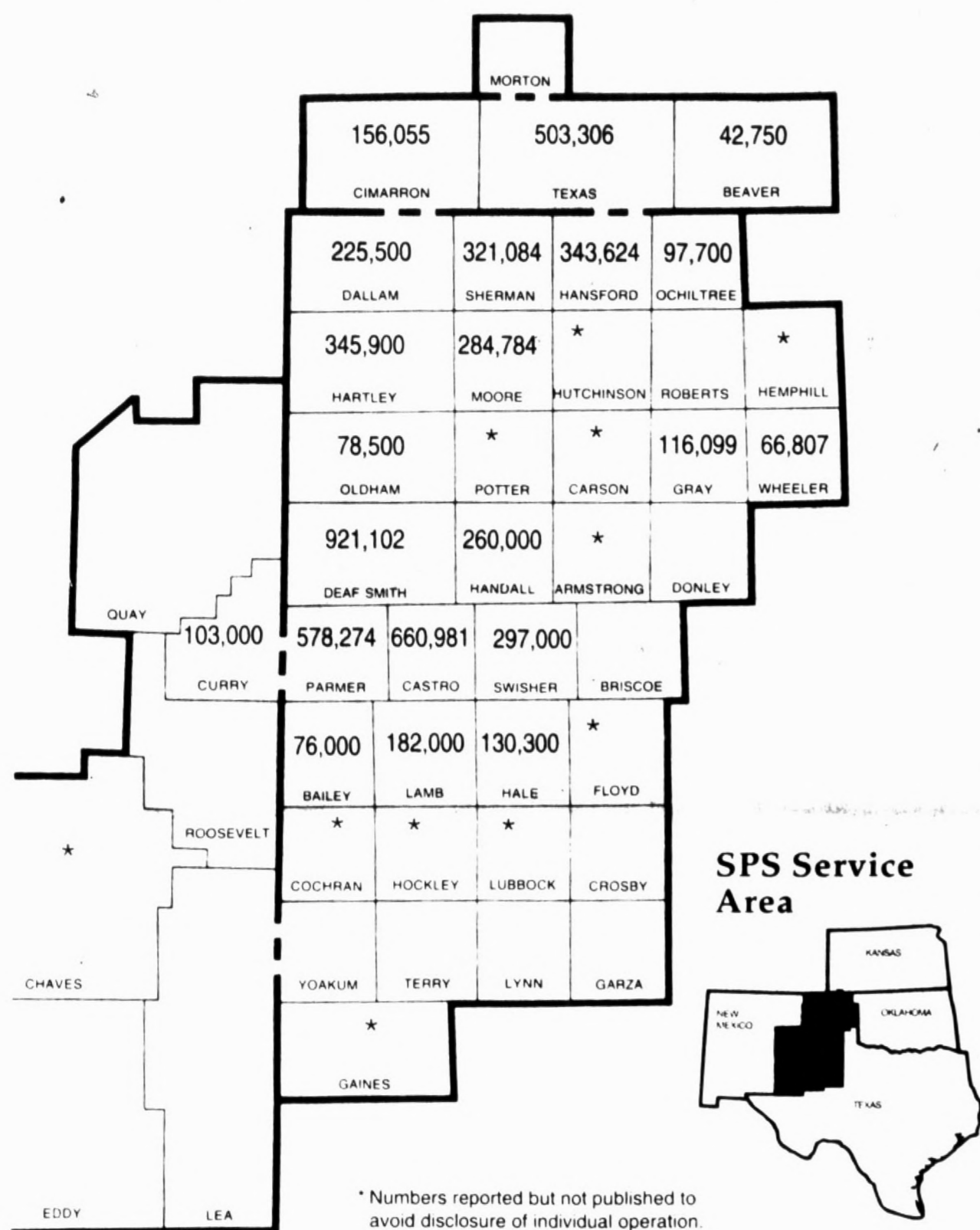

County sets record again in fed cattle

Record 6.27 million head fed in SPS area

Another record-breaking year in the Deaf Smith County and Panhandle cattle industry was reflected in the annual Fed Cattle Survey conducted by Southwestern Public Service Co.

The survey, released Friday, again shows that Deaf Smith County can lay claim as being the "Cattle Feeding Capital of the World" with a total of 921,102 head moved in 1993—up from the record total of 843,276 in 1992.

Cattle fed in the SPS area in 1993 totalled 6,269,425, an increase of 281,000. It marked the fifth consecutive year of growth. The one-time capacity of feedyards in the area grew from 2.94 million to 3.07 million.

"The Golden Triangle" of Deaf Smith, Castro and Parmer counties

accounted for 2,160,357 head of fed cattle, or more than 34 percent of the survey total. Castro County was second with 660,981 head of fed cattle, and Parmer County was third with 578,274.

The survey included figures from 114 feedyards of more than 5,000 capacity and 11 yards under that capacity. The SPS area in Texas includes 96 feedyards, while Oklahoma has 13 and New Mexico 5.

The survey lists 14 packing plants in the area with a total annual capacity of 5,292,600. Three of the plants have a capacity over one million: Iowa Beef Processors in Parmer County; Excel Corp. in Parmer County, and Montfort Inc. in Moore County.

Deaf Smith also led the way in number of feedlots over 5,000 capacity with 15, while Castro has 13

and Parmer has 9. The lots in Deaf Smith County (and capacity): Barrett & Crofoot West (65,000), Hereford Feedyards (48,000), Barrett & Crofoot East (45,000), Southwest Feedyard (42,000), Bartlett #2 (42,000), Champion Feeders (32,000), Sugarland Feedyards (28,000), Great Plains Cattle Feeders (26,000), MC-6 Cattle Feeders (22,000), Circle 3 Feedyard (20,000), Keeling Cattle Feedyard (17,000), Tri-State Feedyards (15,000), Frio Feeders (7,000), Lookingbill Feedyard (6,000), XCL Feeder (6,000).

SPS annually prepares the survey, which includes feedlots in its service area covering 52,000 square miles. The region includes the Texas and Oklahoma panhandles, the Texas South Plains, eastern and southeastern New Mexico and southwestern Kansas.

Rostenkowski still defiant, says he will be vindicated

WASHINGTON (AP) - Rep. Dan Rostenkowski's new lawyer is promising constitutional challenges to wide-ranging federal corruption charges that have hobbled one of the most powerful lawmakers in Congress.

Actions that prosecutors contend are criminal - ranging from hiring practices to gift purchases - were related to Rostenkowski's official duties, attorney Dan Webb said Friday after his client pleaded innocent to a 17-count indictment in U.S. District Court.

In addition, Webb told reporters, the Constitution says Congress determines what is proper spending by its members.

"This indictment raises some grave and serious constitutional concerns. This indictment represents an effort by the executive branch of government to infringe upon and interfere with the performance of congressional duties," the lawyer contended.

Rostenkowski, D-Ill., read a defiant statement on the courthouse steps.

"I will fight these false charges and will prevail. I will wash away the mud that has been splattered upon my reputation," said the veteran lawmaker, who was forced by the indictment to relinquish chairmanship

of the tax-writing House Ways and Means Committee.

"Some ask, 'How could you have done these things?' The answer is simple: 'I didn't do them. Talk is cheap. Allegations come easily. In court, they will be subjected to a higher standard, and when all is said and done, they will fail the test and I will be vindicated.'"

Judge Norma Holloway Johnson set July 8 for a hearing on the case, but excused Rostenkowski from attending and released him without bail. He was ordered not to discuss the case with potential witnesses - including his own employees.

Webb said he may file motions asserting congressional immunity for his client - an action that could delay a trial.

The charges include accusations that Rostenkowski converted nearly \$640,000 in government funds to personal and family use. He is also charged with hiring "ghost" employees who performed no work, arranging for kickbacks, tampering with a witness and unlawfully receiving cash in exchange for stamps at the House Post Office.

Webb described that as a "kitchen sink indictment," adding it includes "every conceivable charge ... no matter how weak it is in order to

make this indictment ... stronger than it actually is."

The indictment came after Rostenkowski spurned a widely reported plea bargain that had been negotiated with federal prosecutors last month by his previous attorney, Robert Bennett of Washington. Rostenkowski and Bennett parted company shortly afterward.

Webb, a former U.S. attorney and prosecutor in the Iran-Contra case who was hired last week, said the defense would show:

"At no time" did Rostenkowski place anyone on his payroll "with the knowledge and intent" that the employee would perform no work. "There are no ghosts," he said.

"Congressional rules explicitly allow employees to voluntarily do personal work for a lawmaker on their own time."

"Nine of 14 people that the government calls ghost employees 'are ancient history' because the statute of limitations has run out, which means they're legally invalid."

"Every one" of the furniture and gift items Rostenkowski purchased from the House stationary store was related to official duties.

"At no time did the congressman ever mispend any congressional money."

Two Hereford schools make up state-mandated test rates

Two Hereford schools which had been chastised by the state last year for "unacceptable student performance" are in the clear this year, based on preliminary results of spring TAAS testing.

Assistant Superintendent Nena Veazey said Friday that the Texas Education Agency has notified the Hereford Independent School District that Bluebonnet Intermediate School and Hereford Junior High recorded improvements in TAAS scores that pulled them above state-mandated

minimum passing rates.

Last year, TEA notified the district that the number of children from specified student population groups (African-American, Hispanic, Anglo or economically disadvantaged) was below the state-mandated 20 percent passing rate.

The district was given one year to implement plans to improve those scores or TEA would have been rated as "low performing" and would have been subject to active intervention by the state education agency.

At the time, Bluebonnet fell short in the economically disadvantaged category, with 18 percent of those

students passing the TAAS.

At the junior high, 17 percent of black students passed, 16 percent of Hispanic students and only 11 percent of economically disadvantaged students passed.

TEA required specific plans be formulated at each school to address the low test scores.

The campuses, Mrs. Veazey said, "had significant gains in reading and writing and they had gains in math and they will not be receiving a letter."

In fact, she said, no school in the district will receive a letter of concern or be listed as "low performing."

Specific data from the spring TAAS testing in Hereford was unavailable.

Mrs. Veazey said it will be later this summer before a breakdown of scores district-wide is received.

However, she continued, preliminary data shows that all schools here recorded increases in reading and writing scores.

"Math will still be a targeted concern," she added.

Mrs. Veazey had words of praise for the two campuses that were targeted by TEA.

"Those campuses did extremely well," she said. "The teachers get all the credit for this."

State standards call for 90 percent of all students to be passing the TAAS test by the 1997-98 school year.

The TAAS is presented in three sections -- reading, writing and mathematics. A score of 70 or better is required to meet minimum expectations and pass that section.

Mexico car blast kills at least five persons

GUADALAJARA, Mexico (AP) - A car apparently laden with explosives blew up early today outside a luxury hotel in this central Mexican city, killing at least five people and wounding six, police and news reports said.

The blast was the latest in a series of violent incidents in Mexico that began with a New Year's Day uprising in the south, the March 23 assassination of a presidential candidate and kidnappings of prominent executives.

Police said the explosion occurred at 2:40 a.m. (4:40 a.m. EDT) outside the Camino Real hotel in Guadalajara, 175 miles northwest of Mexico City.

Police reports cited by the major network Televisa gave the prelimi-

nary casualty count of at least five dead and six injured.

At least 10 cars parked nearby were destroyed or badly damaged, said the official Mexican news agency Notimex. It said there was some damage to the hotel, where a party was being held.

The reports were still sketchy shortly after dawn.

A bus that had transported a band to the hotel for the party was also damaged, and army troops cordoned off the explosion site. Bomb experts began an investigation.

No one immediately claimed responsibility, and the government said it had no report on possible suspects.

'Dynasty' noted as key Bullock employees move to state agencies

AUSTIN (AP) - When the Texas Education Agency was looking for a new chief lawyer this year, an aide to Lt. Gov. Bob Bullock got the job.

When it came time for the Legislative Budget Board to name a new director, another Bullock aide was chosen.

The new director of the Sunset Commission, which reviews state government agencies to recommend whether and how they should continue? An employee of Bullock's when he was state comptroller.

And when Bullock named a member of the public to the Sunset panel, he looked no further than his own executive assistant, Chuck Bailey, who unlike the other aides remains on his staff.

The moves are among dozens of Bullock employees over the years to other key positions, in what Public Citizen's Tom Smith describes as a "dynasty."

Such watchdog groups praise the talent and training of those who have worked for Bullock, even while raising an eyebrow at Bailey's appointment. Public members of commissions generally are thought of as bringing in a viewpoint from outside government.

Executive Director Suzy Woodford of Common Cause said it may be time to change the law to ensure "public" members aren't the staffers of those appointing them. But she added, "I really respect Chuck a lot."

Bullock said he named Bailey because of concern that the Sunset process wasn't working properly, and "I wanted to know what was going on."

Bailey says Bullock's instructions are simple: "Do what's best for the state."

"I think any public member would be not any more free than I am to do what they thought was the right thing to do," he said.

But Republican Tex Lezar, who

wants to unseat the Democratic lieutenant governor, said having "the same players" in various positions makes the public suspicious.

"One of the problems with government now is that it's so incestuous," he said. "People get so intent on controlling things they forget this is a democracy."

Ms. Woodford said Bullock's former aides "are all independent people who have their own qualifications, and to say they're going to be dancing to his drum, I think is disingenuous."

"It's a win-win," said Public Citizen's Smith. "It enables him to keep track of what's going on inside agencies and provides extremely well-trained employees in critical positions."

Bullock says he's proud of such former staff members as David Anderson, who moved to TEA; John Keel, chosen budget board director by its members, including Bullock;

and John Moore, who became Sunset director after serving as University of Texas vice chancellor.

He dismisses talk that such moves enhance his power.

"I don't know what the word powerful really means. I know what responsibility means, and I know what it means to work hard," Bullock said.

The comptroller's office he ran from 1975 to 1990 is large - with 2,800 employees. Because of that, Bullock said, "I don't know that that's really unique" so many former employees have gone on to other state posts.

But Smith said Bullock's aides have a special reputation.

"He trains his staff very rigorously, and weeds out weaklings early on," Smith said. Those who can make it with Bullock are "hard-working and intelligent and able to withstand tremendous stresses of long hours. And they can work for very

demanding bosses."

"I try to impress on them it's not a job, it's a privilege to work in the lieutenant governor's office and try to make a difference," said Bullock, whose campaign in the past has bragged on his "alumni."

A campaign newsletter last year listed more than 50 who went on to other government posts, beginning when he was comptroller, along with others who now have top jobs in professional associations and private business.

In government, they range from posts in the governor's office to the House speaker's office; from top jobs in the prison system to the Medicaid program; from key aides in the attorney general's office to elected officials such as Land Commissioner Garry Mauro.

"The downside for the public (in government posts) is one of inbreeding," Smith said, "in that the many fresh ideas that might come from people who haven't been in government for years and haven't worked for someone who is as dominating as Bullock might not get expressed."

"But balancing that with people who know how to be effective and get things done, government's probably a lot more efficient because of this dynasty that he's creating," Smith said.

Bullock's former workers say he gave them an opportunity to stretch their talents. They describe him as someone who works hard, knows government, excels at management, emphasizes communication and stresses deadlines.

He cares deeply for the state and demands excellence in serving it, they say. "In Bob Bullock, you have a legendary Texan," Keel said.

The praise doesn't wash with Karen Hughes, Republican Party executive director. "Most people are afraid to say anything bad about Bob Bullock because Bob Bullock rules by intimidation," she said.

Bullock said, "Well, throw me in the briar patch. What would one expect her to say other than something like that? ... I'll let the people of Texas judge this, the job these people have done, where they are and where they have been."

Malpractice suit ends with \$10 million award

DENTON, Texas (AP) - A woman who suffered brain damage from complications during childbirth was awarded \$10 million in a malpractice suit against Denton Regional Medical Center.

A jury Friday found the hospital negligent but cleared the anesthesiologists who worked on Kathy LaCroix.

Mrs. LaCroix suffered irreparable brain damage from oxygen loss in January 1991 during the delivery of her daughter, Lawryn, by Caesarean section.

Her attorneys said the nurse-anesthetist and other medical personnel failed to properly treat her when she began having breathing problems and seizures and went into cardiac arrest.

"I think the message this jury has sent is this: the citizens of Denton County expect hospitals to provide top-quality medical care," said

Michael Whitten, a LaCroix family attorney.

"They don't expect anesthesiology services to be provided by a nurse-anesthetist without an anesthesiologist supervising," he said.

Mrs. LaCroix's husband, Lawrence LaCroix, was in the operating room during the birth and repeatedly asked for help for his wife.

Doctors diagnosed her current condition as "moderate dementia" and said the once bright, ambitious career woman can never again live independently.

Jurors in the trial, which began April 4, rejected arguments that the anesthesiologists were negligent. Dr. Christian Green and Dr. Darius Pourzan provided anesthesiology services under contract to the Women's Pavilion at Denton Regional.

"I just felt like everybody did everything they could," said jury foreman Bill Yocum. "In this situation, I think their conscience has to be their guide."

Yocum said the jury blamed the hospital for negligence because former administrator Don Cuilla ignored repeated warnings from the medical staff that nurse-anesthetists should be supervised.

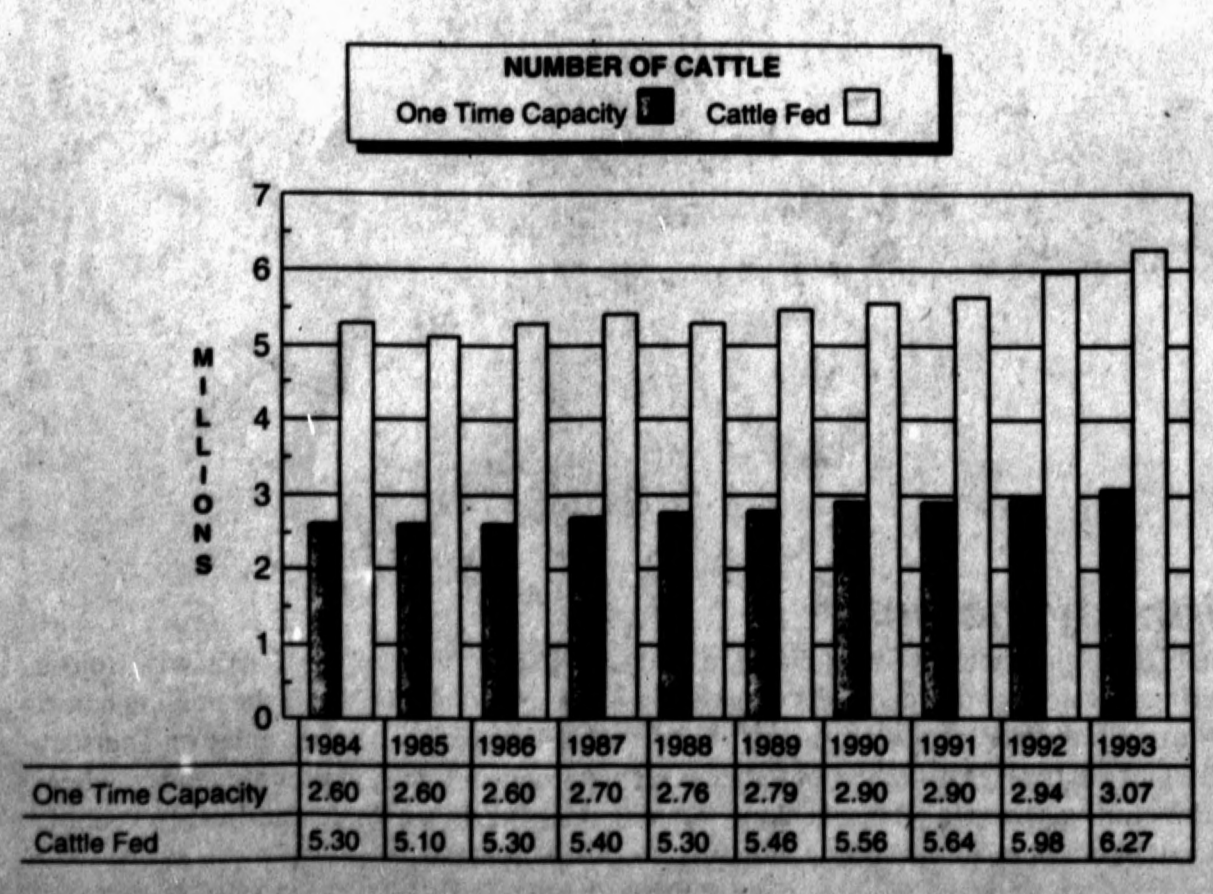
Hospital attorneys argued that Mrs. LaCroix's brain damage was an unavoidable accident.

Jerry Sawyer, lead attorney for the LaCroix family, also accused hospital officials of altering and destroying records in Mrs. LaCroix's medical file.

"This entire case is based on a for-profit conglomerate putting profits ahead of safe medicine," Sawyer said.

Epic Healthcare Groups Inc. operates 39 hospitals in 10 states and has a net worth of \$161 million. Representatives for Epic and the hospital made no statement about whether they would appeal.

Women in Army argue for combat roles

FORT CAMPBELL, Ky. (AP) - As military leaders consider whether female soldiers should get more chances to serve in combat, seven women in the 101st Airborne Division say ability - not gender - is what counts in a fight.

"I think women should be allowed in any area of combat," Spec. Tracy Stephens, 26, a clerk from Socorro, N.M., said in an interview Friday. "This is a very hot issue for me."

Stephens described in great detail and with much enthusiasm the mobile artillery operated by her husband, who is stationed at Fort Sill, Okla. She said she would like to do that, too.

Army Secretary Togo West is to

make a recommendation on whether women should be allowed to serve as pilots of special operation unit helicopters and operators of the Multiple Launch Rocket System, a key artillery weapon.

His decision is expected after Army Chief of Staff Gen. Gordon Sullivan returns today from an overseas trip. Defense Secretary William Perry must approve any change.

The 101st Airborne has been tested in battle from World War II to Vietnam to Somalia, where one member, helicopter pilot Michael Durant, was shot down and captured. Images of his swollen face filled

television screens and the covers of newspapers and magazines.

Two women Blackhawk helicopter pilots at this base on the Tennessee-Kentucky border say women should have the opportunity to volunteer for combat.

"That just opens you up to another area where you have to go out and prove yourself first, and there's a lot of females that are capable of being able to do that," said First Lt. Teena M.C. Fawcett, 26, of Omaha, Neb.

Fawcett and Capt. Jane O'Connor, 33, of Warrensburg, N.Y., said women must be given a chance to advance, although both said they had no personal interest in being in combat.

"Let's make sure that if you open

up a field for women, make sure that it's completely open to the top so she can progress," said O'Connor, whose husband is a special operations unit pilot.

"I just hate to see a woman thrown in there and be a captain and not be able to become a company commander over there," she said. "If they're going to open this, it's got to be wide open."

"And they've got to be able to accept that if she's really good, then she can be a company commander over there as a major."

Two clerks in a supply unit pointed out that women, in effect, already are in combat, whether or not they've been assigned a combat role.

"When we were in Somalia and they needed people to go out in the

convoys, we put the helmets on and we put the flak vests on," said Pfc. Kimberly McGee, 23, of Spring Hill, Fla.

McGee works as a high-tech radio operator and spent 133 days in Somalia.

"I can't see the difference because if we were there and had the men with us, there was no difference. They still shot at us. And we had to shoot back. And if that's not combat - maybe it wasn't the biggest war you've ever seen - but if it's not combat, then what is it?"

Japan has problem with flow of cash to N. Korea

TOKYO (AP) - Shigeru Funaki, a North Korean living in Japan, is part of an overseas lifeline for his native country, supplying badly needed foreign exchange for its feeble economy.

"We send money to relatives back home and to the North Korean government because we want to help improve living conditions there," the trading company chairman says.

The cash flowing to Communist North Korea from Koreans living in Japan, estimated at hundreds of millions of dollars a year, poses an embarrassing dilemma for Tokyo.

Advocates of sanctions against North Korea over its suspected nuclear weapons program say the lifeline must be severed for the punitive measures to be effective.

But it's doubtful Japan can completely cut the cash flow. And if it tries, it risks a backlash from its Korean residents and neighboring North Korea.

On Friday, Foreign Ministry spokesman Terusuke Terada said Tokyo will decide what to do after the U.N. Security Council decides whether to go for sanctions.

Japan has said it will go along with any sanctions ordered by the United Nations. But in recent days it has become more conciliatory toward North Korea, cooling its rhetoric and announcing plans to have lawmakers travel to the North for talks.

Japan is North Korea's second-largest trading partner after China, which so far has opposed sanctions. The two chief advocates of punitive measures, the United States and South Korea, have only a trickle of indirect trade with the North.

In an attempt to scare off Japan, the North Koreans singled out Tokyo on Thursday by warning that they would consider it a "declaration of war" if Japan joins any international sanctions.

North Korea also test-launched a missile in the Sea of Japan that would be capable of reaching large parts of Japan.

If it decides to try to halt the cash flow, Japan could forbid all bank transactions with North Korea, but much of the money is reportedly hand-carried by travelers to the North or goes through other unofficial channels.

"I don't think that the government will be able to halt the payments," Funaki says.

Funaki's company, Dia International, is the largest Japan-based

garment maker in North Korea and has 1,300 workers at several factories there, he says.

He is one of an estimated 200,000 Koreans in Japan who are loyal to North Korea, out of a total of more than 700,000 ethnic Koreans.


In recent years, most trade between Japan and North Korea has been conducted by these North Korean residents, who act as intermediaries, importing goods that are then sold to Japanese companies.

They also send hundreds of millions of dollars each year to the North, according to estimates by Japanese and South Korean officials.

While not large by international standards, the transfers provide crucial support for North Korea's faltering economy, analysts say.

South Korea's central bank estimated in a report Friday that the North's economy shrank by 4.3 percent in 1993 because of lost trading partners in the former Soviet Union and Eastern Europe.



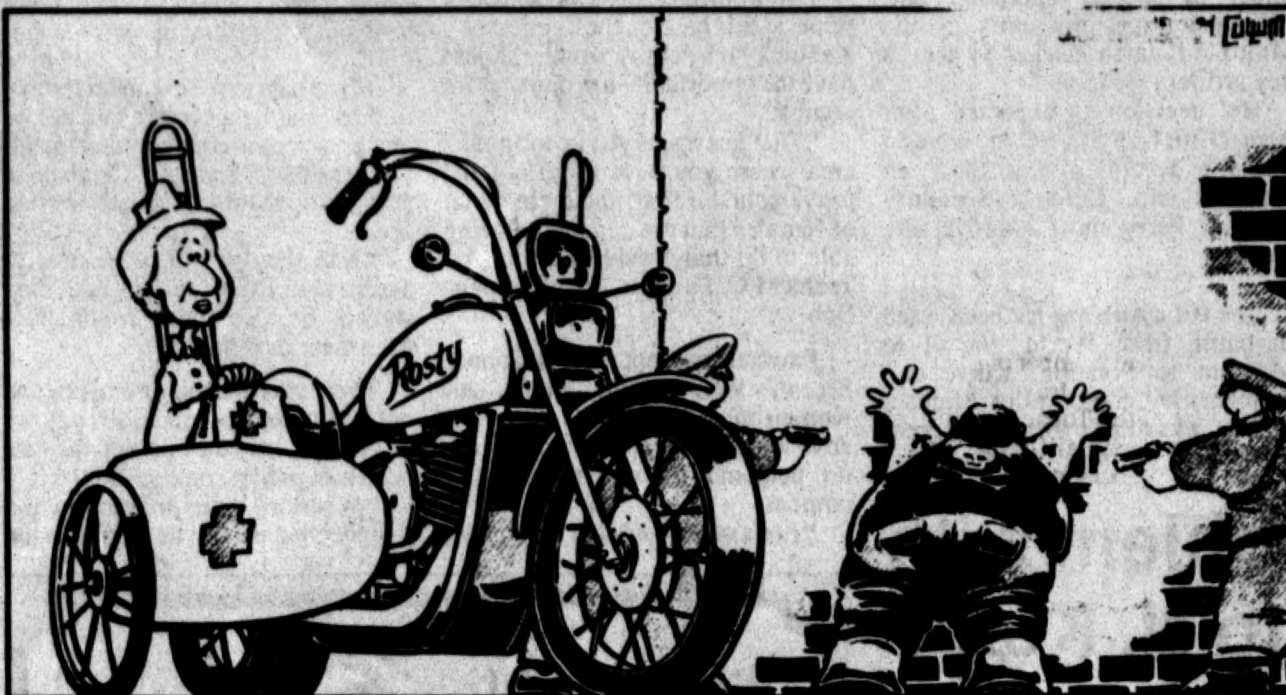

Support Camp Fire

The purpose of this column is to appeal to the good citizens of Hereford to continue support of Hereford Camp Fire.

Perhaps if more people today were aware of the Council's rich heritage, they would be willing to volunteer their time to keep alive this exceptional youth organization so that Hereford Camp Fire would not have to go under or depend on the Amarillo council for support.

The Hereford Camp Fire began because of the dream of Cassie Dowell, who moved to Hereford in 1928. You have to think of the way things were in our town at that time, because many of the conveniences we have today were not available then. The first group of girls met in Mrs. Dowell's home.

There were no official camps and no buses to carry Camp Fire girls to places for camp-outs, so the girls were transported on trucks that were lined with the quilts and pillows (there were no bed rolls) and a tarp to keep out the sun or rain.

As the organization began to grow, it was decided that a meeting place was needed. The interested fathers set themselves to the task of building a small brick building out of bricks from an abandoned well. It was known as "The Hut." The girls were happy to have a meeting place of their own, where they could cook, have meetings and they even had a fireplace.

As Camp Fire continued to grow, more space was needed. Again, the fathers came to the rescue and moved in a building that had been used for the Prisoners of War camp southwest of Hereford. Again there was more room, better facilities and more girls were added to the organization.

The Hereford Camp Fire board then decided to hire a program director. Mrs. Philip Barkley was chosen for the position. She had spent many volunteer hours with the organization, having come from Washington state where Camp Fire was an important part of her childhood years.

Mrs. Barkley continued to serve for a number of years and one could feel her love for the girls and the organization. After Mrs. Barkley's retirement, another volunteer--Nita Lea--was hired to become program director.

In 1962, Camp Fire Girls outgrew the building on Park Avenue by Mothers' Park and the board decided it was necessary for this growing organization to have more room and better facilities. This time, the wonderful service organizations of Hereford came to the rescue.

Spearheaded by the Rotary Club and supported by the Lions Club and

other organizations, a beautiful Camp Fire Lodge was built on 15th Street. Now there was an office for the executive director, Nita Lea, and several meeting rooms with a large Council meeting room, kitchen facilities, and storage.

More girls were signed up and boys were added to the organization. Soon there were as many as 600 members in the Council. Father-Daughter banquets were held in the Bull Barn with as many as 1,000 in attendance. Members put on programs at these events, guided by the volunteers from the high school band and choir directors giving the public an idea of some of the girls' activities.

This continued under Nita Lea's leadership and soon a program director was needed. The organization also gave opportunities for growing young people, besides their group meetings, to take advantage of Council-wide programs needed in a changing world--such as "I Am Safe, I Am Sure" programs provided for by the Council and given by volunteer professionals such as nurses, policemen and people who worked directly with problem youth in the community.

The Camping program began and an important part of the members' experience was an excellent facility in the mountains of New Mexico. Nita Lea, as executive director, developed positive leadership capabilities in both adults and youth they didn't even know they possessed.

Guided by the spirit of WoHeLo-Work, Health, Love) from the founders of Camp Fire, Dr. and Mrs. Luther Halsey Gulick, our youth were participants in the program that teaches a life of service to young people and that "self is forgotten."

Hereford Camp Fire was a shining example to other Councils in our nation. We had excellent leadership, fantastic volunteers, a meeting place that was the envy of all who heard about us. Now, we are in need of more volunteers who will continue the high standards set by those who began this dream.

Hereford still has the people who care, the excellent facilities, a new executive director, a board and volunteers...but we need more. How can we make this a continuing opportunity for our young people? The money-making projects have always benefited our young people with very little of it going elsewhere.

Remembering the glorious heritage that the people of Hereford built, let's not let the banner fall for lack of concern. Before we lose our vision, will you help us? Call the Camp Fire office if you have an idea.

Freebie trips noted on House expense statements

Records show ties to special interest groups

WASHINGTON (AP) - From Israel to Istanbul, House members roamed the globe last year at the expense of interest groups, according to financial statements that offer fascinating glimpses into the lives of America's lawmakers.

Domestic destinations were favored as well, as scores of House members reported all-expense paid trips to such locations as Sun Valley, Idaho; Sea Island, Ga., and Palm Springs, Calif.

In a connection that sparks outrage from groups pressing for government reform, the journeys often dovetailed with lawmakers' legislative assignments.

Rep. Pat Roberts of Kansas, senior Republican on the House Agriculture Committee, reported eight all-expense paid trips in 1993. They included January travel to Marco Island, Fla., paid for by the National Pork Producers Council; and to Phoenix, courtesy of the National Cattlemen's Association.

Rep. Roy Rowland, D-Ga., a physician and member of a key health subcommittee, travelled at the expense of the Tobacco Institute (to Palm Springs, Calif.); the American Medical Association (to Atlanta); and

the lobbying firm of Campbell Raupe Inc. (to West Palm Beach, Fla.).

House members are required by law to file financial disclosure statements annually that show income - including a salary of \$133,600 in 1993 - assets, liabilities, gifts and other material, listed by ranges rather than specific dollar amount.

They show the House has many millionaires, and that numerous lawmakers hold valuable stock portfolios. Others maintain business interests as diverse as the nation's economy. Among them: Rep. Elizabeth Furse, D-Ore., has holdings worth between \$100,000 and \$250,000 in a vineyard in her home state.

Other details nestled in the thousands of pages of forms and figures:

- Rep. Dan Rostenkowski,

arraigned during the day on 17 counts of federal corruption, collected \$750,000 for his legal defense fund, much of it from groups with interests before the House Ways and Means Committee that he chaired before his indictment.

The donations included \$5,000 from the Metropolitan Life Insurance Co.; \$500 from the Hospital Corp. of America and \$5,000 from the Tobacco Institute.

- Rep. Don Edwards, D-Calif., reported that his ex-wife owes him \$1 million from a divorce settlement in 1987.

- Rep. Walter Tucker, D-Calif., received a \$200 love offering after delivering a sermon at the Bread of Life Church, and another at the Antioch Missionary Baptist Church. Tucker also owed \$15,000 to \$50,000 on a Small Business Administration

loan for "unpaid bills, equipment and losses due to the '92 LA riots."

- Rep. Julian Dixon, D-Calif., owns five rare coins valued at between \$1,001 and \$15,000.

- Forbidden to pocket speaking fees, lawmakers instead direct the money to charities. Rep. Barbara Vucanovich, R-Nev., saw to it that \$2,000 in Tobacco Institute money went to the Casa de Vida, a home for unwed mothers in Reno.

- Speaker Thomas Foley, D-Wash., took two expense-paid trips last year. One was provided by The Associated Press, when he spoke at the organization's annual meeting in Boston.

House GOP Whip Newt Gingrich travelled widely on behalf of GOP

House candidates, and also to Israel (eight days) and Greece (seven days) with his wife.

- GOP Leader Bob Michel of Illinois was one of several lawmakers making trips to charity golf tournaments: Bryant Gumbel's, in Orlando, Fla., last March; Jerry Ford's in Denver in August; and the Danny Thompson Memorial in Sun Valley, Idaho, in August.

Rowland, a Georgia Democrat, was among the most frequent travellers last year, spending 35 days on travel paid for by private interests, most often accompanied by his wife.

He was one of a few dozen House members to travel to Israel during the year, courtesy of the American Israel Education Foundation, the tax-exempt educational arm of the AIPAC. It lobbies Congress on behalf of stronger ties between Israel and the United States.

Schools starting to teach 'family values'

IRVING, Texas (AP) - Reading, writing, arithmetic. Right and wrong.

The latter may not be traditional icons of public education, but with juvenile crime on the rise and the call for "family values" still ringing, a debate is stirring in this Dallas suburb over whether schools should be teaching morality along with basic subjects.

The Irving Independent School District is considering a resolution to direct teachers to reinforce "basic traditional moral values" throughout the curriculum from prekindergarten through 12th grade.

The proposal describes the values to be taught as determining right from wrong, honesty, integrity, loyalty, accountability, discipline, sexual purity, self-restraint and the value of human life and property.

Board trustees have endorsed the resolution 6-1 and are scheduled for a final vote at their June 20 meeting.

School board President Joan Sears said the resolution is meant to give teachers the ability to buttress what students should be learning at home.

"It's nothing new, it's just reinforcing what I was taught when I grew up and what we try to teach in

our homes," Mrs. Sears said. "When they're in our charge during the day, a teacher has got to have children who respect authority, and the kids have got to learn these things."

Gary Bauer, president of the Washington, D.C.-based Family Research Council, hailed the Irving resolution.

"Polls are showing people think America is in the midst of a serious moral decline," Bauer said. "This is one of the first responses around the country."

But opponents say so-called values education oversteps the boundaries of schools and takes the responsibility of parenting away from parents.

"These are things that Mom and Dad are supposed to be doing. These are things that our church is supposed to be doing," said trustee Barbara Cardwell, who voted against the resolution. "I don't think we should be putting this in black and white; this is part of life."

Richard Kouri, president of the Texas State Teachers Association, said he is wary of directives to teach values in schools.

Critics and proponents agree the move toward values education is a direct response to increasing juvenile violence.

Alexander enjoying time as Rockets' owner

HOUSTON - Eleven months ago Leslie Alexander arrived in town with all the subtlety of an atomic bomb.

He fired several Rockets front office employees, including general manager Steve Patterson, in addition to firing and rehiring Hall of Famer Calvin Murphy. When the smoke cleared, the new Rockets owner had given the team's front office a major face lift, while making a few enemies along the way.

We did not know much about Alexander and that's just the way he wanted it.

In fact, he chose not to have any biographical information published in the team's media guide.

Who would have thought the mysterious and tumultuous days of July and August would become festive times in May and June.

Despite all the turmoil off the court, Alexander's inaugural season has been the stuff of which dreams are made.

In Alexander's first year at the helm, the Rockets won the Midwest Division title, Hakeem Olajuwon picked up the Most Valuable Player award and now the team is on the brink of the first NBA championship in franchise history.

"When I purchased the team, I

thought we had a real good chance to win a championship and I also thought Hakeem would win the MVP," Alexander said. "I'm happy, but I'm not at all surprised. There's always luck involved, but the pieces have to fall in place for the luck to do its thing."

Alexander, who bought the team from Charlie Thomas for \$85 million, has been described by some as a meddler who dabbles too much to the day-to-day operations of the organization. Alexander said that assessment is far from the truth.

"When you own a basketball team, you want to be involved. That's the fun part," said Alexander, who has a home in Boca Raton, Fla. "But I'm a very good delegator. If someone can do something nearly as well as me or better than me, then I'm not going to do it myself."

"When I took over the Rockets, I thought I was going to be more involved on the business side than I really am. For the first time in my life, I can get up in the morning and not have to do anything. Sometimes I go to the office, sometimes I travel and sometimes I play golf."

Golf and leisure time were the last things on Alexander's mind when he first purchased the Rockets.

He was too busy trying to convince people he was not the second coming

of John McMullen, the former Astros owner who spent much of his time in New Jersey.

"I believe I came under attack early on because I was an outsider," Alexander said.

"Sometimes the media is a little too quick to criticize. They like turmoil and I guess I gave them the turmoil they really wanted. I played right into their hands, and they have a good time. I'm a big boy and I can take it, but no one wants animosity. That doesn't help anything."

Although he said he often felt misunderstood, Alexander is confident he will eventually be accepted in Houston.

"It's going to take time," he said. "Who knows if they ever will? It's hard to know from the outside what someone is really like. I would like the fans to know that I really care about the community, and that I'm concerned about making Rockets games a much better experience for the fans and the community."

Alexander made his fortune by trading bonds and through real estate transactions.

"Those were very exciting times," he said. "I was king of the hill, sort of. I made money every year - lots of money. It was very exciting to come into the office. We rolled in money. It was a lot of fun. It's a lot

like owning an NBA team. There were a lot of highs and lows."

Once he had accumulated enough wealth, Alexander started looking for an NBA franchise to purchase.

He attempted to buy New Jersey, San Antonio and Washington before the Rockets became available. Alexander is bothered by suggestions that he is financially leveraged to the hilt.

"I have no idea where those rumors come from," he said. "I'm more

financially stable than I've been in my entire life. I have no money problems at all. I pay a debt on the Rockets every quarter, but it's not a burden."

Alexander, who plans to make Houston his home, remains convinced The Summit is no longer a viable arena for the Rockets.

"We can't continue to play at The Summit if we want to be competitive in this league," he said. "It doesn't produce the revenue sources that are needed to compete. The income derived

from The Summit won't allow us to go after the best players, and I always want us to go after the best players."

Alexander said Summit renovation is not an option and that he is "conservatively optimistic" that a new arena will be built.

Alexander, 50, has been married 22 years. His wife, Nanci, is the founder and president of the Animal Rights Foundation of Florida. Their daughter, Jodi, is a 19-year-old sophomore at Duke.

Ex-Cowboy coach happy on boat

DALLAS (AP) - Jimmy Johnson says he appreciated Dallas Cowboys owner Jerry Jones letting him out of his 10-year contract and throwing in a few million on top of that.

"If you recall what I said, it was that Jerry Jones at that time was a better friend to me than he had ever been," Johnson said. "And with a \$2 million check in my pocket, he was."

Johnson, in a recent interview with The Dallas Morning News from his Tavernier, Fla., home, admitted the payment and discussed other rumors that circulated after he left the Cowboys March 29.

Yes, he would've liked to coach in Dallas for another year and a chance to win a third-straight Super Bowl title.

And yes, he wonders when Jones first approached Barry Switzer about getting Johnson's old job.

However, Johnson didn't tell Jones what a great job the Cowboys did in their first draft without him.

Johnson has been seemingly

everywhere in the past two months, mostly at news conferences pitching his latest ventures: a local television show, a segment on a cable television program and his NFL analyst job on Fox.

He's also part owner in a new Dallas restaurant and has been seen popping out of a suitcase on a television commercial for a hotel chain.

But what he's been doing most on his self-imposed vacation-retirement is relaxing on his "Three Rings" boat as he splashes through the Florida Keys.

"This really isn't a bad way to live," says Johnson. "I had it pretty well set in my mind that I was going to leave the Cowboys, I just thought it would be after one more season."

Once considered incredibly highstrung, Johnson is now the epitome of laid back. He's even going out of his way to be nice to sportswriters, an act he once considered akin to heresy.

"As long as we were playing football games, I was totally into it," Johnson said. "But Dallas was gradually becoming a situation I didn't enjoy being in. I don't know that I needed a year away from football. I needed a year away from the Cowboys and from Jerry Jones."

Johnson is not endorsing or denouncing Switzer.

"With Barry, time will tell. What he needs to do this first year is stay the hell out of the way and not screw it up," Johnson said.

Johnson did care about Jones' contention that he praised the club's first draft held without him.

"He called to ask about a trade I had made for Elvis Patterson, and the next thing I know he says I loved the Shante Carver pick," Johnson said. "I don't know anything about Shante Carver."

"All I said was it looks like you got a pass rusher because that's what he did at Arizona State. I have no idea if he can play."

KNICKS

Houston's points coming on free throws in the last 6 1/2 minutes, was led by Derek Harper, who hit two of his four 3-pointers during the spurt.

Harper and John Starks had a combined 19 points on 6-for-28 shooting in the opener of the NBA Finals, but they both came back to play strong all-around games for the Knicks.

Starks had 19 points on 6-for-11 shooting, nine assists, three 3-pointers and three steals. Harper finished with 18 points on 7-for-11 shooting, four 3-pointers, seven assists and three steals.

"You can't play perfect basketball all the time, but professionals are supposed to make open shots," Harper said. "In the clutch, you just have to step up and knock down shots."

Starks was superb in the third quarter, scoring 11 points on 4-for-5 shooting, including three 3-pointers without a miss in the period.

"It's very important for us to shoot well because this team gives you open shots," said Starks, who missed 15 of 18 shots in New York's Game 1 defeat. "I have to be patient and hit the shot when it presents itself. I put a lot of pressure on myself to perform well. I understand how to turn myself around after a bad game."

Patrick Ewing, the Knicks' leading scorer in 16 of their previous 19 playoff games, finished with 16 points, 13 rebounds and six blocked shots.

"I didn't score a lot, but I did

everything else - rebounding, blocking shots, making passes - all the other things," Ewing said.

Hakeem Olajuwon scored 25 points for the Rockets, but had just seven rebounds overall and had just four points in the fourth quarter as he continued to be surrounded by New York defenders.

"We have to watch the films and come back and make some changes," Olajuwon said. "We must stick together as a team and come back for a real battle."

Houston guard Vernon Maxwell bounced back from a subpar first game to score 20 points in Game 2, but the Rockets' other two guards, Kenny Smith and Sam Cassell, combined for just 11 more. Smith and Cassell missed 11 of 14 attempts.

"They won the guard battle tonight," Cassell said. "We'll win it another night."

The Rockets trailed 72-65 after three quarters, but they started the final period with a 14-4 run, with Maxwell starting the spurt with a layup and finishing it with a three-point play after a long pass from Otis Thorpe.

That gave Houston a 79-76 lead with 6:32 left, but they didn't have another field goal after that.

"Defense was the deciding factor," Rockets coach Rudy Tomjanovich said. "It got them the lead after we made a strong run in the fourth quarter."

The Knicks, who shot under 40 percent six times in the playoffs, made 52 percent in Game 2 compared to 39 percent for the Rockets. Despite outshooting Houston 50 percent to 42 percent in the first half, it was 42-42 at halftime.

The Rockets, 4-3 on the road in the playoffs, don't seem concerned about the possibility of losing three straight games.

"It's still a long series," Maxwell said. "We still have five games to play. It's going to be tough for anybody to beat us three times - I don't care where it is."

"But we have our work cut out for us. We've had to bounce back before, and we'll find a way to bounce back this time, too."

Most Dallasites greeting World Cup '94 with yawn

DALLAS (AP) - The sporting world's largest spectacle kicks off at the Cotton Bowl this week and you'd hardly know it by the look and feel of things in Dallas.

Billboards trumpeting the arrival of the World Cup are limited mostly to the airport and the area near the stadium. Television and radio ads have been at a minimum and on-air personalities seldom mention the soccer matches.

Sports talk shows, which the Dallas AM dial is filled with, rarely discuss the event. You're more likely to hear a discussion about who the Mavericks should take with the 28th pick of this month's NBA draft.

No wonder ticket sales are embarrassingly low.

Only partial sections have sold out for the six games to be played here between June 17 and July 9, including a second-round game and a quarterfinal match that could produce the Cup champion.

Then there's The Great Fence Controversy, a ridiculous battle over a 6-foot, chain-link fence around the retaining wall meant to keep out of control fans off the field.

The city put the thing up last month much to the chagrin of Cup

officials. The head of soccer's international governing body even asked President Clinton to throw his weight around to get the fence torn down.

Eventually, the city and Cup came to an agreement. They'd tear down the west side fencing so television cameras would have unobstructed views but the fence was staying up on the east side.

That's silly.

All or none is OK. Half way is indecisive and begging for trouble. Figure it this way: If violence erupts at one of the six fenceless World Cup venues, the Dallas officials who insisted on the chain links can thump their chests proudly and say "We told you so."

If there's no violence anywhere, they can suffer through whatever complaints they receive comforted by the knowledge they erred on the side of caution.

But if problems occur at the partially fenced Cotton Bowl, that decision could be one of the worst in Dallas since city officials decided the Super Bowl champion Cowboys should ride in convertibles in a downtown victory parade.

Oh well. Let's just hope the hooligans sit on the east side.

Then again, with so many tickets

available, it wouldn't be hard for the rowdy rooters to buy west-side seats. Maybe the tickets would've been sold had the game been marketed better.

Sure, people don't need to be told the Super Bowl is coming, but World Cup organizers should've realized their game just doesn't carry that kind of weight in this neck of the woods.

Yet, they insisted on riding the national advertising campaigns, pointing to those "official advertiser of the 1994 World Cup" spots as full-fledged marketing.

Seems like it wouldn't have been hard to have added a segment to the end of each ad, something like listing the games that are going to be here and giving a phone number for ticket sales. Maybe even get a local celebrity to lend their name or face.

Organizers thought simply rolling out the black-and-white balls and touting this as a once-in-a-lifetime event would be enough to make Americans as passionate about the game as the rest of the world is.

What's happened was much more predictable. Those who love the game, and there are plenty of them in North Texas, have bought tickets.

Those that don't, haven't. And they won't.

Let the games begin.

Dallas-area Hispanics to root for Mexico's World Cup team

DALLAS - Cesilio Martinez is still reeling from the news.

The Mexico native moved to Dallas from Houston six months ago, hoping that Mexico would be among the six soccer teams playing first-round World Cup games at the Cotton Bowl.

That's not going to happen. Martinez, who attended six World Cup games in Mexico eight years ago, will have to settle for watching his favorite team on television.

He plans to be glued to the set when Mexico plays June 19 and 28 in Washington and June 24 in Orlando, Fla.

"I really thought that Mexico would play here," Martinez said Thursday. "But I'm okay. The games are going to be good and I expect Mexico to win."

Martinez is not the only soccer fan in the Dallas area pulling for Mexico to win it all. The Mexican team has been adopted as the home team by many local fans, who intend to jam sports bars every time Mexico plays.

Spanish-language radio and television stations plan to increase daily sports shows and even send staff members to Washington and Orlando to cover the games.

Billboards are up around Dallas showing star Mexican goalie Jorge Campos promoting an athletic shoe on sale at a sporting goods store in suburban Plano, Texas.

Jesus Padilla, sports director at Dallas radio station KESS-AM, said he has already begun airing a one-hour World Cup wrapup every Sunday night.

"I'm increasing my sports segments because I'm getting calls from people wanting to know more about the Mexican team," said Padilla, who will hit the road to cover the team.

Television station phone lines also have been buzzing. KUVN-TV of Dallas, which broadcasts in Spanish, will televise all 52 World Cup games, most of them live and the rest on taped delay. It is counting on good ratings from Dallas-area Hispanics.

"Of the Hispanic households, we will definitely have the lion's share turned to Univision for the games," said Mario M. Carrera, vice president and general manager for KUVN-TV.

Carrera said most of his station's viewers are looking forward to the games. They couldn't care less about disputes between Dallas and World Cup officials over security fences, beer sales and other contractual matters.

"I think they're missing the point about what the World Cup means to the world," Carrera said of city officials. "Every game in the World Cup is a social event in a lot of different parts of the world."

KFWD-TV is bracing for a huge response when Mexico plays, said Wayne Casa, the Spanish-language station's vice president and general manager.

"We did a game last week between the U.S. national team and Mexico," he said. "The next day, the switchboard was swamped. People wanted to know when we were going to repeat the game. There had been a phenomenal response about Mexico."

Casa said he was not surprised by the response because 21 percent of

Dallas residents are Hispanic. Because about 88 percent of the local Hispanic population is of Mexican descent, he said, "I would assume that they would support Mexico regardless of who Mexico is playing. We see that when we televise the games."

Casa said he plans to superimpose World Cup scores on the screen during regular programming and use game highlights from ABC, ESPN and Telemundo television networks. Channel 52 will not air many games live because of contractual agreements, he said.

Most people, he said, will watch the games live at home or at sports bars.

"The reality is that those people interested in the Mexico team will watch the game whenever it's televised, whether it's 11 in the evening or three in the morning," he said.

Many people will be watching from Topacio Latin Club on Harry Hines Boulevard near Love Field. The six-year-old club often has standing-room-only crowds for soccer games.

When Mexico plays, forget about getting in minutes before the game starts, owner Jorge Perez says. He said he often has to turn people away hours before game time.

"We usually have about 250 people

per game," said Perez, who began televising games on a 10-foot screen 2 1/2 years ago. "We get about 300 when Mexico plays."

Amiro Pupo is often at Topacio early. Pupo, who owns a paging and cellular telephone company, has made the 45-minute drive from his home in nearby Rockwall, Texas, to watch soccer dozens of times since the screen was installed.

Pupo, 18, said he can't wait for the World Cup games to begin.

"When the World Cup gets here, it's going to be great," he said. "It's going to be exactly like the Super Bowl. This place is going to be packed."

Elias Gomez hasn't decided where to watch the World Cup yet. But there is no question, he says, about which team he favors.

"I wanted to see Mexico play in Dallas," said Gomez, who owns a roast corn kiosk in north Oak Cliff. "I'm disappointed they are not coming. A lot of people tell me that they wish Mexico would have been here."

Gomez, who became a serious soccer fan five years ago, said World Cup officials would not have had problems filling hotel rooms if the Mexican team were playing in Dallas.

"You would have seen the same celebration that we do for the Super Bowl," he said. "Everybody would have gotten into it."

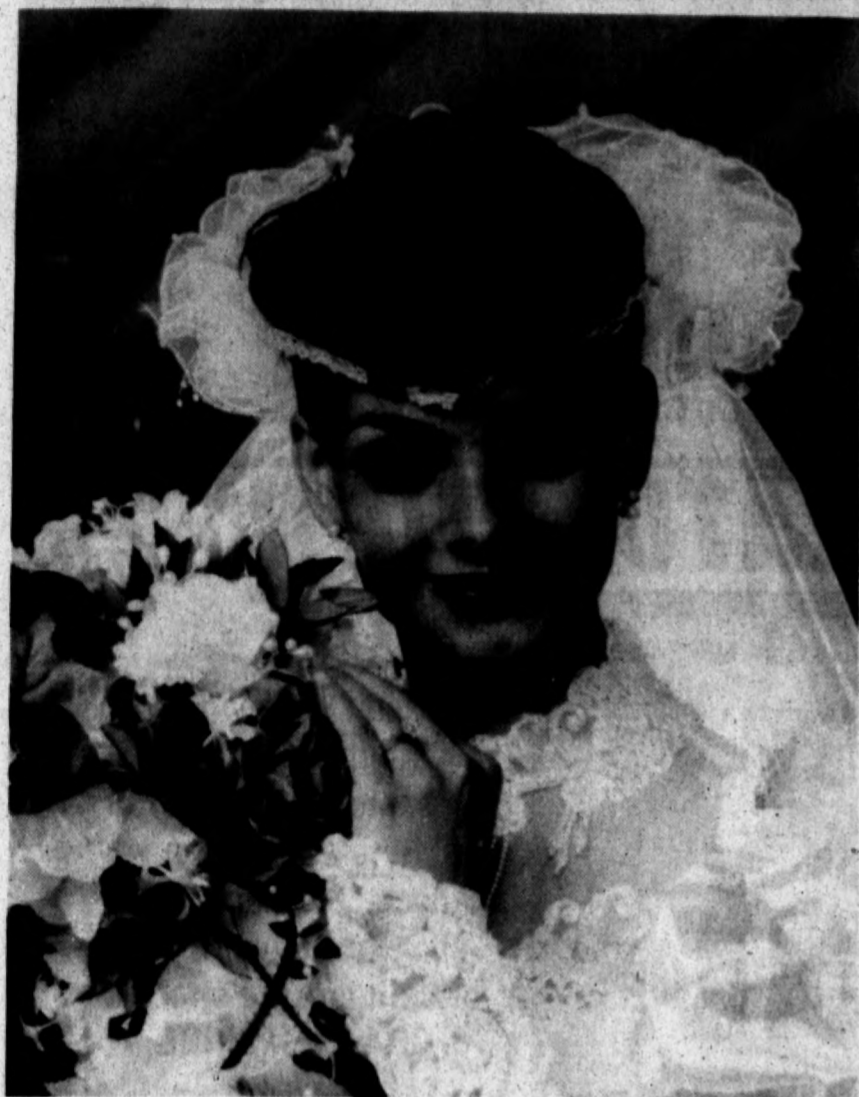

What is psychotherapy?

"Psychotherapy helps people learn to solve their own problems," says Ronald E. Fox, Ph.D., president of the American Psychological Association. Problems with a marriage, a job, the death of a loved one, depression, substance abuse—or just the stresses of daily living—can be treated, and better understood through psychotherapy, according to Dr. Fox.

There are several different types of psychotherapy providers available. Psychologists in independent practice must be licensed or certified by the state in which they practice. Most states require a doctoral degree as a minimum. Psychologists undergo five to seven years of full-time graduate study in mental health and including a one-year residency, plus one year of supervised clinical

experience. They also receive intensive training in diagnostic, assessment and treatment techniques, including individual, child, family and group therapies.

According to the American Psychological Association a recommendation from a friend or relative who has had a successful therapy experience is one way to find a psychotherapist.

Your personal physician or your clergyman may also be able to help. Additionally, a guidance counselor, school psychologist, a local college or university counseling center or your state psychological association may be able to recommend someone. At the very least, the psychotherapist you choose should be licensed or certified by the state in which he or she practices.

— YOUR EYES — SPORTS VISION TESTING

While any basic optometric eye examination will evaluate the health of the eye, check visual acuity and ascertain that two eyes are working well together, there are further areas of concern for the athlete, whether amateur or professional.

For example, a sports vision examination goes beyond reading an eye chart on the wall to determine vision strength when both the eyes and the ball they are following are in motion—a skill called dynamic visual acuity. Further testing can determine the speed and accuracy of the subject's hand-eye coordination and how well peripheral vision is used. With special equipment, the eye doctor can gauge just how well the athlete keeps an eye on the ball.

Once the level of sports vision skills is known, visual training can be utilized to enhance the, helping the athletes to improve their games, and their lives.

There were over 200 children that attended the first activity day. Joe Weaver presented African folk tales which explained why turtles have no hair and why they like to live near water. Next week on June 14, at 10:00 Betty Stephan will be presenting stories from Europe and then the children will be painting clothespin people in a European costume. Remember the library opens at 10:00 am from now until Sept. 1, 1994.

Are you ready for a new book to read? Coming out this week is Tunnel Vision: A V.I. Warshawski Novel by Sara Paretsky. Private investigator Warshawski needs a lucrative case to cover the cost of the many repairs her office building needs, not to mention the unpaid bills that keep mounting up. Instead of a lucrative case, one of her most important clients demands that V.I. find a community service job for his son, in hopes that the young computer hacker can stay out of trouble and out of jail. As if that isn't enough V.I. discovers a homeless family has settled in the basement of her office building. V.I. has an old college flame who directs a charitable organization for the homeless known as Home Free. Help for this family should be as simple as contacting her old group of tradeswomen she discovers they received the same response plus the turnaround. With other pressing business V.I. ignores the Home Free organization until one of its board members is found murdered in her office. As V.I. begins her investigation she discovers a trail that leads to runaways, abused spouses and financial fraud that stretches from Chicago's banks to the halls of Congress.

Jim Bouton's first novel Strike Zone shows an "original coming touch" in his character Sam Ward. It's 1993 and the Chicago Cubs win 10 straight games and are tied with the Phillies. It is the last day of the season and the exhausted pitching staff for the Cubs calls Sam Ward, a 32 year old rookie to pitch the game. This is Sam's chance to start in the big leagues and prove that he can do it, that he isn't a "Baseball bum," and that maybe his wife shouldn't have left him. MINDING YOUR OWN BUSINESS

Don Taylor

COLLECTING

Larry is a successful small business owner whose sales are increasing steadily. In May, he achieved his third record month in a row. Business is booming, but Larry's bank account is empty. Selling is becoming easier, but Larry is slow in collecting the money his credit customers owe him.

Like Larry, most businesses are selling on credit. We're not talking about credit card sales, rather we mean open account, non-secured credit. When you sell on credit it means that you are not only in the selling business, but also in the collection business. This is an area of business that many entrepreneurs struggle with.

Laura is a perfect illustration of this point. Laura runs a very successful service business. She is bright, talented and pleasant.

Her work is excellent, and her prices are reasonable.

Laura came to us for help because she was out of cash. Sales were strong and she had more work than she could do, but she had no cash and couldn't pay some of her suppliers.

The first thing we did was analyze Laura's financial records to see if she had a profitability problem or a cash flow problem. After examining Laura's business records we found that she was generating profit, but she wasn't collecting cash from her customers quickly enough. The result was that Laura was using her available cash to pay the higher variable expenses that come with increased sales. It was a classic cash-flow problem.

Improving Collection

In Laura's case we made several recommendations for improving collection and cash flow. Here are several tips that you can use, too:

- Bill quickly. When Laura landed new clients and got very busy, her billing regularity slipped. Sometimes accounts went along as 45 days without receiving a bill.

- Our experience has been that even your best paying accounts won't pay until they receive a bill. If you're experiencing cash flow problems, we recommend that you send out bills as soon as you complete the work.

- Bill frequently. On jobs where you don't complete the work quickly, make partial billings. Bill on the 15th and the 30th of each month. Billing quickly and more frequently will improve cash flow.

- Bill clearly and accurately. Inaccurate or unclear invoices will always delay your collection process. To ensure clarity, keep bills simple and uncomplicated. Describe each billing item separately.

Check your math. Double-check all figures and calculations. Make certain that all bills are based on accurate charges. You may wish to provide documentation of delivery or services rendered.

- Bill conveniently. Enclose a self-addressed envelope. Make it easy for the person you've billed to pay your bill. Although simple, this technique may move your invoice to the top of the "to be paid" pile.

- Expect prompt payment. Once you've sent an accurate bill, you have a right to expect prompt, timely payment. If you don't receive that payment within a reasonable period, communicate your expectation clearly. Don't delay. Get on the phone and let your customer know that you expect payment.

If you're not going to get paid the sooner you find out the better. You may want to take quick actions such as cancelling further work orders or shipments.

- Follow-up. No one likes to make collection calls. It is stressful. It is not fun. However, there is no fun in not being able to pay your bills either.

When you must make collection calls, get right to the point. Don't beat around the bush and don't apologize for calling. You shouldn't be on the defensive. You have a right to be paid and you need to express it. Follow your call with a short letter confirming your conversation. You'll be pleased with the results.

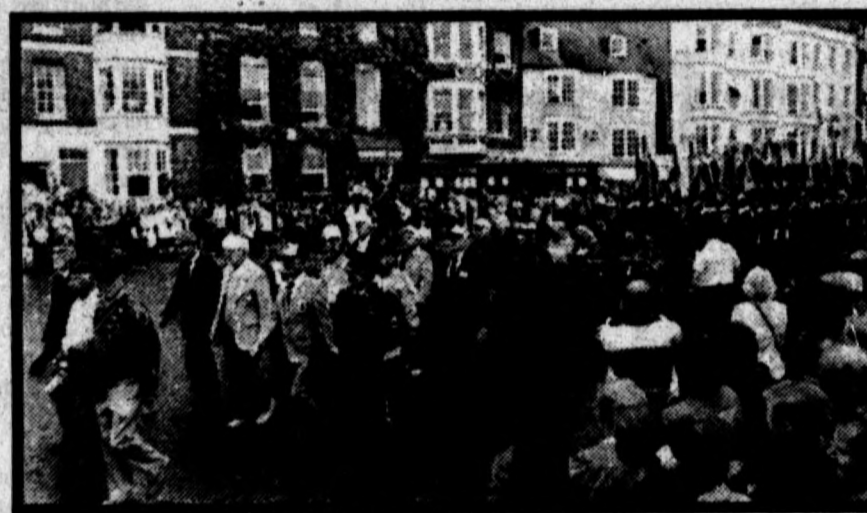

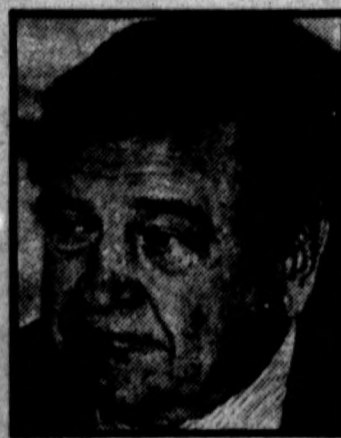

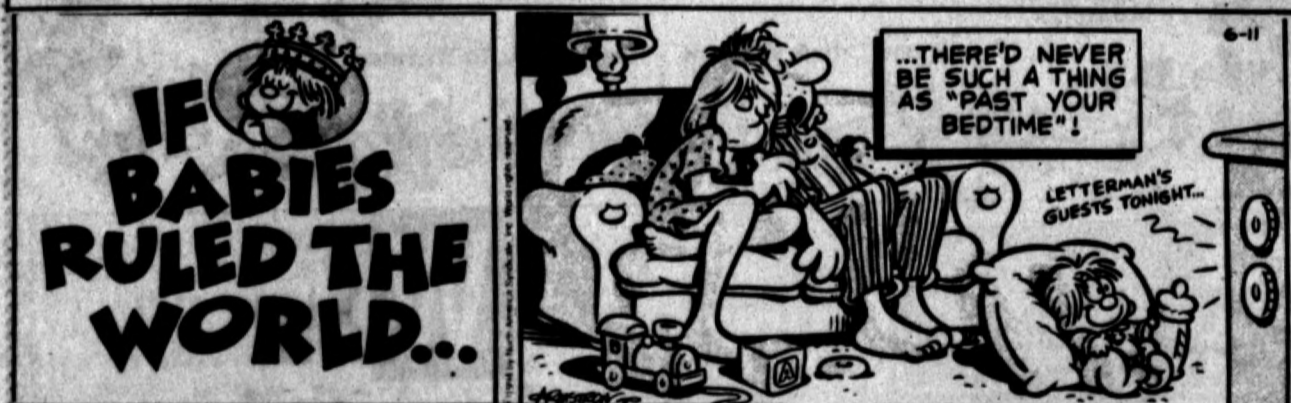

Poet Laureate of Texas takes job seriously

VICTORIA, Texas - For a woman who was once nicknamed "Tex," Mildred Baass, Poet Laureate of Texas, finds it easy to represent the Lone Star State.

However, it wasn't always that way. She tells of a time when she served with the Red Cross in World War II, the only southerner in a "Yankee" unit, and had some trouble performing her Texan duties.

For some reason, everyone in her unit thought she "must have been missing a horse." So, a general got her a horse to ride, but little did he

know that Tex's only contact with horses was seeing tourists ride them in San Antonio's Brackenridge Park. "But I wasn't going to disgrace my state!" she says with conviction. So without an inkling of what she was doing, she hopped on the horse, held her head high, and showed her Texas pride, much like she does when meeting the challenges of her honorary title.

Mrs. Baass, who was appointed 1993-94 poet laureate by a joint committee of the Texas Legislature, has been relentlessly promoting poetry around the state since she was named to her post. It's an honor she

hasn't taken lightly. "I don't want to be a sit-at-home poet laureate," she says. "I want to be a visible, vocal poet laureate." Since her appointment, she has attended monthly meetings of the Poetry Society of Texas and has judged myriad poetry contests.

She and her daughter, Nancy Baass, who has unofficially taken up the post of assistant to the poet laureate, have actively pursued opportunities in which to wave the poetry banner.

Their motto? "Have poem, will travel."

It's a challenging task, since Texas is known more for its rough-and-tumble cowboys than for its budding poets.

"I want to encourage and promote poetry in Texas. We live in a great state that has great diversity. Although our state is known for cowboy poetry, we don't want people to think that's the only poetry in Texas. There are other kinds, too." She makes her own way when it comes to her poet laureate duties, since the Legislature hasn't charged her with a specific agenda.

However, she is determined to make the poet laureateship uniquely her own. "I want the Texas Legislature to know that I haven't taken this honor lightly."

A native of San Antonio, she wrote her first poem when she was 10 years old. It was about her mother, and she can still recite it.

"I was proud of that poem," she says. It's that pride that fuels her energy, especially her pride in Texas, love of country and family, and appreciation of nature.

Her first poem was printed in the publication, "The Rectangle." She submitted it while she was attending our Lady of the Lake University in San Antonio, with encouragement from a teacher she remembers only as Sister Angelica. She also contributed poems regularly to the college quarterly, on which she served as editor.

Although she earned a teaching certificate, she found herself without a teaching position after graduation and took a summer job proofreading a novel for a doctor at the downtown Medical Arts Building.

The doctor eventually joined the Army, and she filled a civil service position at Fort Sam Houston. However, like many young people during World War II, she found herself searching for a purpose. She ended up "patriotically resigning" her post and joined the Red Cross. She was assigned to the 81st

Station Hospital in Italy, where she was given her nickname. Soldiers from her home state sought out - and managed to find - this girl called "Tex," and she wrote home so her mother would be sure to send her anything Texan.

One of her most vivid World War II memories was made during a stop in Rome, where she was part of a mostly male audience gathered to hear Pope Pius XII.

She must have stood out like a sore thumb, because the pope stopped to ask about her Red Cross uniform and also inquired where she was from.

A confirmed "big Catholic," she was awed. With trembling hands, she lifted her dog tags and said, "Please bless these."

She met her husband, Alfred C. Baass, in college. He attended St. Mary's University, and she'd met him at various social events. He became a lawyer. She served as her husband's legal secretary throughout his career. He was the county's only justice of the peace for many years.

As she raised daughters Carol and Nancy, she continued writing poetry. She read Mother Goose rhymes to her daughters but eventually had to write her own children's poems to keep up with her children's voracious appetite

for stories. Although she continued writing poetry when she was raising her family, she didn't pursue it as vigorously as she would later in life. Her husband was the one who later encouraged her to focus on her art.

She's involved with the Poetry Society of Texas, a member of the National Federation of State Poetry Societies, and serves on the board of directors for A Galaxy of Verse Literary Foundation. She has received numerous awards in contests sponsored by these organizations.

Her work has been published in numerous anthologies, magazines and books. In addition to her book, "Mythology in Verse," she is co-author of "Poetry Keys to the Open Door" and "Listen to Texas."

Her poetry spawned a three-year drive to attain her the poet laureateship, an honorary title which was established in Texas in 1932 but which hadn't been filled in five years.

Her poetry isn't just a hobby, it's a passion. Not only does she have yellow writing pads placed in strategic areas of her house, but says daughter Nancy, "She keeps a clipboard by the bed and will write down things that come to her."

Monkey brings life to nursing home resident

HARLINGEN - Like a queen on a mobile throne, Ninfa Castaneda rolled down the white hallway in her best flowered dress, as a chattering monkey darted from her feet to her shoulders and groomed her thick hair.

When the 55-year-old woman moved to Retama Manor Nursing Center because of muscular dystrophy, nurses noticed "something missing from her life," said Donice Holmes, director of nurses. "She had no desire whatsoever. She was so sad all the time," Holmes said.

Then Lacy showed up, a baby pigtail macaque - a monkey that leaps around like a hyperactive kitten with opposable thumbs.

"I treat her like a human being, like a human baby," said Ms. Castaneda, a resident at the Harlingen nursing home since August.

"Since I've never been married, I didn't have kids. I thought, 'Oh, I wish this could be my baby.' That's

why I love her a lot and I protect her. I don't like nobody to get her upset." For nurse Elaine Bennett, the monkey solution was obvious.

Over the past 16 years, Bennett and her husband have collected 70 monkeys and 14 chimps that they keep on a six-acre sanctuary near La Feria.

The monkeys came from zoos, exotic animal auctions and pet owners who discovered that cute baby apes don't always become cute adults.

"They can't buy it a car when it's 16, so they can't stand it any more and they bring it to me," said Bennett, Retama Manor's in-service director.

She brings as many as four of her monkeys at a time for the nursing home's patients.

In the absence of family members, Ms. Castaneda and her tiny ape companion have learned to depend on one another for small but significant things.

Lacy sometimes pounces at strangers' legs to protect Ms.

Castaneda and knows how to push a button near the bed to call a nurse. She also knows how to turn on the electric wheelchair and at mealtime brings a straw for Ms. Castaneda's juice. For an apple left on the bedroom dresser, the monkey thanks Ms. Castaneda with a kiss on the cheek.

Health care workers call the relationship pet therapy. "Because the patients can touch and hold and caress them, there's just a magic touch that is missing from the elderly and the sick sometimes," Holmes said.

The nursing home has used dogs and rabbits, but none can match the monkey's ability to take and return affection, she said.

"She brought me joy, happiness and she makes me feel like I have somebody to love me," Ms. Castaneda said.

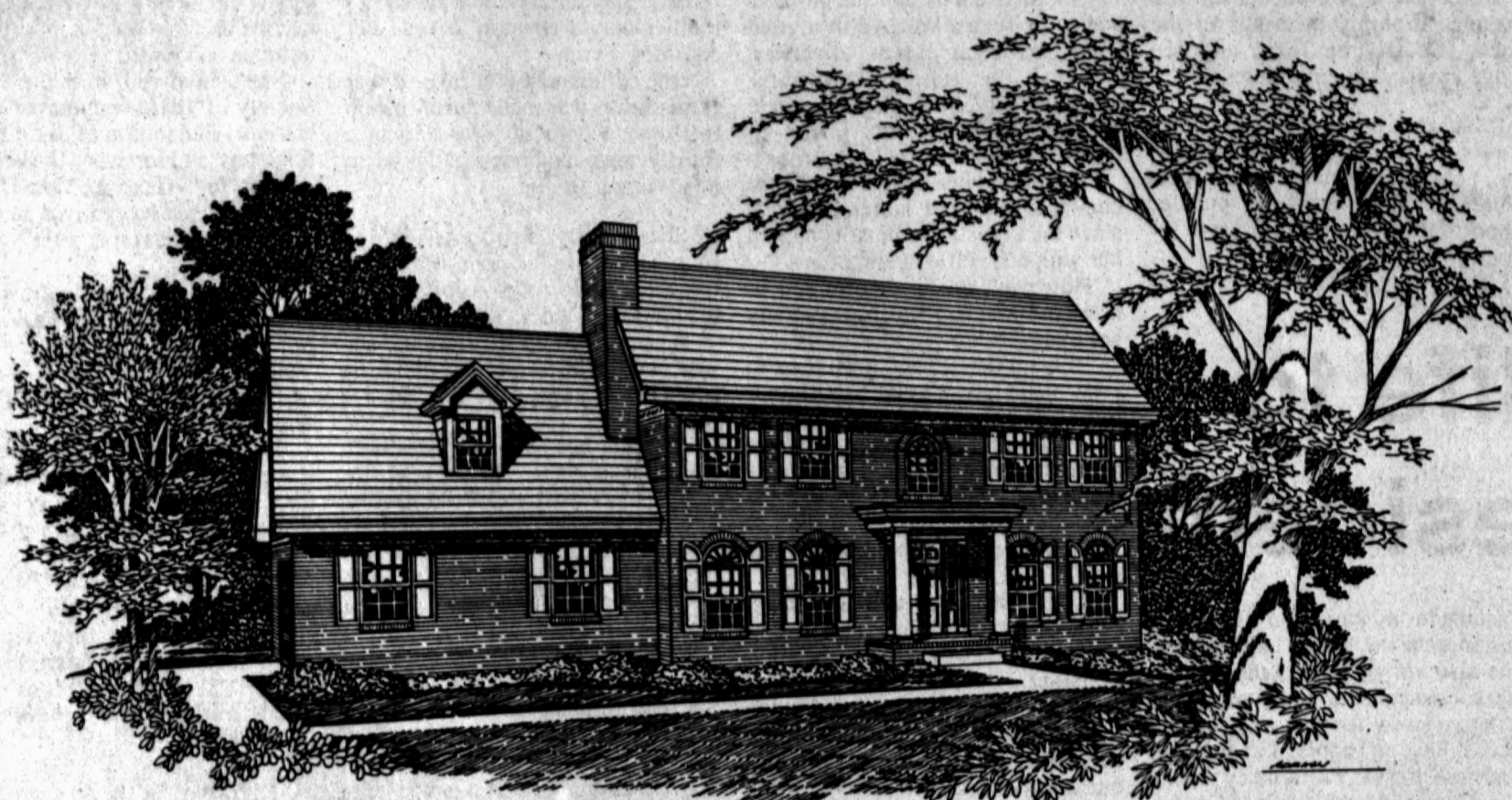

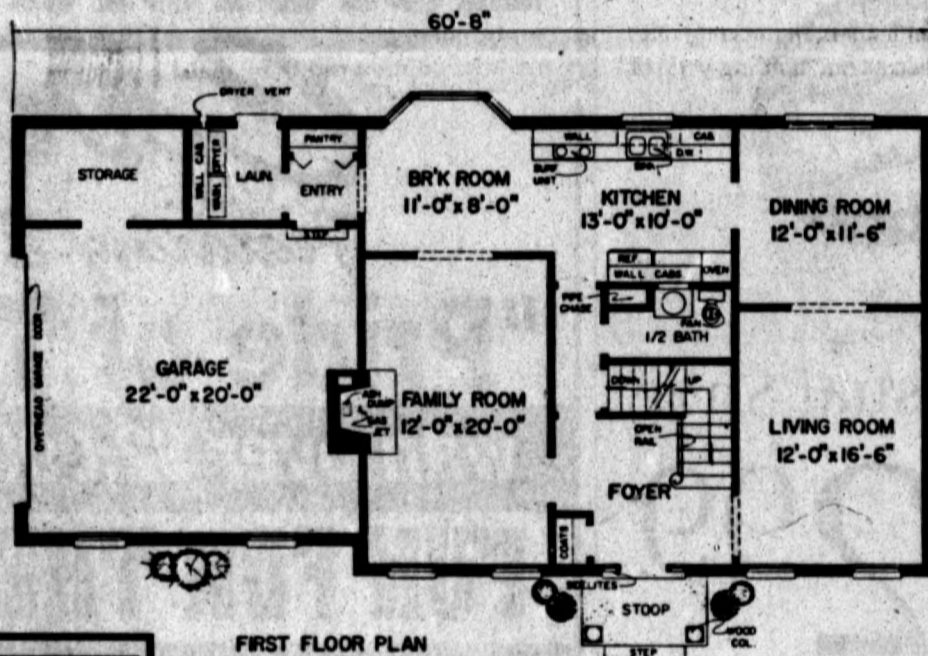
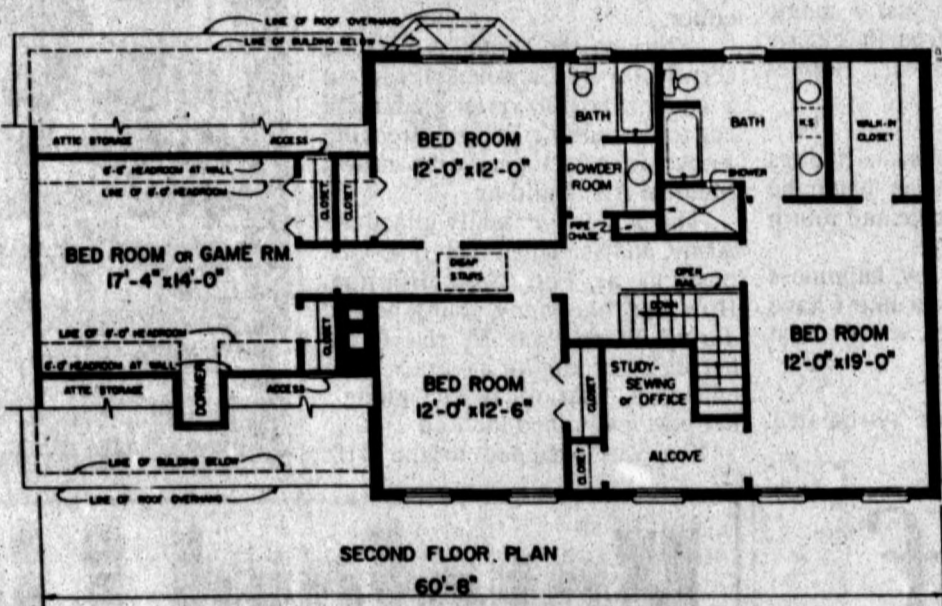

Q: I was wondering if you have a solution to my problem. A leaky roof left water spots on my bedroom ceiling. I have had the roof fixed, and I have tried to paint over the spots, but they just show through.

A: There are a number of products on the market that will solve your problem. They are available at hardware stores, paint stores and home centers, and are referred to as water stain blockers or sealers (also

called stain-blocking primers and stain-blocking sealers).

The stain-blocking sealer-primer is applied to the ceiling with a brush or roller, or it is sprayed on (it's available in aerosol cans). After the sealer-primer is dry, paint the ceiling.

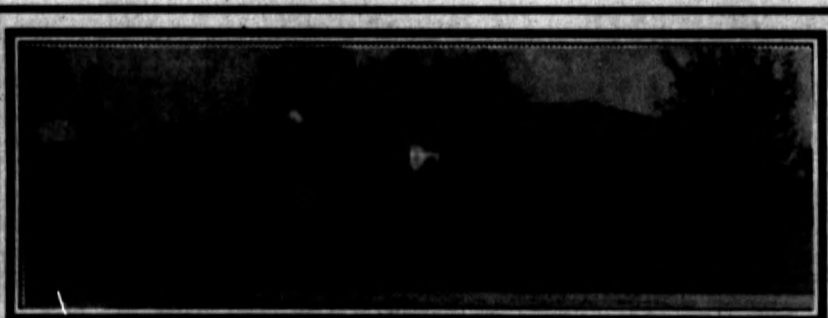

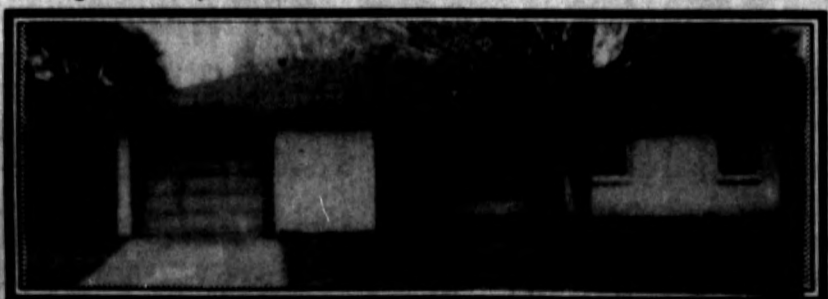

Use for sorghum residue studied Baylor report promotes cardboard manufacturing

AUSTIN - Paper manufacturing is normally considered a Southeastern United States and East Texas industry, but facility that manufactures cardboard box paper from sorghum stalk residue could boost farmers' incomes and create jobs in the High Plains.

A Baylor University study was conducted on the subject. Funding for the study came, in part, from the Texas Department of Agriculture. Grant funds also were provided by the Texas Grain Sorghum Association, Deaf Smith County Chamber of Commerce and Ken Rogers, Hereford agribusinessman.

"We're convinced it's really economically viable," said Patrick Odell, a mathematics professor at Baylor, who has conducted two studies on grain sorghum paper production. "In fact, it's economically desirable."

Sorghum residue can be used to make all types of paper, but according to Odell's 1993 study, the most economical production in the High Plains would involve a company that produces corrugated medium and liner board.

Corrugated medium is the fluted

paper between the top and bottom liner board used to make cardboard boxes.

The plant would cost about \$25 million to establish and would create at least 94 jobs. Odell estimates that farmers could earn as much as \$40 a ton for stalk residue that now is either burned, plowed back into the soil or used for animal feed and bedding.

"Finding new uses for agricultural products is one way we are going to keep Texas farmers and ranchers in business," said Texas Agriculture Commissioner Rick Perry.

"Making paper out of sorghum residue clearly will boost farmers' incomes and provide manufacturers with an alternative source for paper pulp."

Odell's study also found that a "thermomechanical" method would minimize chemicals needed to extract pulp from grain sorghum stalks. This method involves heating and grinding sorghum residue to separate pulp fibers needed to produce paper.

A small amount of ammonia can be used in the thermomechanical method, so that the waste from the pulping process can be applied as

fertilizer to crops. Ammonia is a basic component in fertilizers.

Odell's study was funded by a \$7,500 matching grant from TDA's Texas Agricultural Diversification Program. The program is designed to help diversify Texas agriculture by providing money to help transfer newly developed agricultural crops and techniques to the marketplace

through agricultural research and innovation, business assistance and small business incubators.

The program also supports projects that enable Texas agricultural products to replace those being imported, demonstrate new and efficient farming practices involving conservation and assist rural business incubators.

Dairy farmers brace for milk price drop

WASHINGTON (AP) - The nation's dairy farmers are bracing for a steep drop in milk prices this month, but don't expect the decrease to show up at the dairy counter.

Prices paid to farmers are falling, in part because they had risen unexpectedly earlier this year. And more cows are producing more milk.

Why? Well, Midwestern farmers didn't cut back on their herds as much as expected. And nice spring weather made cows more contented, and more productive, than usual.

Then there's a little extra push to the market from a genetically engineered hormone, recombinant bovine somatotropin, that came on the market in February.

Even though dairy farmers will feel the decrease, shoppers may notice little. Retailers simply don't pass their lower milk costs on to consumers as quickly as they do price increases, the Agriculture Department says.

"It's far more typical for a retailer in a period of declining wholesale prices to just hold the retail price steady, or maybe to run a special," said Andrew Novakovic, chairman of the Department of Agricultural Research and Managerial Economics at Cornell University.

As a whole, dairy prices have been rising at about half the rate of other food prices in the last 10 years.

Besides, farmer prices account for about a third of what consumers pay for dairy products, the Agriculture Department says. For milk, the farmer share is slightly higher - about

42 cents out of each dollar the shopper spends.

But the milk industry and dairy state lawmakers say another consumer cost may come sooner: The government may soon be buying more surplus milk because wholesale prices are getting so low.

The industry and its congressional supporters want the Agriculture Department to make advance purchases of dairy food for schools and nutrition program, step up export subsidies and use more dairy products in foreign aid.

Members of the National Milk Producers Federation, which represents dairy cooperatives, planned to meet with Agriculture Secretary Mike Espy today.

Economists such as Novakovic at Cornell say government intervention would help for a while, but "those kinds of activities are not large enough to completely forestall some kind of drop in price."

"I think the basic fundamentals of the marketplace as we look out over the next few years suggest we're in a period where prices are going to be at best stable and more likely trend downward, which is what they've been doing since the early 1980s," he said.

Simply put, there aren't enough milk drinkers, butter spreaders and even pizza munchers to keep up with what dairy farmers in this country can produce. And global competition is so fierce that trade pacts, such as the recent General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, offer little help.

Although no one is making comparisons yet, the last tumble cost the CCC \$840 million in 1991.

CORN

Corn ranked second only to cotton in production value among Texas crops in 1993. Texas producers harvested 213 million bushels last year, up from 203 million the year before. The top-producing corn counties in Texas are in the Panhandle, where much of the land is irrigated. Most of the corn in Texas is grown as feed for livestock.

Beef Council votes funding for programs

Programs to promote additional beef consumption in coming months will be funded by a \$300,000 allocation made by the Texas Beef Council's board of directors.

The beef checkoff dollars will come from other budgeted programs and from higher-than-expected checkoff revenues for 1993-1994.

The action by the board was prompted by a need to move a huge amount of beef in the marketplace, a situation that is depressing prices of live cattle.

The board emphasized that the measures complement a number of proactive measures on the national level to help reduce the current oversupply situation.

Harian Huffman of McGregor, chairman of the TBC board, said that even though the checkoff was not meant to be a bandage when prices are hurting, existing programs can be supplemented, extended or redirected to increase consumer awareness of beef during times of price declines.

"The diverted funds will extend radio buys and consumer access to beef cooking ideas," said Huffman. "Our goal is to increase the servings of beef within Texas by 680,000 per week."

Farms, ranches provide work for 2.92 million

WASHINGTON (AP) - There were 2.92 million people working on U.S. farms and ranches during the week of April 10, compared with 2.88 million during the April 1993 survey week.

Self-employed farm operators accounted for 1.42 million of the total, along with 456,000 unpaid workers, and 803,000 workers hired directly by farm operators.

Agricultural service employees working on farms and ranches made up the remaining 240,000 workers. Farm operators paid their hired workers an average wage of \$6.42 per hour during the April 1994 survey week. This rate was up five cents from a year earlier.

Benefits, such as housing and meals, were provided to 42 percent of the hired workers during the survey week, compared to 44 percent in April 1993.

eat approximately 6.8 million additional servings of beef. Overall, these increases will affect cattle prices by less than \$1 per head, but the board also felt the promotion will contribute to further meal increases in the fall.

USDA survey being taken during June

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Agriculture Department is surveying the nation's farms and ranches during the first half of June.

The survey is the largest in a series conducted throughout the agricultural season to determine crop production and stocks, and livestock inventories.

"This year's June survey is particularly important because it follows last year's flooding in the Midwest and drought in the Southeast," said Fred Vogel, head of the service's Estimates Division.

"It will provide the first clear indications of acreage planted and potential production of major crops for 1994," he said.

About 125,000 farmers and ranchers will be contacted to provide the information needed to make state, regional and national estimates of crop acreage planted, grain in storage, and cattle and hog inventories. Local interviewers trained by the service will conduct the survey with personal or telephone interviews.

The survey will provide producers with hard information about the outlook for crop supplies and livestock marketing.

Also, in deliberations on the North American Free Trade Agreement and the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, "the survey information has been used to assess where the United States stands in relation to other countries in production and stocks of major commodities."

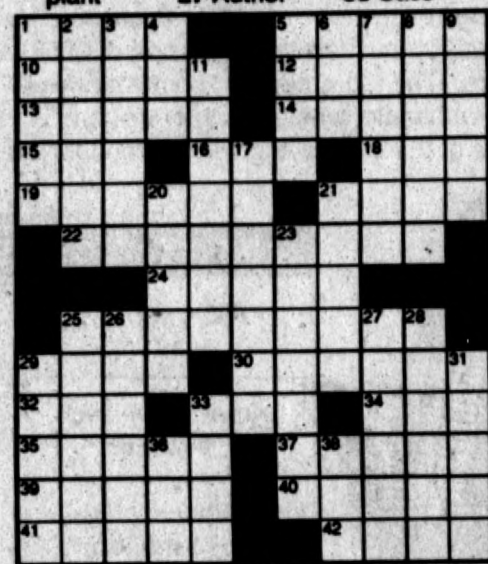

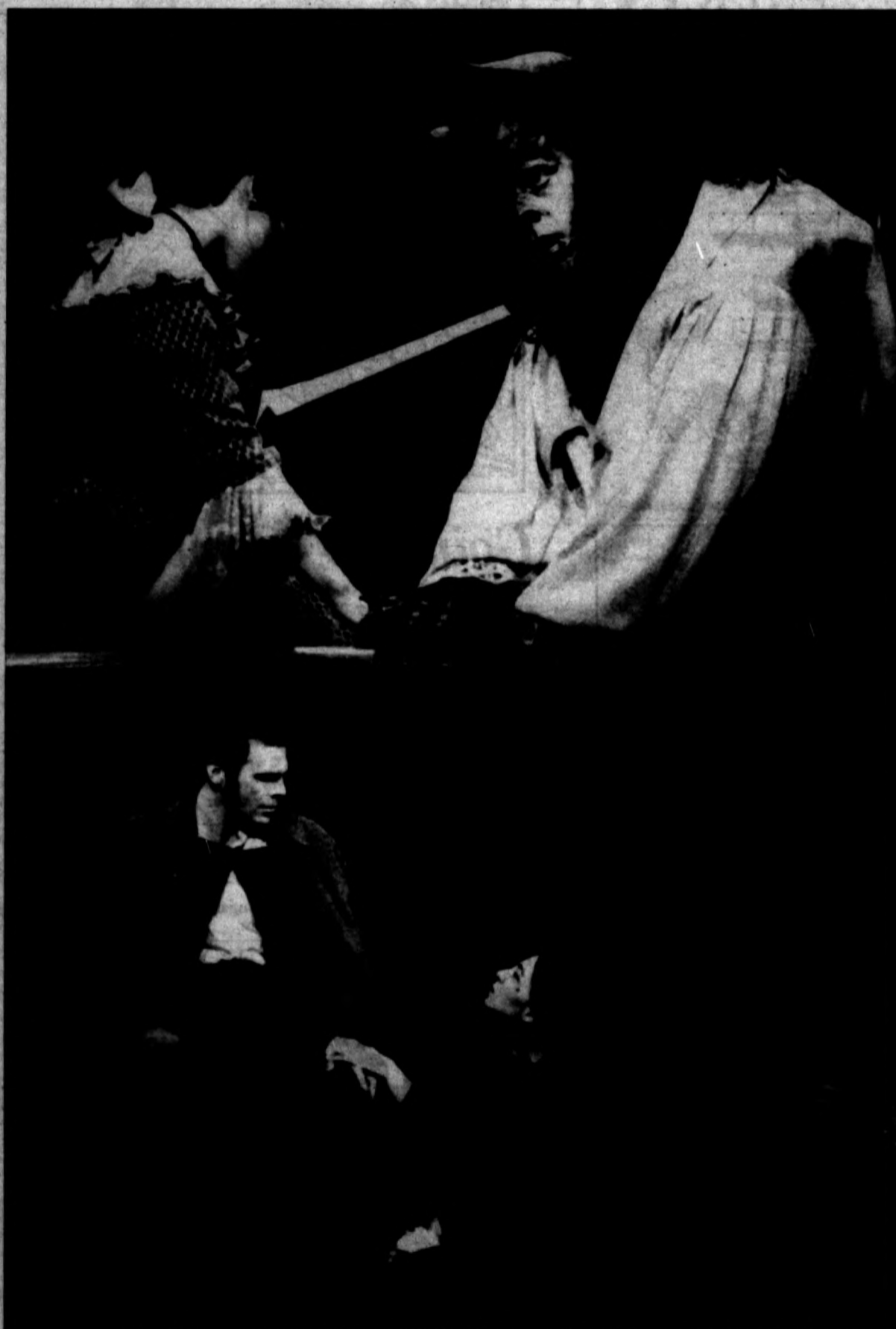

CBS presents the American Theatre Wing's 1994 Antoinette Perry Awards, or, more succinctly, "The Tony Awards," on Sunday, June 12.

Sir Anthony Hopkins and Amy Irving will serve as hosts for the extravaganza, which will present awards in 20 categories, from best play and best musical to best lighting design, scenic design and choreography.

Hopkins, a great lover of the theater, admits to not having seen as many Broadway plays as he'd like to have this past year.

"I went to see 'Timon of Athens,' with (best performance by a leading actor in a play nominee) Brian Bedford, last December. That was great, I really enjoyed that. But I haven't ... you see, I don't get to New York that often, and when I am, it's always a trip passing through.

"But when I do get to stay any length of time, I go and I see as many plays as I can. I can always remember my first Broadway play. It was in 1983 and I saw 'That Championship Season,' which I thought was just terrific."

The other nominees for best performance by a leading actor in a play include Christopher Plummer, for his role in "No Man's Land," Stephen Spinella for "Angels in America: Perestroika" and Sam Waterston for "Abe Lincoln in Illinois."

The musical "Passion" received the most nominations with 10 including best musical, best original score (Stephen Sondheim), both best performance awards for a leading actor and leading actress in a musical (Jere Shea and Donna Murphy) and featured actor and actress in a musical (Tim Al-dredge and Marin Mazzie).

"She Loves Me" and Disney's "Beauty and the Beast" trail "Passion" with nine nominations each.

The award program's host, Hopkins,

is preparing to re-enter the world of theater, following a five-year absence from the stage since appearing in a 1989 London production of "M. Butterfly."

"I haven't done that much stage over the last few years," Hopkins states. "I enjoyed working in the theater, but it's the long runs that get to me.

"I'm working in the theater here in England soon. I'm directing and playing in (an adaptation of) Chekov's 'Uncle Vanya.' Now it's going to be called 'Scenes From a Country Life.' It's a very, very good script, written by Julian Mitchell. It's got Kate Burton in it, Richard's daughter. I'm looking forward to going back."

This October, the Academy Award winner will appear in two feature films, "The Road to Wellville" directed by Alan Parker, with Matthew Broderick and Bridget Fonda, and "Legends of the Fall," a Western with Brad Pitt ("Nice fellow," Hopkins adds, "I liked working with him.")

Hopkins admits to having little knowledge of any proposed sequel to the immensely successful "Silence of the Lambs."

"It's a mystery," he states. "I don't think it's even been written yet. I asked Jonathan (Demme) about a sequel and he said 'Nobody seems to know.' So, I don't know. It's academic really, now."

And what would it take to lure the highly cinematically successful Hopkins back to those "long runs" of the stage?

"I don't know how to answer that," Hopkins says. "It depends what comes along. 'Equus,' that was terrific. I had a great time on that. I did a play here in London called 'Pravda,' years ago. If a really great play comes along, of course I'd do it again."

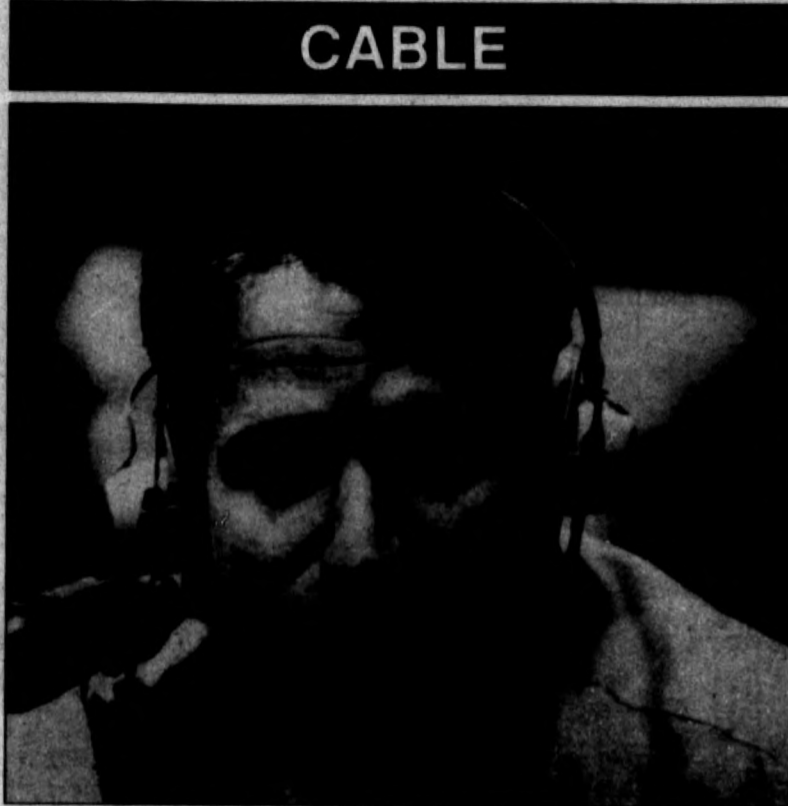

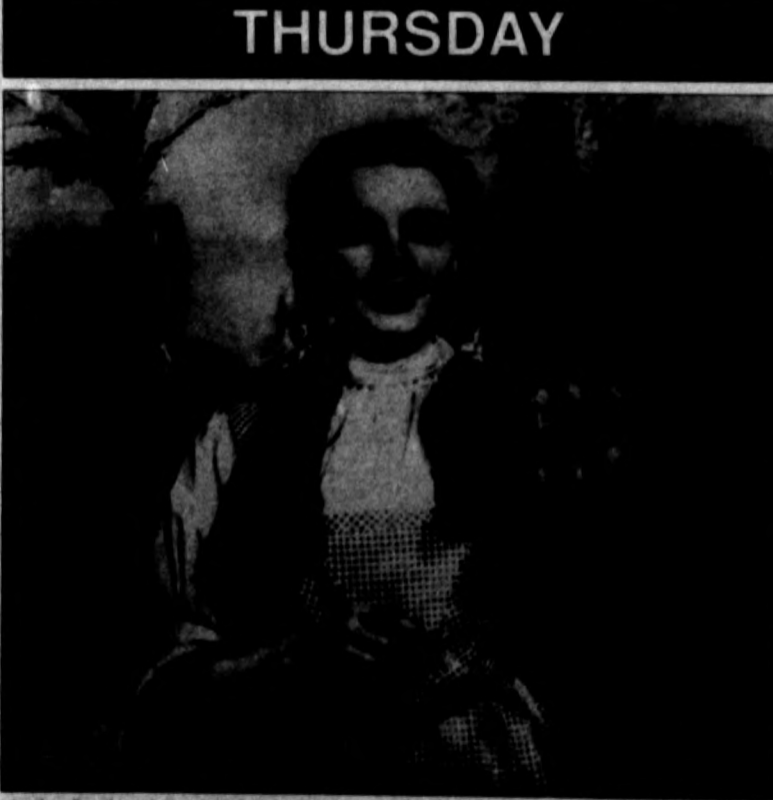

"Dead At 21"

MTV's first dramatic series

LOS ANGELES (AP) - MTV is coming of age with "Dead at 21," its first dramatic series. Sounds gloomy, but the video music channel believes viewers will still hum along. "Dead," about a 20-year-old trying to unravel a nefarious government plot that threatens his

life, won't lack for MTV trademarks, and that includes "wall-to-wall" music, says MTV executive Joe Davola.

"I think the soundtracking is something you wouldn't get in network TV at all," Davola says. "It will be the best soundtrack in television because of our relationship with the record companies. 'Music drives the storyline through.'"

"Dead" debuts this week in its 10 p.m. EDT Wednesday time slot.

The first episode's songs include "Man in the Box" from Alice in Chains; "Creep" by Radiohead; "Sex Type Thing" by Stone Temple Pilots and Nirvana's "Come as You Are."

The look, as well as the sound, will be pure MTV: "A lot of hand-held (camera) shots, lots of angles, lot of quick-cutting," says Davola, senior vice president of MTV Productions-MTV Development.

But "Dead at 21" isn't tossing away all convention. There is a plot.

In fact, the series has the ring of TV tradition, invoking elements of "The Fugitive," "Run for Your Life," "The Twilight Zone" and even this season's cult hit, Fox's "The X-Files."

"Dead at 21" stars Jack Noseworthy as Ed, a college student who is in for a shock at his 20th birthday party: He discovers that he's the product of a now-defunct federal experiment.

His parents aren't his parents. His brain is implanted with a microchip intended to boost the brain power of American youth. And at 21, the wild dreams the imperfect chip produces will cause him to self-destruct.

Ed goes on the run when he is framed for murder by a rogue federal agent. The youth has one year to find the scientist, Victor Heisenberg, behind the experiment and save himself.

With the help of new-found friend Maria (Lisa Dean Ryan), he's also fending off the assassination-minded agent.

But the series will venture beyond its central theme, just as another cat-and-mouse drama, "The Fugitive," did in the 1960s.

"There are stories that sometimes touch on the chip, touch on the search for Heisenberg," Davola says. "But

sometimes the series just deals with the story of Ed and Maria falling into a town and how they affect people's lives."

Davola thinks "Dead" has what it takes to satisfy MTV's 18-to-34 target audience, including a youthful hero, surreal science fiction and a skittish paranoia about the world in general.

But don't expect glorification of so-called Generation X, the slacker culture, he says. The series trades on more traditional youthful angst.

"I don't this tips into any sort of slackerism, if that's a word," he says. "I think this tips more into ... when you're in your late teens, or even older, you don't trust authority," he says.

"I think there're points in your life when you're not getting along with your parents. Sometimes you fantasize, 'Was I adopted? Was I not my parents' son?'"

Get out your handkerchiefs - lots of them - before watching teary fantasy 'Heart and Souls'

"Heart and Souls," the romantic fantasy starring Robert Downey Jr., looked like a sure thing before it opened in theaters last year. It had a strong cast, an imaginative script and, above all, frequent opportunities for sentimental moviegoers to empty their tear ducts.

Unaccountably, it was stiffed at the box office, lasting less than a month in many cities. Thanks to its recent release by MCA/Universal Home Video, audiences have a second chance to discover a sweet little movie that deserved a better reception.

On a night in 1959, four people perish in a bus crash. Death leaves each of them with unresolved issues. Julia (Kyra Sedgwick from "Singles") was facing a difficult choice between love and career. Penny (Alfre Woodard) was leaving two orphan children behind. Aspiring singer Harrison (Charles Grodin) was desperately seeking relief from his crippling stage fright. And petty thief Milo (Tom

Sizemore) was losing a chance to correct a crime that was haunting him.

Through a cosmic fluke, their four souls are attached to an infant who is born at the moment of their deaths. Years later, as an adult, Thomas Reilly (Downey) discovers that he alone has the power to help his spirit friends resolve their unfinished business.

As each member of the ghostly quartet is freed from his or her earthly bond, the movie dishes up a tearjerking farewell scene, punctuated by Marc Shaiman's heart-on-the-sleeve score. To call this music "schmalzy" is like describing the Pacific Ocean as "damp," but it is undeniably effective.

After awhile, however, more cynical viewers may feel blatantly manipulated: Think of Dorothy Gale bidding farewell to her Oz friends, multiply its intensity by four, and you'll get the general idea.

Still, "Heart and Souls" is easily worth an evening's rental. Its cast is exceptional and there's enough honest laughter to cut through the tears.

can't trust anybody over 30... I think everybody can relate to the insecurities of growing up."

MTV is breaking one more series convention with "Dead," which is a half-hour, a length usually reserved for sitcoms.

That, again, is a function of knowing the MTV audience: "Attention span," Davola says, by way of explanation.

"People who watch MTV have been growing up on it," he says. "Look at the way the (music) videos tell a story in three minutes. Some of these things people view as epics; you can get a lot of story in a three-minute video."

Production costs and the crowded TV environment also led to the 30-minute format.

"You arm somebody with a remote control, and give them choices of 60 to 70 channels, and they're going to

be flipping all over the place," Davola says. And younger people "are more savvy about that kind of thing."

Shorter isn't necessarily a drawback, he contends. The quick storytelling pace leaves no room for the "filler" that Davola contends pads weaker dramas.

"We wanted to have no fat, just meat," he says.

But will his audience sit still for a show that, in MTV measurements, is a daunting 10 times the typical three-minute video?

"I think so," he says. "I hope so." And just why is the music channel getting into the series business?

"MTV's evolved over the last 13 years," he says. "We tried everything else. We've done the game show, we did a talk show this year, 'The Jon Stewart Show,' we did a sketch show. We just figured it's the next step."
