## New fire truck arrives, gets baptism at blazes

Several months ago, a Hereford Fire Department truck was destroyed while trying to extinguish a fire east of town.

On Saturday, the brand new replacement truck arrived in town.

After installation of local equipment -- hoses, oxygen tanks, a radio and other items -- the fire station was placed in service at 3 p.m. Tuesday.

"We filled it up with fuel, backed it in, had the radio in it, everything" at 3 p.m., said Fire Marshal Jay Spain.

He and other workers installed the air tanks on the vehicle, then retired to the kitchen for a cup of coffee.

Minutes later, the truck was racing toward its first of four calls in the first hours of service.

By the end of the night, the truck had responded to one structure fire, a car fire, two grass fires, then returned to the structure fire, racking up 5.1 hours of service the first day.

The truck was built by W.S. Darley and Co., a Melrose, Ill.-based company, at its Chippewa Falls, Wis., plant.

It was ordered using a combination of city, county and insurance money after the previous Booster 3 was destroyed in a fire on April 19.

In that incident, firefighters Bill Watts and J.O. Walls suffered smoke inhalation after Booster 3 and other local and area units responded to a fire near Dawn that started in a car traveling on U.S. 60 and quickly spread to nearby fields.

Booster 3 was driving through the

fire area putting out flames when the intense heat of the blaze caused the engine to die. When flames threatened the men, they used the water in the truck to fight the fire around them, then ran for safety after running out of water.

The truck was a total loss, although some hoses and other equipment on board were salvaged.

The new truck was bought on a bid of \$56,400, although some money above that was provided by the fire department.

City insurance paid \$23,000 of that cost. In addition, \$13,000 that was paid to the landowner by the insurance company of the car that started the fire was given to the city for the truck.

Finally, the remaining \$20,400 was split between the city and the county.

As a result, the volunteer department now owns a 1994 GMC truck that has a 750-gallon tank on back.

It is, said Spain, a medium-size booster truck.

The manufacturers put larger tires on the truck than originally supplied, to raise the vehicle up for use on grass fire situations.

The new truck, Spain said, gives the department a fleet that is comprised of three boosters, three engines, one rescue vehicle, two Suburbans for transporting firefighters, and a 5,000-gallon tanker truck. In addition, a pickup has been outfitted with a 200-gallon tank and was used as a substitute Booster truck before the new one arrived.

Finally, the department was recently given an old U.S. Forest

Service truck and two large water tanks that firefighters are currently working on to transform into a "Bigfoot" booster truck. That will be used solely on county grass fires.

"It'll be a county fire truck -- mainly big grass fires," Spain said. It will be used on rough range land and in bad weather, places where its all-wheel drive and high body will be best used.

However, "It'll take us a while to get it like we want it," Spain said, adding that volunteers are working on the truck as they are able.

Although the department has a new truck, Spain said there will still be a need for the backup pickup for a while.

"We've been so short on trucks we haven't had time to work on them," he said.

So, on Monday Booster 1 will go into the body shop to repair damage caused when Watts ran into the truck with his pickup while trying to get to the station on a fire call.

After that, Booster 1 and Booster 2 are in for stays at the mechanic, where routine maintenance that has been postponed will be performed.

Spain said the department as a whole is very fortunate to be in the position it is today -- with good equipment, of which the oldest is a 1970 American La France truck used rarely as an in-town engine.

"We have one of the finest fire departments in the state and one of the reasons is the type of people we have in this department," Spain said, as well as "the backing from the City Commission, the County Commission and the citizens of Deaf Smith County. As long as they continue to back us, we will continue to be one of the best

## 222nd District Court gets program grant

A grant of \$49,695 has been awarded to continue the Community Service Restitution Program in the 222nd Judicial District Community Supervision and Corrections Department.

Funding for the program began four years ago with a grant of approximately \$6,000. In fiscal year 1994 the amount was the same as the \$49,695 announced for the 1993 fiscal year.

The 222nd District covers Deaf Smith and Oldham Counties.

Larry Sheffield, community corrections director, said the program is expected to experience more growth in the next year because of a law that recently became effective. "All offenders will be assigned to community service, now," said Sheffield.

The funds from the Texas Department of Criminal Justice provide two staff positions, now held

by Kathy Moore, CSR manager, and Jennifer Eggen, officer, as well as support such as computer equipment and office supplies.

Purpose of CSR is to provide an alternative to jail, assisting offenders in efforts to rehabilitate themselves. Additionally, the community benefits from the service.

Sheffield reported that approximately 70 agencies and Hereford, Vega, Dimmitt and Friona work with CSR. Nursing homes, school districts and many county and city offices receive the benefits of the program.

In the fiscal year just ended, courts ordered 24,937 hours of community service. A total of 22,393 hours were completed by 379 offenders participating in the program.

Local agencies saved an estimated \$111,967 through the CSR hours. The amount is based on \$5 per hour of service.

## 'Victim' changes story

HOUSTON (AP) - In a case that already has dozens of bizarre turns, a woman who claimed the identity of a Henry Lee Lucas murder victim now says she invented the story.

The reversal Tuesday from a woman who said she was Frieda "Becky" Powell even duped Lucas' own attorney, Vic Fezell, who has been critical of the way Texas authorities investigated the claims Lucas killed hundreds of people a decade ago.

Like Phyllis Wilcox, who claimed to be Becky Powell, Lucas has recanted all of the slayings.

"She cried and admitted to me that she is not Becky Powell, that she is Phyllis Wilcox and that this whole thing was fabricated by her," Fezell said.

"I now understand how easy it is to be misled when you are dealing with these Henry Lucas cases. I understand now how it could have happened to the Texas Rangers... Now I feel I owe them an apology."

Fezell said the woman invented the scheme because she was in love with Lucas, 58, a one-eyed drifter on Texas' death row.

"I know I have done something terribly wrong," Ms. Wilcox told KVVU-TV in Austin on Tuesday.

Fezell, a former district attorney in Waco, had said Monday he was convinced the woman really was Ms. Powell.

"Vic Fezell is getting done to him what he was trying to prove was done to the Rangers," said Wise County Sheriff Phil Ryan, who investigated the Lucas confessions and murders when he worked as a Texas Ranger.

Ryan said he wasn't surprised the woman who contended she was Ms. Powell turned out to be a fake.

"Man, oh man," Ryan said. "It's just because the way Henry is and the kind of people that surround him. It's just a circus that won't leave town."

Lucas has been convicted of 13 murders in Texas and Florida, including that of Powell, 15. He once confessed to killing her, then said he did not.

Remains identified as hers were found in a field off Interstate 35 in Denton, north of Dallas, in 1982. Lucas was convicted of her murder

two years later.

The woman who said she was Ms. Powell and had been living in Missouri for the past 12 years contended she was with Lucas in Florida on Halloween night in 1979, giving him an alibi in a murder that landed him on death row.

Lucas once claimed involvement in more than 360 murders nationwide but now claims to have killed only his mother in Michigan in 1961.

## Fundraising drive shows slow start

Wes Klett tried to be positive at the first United Way of Deaf Smith County fundraising report luncheon, but with less than 20 percent of the \$150,000 goal in hand, he was having trouble finding some inspiration to give volunteers and board members.

The luncheon was held at fresco in the grass north of City Hall and featured 25 United Way volunteers who gathered for hamburgers cooked by Klett and a report on the progress of the drive.

The drive began last month and is scheduled to end in four weeks.

As of Tuesday's report luncheon, only five divisions reported donations, with the total money raised set at \$22,500.54, or 14.86 percent of goal.

The top division so far is the Senior Citizens Division, which reported collections of \$9,822, or 87 percent of its \$11,233 goal.

The Agriculture Division has reported \$1,380, or 30 percent of the \$4,635 goal.

In the FIRE (Finance, Insurance and Real Estate) Division, \$500 of the \$8,400 goal is in, for 0.6 percent.

The Pacesetters Division -- a new category comprised of Hereford's 10 largest employee giving companies -- has brought in \$6,872.54, or 16 percent of the goal of \$42,800.

The Non-Profit Division has collected \$3,000, or 37 percent of a goal of \$8,216.

In addition, Klett's Care Walk last week has brought in \$476 to date, while Jeff Yates' "100-Holes-Of-Golf-In-A-Day" fundraiser and other sources has brought an addition \$250 in.

The other divisions, which did not report any donations as of Tuesday, are: Business and Industry, Commerce, Corporate Gifts, Professionals

## Sad day for chickens, amoeba; 'Far Side' artist Larson retiring

SEATTLE (AP) - Limp hens lying around the Boneless Chicken Ranch. Bears spying campers in sleeping bags and exclaiming "Sandwiches!" Smart-talking cows. Dumb scientists. Amorous amoebas.

It's not just that cartoonist Gary Larson sees the world through a different lens. "I think the wires connecting the lens to the gray matter are crossed," said his friend John McCosker. "I just wish I could figure out how to do it myself."

After Jan. 1, he'll have to. Larson is retiring, ending 15 years of his syndicated daily cartoon "The Far Side."

Monday's announcement had fans running to refrigerators and filing cabinets for a reassuring glance at their favorite "Far Side" clip, such as:

"Wait a minute here, Mr. Crumpley," the doctor says to a man impaled on a rhinoceros. "Maybe it isn't kidney stones after all."

- A tyrannosaurus and two other dinosaurs puffing on cigarettes over the caption "The real reason dinosaurs became extinct."

Larson creates a world of supersaturated silliness in which

animals act like humans and vice versa. Through characters such as pudgy little boys and women with beehive hairdos, he conjures up absurdity by inserting ordinary conversation into extraordinary situations.

His work often teeters at the edge of bad taste -- and occasionally embraces it.

Take the 1990 cartoon about the Donner Party, whose 1847 attempt to cross the Sierra Nevada ended in cannibalism. Larson's cartoon showed a foot sticking out of a sandwich.

"The mind that conceived it must be terribly sick, and the mind that permitted this to be printed is even sicker," one reader wrote to the Miami Herald.

To which another reader replied: "If you mess with Gary Larson fans, you may be sorry! We are intelligent, independent, and potentially fierce! If pushed, we could get militant. Terms like 'economic sanctions' come to mind. We also are hard-working, loyal Americans who happen to enjoy witty, offbeat, thought-provoking humor."

Fans appear to outnumber the critics.

The cartoon is distributed to nearly 1,900 newspapers worldwide through the Universal Press

Syndicate. "The Far Side Off-the-Wall Calendar" has been the nation's best-selling calendar for nine years. And each of Larson's 19 books of collected cartoons has sold more than a million copies.

An exhibit of his science-related cartoons made a nationwide tour of science museums, including the Smithsonian, and now resides permanently at the California Academy of Sciences in San Francisco. Larson even has an insect named after him: Strigiphilus garylsoni, a biting louse.

Larson, 44, is not entirely comfortable with all the attention. He lives in Seattle and rarely grants interviews.

Officials at Universal Press Syndicate said Larson was "out of the country" this week -- the same place they said he was in 1988 when he announced a 14-month hiatus from drawing "The Far Side."

In a prepared statement, Larson said Monday that he was worried his work would suffer if he continued, "or at the very least ease into the Graveyard of Mediocre Cartoons."

The syndicate will continue to publish "Far Side" books, calendars and greeting cards, but they'll be based mostly on existing work.



## New truck in action

The Hereford Volunteer Fire Department's new fire truck was put into service on Tuesday afternoon after it was delivered from the factory on Saturday. The truck, which replaced one

## Immunization schedule noted

**PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti** - With coup leader Michel Francois in exile and a paramilitary leader making a public conversion to pacifism, Haiti appeared closer to restoring its democracy today.

**HOMER, Ill.** - From a prison cell on death row, Joe Burrows watched his three children grow up in pictures, missed his father's funeral and tried to deal with the murder another person now claims to have committed.

For nearly six years, his wife, Sherri, struggled to get along without him, eventually going on state aid and moving in with her parents.

Now released from prison, Burrows finally has hope for a future. But his fate is still up in the air: A judge granted a retrial, and the state is appealing.

**TOKYO** - Cargo planes carrying rescue workers are headed for Russia's remote Kuril Islands after a major undersea earthquake that killed at least 16 people, jolted Japan and triggered fears of tidal waves on both sides of the Pacific.

# Clinton may be unseen ballot issue

## Poll shows lagging popularity could affect candidates

**HOUSTON (AP)** - Although voters won't notice on their November ballots, an unseen issue could be as important as their choices for candidates.

A poll conducted for The Houston Post and KHOU-TV shows that lagging popularity of President Clinton could affect the performance of his fellow Democrats up and down the ballot.

"It's clear he is not a popular person in this state," said Bob Stein, the Rice University political scientist who conducted the statewide poll of 676 likely voters Sept. 23-28.

Results showed that 58 percent disapproved of Clinton's job performance while 33 percent approved.

Questioned about their overall feelings about the president, 54 percent said they had an unfavorable view and 35 percent replied favorably.

Popularity ratings for incumbent Democratic Gov. Ann Richards, in

contrast, were 56 percent favorable and 34 percent unfavorable. She is a longtime Clinton ally.

Ratings were 54 percent favorable and 23 percent unfavorable for Republican challenger George W. Bush, son of former President Bush.

Of those who disapprove of Clinton, 60 percent support George W. Bush and only 23 percent back Richards. About 68 percent of white voters in the poll gave unfavorable reviews to the president, with only 25 percent favorable.

The president fared better with Hispanics, 57 percent approval and 31 percent disapproval, and blacks, 60 percent approval and 21 percent disapproval. Richards also polls better among minorities.

Even among those voters who believe the economy is improving, 48 percent disapprove of Clinton's performance and 47 percent approve.

Ratings for ex-president Bush topped them all at 66 percent

favorable and only 19 percent unfavorable.

Margin of error for the poll is plus or minus 3.5 percentage points. The so-called "Clinton factor" is being felt in campaigns in many states, especially the South, where the president's poll ratings are depressed.

Democratic U.S. Senate nominee Richard Fisher, also a longtime friend of Clinton's, recently declared publicly that the president's ratings are hurting Democrats in general.

Despite Richards' popularity and her strong personality, the poll showed her in a virtual dead heat with Bush, and the numbers suggest it has a lot to do with the negative feelings for Clinton.

Richards campaign spokesman Chuck McDonald said that regardless of the numbers, Democrats expect the incumbent to be judged on her own merits, not the president's.

"Voters just don't see it as a Bush-Clinton race. They know better.

The fact is it will be her strong record, her strong personality and her performance that will carry her," McDonald said.

But Bush strategist Karl Rove predicted the Clinton factor will become more pronounced as the election nears.

"It's hurting Ann Richards and every Democrat. She definitely is not immune to this. After all, she was chairman of the (1992 Democratic National Convention) that nominated Clinton," Rove said.

The Clinton influence is even more pronounced in the U.S. Senate race between Fisher and Republican incumbent Kay Bailey Hutchison.

Even among voters who approve of Clinton's performance, only 36 percent support Fisher, compared with 23 percent for Mrs. Hutchison.

"Fisher doesn't even get a majority of the vote that thinks Clinton is doing well. That's very bad news for Fisher," Stein said.

## Bus-sized space radar scanned 600 sites

**SPACE CENTER, Houston (AP)** - NASA's most advanced space radar scanned island volcanoes in the Atlantic and Pacific from shuttle Endeavour today as the 10-day Earth-mapping mission neared its midpoint.

The bus-sized radar device is gathering three-dimensional images of nearly 600 sites around the world so scientists can look for hints of global change and learn more about

the environment.

Ground controllers aimed the device today at a volcano in the Canary Islands that researchers say might erupt soon, and at Mount Pinatubo in the Philippines, which exploded in June 1991. The radar also was pointed toward the northern Andes Mountains for a study of volcanic activity there.

In all three cases, geologists hope the data gives them a better idea of how the regions evolved. They also want to upgrade their maps, now sketchy for such remote areas as the Andes.

Six shuttle astronauts are employed as shuttlers during the flight, taking photographs and video of the targeted sites. They expect to take some 14,000 pictures before Endeavour's return to Earth, set for Monday.

If we correctly fill out all the paperwork and do everything right, we will be reimbursed for half the cost of printing brochures in foreign languages, participating in overseas trade shows, etc., up to \$10,000. All the expenditures will be toward increasing export sales.

As the news article stated, funding for this grant is actually part of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's marketing promotion program. Our application was filed through the Texas Department of Agriculture, but the program is administered by the Southern U.S. Trade Association in New Orleans.

We are appreciative of the degree of assistance provided by the Texas Department of Agriculture in this instance, and we are especially appreciative of the TDA's ongoing organic certification program which was begun under the leadership of former Ag Commissioner Jim Hightower.

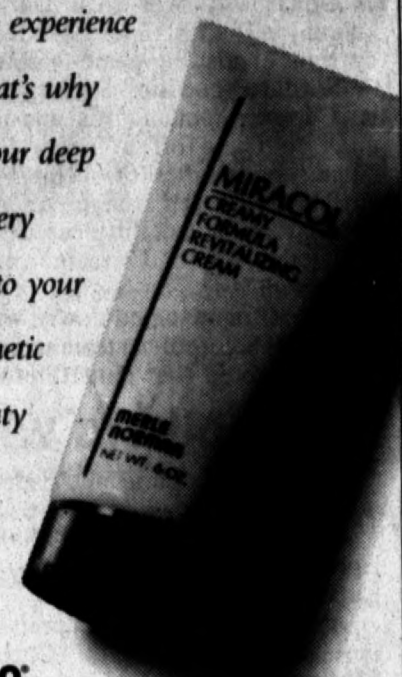

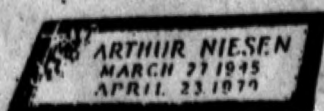

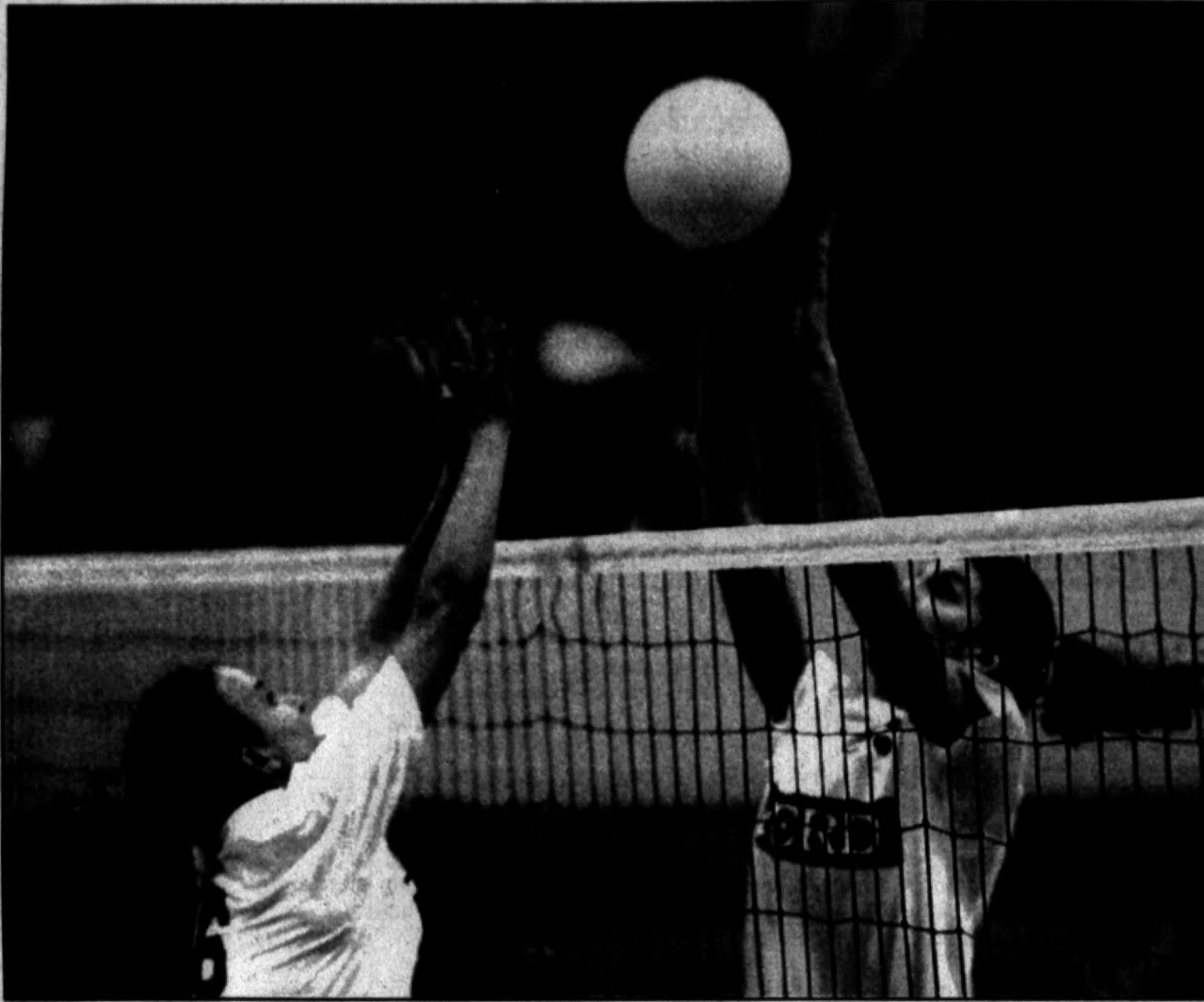

Back spasms knocked Tuinei out of the Washington game last Sunday and it was feared rookie tackle Larry Allen might have to try to block defensive end Clyde Simmons against the Cardinals.

But Tuinei was getting better and coach Barry Switzer said "Mark has improved and thinks he might be able to play on Sunday."

Tuinei's improved condition and the fact running back Emmitt Smith's pulled hamstring was better helped Switzer's sense of humor.

Cleveland Gary's skipping town didn't.

The Cowboys thought Gary was about to sign a one-year contract as backup insurance for running back

Emmitt Smith. Instead, he signed with the Miami Dolphins.

"It's no different than recruiting (in college)," Switzer said. "Somebody outbid us."

The Cowboys offered Gary \$162,000 plus incentives.

"We had a good visit yesterday and he said all the right things," Switzer said.

The Cowboys had hoped to sign Gary, a 1989 No. 1 pick of the Los Angeles Rams, because of Smith's pulled hamstring. Smith said on Tuesday the hamstring was better and he felt he could play on Sunday against the Arizona Cardinals.

"It's getting better and better," said Smith, who will likely test the hamstring in practice on Wednesday. "I had a hamstring pull in high school and couldn't walk on it. This one is different because I can walk. If I can stride I'll be fine."

Stephen Jones, Cowboys vice president, said the dealing with Gary "was frustrating."

## 6-man team plans 886-mile road trip

ABILENE, Texas - How far will a high school six-man football team go to play a game?

Try 886 miles.  
That's how far some fans will travel this Saturday when Revere, Colo., plays at Gordon.

That's right, Gordon, Texas, located three miles north of Exit 370 on Interstate 20, 90 miles east of Abilene. Revere is a consolidated school between Ovid and Sedgwick near Interstate 76. It's about three miles south of the Nebraska border the way the crow flies, but 12 miles if you drive it.

"We had trouble getting some games, so when we were contacted by Tommy Wells about playing Gordon, we jumped at it," Revere coach Dave Rice said. "This will be a great experience for our kids. We want them to have some fun and we'll use it as a learning tool."

If nothing else, they'll learn a lot about geography, and they won't miss any school time. Rice said the team will drive to Denver, about 180 miles from Revere, after school Friday and then will fly Saturday to Dallas, arriving around 9 a.m. Gordon will have a bus waiting there to pick up the team and take them to the stadium for the 4 p.m. kickoff.

After the game, the team will be fed a meal, then be taken back to the airport for an 11 p.m. flight home.

There are 20 players, plus two coaches and two managers, cheerleaders and school administrators making the plane trip along with several fans. Rice says quite a few fans are leaving Friday morning to drive to Gordon, a 16-hour trip.

Wells, who lives in Ranger but publishes six-man football magazines in Texas, Colorado and Nebraska, is using some of the proceeds from his publications to help defray some of Revere's expenses.

"We came up with an open date when Blum was put in 11-man football, leaving only five schools in our district," said Gordon coach Nelson Campbell. "Tommy approached us about playing an out-of-state team, but efforts to get a team from Nebraska fell through. Then he worked out a deal with Revere."

"It will be good for us because they run basically the same offense that Walnut Springs does and we play them next week in our first district game."

Revere won the Colorado state six-man championship in 1989, '90

and '91, winning 29 straight games during one stretch. Then the Raiders went 4-4 and 9-2 the past two years in eight-man football before dropping back down to six-man. The Raiders are 4-0 this year and are the top-ranked six-man team in the country - by Wells.

One of its former players is Keith Miller, a reserve fullback on the University of Colorado's undefeated team. Rice said he didn't have a player of Miller's caliber this year.

The Raiders will have to get used to a few rule changes for this game because it plays under high school Federation rules; Texas doesn't.

"We have to pitch the football at once before we can run with the football," Rice said. "And we can throw two forward passes on the same play as long as both are thrown behind the line of scrimmage. We

swapped films with Gordon and I noticed some chop blocks thrown and no penalties were called. Those are illegal up here."

This may be the first trip to Texas for most of the players, but Rice once pitched in a baseball game for Lamar Community College at Ranger College. Ranger is about 30 miles from Gordon.

Right now, the schools are working on a one-game contract, and there's been no discussion about next year. But Campbell said he's not against playing them again.

Gordon has just built a new football stadium which will seat 3,500, Campbell said.

"We've drawn well this year, our side of the stadium (about 2,000 seats) has been full for each game, but our opponents haven't brought many fans with them," he said. "I understand


they have a pretty good following coming here."

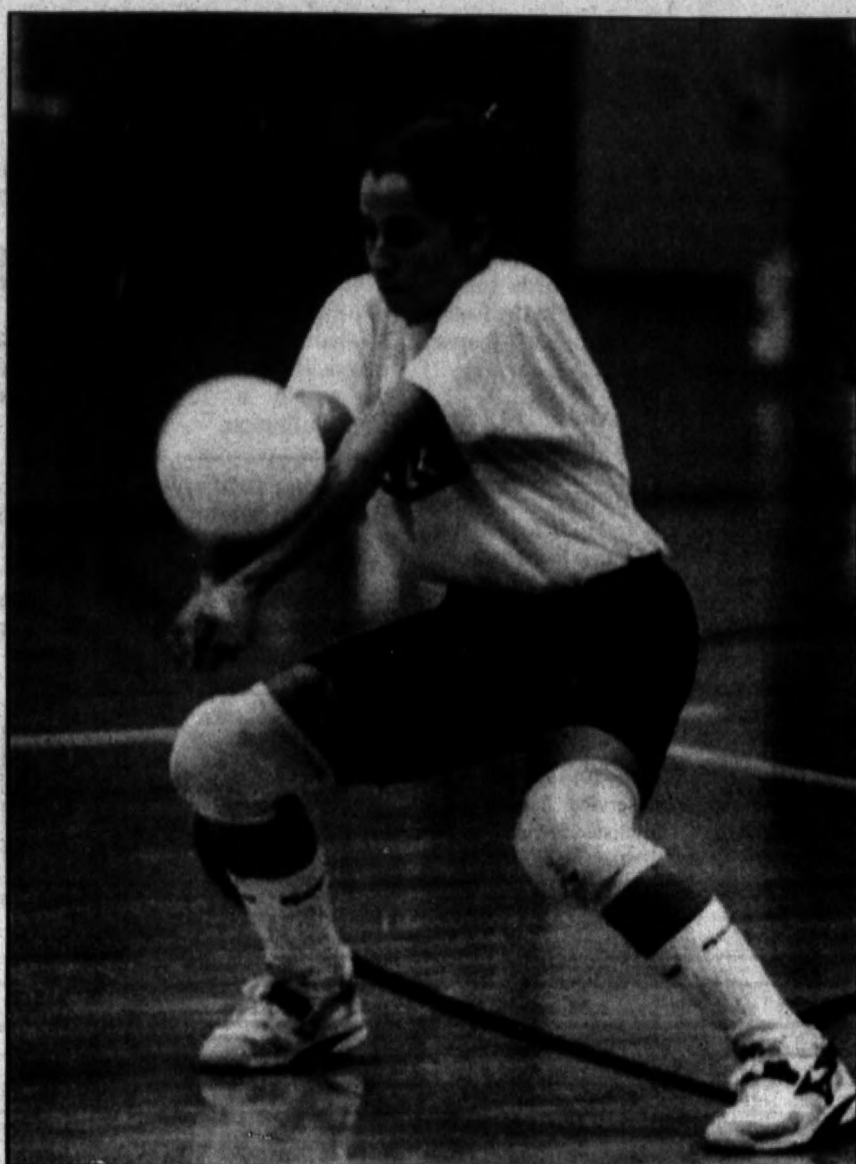
But they may be too travel-weary to enjoy the game, especially those who will be thinking about the drive back home.

# Garland fullback racks up 323 yards, 7 TDs

DALLAS (AP) — North Garland's Joseph Polk spent the first four weeks of this season getting used to being a fullback, picking up things like which linemen to run between instead of around like he did as a tailback.

Game five was against Garland Naaman Forest, where Polk went as a freshman.

Spurred by the excitement of playing his ex-teammates and filled with the confidence of being comfortable at his new spot, Polk had the game of his life Friday night.

He ran for 323 yards and seven touchdowns on 16 carries in a 56-20 North Garland victory, earning Polk top billing on this week's Associated Press honor roll.

"When I came (to North Garland), people I knew from Naaman Forest were talking up stuff about me," Polk said. "All that was built up inside me. ... I wanted to have a big game against Naaman Forest this year."

Polk had a huge first half, rushing for 321 yards on 15 carries. His six TDs in the first two quarters included runs of 30, 54, 59 and 91 yards. His only second-half carry was a 2-yard TD run.

North Garland coach Joe Allen said Polk's big night was a culmination of him understanding his new role and settling an old score.

"He looked a little different in practice last week," Allen said. "He looked more explosive. Usually when we break a play he goes 15 yards. But last week he'd go 30. I guess that was because we were playing Naaman."

It also was because Polk is getting the hang of playing tailback.

"He had been tentative sometimes," Allen said. "You have to read your blocks and go inside. The cuts and things are a little different than they are at tailback."

Polk - who is 5-foot-9, 165 pounds with 4.48 speed in the 40 - sprung loose for the big runs by popping through the line and burning downfield.

Allen said he saw Polk show an extra burst of speed as he headed downfield. That's something that may be traceable to an adrenalin rush caused by playing his old school.

"That was extra incentive for him," Allen said.

Polk's outing easily was a career-best, but it wasn't totally out of the ordinary.

He already was among the area's Class 5A rushing leaders and he now has 764 yards, an area-best 102 points and an average of 8.1 yards per carry. He ran for 805 yards as a tailback last year.

In other outstanding Week Five performances:

-Dameon Badger carried Fort Worth Eastern Hills to its first victory of the year, 26-23 over Fort Worth Paschal, by rushing for 260 yards and adding another 121 yards receiving. He scored all four Eastern Hills touchdowns, including a game-winning 72-yard reception with 21 seconds left.

-Alvord running back Billy Baker ran for 356 yards on 25 carries and scored five TDs in a 35-21 victory over Millsap.

-Deweyville's Levi Moore ran 21 times for 323 yards and four TDs in a 38-22 victory over Huntington.

-Jason Enoch scored 38 points as Class 3A's top-ranked Cuero crushed Victoria Stroman 61-6. He had six touchdowns and a two-point conversion. On only 11 carries, he ran for 153 yards.

-Magnolia's Stephen Phillips scored six touchdowns on 263 yards rushing in a 41-10 victory over Dayton.

-Willie Angton ran for 302 yards and three TDs as Shamrock remained undefeated with a 42-12 victory over Crowell.

-Houston North Shore's D'Andre Hardeman, who ran for more than 2,000 yards last year, ran for TDs of 80 and 29 yards on his first two carries and finished with 308 yards in a 29-16 victory over Vidor.

-Dean Boyd ran for 305 yards on 31 attempts and scored all three Irving TDs in a 24-21 loss to No. 8 Arlington Lamar.

-Newton's offense gained 663 yards, 597 of them rushing, in a 60-13 victory over Woodville. Brian Samuel led the way with 267 yards and four TDs on 19 carries and Raymond Thomas added 248 yards and a TD on 17 carries.

-Lamont Zachery went over 1,000 yards for the season as he ran for 280 yards on 16 carries in Linden-Kildare's 42-0 victory over Pittsburg. He scored on runs of 83 and 54 yards.

-Corsicana's Ketric Sanford also reached the 1,000-yard milestone behind 261 yards on 38 carries in a 23-22 loss to Highland Park.

-Jim Ned beat Stamford 46-12 behind 100 yards rushing from three players: Chris Kraatz had 148 yards and three TDs on 10 carries; Larry Trevino had 135 yards on 19 carries; and Jason Melton added 102 yards on 15 carries.

-Floresville's Rusty Moody ran for 268 yards and four TDs in a 42-6 victory over San Antonio Southside.

-Chris Sanders of Flower Mound Marcus was 31-of-61 passing for 413 yards and three TDs in a 41-27 loss to Lewisville.

-Mineral Wells quarterback Brent Tinchler threw for a school-record 340 yards and two TDs in a 23-20 victory over Lake Worth. Jason Winfield also set a school record by catching 13 of Tinchler's passes for 185 yards and a TD.

## Special treatment can help premature babies

CHICAGO (AP) - Premature babies who receive care tailored to their own needs and personalities develop stronger minds and bodies than those who get the standard treatment, a new study found.

"It has implications for the medical outcome. It has implications for reducing costs," said Dr. Edward Ogata, head of neonatology at Children's Memorial Hospital in Chicago. "And it has implications for what parents think about - what their baby will be like after 10 or 12 years of life."

The concept behind the research is simple: Care for premature children as if they are "actively participating in their own care and shaping their own development."

Doctors said the results were remarkable.

Only one of the 18 infants who received the specialized care suffered a brain hemorrhage. Of the 10 in the study who didn't get the specialized care, six were diagnosed with internal brain bleeding.

"That was the most surprising," said Heideise Als, an associate professor of psychology at Harvard University and a co-author of the study, which appeared in Sept. 21 issue of the Journal of the American Medical Association.

The children who received specialized care also showed a reduction of chronic lung disease because they spent less time on mechanical ventilation.

"These children with chronic lung disease have much poorer pulmonary functions," Als said. "They're very vulnerable children, and they grow poorly. They put all their effort into breathing."

In the study conducted at Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston, premature infants weighing less than 2.76 pounds were monitored for 91 behaviors before and after each care-giving activity.

Some behaviors, like flaccidity and gaze aversion, were considered signs of stress. Others, like grasping and hand clasping, were labeled regulatory behavior and interpreted as signs of vulnerability.

The observations were turned into appropriate treatments such as placing the infant in a flexed position to promote rest, holding the child after taxing procedures and making rooms dark and quiet.

The procedures might sound like common sense, but doctors say they're not always easy to use in intensive-care nurseries.

"Those tiny little bodies need intensive procedures," Als said. "To simultaneously take into account what the baby was saying was probably overwhelming."

Less intrusive technology means it's easier to integrate the ideas, Als said. But there's still the obstacle of training and money, she said.

Some hospital nurseries are using a few of the procedures described in the study - and that's an improvement from years ago.

"When I started about 16 years ago, the lights never went off because you always had to see the baby," said Ogata, who was not involved with the study in Boston. "There were often radios blasting because the staff had to stay awake."

"It's a very different environment now."

# To Your Good Health

DEAR DR. DONOHUE: What is the connection between moles and cancer? — Mrs. F.M.

ANSWER: Several kinds of moles have cancer potential, an example being one that has been present since birth. Otherwise, potentially dangerous moles distinguish themselves by how they look and where they occur.

A broad category of potentially precancerous moles is the atypical kind. The atypical mole has pretty reliable telltale features to distinguish it from the ordinary kind. It is generally larger than a pencil eraser and has a variety of coloration, with tans, grays and blacks mixed in. An irregular circumference is another characteristic of the atypical mole.

Any mole on the scalp, breast or buttocks should be looked at with suspicion. Ordinary moles rarely occur in those places.

Changing shape and coloration are other mole danger signs.

The safest rule to follow is to suspect any unusual skin growth, no matter where it appears. Periodic skin self-examination is one of the easiest and most rewarding preventive steps you can take. That precaution alone has prevented many cases of melanoma, a skin cancer that is highly curable when reported early. Melanoma can be lethal if ignored.

DEAR DR. DONOHUE: Could you please explain a bit further about chemical imbalances? How is it diagnosed? Is there a lab test for this? Is it possible that a person with a chemical imbalance could be misdiagnosed as having chronic fatigue syndrome? What is the treatment for chemical imbalance? Finding a doctor who does not automatically label you as "crazy" or "lazy" when tests come out normal is next to impossible. — R.P.

ANSWER: I am sorry your medical experience has been such a sour one, but you really won't find many doctors who, as you say, label a patient "crazy" or "lazy."

Chronic fatigue can be a part of depression, and one condition can be related to the other, so certainties are elusive.

Most often, "chemical imbalance" refers to some derangement in the normal levels of brain-messenger chemicals. One of the most common messenger-chemical disorders is depression. We have no lab test that uncovers the imbalance, but it can

be strongly concluded from observation of the patient. Further, there is medicine to correct such an imbalance.

A chemical imbalance is not always brain-related. A low sodium level is also a chemical imbalance. But usually what is intended when the term is used is disruption of brain-chemical balance.

DEAR DR. DONOHUE: I have just recently been informed by my doctor that my red blood cells are growing larger. Apparently, this has been going on for the past few years. Vitamin B deficiency has been ruled out. I don't recall ever reading before about red cells getting larger. I read Dr. Lamb's column for years before you appeared in our newspaper. Can you please explain in brief the cause of my problem? — Mrs. L.L.

ANSWER: Deficiency of B-12 or folic acid—another B vitamin—can cause red blood cell enlargement, as can an underactive thyroid gland or certain liver illnesses. The extralarge red cells usually indicate an anemia.

DEAR DR. DONOHUE: Four weeks ago, I stumbled while walking. My right leg got extended. I had a great deal of pain, which continues. Four days ago, I checked with my doctor. He said I had pulled a tendon and it would heal in time. Tell me, is there any exercise for healing the strained muscle or tendon? — E.F.

ANSWER: What to do for an overstretched muscle or tendon depends on just how stretched either was at the time. At one extreme is a

stretch that tears only a few fibers of muscle or tendon. Those are the common strains and sprains.

At the other extreme is a stretch that actually severs the muscle or tendon. Surgery is often needed to repair such an injury.

Be leery of exercise right now. Time heals most such problems. Rest and the application of heat are two

things you can do to help speed the process of healing and make yourself comfortable.

You've had the pain for four weeks. Your leg should be coming back to pretty near normal in a couple of weeks more. If it has not, go back to the doctor for a second look.
