Federal government shuts down -- again

Budget talks stall between Congress, Clinton

WASHINGTON (AP) - Parts of the federal government were ordered shut down today as President Clinton blamed the Republican Congress for attempting to force unacceptable cuts in programs affecting the lives of children, the elderly and the poor.

Republicans responded that the budget blueprint Clinton has offered is based on smoke and mirrors and would leave a sea of red ink after seven years.

Clinton insisted that his budget would do the job without hurting programs for people, harming the environment or raising taxes on the working poor.

"We should not leave a legacy of debt," he said in his weekly radio address. "Neither should we leave the next generation a legacy of neglect."

"The facts are plain," Clinton said. "The Congress has failed to pass a budget for this next year and

they have deliberately done this to force me to accept their long-term agenda of big cuts in Medicare, Medicaid, education and the environment and a tax increase on working people."

"For them to cause a government shutdown denying them the services their tax dollars support as a tactic in the budget debate is wrong; I won't give into the threat," the president said. "I am not going to let them hurt our children."

In the Republican radio address, Gov. Jim Edgar of Illinois said his party now has "serious doubts" that Clinton will keep his word to produce an "honest" balanced budget in seven years.

"Indeed, the Congressional Budget Office has said the budget he produced last week would result in a deficit of \$115 billion in 2002," Edgar said.

"We need good faith bargaining from the president - not smoke and mirrors, not the rhetoric of fear," the

GOP governor said.

White House Budget Director Alice Rivlin ordered parts of the federal government to begin shutting down, hours after the government's authority to spend money for some departments and agencies expired.

Nine Cabinet departments and scores of other agencies lost authority to spend money at midnight Friday, hours after budget talks between the White House and congressional Republicans broke off in bitterness.

"The continuing resolution expired at midnight last night," Rivlin wrote in a memo to departments and agencies. "...We have no indication yet that Congress will act today and pass an acceptable CR. Therefore you should now implement your plan for closing down operations funded by accounts that have not received appropriations."

"You should implement the close-down of affected operations

Armenian student learning Christmas is big day in U.S. New Year's is major holiday in her country

As holidays go in Armenia, New Year's is the major attraction but an exchange student in Hereford is learning that Christmas claims the honor here.

"On Dec. 31, we celebrate with our national foods, dress in new clothes and make toasts at midnight," explained Angela Saghatelian about traditions of her homeland.

Christmas doesn't come until Jan. 6, when Father Frost arrives, looking for all the world like Santa Claus, the student said.

Even when Armenia was part of the Soviet Union, citizens expected Santa Claus to bring gifts, Angela continued, although there is not a lot of exchanging of gifts between individuals.

Angela is living with the Tom Fellhauer family this year while attending Hereford High School, coming to the United States through the Freedom Support Act, a program that brings students from other countries to study in American schools.

Angela successfully passed written

and oral examinations as well as psychological assessments to earn a trip to the U.S. Her application was sent to Washington, D.C., where only 50 students from Armenia were chosen for scholarships.

She's learning quickly that Americans are high on Christmas and is looking forward to the celebration with the Fellhauer family.

"We open gifts on Christmas morning and spend the day with my parents, Kenneth and Dolores Christie," said Valerie Fellhauer.

Angela and Tanya Vakhraneva, a former exchange student now living with the Fellhauers and attending West Texas A&M University, will join the family in the day's celebration.

Even though Christmas is not the same kind of holiday in Armenia that is observed in the U.S., Angela's native country is Christian-oriented.

"Armenia was the first country in the world to adopt Christianity," Angela pointed out. The church, Gregorian Apostolic, is a separate entity from any denomination and not an offshoot of any other Orthodox religion, she continued.

Armenia is not a large country by any stretch of the imagination and has been beset by natural and manmade disasters for years and years.

One of the worst was the massacre of 1915, Angela said, when 1.5 million Armenians lost their lives at the hands of the Turks.

A devastating earthquake struck Armenia several years ago and left thousands dead or homeless.

And a war with a neighbor, Azerbaijan had a chilling effect on the economy of Armenia.

Held under the thumb of the Soviet Union for many years, Armenia gained independence with the breakup of the USSR, Angela observed.

Her country is experiencing "hard times in the change from socialism to democratic government," the student said.

"We have to learn to live on our own... we depended on the Soviet Union for so long," she added.

Much of the country has been without electricity because a nuclear power plant was shut down. After the earthquake, Angela attended school

Lone Star Card computer failure leaves some people without food

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) - State Comptroller John Sharp said customers should not have been turned away from grocery store checkout lines Thursday when a computer glitch temporarily stalled the use of the Lone Star Card.

On Thursday, an unknown number of stores statewide lost computer service throughout the afternoon and early evening, according to a Transactive official in Austin. Some salesclerks appeared unaware that a purchase could still be made.

A provision in the state's contract with Transactive Corp., which runs the electronic system that replaced food stamps, allows for grocers and

retailers to provide at least \$25 in purchases through a manual procedure when computer problems occur.

"This deal about a woman having to walk away and unload her cart that should never have happened," Sharp said about a news report. "All retailers and grocers, in the provision they signed, they call the help desk, and if they don't get a response in 30 seconds, they can have someone buy the groceries up to \$25 and do it manually."

The provision also states that if the customer does not have the \$25 in their account, Transactive must pay the difference if the computer cannot

be used to verify the customer's balance. The provision was added after five days of "contentious debate" with Transactive officials two years ago, when the contract was being written, Sharp said.

"The reason we put that (provision) in there is one, to make sure if you had a power outage, no one would ever have to leave the store without being able to buy groceries," Sharp told the Fort Worth Star-Telegram. "The second reason is you provide a heck of an incentive to make sure those systems are never down, because they have to pay for it."

Guilty pleas entered in District Court here

Probated sentences previously imposed on an offender were revoked in 222nd District Court Friday and he was ordered to serve out the sentences in Texas Department of Criminal Justice facilities.

During the court session, four defendants entered guilty pleas to charges and terms of probation were modified for another offender.

Johnny Ortiz was ordered to serve two 18-month state jail sentences on revocation of probation on convictions for burglary of a building and forgery my making.

Probation on a conviction for aggravated sexual assault of a child also was revoked and Ortiz was sentenced to serve nine years in prison.

Armando Bustamante Jr., entered guilty pleas to three charges of burglary of a building, state jail offenses. He was sentenced to two years, probated five years, on each charge. Fines of \$500 also were

levied on each charge.

Marcos Castillo, 17, entered guilty pleas to two charges, delivery of a controlled substance, cocaine, and burglary of a habitation. On the drug charge he was sentenced to state jail for two years, probated five years. An eight-year probated sentence and \$1,500 fine were assessed on the burglary charge.

On a plea of guilty to sexual assault of a child, Filiberto Christopher Vallejo III, was granted deferred adjudication probation of eight years and fined \$500.

A five-year probated sentence was given Jose Alfredo Cobos, 35, who entered a guilty plea to felony driving while intoxicated.

Terms of probation of Christopher Reuterskiold, previously convicted of sexual assault, were modified by agreed order after the state asked for revocation of probation. Another year was added to the original eight-year sentence.

Northwest School playground drive reaches milestone with first phase

A drive by Northwest Primary School to get a new playground has begun bearing fruit, as the first phase of the \$80,000 project is on order.

A recent briefing to parents noted that the first section of the playground was ordered on Nov. 11 and is expected to be shipped to Hereford on Jan. 23, 1996.

The school's third grade has led efforts by the entire campus -- called "Building Sparkler Dreams" -- to buy the new playground, primarily using funds raised from recycling.

The modular playground system is being built by Landscape Structures in Minnesota, which markets a line called Play Venture, which is

primarily from recycled materials.

On Oct. 2, the school kicked off its recycling efforts, seeking newspaper, aluminum and metal food cans, plastic and glass.

As of the end of November, the school reports, nearly nine tons of paper have been donated, along with 600 pounds of plastics. Those items are sold to Panhandle Recyclers in Amarillo.

However, the school will no longer accept plastic because costs to ship from Panhandle Recyclers to its market are too expensive.

In addition, the school has collected 1,637 pounds of metal food

cans and 1,097 pounds of aluminum, netting \$450.65. Those are sold to Hereford Iron and Metal.

Glass donations are currently being handled through the Hereford Beautification Alliance.

However, principal Alice Lockmiller said in a report about the project that Northwest has applied to the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission for Dumpsters to collect glass at the school. Those may be received in January or February. In the mean time, she said, donors are encouraged to take glass to St. Anthony's School.

Additional funds for the playground project included \$6,280 from

a schoolwide fund-raising project, \$4,500 received from Landscape Structures in a grant for the school having established a recycling program, and \$3,000 earned by the school PTO.

The playground project will be installed in four phases.

Equipment costs, according to school information, will be about \$45,000, including \$14,517 for the first phase.

Additional expenses will be incurred for site preparation, edging around the playground and filler material -- sand, gravel or some other item -- for the playground area.

promptly and in an orderly manner," Rivlin wrote.

The immediate impact is being felt by weekend tourists, who will find hundreds of national parks, monuments and museums shuttered.

Standing in the rain at the Lincoln Memorial on Saturday, Shannon Del Grosso of Pierre, S.D., lamented: "They shouldn't shut this down. This is America's history. It's sad."

The full brunt of the partial shutdown won't hit until Monday, when 260,000 federal workers, about 15 percent of the government's civilian employees, would be furloughed unless a fiscal truce is declared. That's about one-third of those who were idled during the six-day closure in November, which ended when the two sides agreed to the negotiations that for now have run aground.

Clinton accused the GOP of vowing to padlock the government unless he proposed additional slashes

in health-care programs, which have been among the priorities he has pledged to protect.

"It is simply wrong for the congressional Republicans to insist that I make deep cuts in Medicare and Medicaid, or they will not even talk; and, furthermore, they will shut the government down again, just before Christmas," the president declared in remarks made just in time for evening television news programs.

Republicans denied Clinton's assertions. They insisted he had poisoned the talks by failing to produce a plan that balances the budget by 2002 using the Congressional Budget Office's economic assumptions. Clinton projected that his package would eliminate annual deficits in seven years, but it was based on more optimistic White House estimates of a more robust economy and smaller shortfalls.

"The closing of the government is on the president's back," said House Budget Committee Chairman John

Kasich, R-Ohio. "All the president has to do is make a good-faith effort."

Throughout the year-long budget fight, Republicans have sought to pluck deeper savings from Medicare, Medicaid and other social programs and provide steeper tax reductions than Clinton says are wise.

The two sides each were gambling that the public would blame the other. Opinion polls last month found people blaming Republicans by a 2-1 margin; since then, Clinton's popularity in the polls has surged while the GOP's has declined.

Senate and House leaders were poised to push legislation through Congress over the weekend to fully reopen the government - if a way to break the budget stalemate could be found. But there were no bipartisan meetings planned.

Instead, to outmaneuver their opponents, both sides were hoping to craft new budget-balancing plans that would attract support from moderates

from the other party.

A chief target for both sides were the self-proclaimed "Blue Dogs" - 21 conservative Democrats who have written their own seven-year budget-balancing package. Their measure has deeper spending cuts than Clinton wants, but none of the tax reductions that Republicans covet.

There were already signs on the Democratic side that the president would have to give some ground.

At a closed-door meeting among House Democrats, Minority Leader Dick Gephardt, D-Mo., said, "For our party to come out of this looking (good) ... we have to put together a credible, logical, seven-year balanced budget using CBO numbers" - something Clinton has resisted all year.

Both sides had expressed some optimism about Friday's negotiating session. But it ended abruptly in the afternoon after each had presented a new offer that was judged insufficient.

She completed her public schooling, through the 10th year, before applying for the exchange. She planned to enter a university for foreign languages.

Angela speaks Armenian and Russian and is quite fluent in English, a result of a year of "cramming."

"I started English in the fifth grade, learning some words," she explained, "but the teachers didn't know much more than the students." Her year of intensive study paid off when she received the scholarship to study in the U.S.

Among her courses at HHS is

French, which she hopes to add to her repertoire of languages.

Angela pointed out that she chose French instead of Spanish because it is a language used more widely in Europe. When she finishes her year at HHS, she expects to continue her education at a university in Armenia.

Despite a history of tragedy in her country, Angela has all the marks of a happy teenager.

Her blue-green eyes sparkle when she laughs, as she does often, says her Hereford "mother," Valerie Fellhauer.

"She just laughs all the time," Fellhauer insisted, over Angela's objections.

Angela describes her hometown of Vanadzor as an industrial city of about 300,000. Major industries are chemicals and machinery. Her father, Samvel Saghatelian, is chairman of a trade union and her mother, Vanera Saghatelian, is a chemical engineer. She has a 15-year-old sister, Nazeli, at home, also.

One of the differences in her school in Armenia and HHS is the option students have for selecting courses they want to take.

"We don't have any choice," she said. Another difference is the clothing students must wear.

"We could not wear jeans or pants to school," Angela noted.

The classes she chose at HHS are English, American history, American government, photography and tennis, as well as French. But, Angela hopes the best results in English as she talks with other students, teachers and friends since her goal, eventually, is to concentrate on languages in a university.

She keeps up her Russian language capability in conversations with Tanya

Ten-year-old Kealie Fellhauer is picking up some, too.

The 17-year-old student marvels at the weather in Hereford, observing that back home, "it is cold and snowing."

Angela enjoys reading, playing the piano and watching television, "everything," she declared.

And, as normal as any American teenaged girl, "I really like to go shopping," she laughed.

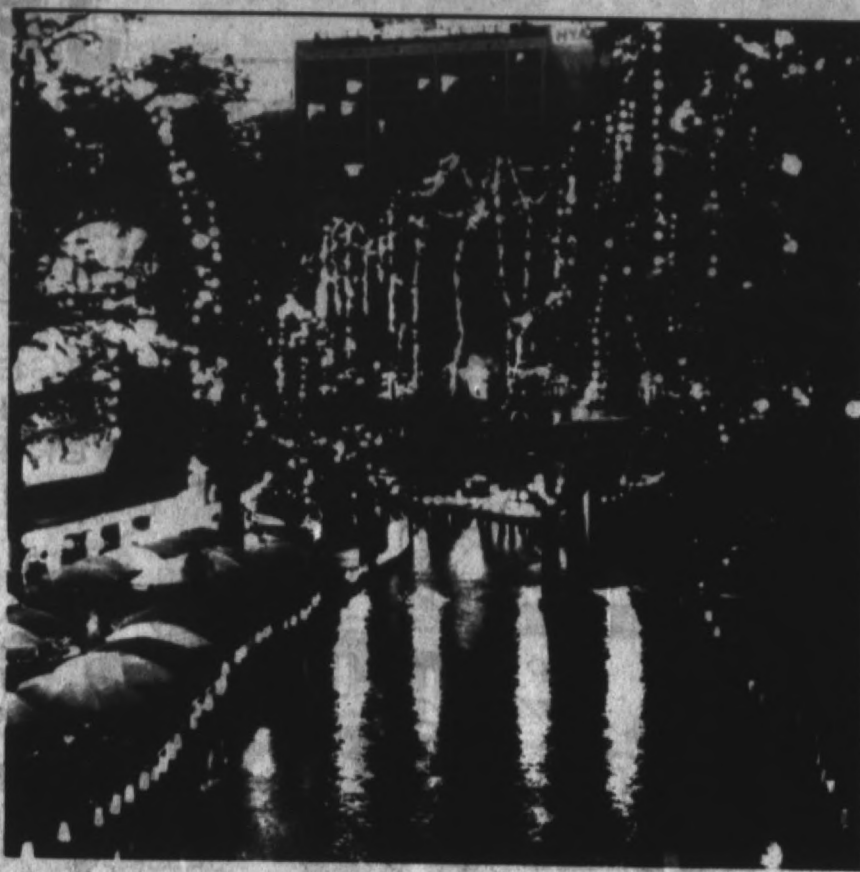

Immediately following the lighting ceremony, San Antonians are treated to the annual Holiday Parade. River barges decorated for the holidays wend their way past the more than 100,000 spectators that line the Paseo del Rio. Santa Claus also makes his first appearance of the season when he arrives by riverboat during the floating river parade.

Holiday celebrations are certainly not confined to San Antonio's River Walk, however. Fiestas Navideñas, a Christmas festival held the weekend following Thanksgiving and each weekend in December before Christmas, takes place in Market Square and is a wonderful blend of Hispanic Christmas traditions. The Market Square comes alive with Christmas lights the Friday after Thanksgiving at 7 p.m., and afterward the air fills with the finest music in South Texas for a weekend mariachi festival. There are also samples of the many foods, wines, and cheeses unique to Texas during "A Taste of Texas," which is held in the Farmers Market Plaza. Fiestas Navideñas continues each weekend with piñata parties, blessing of the animals and a visit from Pancho Claus for the children. All events are free.

The communities that lie to the south of San Antonio are also busy with their own holiday celebrations. A portion of this area, called the Alamo-La Bahia Corridor, is a 90-mile stretch that reaches from San Antonio to Goliad and is well-known for its historical significance. In an effort to highlight the rich history of this area, a wonderful holiday celebration, Christmas Along The Corridor, was created to attract attention to the area's heritage and history. Christmas Along the Corridor is a living history celebration held the first Saturday in December. The centerpiece of the celebration is a group of Pony Express Christmas couriers, sworn in by the U.S. Postal Service for the day, who ride 90 miles from Goliad to San Antonio carrying the Governor's season's greetings and proclamation for the event. This special group of couriers includes members of the Atascosa County Sheriff's Mounted Posse, the Alamo Trailriders, the Old Chisholm Trailriders, the Mesquite Trailriders, and the Medina Trailriders.

gets underway in Goliad when the day's first Pony Express courier leaves the Presidio La Bahia and is greeted at Goliad's courthouse square for the reading of the Governor's proclamation. Afterward the proclamation is read the courier gallops off, passing through Runge, Helena, Panna Maria, Cestohowa, Stockdale, Sutherland Springs, La Vernia, Kenedy, Karnes City, Hobson, Falls City, Poth, Floresville, Pleasanton, Poteet, and Elmendorf, with the final destination, San Antonio, 90 miles to the north. Each courier travels a mile

then passes off the saddlebag with the Governor's proclamation to the next courier. Some of the towns also set up temporary post offices that can add a special Pony Express postmark to holiday correspondence.

But the arrival and welcome of the courier is only the beginning of the festivities that each community has planned for this special event. Many of the communities host special events that include arts and crafts shows, music, entertainment, parades,

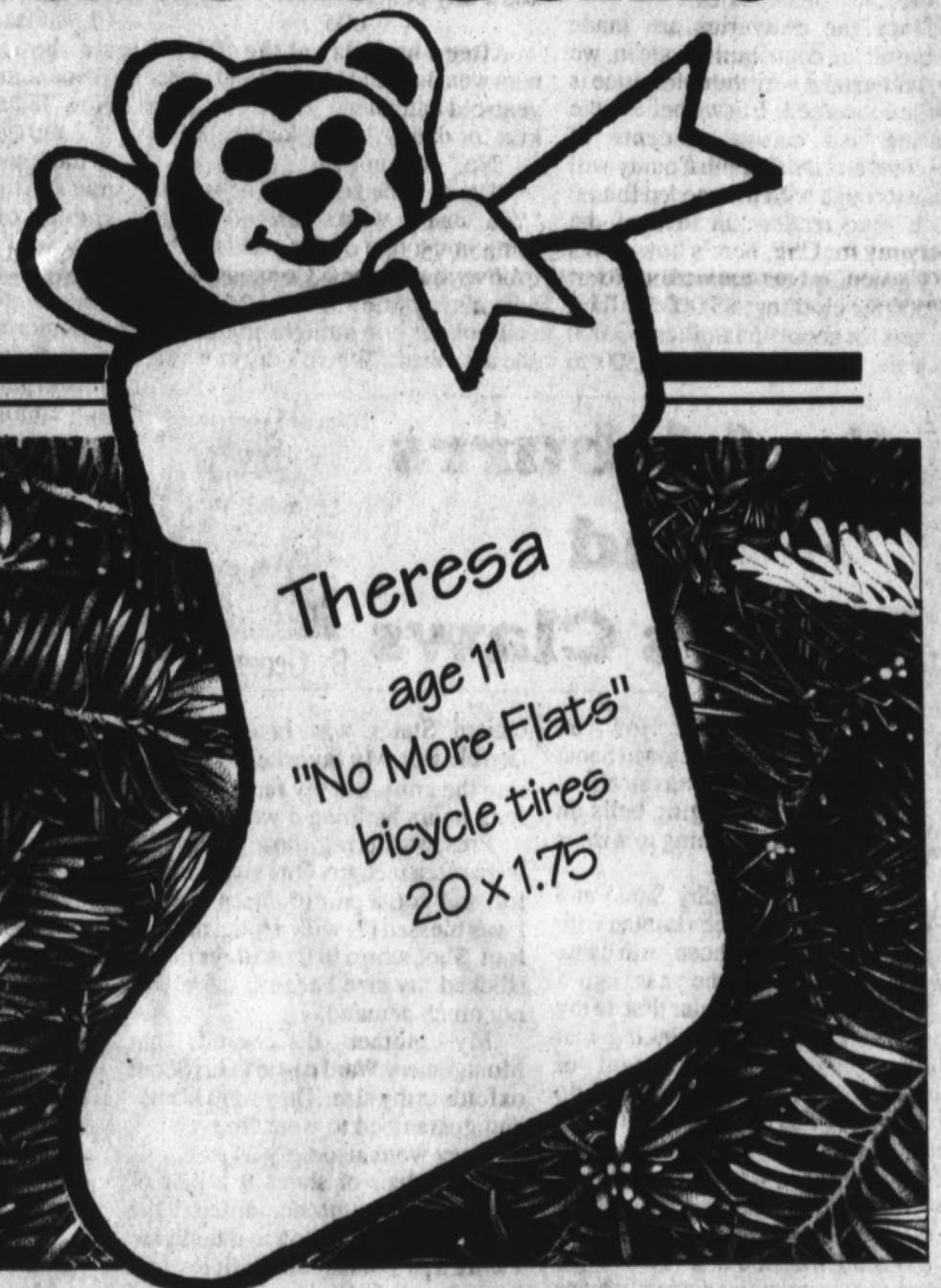

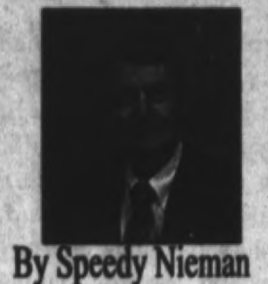

Daffynition: Bank--an institution where you can borrow money if you can present enough evidence that you don't need it.

Volunteers working with the Christmas Stocking Fund were getting a little concerned this week. They have projected expenses of more than \$17,000 to adequately cover the number of applications for assistance this Christmas.

With the contribution total at just over \$7,000 on Wednesday, the CSF committee was about to panic.

"Don't worry," we told them. "Every year it seems the donations are coming in slow, but the last week before Christmas, the checks pour in and we wind up with about \$17,000."

At least that's the way it has gone since 1989, when contributions totalled \$20,718. The fund has been at \$17,000 to \$21,000 every year since. The peak was 1993, when the total reached \$21,451. Last year's total was \$18,414.

The CSF group delivers the food baskets and vouchers for clothing, utility bills and medical expenses early. It's set up that way so the anonymous volunteers can spend time with their families the days just before Christmas.

Since the deliveries are made before all the contributions are in, we can understand why the committee is a little concerned. But we believe the sharing and caring residents of Hereford and Deaf Smith County will come through with the needed funds!

To give readers an idea of the expenses for CSF, here's how funds have generally been earmarked so far: \$9,500 for clothing; \$3,000 for food baskets for about 45 families; \$3,000 to assist on utility bills; \$1,500 to

help on medical bills; and \$1,500 for needy individuals at nursing homes.

In case you didn't know it, there is a lot of sickness going around the community. My wife and I have been sickly this week, and we found it difficult to see the doctor. Apparently all of them have been busy treating folks with flu, bronchitis, sore throats, coughing and the like.

Finally, she admitted that she had known for a year that there was no real Santa but she didn't want to spoil it for the rest of us.

"It's the meaning of Christmas that counts," she declared. Amen, sister.

An Old Testament look at Christmas

Out of the Blue

So many times, it seems like Christians consider the Bible as two separate documents -- you know, the Old Testament and the New Testament.

Often times, we forget that they are a cohesive whole, a total work, something that stands as a united testament of God's love to man.

And what better time than Christmas to bring this to mind, as we see how Scriptures in the Old Testament point us to Christ in the New Testament.

I thought it would be interesting to track some of the many prophecies made in the Old Testament about the coming of the Messiah, and where they are fulfilled in Christ.

My Open Bible (King James Version, of course) is where I found this information. Here's what I found.

1. Gen. 3:15 tells us that God cursed Satan (the serpent) that "I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed."

Now, as anybody knows, it is the seed of man, not woman, that brings about a new life.

Therefore, this could only be fulfilled in a woman impregnated without benefit of male seed.

In Gal. 4:4 we see the fulfillment of this, where we are told Christ was "made of a woman."

2. Gen. 49:10 tells that the Messiah will be from the tribe of Judah (one of the 12 tribes of Israel), while Isaiah 9:7 says Messiah will be heir to the throne of David.

Judah was ordained as the tribe from which kings of Israel would come. Isaiah's prophecy made it a requirement that Messiah be a descendant of King David (and, thus, a member of the tribe of Judah). The fulfillment is in both Matthew Chapter 1 and Luke Chapter 3, where the lineages of Mary and Joseph are presented (Joseph's, even though he was not the biological father, to prove the legal connection as Jesus' legal father).

3. In Luke 2, we are told that Caesar Augustus decreed that all the world should be taxed and that said taxation (census) would be in the city of that person's lineage.

For Mary and Joseph, this was

Bethlehem, a small town a few miles south of Jerusalem, which was the town where David was born.

What Caesar didn't know, however, was that the prophet Micah wrote in Micah 5:2, "But thou, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though thou be little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of thee shall he come forth unto me that is to be ruler of Israel; whose goings forth have been from old, from everlasting."

4. The only way to ensure that a baby would be born of the seed of a woman (see above) and not of the seed of a man, is to make sure the woman had never had a man before. Thus the fulfillment of Isaiah 7:14 calling for a virgin to conceive and bear a son was fulfilled in Luke 1, when the angel Gabriel told Mary, a virgin, that "thou shalt conceive in thy womb and bring forth a son and shalt call his name Jesus."

5. Probably one of the single most tragic events of the entire Bible is the slaughter of the innocents in Matthew 2:16-18.

Herod, following the visit of the Wise Men to him (and, subsequently, to Jesus in Bethlehem), became furious that the long-promised Messiah -- King of the Jews -- was alive and threatening his despotic rule.

He ordered his soldiers to kill all children age 2 and under in Bethlehem and the surrounding region, thus (he hoped) wiping out this new king.

But the slaughter had been foretold centuries before by Jeremiah, who wrote in Jeremiah 31:15 that "a voice was heard in Ramah, lamentation, and bitter weeping; Rachel weeping for her children refused to be comforted for her children, because they were not."

6. Of course, Jesus escaped slaughter in Matthew 2:14, because God warned Joseph to take his Son to Egypt because of the coming massacre, fulfilling a prophecy in Hosea 11:1 that God's son would come from that country.

There are many, many more such prophecies, but just these few should show us that God had planned all the events surrounding the birth of His Son and pointed the way to Christ many centuries before His actual birth.

Dec. 11
San Antonio Express-News on health care lobbying:
The ongoing debate over health care churns the stomachs of 40 million Americans who don't have health insurance. It heightens stress among the poor on Medicaid and the elderly on Medicare. But it has been a veritable Klondike bonanza for members of Congress.

Health insurers and doctors contributed \$48,616,570 to congressional campaigns and political parties between July 1, 1985 and June 30, 1995, reports Common Cause.

This is, of course, to ensure that their interests are covered in legislation. To date, they have been.

Most of the money went to members of key committees. Thirty-five current House members received more than \$100,000 apiece during the decade, eight of them more than \$200,000. Thirty-two senators received more than \$100,000 apiece, three of them more than \$200,000.

But there was something for virtually everyone. Local U.S. Rep. Lamar Smith, for example, has collected \$60,567 since he went to Congress in 1987, reports Common Cause, but local U.S. Rep. Henry Bonilla, in

just 2-12 years in the House, received \$45,145 from health-care contributors.

The top Texas beneficiaries, however, were Sens. Kay Bailey Hutchison (\$149,450) and Phil Gramm (\$127,146) and U.S. Rep. John Bryant (\$124,289).

Also enlightening is how giving has shifted to the party in power. GOP candidates have outpaced Democrats this year, 2-1.

Doctors and insurance firms have a lot to gain - or lose - by what Congress does to health care. Common Cause concludes that they are getting their money's worth.

"The voices of average citizens have been drowned out in the Medicare debate by the enormous financial influence of the special interests who will profit if the current congressional overhaul becomes law," says Common Cause President Ann McBride.

"Political contributions should not play a key role in determining the future of our nation's health-care system for the elderly and disabled."

Unfortunately, they do and they are and probably will continue to do so. It's another reason for Congress to reform campaign finance law.

But if it means taking bread out of their baskets, what do you suppose the chances are of that happening?

Austin American Statesman on Whitewater and the Clintons:

The closer an election year gets, the more taxpayer money Congress spends on inquiries into charges of misconduct by prominent denizens of Capitol Hill. But the political timing doesn't mean the allegations are all concocted and shouldn't be probed. And it doesn't mean ignoring them will make them go away.

Which is why President and Mrs. Clinton ought to quit trying to hide behind legal technicalities in the Whitewater matter. ...

If there's nothing to hide, the Clintons need to quit acting as though there is. That's the only way to put Whitewater behind them.

Waco Tribune-Herald on flag amendment:

A demagogue, according to the American Heritage Dictionary, is "a leader who obtains power by means of making impassioned appeals to the emotions and the prejudices of the populace."

Demagoguery, then, perfectly describes the political posturing going on in the Senate on behalf of the senseless proposal to amend the Constitution to prohibit desecration of the U.S. flag. Flag desecration is a despicable act, but there are laws to deal with it in most cases - laws against theft, vandalism and inciting a riot.

Yes, desecrating the flag is offensive, but not as offensive as desecrating the Constitution by trying to dot the First Amendment with asterisks. If the flag doesn't stand for freedom to dissent, it stands for nothing.

Considering that there were only four flag burnings last year, it is sadly comical that this issue would command Senate-floor time. Meanwhile, a long list of ambassadorships, pending for months, goes undeliberated, among so much else.

Rather than honoring the flag, this proposed amendment cheapens it. It cheapens the Constitution. It cheapens Congress.

Other events scheduled to conclude the day's events include period crafts and food booths, and performances by the Village Band and the Cadence Cloggers to brighten the grounds with holiday cheer.

If it's a Cowboy Christmas you're interested in, then the place where cowboys were invented is definitely the place to be. Strut your stuff, your Stetson, and your western wear during Anson's annual Cowboy's Christmas Ball. Anson's first ball, which took place more than 100 years ago, was held in honor of a young cowhand's marriage. The affair became so popular that it grew into an annual holiday event. Each night couples who were married during the past year lead the Grand March in Pioneer Hall in City Park. Make sure you're dressed for the occasion, special recognition is given to those sporting the most authentic western wear. Anson is 25 miles north of Abilene.

Deeper in the heart of the Texas Panhandle, Lubbock celebrates the holidays with its Candlelight Christmas at the Ranch. This event is a celebration not only of the holidays, but of Lubbock's rich ranching heritage. This old-fashioned American West Christmas celebration takes place at Lubbock's Ranching Heritage Center, which is home to 30 historic ranching structures that provide a living history of the role ranching has played in this part of the country. Christmas in the 1800s will come to life as you walk pathways lighted with glowing luminaries, candles and kerosene lanterns. Docents dressed

in period clothes will guide you through historical structures decked with holiday lights and decorative garlands.

If you're looking for a Texas holiday celebration with a different twist, head to the Texas' beautiful Gulf Coast. Celebrate Corpus Christi's maritime heritage at Harbor Lights where lights will adorn downtown and the harbor areas. Discover how early Texans celebrated the Christmas season at the birth place of the Republic of Texas, Washington-on-the-Brazos State Historical Park, during the "Twas a 19th Century Christmas." Fun and adventure await, with folk dancing demonstrations, three-legged races, and challenging arm-wrestling matches.

Storytellers recount tales of Christmases past as you ride along the Brazos River aboard an old-fashioned wagon. Reserve your spot for a candlelight living history tour through the home of Anson Jones, Texas's final president.

Travel up Interstate 35 to the Metroplex area of Dallas/Fort Worth, for plenty of present-day Christmas fun and excitement! Don't miss Fort Worth's Zoobilee of Lights, where you'll see more than 300,000 twinkling white lights set to illuminate the Fort

Worth Zoo during the winter holiday season. A station will be provided for youngsters to make crafts like jingle bell necklaces and reindeer antler creations. Enjoy holiday snacks while watching puppet shows or listening to carolers fill the air with sweet melodies. Randall girls shut down Herd

Herd boys defeat Coronado in non-district hoops

The Randall Lady Raiders used a deliberate offense, physical defense and good free throw shooting to defeat the Hereford girls' basketball team 51-39 Friday in Whiteface Gym.

The Hereford boys got a quality non-district win in the first game of Friday's doubleheader, knocking off Coronado 62-57.

The Hereford girls fell to 1-1 (10-2 overall) after the District 1-4A showdown between state-ranked teams. Hereford is ranked 11th in Class 4A, while Randall (2-0, 10-3) is sixth.

The teams were close in the first half and Randall led 19-15 at the break. The Lady Raiders backed up its ranking in the third quarter, outscoring the Herd 16-5, including the final 13 points of the quarter.

Hereford's Julie Rampley completed a three-point play to pull Hereford within 22-20 at the 6:06 mark, but the Herd didn't score again in the quarter.

Randall got two treys from Sherry Bryant and one from Lindsay Gilmore - all of which were like daggers to Hereford because the Lady Raiders passed the ball around so many times, then didn't miss.

The Lady Whitefaces seemed frustrated by Randall's very deliberate offense.

"We've had this happen to us before against Nazareth," Herd coach Eddie Fortenberry said of his team's only other loss. "Even at that pace, we've still got to catch the ball, got to rebound, got to pass. We just turned the ball over. You can assess this one pretty quick: we played poor."

And Randall played pretty well. The Lady Whitefaces rarely got good shot opportunities.

"They did a pretty good job of pressuring the ball, and in turn, that forced us out of our offense," Fortenberry said. "Offensively, during the third and most of the fourth, we were out of sync."

"That's a credit to them, but also we didn't play well on the perimeter, which forced them to come out and play even tougher. They realized our guards were frustrated. They smelled blood, because they came after our guards and they really got frustrated."

Hereford never got closer than 12 in the fourth quarter. Randall hit 10-of-10 free throws in the quarter, while Hereford hit only 9-of-17.

Hereford's Misti Davis hit a trey at the buzzer for the 51-39 final score. Davis also hit a three from about 35 feet out to beat the first quarter buzzer and give Hereford a 9-8 lead - Hereford's only lead other than 2-0.

The lead changed hands several times in the boys' game. Coronado

led 15-10 at the end of the first quarter, but Hereford's Brian Torres outscored the Mustangs 10-4 to start the second and give the Herd a 24-19 lead. Torres was the beneficiary of a great defensive run by the Herd, as several steals - one by him - set him up for layup after layup.

"In the first quarter, we missed a lot of easy shots, and that's why we're down," coach Randy Dean said. "In the second quarter, the difference was we got turnovers and baskets off our defense. When we do that it seems to bring everything in sync."

Hereford took a 28-25 lead into halftime. Coronado came out hot in the second half, starting with a 13-6 run. Hereford's Michael High stopped the run with a dunk, then Cory Schumacher hit a trey for a 39-38 lead.

The lead switched three more times before the quarter ended with Coronado up 43-41.

The Mustangs got the first four points of the fourth, but Hereford answered with three-pointers by Ronald Torres and Schumacher.

"They leave two things open: the flash and the backside three," Dean said. "Ronald's three was a real bit shot at that point in the game."

Torres' shot broke Coronado's

momentum. Schumacher's started some momentum for Hereford: an 8-0 run by Hereford for a 52-49 lead, but Coronado's Robert Doty hit a trey to tie it.

That would be Coronado's last gasp. Brian Torres drove the baseline for a tie-breaking layup, then stole the ball at the other end. High took the ball the length of the court for a dunk and a 56-52 lead.

Coronado hit two free throws, but Hereford stayed ahead. Schumacher made a nice pass to Todd Dudley for a layup, then High hit two free throws with 16 seconds left for a 60-54 lead. CHS' Ryan Burke hit a trey, but the Herd's Isaac Walker sealed the win with a pair of free throws. Hereford improved to 6-7.

Hereford held Randall to two points in the first quarter, but Randall outscored Hereford 21-10 in the second half. The score was 30-30 at the end of regulation. Low number of pheasants spells trouble of Panhandle

AMARILLO, Texas (AP) - Opening day of pheasant season usually draws huge crowds of hunters to Sam's Restaurant in Dalhart, says owner Boog Wallace.

Not this year. Businesses in the Texas and Oklahoma panhandles are complaining that their annual hunter-driven economic surge didn't happen when the season opened Dec. 9. They attribute the bust to a big dropoff in birds.

"We used to sell 1,200 raffle tickets for a shotgun or something like that on opening day, but we didn't even sell 100 this year," Wallace said. "This restaurant seats 325, and we didn't even fill the main dining room."

Danny Swepton of the Parks and Wildlife Department says one survey showed a 32 percent decrease in the pheasant population from 1994 in the northern 56 counties of Texas. Swepton said the birds need something besides cotton as a cover crop.

Wallace says the pheasant

population has declined since 1990. "The word gets out downstate, and it hurts," he said. "We don't have any maize to speak of any more and we don't have enough ground water. The birds can't drink from sprinkler systems."

He and others say the state made a mistake in raising the limit from two birds to three.

Jess Nelson said the low pheasant count has slowed business in Guymon, Okla., too.

"I've talked to several motel owners, and they said they booked up on opening day, but many of the guests had canceled their last nights on the trip," said Nelson, who is the mayor. "We get a lot of hunters from out of state, so the word-of-mouth about the bird count this year almost certainly hurts."

And Jim Bradford of Dimmitt says the depleted hunting has hurt the Texas Panhandle.

"Between three years of drought, hail, the raccoons and skunks, I'm afraid we're just not having much of a year for pheasant hunting," he said.

Grizzlies stop long losing streak

In other NBA games, it was Orlando 111, Utah 99; Detroit 105, New Jersey 98; Boston 122, Toronto 103; Washington 122, the Los Angeles Lakers 114; Indiana 112, Milwaukee 95; Orlando 111, Utah 99; Cleveland 100, Minnesota 88; Sacramento 114, Houston 110; and Seattle 108, Golden State 101.

In overtime, Eric Murdock scored on a rebound and Reeves on a jumper before Ashraf Amaya made three foul shots and Reeves one. Vancouver also missed four foul shots in the extra five minutes, but held the Trail Blazers to just four points.

The Grizzlies made 28 free throws in the game to just 10 for Portland.

"Missed free throws and turnovers killed us," Portland coach P.J. Carlesimo said. "We let it slip down the stretch."

Murdock, starting for the first time

in place of injured Greg Anthony at point guard, had 14 points. Anthony Avent added 13.

Portland was led by Ron Strickland with 29 points. Cliff Robinson scored 19 and Buck Williams 17.

Magic 111, Jazz 99

Shaquille O'Neal's return from a broken thumb overshadowed a 24-point, 21-rebound night for Utah's Karl Malone at Orlando Arena.

Dennis Scott scored 26 points, Nick Anderson 17 and Anfernee Hardaway, who helped Orlando to a 17-5 record without O'Neal, had 16 points and 11 assists for the Magic.

Utah got 21 points from Chris Morris and 12 assists, but just seven points, from John Stockton, who missed his first seven shots and didn't score until midway through the fourth quarter.

Pistons 105, Nets 98

Grant Hill's second triple-double of the season led Detroit past New Jersey.

Hill finished with 19 points, a career-high 12 assists and 10 rebounds.

The Nets cut Detroit's lead to 93-89 with 6:25 to play, but the Pistons scored the next six points to clinch the game.

Allan Houston led the host Pistons with 22 points, while Joe Dumars had 20 and Otis Thorpe 19. Kevin Edwards had a season-high 26 for the Nets.

Celtics 122, Raptors 103

Coach Barnett promises he's staying in Evanston

EVANSTON, Ill. (AP) - Gary Barnett has tired of talk about his future as the Wildcats prepare for the Rose Bowl.

"Once and for all, I don't really want to say it again," Barnett said Friday before reiterating he's negotiating a long-term deal with Northwestern.

"I've laid it to rest. I'm not going to anymore. I've said it. That's all there is to it. It's the truth," Barnett said when pressed on the topic during a Rose Bowl media event.

"I'm negotiating in good faith. Right now I got a lot of other things to do than just negotiate because I feel like negotiating," he said.

Barnett, who's been collecting various coach of the year awards since the season ended, looked weary from long hours of travel. He said he doesn't want the speculation to affect his players and doesn't think it has.

"All year there has been a great deal of trust and respect between the coaches and the players. My players read what I said. They've seen my statement. They've heard my statements, and they trust me. That's about as far as it needs to go," Barnett said.

"The same speculation that is being thrown around now falls in the same category as preseason predictions, as far as I'm concerned. There isn't any more knowledge about the exact information in the preseason periodicals than there is in my particular case."

Many of the preseason publications thrown another season of doom for the Wildcats, who then won 10 of 11, their first winning season in 24 years.

Now the 49-year-old Barnett has been linked to major coaching vacancies across the country, and he even visited Georgia last weekend. Since then he has released two statements, one saying he was just visiting Bulldogs athletic director

Vince Dooley and seeing the facilities.

In the second statement, released Wednesday, Barnett said he was not a candidate for a vacancy at any school and was working on a new long-term contract.

Offensive lineman Justin Chabot said so far, through two days of practice, Barnett's future has not been a distraction. The team leaves for Pasadena on Sunday.

"It doesn't even come up. It's not taboo, but at the same time it's not important," said Chabot, Barnett's first recruit four years ago. "Really. We all feel comfortable the coach will stay."

Darnell Autry, a Heisman Trophy finalist who nearly left the school after last season because he was homesick, said he wanted Barnett to do what is best for him.

"It's not going to be a distraction," Autry said.

Utah picks on St. Thomas

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) - Another mid-December, another Utah patsy. This time, it was tiny St. Thomas of the NAIA that was the main course for the Runnin' Utes.

Coach Rick Majerus makes no apologies. He insists his players' academic performance is every bit as important as impressing pollsters, and this is finals week.

"I only book this game to win," Majerus said after this Utes rolled to an 87-63 victory over the outmanned Bobcats in college basketball's only game involving a Top 25 team Friday night. "I expect no less than nine guys on this roster to be on the honor roll."

In just 24 minutes of play, Utah star Keith Van Horn had his season-high of 29 points and 11 rebounds as

the Utes (6-1) won their sixth straight game. St. Thomas (3-6), from Miami, has lost six of seven.

Asked to grade his team's performance, Majerus proved just as unimpressed as he was unapologetic.

"We played liked we didn't practice for a week and had exams," Majerus quipped. "The only people I feel bad for is the fans."

Super coaches explain secret of their success

 IRVING, Texas - How former Cowboys coach Jimmy Johnson fixed his occasionally funk-burdened 1989-93 team is well-chronicled. An orchestrated tirade, a guarantee of victory, or the sudden human sacrifice of a meaningless backup player always did the trick during Johnson's back-to-back Super Bowl runs.

But what would Johnson do to make sure the present edition of the Cowboys, suddenly in a self-described funk despite a 10-4 record, stay on a Super Bowl course? What did other Super Bowl-winning coaches do when teams they felt were Super Bowl caliber were not playing up to par? Can a head coach make that much of a difference motivating today's players?

The Star-Telegram visited with three coaches who have won Super Bowls - ex-Cowboys coach Johnson, ex-Kansas City Chiefs coach Hank Stram and ex-San Francisco 49ers coach Bill Walsh - to explore those and other issues as they apply to leadership of today's Cowboys.

Q: When faced with a situation where a talented Super Bowl-caliber team is underachieving, how important is the role of the head coach?

Walsh: "It needs to be business as usual. You don't need a hysterical atmosphere. You have to be honest and direct with the team and with the public and the press. The head coach at this point is the critical factor. He's the single source in leadership. If players have respect, they'll respond. If they don't have respect, they'll unravel."

Stram: "One year, we were out of the race, but we had a big rivalry game with Houston. Well, one guy on the team went back into the training room and was talking to some other players, saying, 'What the hell do we need to win for? We're not in the playoffs.' A very negative thing."

"I called the team together and said it took a lot of guts to say something like that in front of people, and that the person should show the same guts and say it now. I'll never forget the silence in that room as I counted, '1-1,000, 2-1,000, 3-1,000.' I'll never forget the silence. '4-1,000, 5-1,000, 6-1,000.' Finally, a guy jumped up and said he'd said it. I told him, 'You're off the squad and I never want to see you again as long as I live.'"

"We beat Houston and won our

last three games, convincingly. That incident reminded us all of the loyalty it takes for a program to succeed. That was in '61. We won the AFL championship in '62."

Johnson: "I said this watching the Cowboys' loss to the Redskins: I said they didn't look inspired. I believe now they'll be inspired. There are methods that can be used."

Q: How much of the problem is the burden of expectations, the concept that a great team shouldn't have adversity?

Johnson: "Sometimes, you have to take that into consideration looking at this in personnel decisions. You've got to weigh if certain individuals, for instance, who are a bit free-wheeling, do more to hurt than to help. That's coaching, but that's also drafting."

Stram: "Motivation, focus, intensity, the competitive urge to succeed, these are hard to sustain for years and years. Plus, you go into games overconfident, against nondynamic teams, and the next thing you know, you're spending the week figuring out why you lost. That's just the nature of people."

Walsh: "There's no escaping some adversity. Winning every game is not critical, but improving every week is. And recovering immediately from losses is."

Stram: "Coach George Halas, one of the great Polish philosophers of our time, once told his Bears, 'We have proven we can stand adversity. Now let's prove we can stand success.' It's so true. Most people will handle adversity because it's so commonplace. It's tougher to handle success."

Q: When faced with these situations, what did you do? Crack the whip, or stroke egos, or give fire-and-brimstone speeches, what?

Stram: "Once, in Denver, it was halftime and we were getting killed. I said, 'Everybody you ever met in your lifetime is watching this game from all over world. You're wearing the arrowhead on your helmets, the red jerseys, the right names, but you're a bunch of damn impostors. And we're not playing the rest of this game with impostors.' I told them I'd hold up the purse (salaries) until I watched the film. 'If I see on film that you were an impostor, you'll have played this game for free.' We came back in the second half and won. Years later, Jan Stenerud asked me if I could really have not paid them. No, I couldn't have really done that. But it worked."

Johnson: "Any time our team was playing a team that was confrontational, I beat something into our players'

minds. I beat it into their minds that there were going to be some skirmishes, and that they'd look best in my eyes if they were the guys who walked away from the skirmishes and let the other team get the 15-yard penalty. The guy who gets on my bad side is the guy who shoves back."

Stram: "One time, as we were heading to a Super Bowl season, I had my trainer, Bobby Yarborough, go down to the five-and-dime store and buy \$15,000 worth of play money in a big bag. Before the game, I emptied it in the locker room. The guys couldn't tell it wasn't real and their eyes got as big as golf balls. 'Win the Super Bowl,' I said, 'and each one of you gets this much money!' Wow, you should have seen them."

Walsh: "If you are the same exact person day after day, players become too comfortable and you are no longer a resource. The great coaches, like Pete Newell, the great basketball coach of Cal - I'm a student of his style - possessed a tremendous sense of humor, and was close to his players. Yet he was a major taskmaster. The best coaches are unpredictable. The very best all have that."

Q: How can a coach turn a negative into a positive?

Johnson: "In Dallas, we once had some problems with penalties. So we hired a couple of officials and they came and worked all of our practices. I'm not saying that kind of thing helps everywhere. But that's what we did, and it worked."

Stram: "You can't use adversity as an excuse to lose. You've got to use it as a reason to win. We said going into the 1970 season that we might lose some people to injury along the way, and even if it's Buck Buchanan or Willie Lanier or Len Dawson, we've still got to win. Then we lost Lenny for six weeks. It was a severe blow, but we started Mike Livingston, the great athlete from SMU, and we won all six games. The team rallied around the loss of Lenny."

Walsh: "Humor can do it. I could get everybody laughing, and I don't mean with some traveling salesman joke. I'd stumble and fall, make myself the butt of the joke. I knew if I could get 'em laughing, I could get 'em serious."

Q: Did you ever sense that players thought you were a fake, or that they tired of your act?

Stram: "I never talked to the team without tape-recording the speech. I did it only because if you're not careful, you can be very, very

repetitious. At the end of the year, I categorized the speeches and filed them for future reference. Also, I got motivational speeches on tape from other great speakers, and played two or three minutes of it for the team. They loved it. It was famous speakers saying the same thing I'd said, but in a different way and with a different title."

Walsh: "You don't want to be a coach expecting your players to come flocking around like a shepherd with his sheep, waiting for the magical words. The atmosphere must be that they also demand of each other."

Johnson: "I've always been clear with people that I treat them consistently - consistently different. You have to have a plan to address each and every player. Which players do you take aside? Which do you take into your office for a talk? Which do you chew out in front of the team? Which do you talk to through the media? You have to have a plan."

Stram: "You think you have a captive audience. But they'll know if it's not real. Jimmy had his way. Tom Landry had his way. I had my way. (Vince) Lombardi was a scream-and-holler guy, and the Packers knew that's what he was like. Tom was very stoic. He screams and hollers, his players would say, 'What the hell happened to Tom?' You've got to believe in what you do, believe strongly. Players like that and respect it."

Q: If the coach is not a motivational type, or doesn't quite click with his players, can players with leadership qualities be relied upon to do it for themselves? And is that enough?

Stram: "The kind of team the Cowboys are, they have that kind of core. With free agency, you can buy all the players you want to, but you can't buy chemistry. You can't buy 'team.' A player finds somebody slipping, he's got to tell him that he's taking money out of 'my' pocket."

Walsh: "There is great leadership on the Cowboys, probably the best leadership in football. Troy Aikman in particular. Interestingly, almost all their greatest players are also great leaders."

Johnson: "This can be a problem. A player can be a leader. He can set himself up to chastise other players. But if he's chastising other players, that can cause a problem. I'm not saying that's what's happening (with the Cowboys). I'm saying if players are doing the job of the head coach, or the job of the enforcer, some players might resent that."

Walsh: "Some teams are strong enough to go without a coach and win. But remember during players' strikes, when we heard the rhetoric about players forming their own leagues? How disastrous that was! They couldn't even assemble to practice! They need authority. In Dallas, they can win because winning was already established before (Barry Switzer)."

Stram: "Ultimately, you are the coach. You got the chalk. You got the keys to the plane. You've got to make it fly."

Q: If you were in charge of this Cowboys team at this moment of supposed crisis, what would you do?

Walsh: "It's simple: hard work, concentration and as little dialogue as possible."

Stram: "People don't understand this about Barry Switzer, but you don't win like he won, with that consistency and those national championships and for all those years, without being a great coach. That's a given. This is a people business. He's a great people person. I think the world of Barry. I don't think he's got nearly the recognition he

deserves for the tough spot he was in, replacing Jimmy. I think Barry can push the right buttons."

Johnson: "I've talked to the (Cowboys) players ... In my conversations, they've said they feel their back is against the wall. Now, it's not, really. They're going to win the NFC East and have home-field advantage. But they've taken the position that their back is against the wall. They've challenged themselves. So the right button has already been pushed."

Cotton Bowl attracts little interest

 DALLAS (AP) - They'll be playing the Cotton Bowl in a couple of weeks and you wonder if anybody cares.

Certainly, the press box won't be jammed what with the grand old bowl's second-class status.

The press goes where the action is and Colorado versus Oregon isn't it. Texas is in the Sugar Bowl and Texas Tech is in the Copper Bowl and Texas A&M is in the Alamo Bowl. That's where sports editors will be sending their staffers from Texas newspapers. There are only a certain number of dollars in the budgets and a Buffalo-Duck scrum doesn't attract that big a readership following.

No Texas team in the Cotton Bowl hurts publicity matters. Of course, Southwest Conference football is dead and its representative to the New Year's Day game in Dallas along with

it. It just won't be a Cotton Bowl without an SWC team taking on some foreigner.

The foreigners had made winning a habit of late. The last SWC team to win a Cotton Bowl game was Texas A&M over Notre Dame in 1987. Still, the Cotton Bowl was selling out. Texas Tech against Southern California was a sellout hit last year. Nine of the last 10 Cotton Bowls were sellouts.

This time SWC champion Texas will be meeting Virginia Tech on Dec. 31 at the Superdome in New Orleans. The Sugar Bowl can't print tickets fast enough.

The Cotton Bowl needs to sell every ticket it can. And there are still over 10,000 ducats on the shelves.

Now, the Cotton Bowl has to depend on season-ticket renewals, corporate help and strong demand from Colorado and Oregon supporters.

There's usually not much of a walk-up sale on New Year's Day.

Oregon expects to sell about 11,000 tickets. Colorado is on line to get some 13,000 tickets. So, the Cotton Bowl has a good start to filling its 68,000 seats for the 12:38 p.m. kickoff.

The Cotton Bowl is classified as a Tier 2 bowl which means it won't have a game with the national championship on the line unless some changes are made. The national attention the bowl once commanded won't be there. There will be minimum national media attention.

The game will still be nationally televised but the bowl has lost its sponsor, the flying red horse, the Mobil Oil Co.

Mobil gave the Cotton Bowl a \$1 million divorce settlement, which will help with the many expenses the

Cowboys went downhill after last Giants game

IRVING, Texas (AP) - The first time Emmitt Smith touched the football this season he dashed 60 yards for a touchdown against the New York Giants.

It looked like it was going to be an easy year for the Cowboys, as Smith rolled up 163 yards and Dallas routed the Giants 35-0 on Monday Night Football.

Few critics thought the second game against the Giants on Sunday at Texas Stadium in the 15th week of the season would be a "must" win for the Cowboys, who have to win out to clinch the NFC East and a bye in the first round of the playoffs.

Dallas is 10-4 and tied with San Francisco for the best record in the NFC. However, the 49ers have the tiebreaker after beating the Cowboys, who are one game ahead of Philadelphia in the NFC East.

So much has happened to one of the favorites to win the Super Bowl

since that September evening when owner Jerry Jones paraded Nike president Phil Knight around the Meadowlands at halftime. The Giants were trying to honor Phil Simms at the same moment.

Jones and the Cowboys were sued for trashing NFL properties and Jones countersued. The matter is still in the hands of lawyers.

Almost overlooked in the first game of the season was the fact the Cowboys' best defensive back, cornerback Kevin Smith, tore an Achilles tendon and was lost for the season a day after he signed a big contract.

Then Deion Sanders was signed for \$35 million and the NFL said it was a salary-cap buster. The dispute was put in the hands of a special master and could go back to the courts.

The Valley Ranch soap-opera kept churning out the subplots. Troy Aikman got hurt, twice, but battled back. Emmitt Smith went down, but

got back up and played hurt again.

Leon Lett and Clayton Holmes were suspended by the NFL for substance abuse. Lett got a four-game suspension. Holmes got kicked out for the season.

The 38-20 loss to defending Super Bowl champion San Francisco was a shocker. It was almost a replay of the 38-28 NFC championship defeat in January. The game was over in a quarter thanks to Cowboys turnovers.

Former Dallas offensive coordinator Norv Turner beat his old team not once, but twice. After the first loss,

Charles Haley retired one day and came back the next. In the second loss, Haley hurt his back, retired, and went to California for surgery and apparently was lost for the season.

Then came last Sunday's shocker in Philadelphia, where coach Barry Switzer made what's referred to as "The Call." He went for it on fourth-and-1 and failed from the Dallas 29-yard line. Philadelphia kicked the game-winning field goal to win 20-17.

Jones was backing Switzer through

all the losses, saying the only way he wouldn't be coaching the Cowboys next year was "to get shot or hit by a truck."

Criticism poured down on Switzer's head this week. Giants coach Dan Reeves made a similar call and succeeded in a 20-13 win over Washington.

Asked the difference, Reeves said "I made it. He didn't."

"There's no respite from Monday morning quarterbacks around here," Jones said. "That's what makes it fun to be a Cowboy. Everybody is always

talking about us."

Critics will be talking about one of the biggest collapses in history if the 15-point favorite Cowboys don't beat the Giants on Sunday.

"This is a must win for us," said safety Darren Woodson. "Our confidence will be shot going into the playoffs if we don't win this game. We have to have it. We don't want to be a wild-card team. We still control our own destiny."

But the way this season has gone, the Cowboys haven't been destiny's darlings.

Esiason gives veteran guidance to green Jets

HOUSTON (AP) - Boomer Esiason hopes he has fewer titles next season, especially if he's still with the New York Jets.

"Right now, I'm a little bit of coach, psychologist and player all rolled into one," Esiason said. "That's certainly not an easy role to be playing, but it's one I don't take lightly."

On a team with 14 rookies and first year players, Esiason, at 34, has become a father figure, shepherding the younger players through a rugged season of inconsistency.

Esiason will try to get the Jets (3-11) kids through two more games beginning Sunday against the Houston Oilers (5-9) in what likely will be the last NFL game played in the Astrodome before the Oilers' expected move to Tennessee.

The Oilers have their own youth movement with three rookie starters, including No. 1 pick Steve McNair, who was impressive enough against Detroit last week, to earn his first NFL start.

"I think it's going to be an exciting time if this is the last game, for people to come out and see Steve," Oilers coach Jeff Fisher said. "He stimulated the Astrodome last week and hopefully he can do it for four quarters this week."

The Jets' rookie review centers around three players on offense. Wide receiver Wayne Chrebet set the club rookie record with 57 catches. Tight end Kyle Brady and guard John Bock also are starters. On defense, end Hugh Douglas has been a sensation with 10 sacks.

"I probably have more experience than everyone combined on our offense," said Esiason, a 12-year veteran. "In some respects, it's quite fulfilling when you see players like Wayne Chrebet and Adrian Murrell (a third-year running back) put up numbers and set new marks. I feel

very good about that."

Murrell is on course to become the fourth Jets player to lead the team in rushing and receiving. He has 62 catches for 453 yards and two touchdowns and he's rushed 752 yards on 182 carries for one touchdown.

"I probably have the youngest team in the NFL," coach Rich Kotite said. "A lot of young players got a lot of good experience this year and they are our investment in the future."

"Murrell has emerged as a formidable rusher. We throw a lot of our backs and he's caught a number of balls. He's becoming more of a complete player, learning to play four quarters."

Murrell has a pinched nerve in his shoulder and may not play against the Oilers. He would be replaced by Ronald Moore.

Rodney Thomas, the Oilers' leading rusher, and wide receiver Chris Sanders also are rookie starters.

McNair and Sanders demonstrated a bright pass-catch future with a 39-yard touchdown pass play in last week's 24-17 loss to Detroit. But the Jets will be ready for McNair.

"I expect the Jets to continue with their game plan and that is to blitz," Fisher said. "He's facing the No. 1 pass defense in the NFL, a defense that's going to pressure him, that's going to rush him. It'll be a big test for him."

Fisher liked enough of what he saw of McNair in two quarters against the Lions to allow him to rest Chris Chandler, still weakened by mononucleosis.

"Being a young quarterback, they're going to blitz and come after me," McNair said. "We have to be focused and know what we're doing. I just can't get caught up in the emotion of the game."

McNair gave the Oilers a chance to win against the Lions until the last second of the game, when he threw incomplete into the end zone.





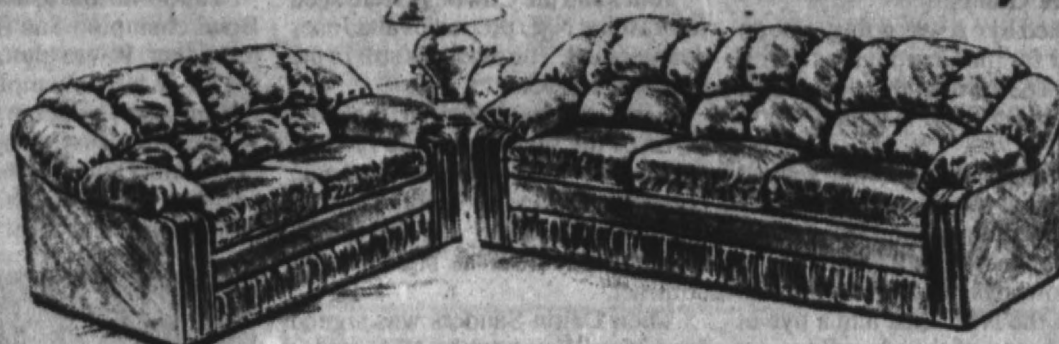

Castro County since 1955 and has been involved with agriculture for most of his life.

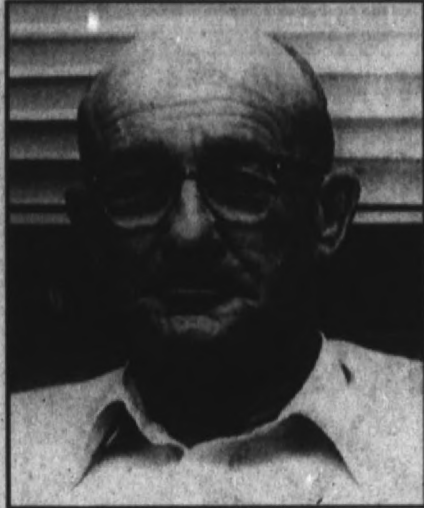
He formed the grower association in 1971, and was involved in the establishment of TCPB in 1980.

Lois Wales of Dimmitt has also resigned her post as assistant executive director. She will remain as one of the 15 elected TCPB directors.

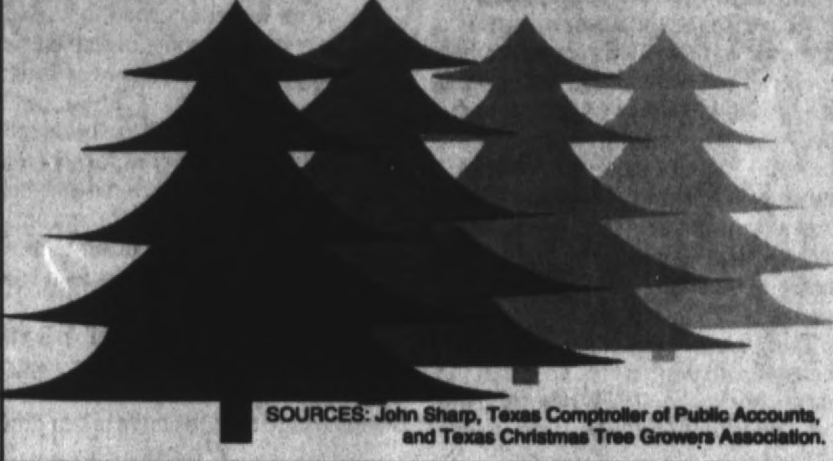

Texas has 350 commercial Christmas tree farms, with 3,370 acres, primarily in northeast Texas, producing 400,000 trees annually. As they grow, each acre of Christmas trees provides oxygen for 18 people and a natural habitat for wildlife. Last year, Texas Christmas tree growers contributed \$20 million to the Texas economy.

New Mexico releases VS horse quarantine

The New Mexico animal health authorities have released their state's last quarantine for vesicular stomatitis (VS). Kentucky officials also have reopened their doors to Texas livestock, after shutting off shipments in mid-summer, due to the disease.

A viral infection, VS causes affected livestock, particularly horses, to develop blisters in and around the mouth, nose and teats, and above the hooves.

Dr. Terry Beals, head of the Texas Animal Health commission (TAHC), announced that a veterinarian's "VS" statement is no longer required on health papers for livestock coming from New Mexico.

The statement had been required since early summer on certificates of veterinary inspection to indicate that animals were not showing symptoms, known to be exposed, or traveling from a VS-quarantined area.

Beals said dropping the require-

ment will make it easier for West Texas ranchers and livestock market operators to conduct trade with New Mexico producers.

Kentucky animal health officials have reopened their doors to livestock from Texas and Arizona. However, horses, mules, donkeys and other equine from the two states must be tested negative for VS within 30 days before entering Kentucky.

Since mid-summer, Kentucky has embargoed livestock from states affected by VS. This summer, Texas and Arizona each had a confirmed case; in Texas, a rodeo horse from McCaulley, near Abilene, contracted the disease after being hauled to events in New Mexico and Colorado.

The quarantine was released in late August. In October, a horse in Henderson County was quarantined, but released after laboratory results could not be reproduced.

On Monday afternoon, December 18, we will have the scales set up at the Bull Barn to weigh hogs and lambs. This will be an excellent opportunity to bring your animals in and get them weighed. We will begin at 4 p.m. and expect to finish weighing around 8 p.m.

Bringing your animals to the weigh session will help in getting them used to being hauled, as well as provide an opportunity to visit with the County Extension Agents and

Project Leaders about your animal's progress.

There will be a shearer on hand to shear the lambs. It would be a good idea for most of you to get your lambs shorn at this time so that you can monitor their growth in the few weeks before the Project and County Shows. It is much easier to evaluate their condition without their wool. If you are going to get them shorn be sure that you have blankets available.

Due to the hectic schedules of everyone during the holidays and the stock show season, it is highly recommended that you take advantage of this opportunity to weigh and evaluate your animals with your Project Leaders.

Extension Service will conduct Women's management course

The Texas Agricultural Extension Service will begin offering the first sessions of the Women in Agriculture: Business Management Program.

The program is designed to help farm and ranch women develop their business management knowledge and abilities.

The management program is geared toward farm and ranch women working on or off the farm, as well as women who run their own farm or ranch business.

The workshops will address the production management aspects of specific crop and livestock enterprises.

After pilot testing several alternative formats, the complete program will be divided into three units.

Each unit will involve two full days of instruction beginning at noon on Day 1 and ending at noon on Day 3.

The units are designed to be taken in three successive years. However, the initial group will be polled to determine if they would prefer a more compressed time frame.

Enrollment is limited. Two sessions of unit 1 will be offered in

1996. The first will be held at the North Hilton in Austin on January 31-February 2 and the second at the Holiday Inn civic center in Lubbock on February 21-23.

In addition to the formal session during the day, there will be optional participant roundtables/panels available each evening for those who wish to participate. These are intended to allow the participants to share experiences, insights and concerns in an informal discussion format.

Registration for each unit is \$175 per person. It covers all seminar materials, breaks and lunches for the first and second day. Lodging is not included.

In addition to strengthening management skills, the program can also help prepare participants for the uncertainties of the future. It is widely recognized that farming and ranching is a high risk industry.

Wheat projected to be off 10 million bushels

WASHINGTON (AP) - Supplies of U.S. wheat going into the spring 1996 harvest are projected to be off by 10 million bushels from last month's estimate, the Agriculture Department says.

The drop in the forecast occurred because lower food use only partially offset a 15-million-bushel reduction in imports, the department said.

The projected price range is \$4.25 to \$4.45 per bushel.

Global wheat production, consumption and ending stocks for the year that began June 1 also were down slightly from the November estimates. The department said a reduction of 2.5 million tons in Russia's wheat crop was the reason.

USDA's estimate of corn supplies going into next year's summer and fall harvest is unchanged from last month. An increase of 50 million bushels in expected exports is offset by a similar reduction in feed and residual use, the department said.

Prices are expected to remain unchanged in the range of \$2.95 to \$3.35 per bushel.

USDA forecasts similar conditions for sorghum, with projected ending stocks for the year that began Sept. 1 unchanged from last month. The

price range for sorghum, however, increased by 10 cents on the low and high ends to a range of \$2.95 to \$3.35 per bushel.

The projected price range for barley is also up by a similar amount to a range of \$2.70 to \$3.00 per bushel.

For rice, projected exports of long-grain rice for the year that began Aug. 1 are down 100,000 tons from last month, which would create a larger supply of ending stocks.

The export forecast was lowered, USDA said, because of higher-than-expected prices and lower-than-expected export sales so far this year.

The 1995-96 price range for rice was raised 25 cents on each end to \$7.25 to \$8.25 per 100 pounds.

Worldwide, rice production, consumption and ending stocks for the year are projected higher than November's forecast, with larger crops in Bangladesh, China, Cambodia and Iraq more than offsetting smaller crops in Brazil and South Korea, USDA said.

Christmas '95 is far cry from 1994 holiday

EDITOR'S NOTE - Roy Jones worked with Tom Hargrove in 1965 when Hargrove covered agriculture for the Reporter-News, and they have corresponded throughout the years.

ABILENE, Texas - The blood drained from Tom Hargrove's dirt-encrusted face as one of his Colombian kidnapers reloaded an Israeli automatic assault rifle and put the muzzle to the back of his head.

Stoned on a deadly combination of cocaine and cheap brandy, the teen-age guerrilla commander had already fired several bursts into the air, and the muzzle was hot. He continued to curse insanely and blame Hargrove for the fact that he was having to hide out high in the cold, wet Colombian Andes mountains and endure such miserable hardships.

"You're miserable?" Hargrove thought to himself. "I'm the one you kidnapped and brought up here! At least you have a warm, dry bed and plenty to eat! I'm the one you're freezing and starving, and for no earthly reason."

Wisely, the 50-year-old Rotan native and former Abilene Reporter-News farm editor kept his thoughts to himself. Why infuriate his captor more? A single word might just push him over the edge, Hargrove reasoned.

Still, Hargrove said, "I feared I was about to be executed."

Later on in his captivity he wouldn't have cared. But 28 days into the ordeal, Hargrove wasn't ready to die.

He closed his eyes and breathed a prayer to a God he hadn't been particularly close to for years.

Suddenly, another rifle burst split the air. Hargrove flinched, his ears rang and his hunger-weakened legs crumpled beneath him. Within seconds, however, he realized he'd not been shot - only cruelly, mentally tortured once again.

"At the last moment he pulled the muzzle up and shot over my head through the roof," Hargrove explained.

The captive never knew why he was spared, however. Less than two hours later, Hargrove said, the 16-year-old commander "put the muzzle of the Galil under his chin, turned it to full automatic and pressed the trigger with his thumb. It got off

three rounds through the top of his head. He was dead before he hit the ground."

Hargrove dubbed the guerrilla camp, "The Valley of the Shadow of Death."

While it may have been his closest call with death, Hargrove was to experience much worse mental torture over the next 10 months - so much so that, at times, death would have been a welcome relief.

Hargrove, a 1962 graduate of Rotan High School who was working as an agricultural scientist in Colombia, was eventually released after his family had paid not one, but two ransoms.

His life, and those of his family members, will never be the same.

Now Hargrove is letting those outside his immediate family know what he went through. The diary that he kept so meticulously throughout his captivity has been published in book form by The Ballantine Publishing Group, a division of Random House.

Essentially, it is a diary, rather than a book. The 334 pages (coincidentally, the same number of days he was held hostage) are actually the lightly-edited transcripts of the voluminous notes Hargrove made and hid on his body throughout his captivity.

Released earlier this month, it is titled "Long March to Freedom: Tom Hargrove's Own Story of His Kidnapping by Colombian Narco-Guerrillas."

Now that he's had nearly four months to reflect on his ordeal, Hargrove says, "I wish I had named (the book) 'The Valley of the Shadow of Death' instead."

"People ask me how I managed to write a book in such a short time (it was published within three months of his release)," Hargrove said from his home in Granbury. "I tell them I worked on it for a year."

"Really, it's not much writing for a year because I had to conserve paper and I didn't know when I'd have a pen or pencil."

"I was obsessed with the diary. That's about the only thing that kept me going at times," Hargrove said.

"The only thing selfish that I prayed for, other than to get out alive, was to get out alive with the diary. It was the only thing that made any sense to me out of the whole experience."

He scribbled the notes on what he happened to have in his pockets when he was jerked from his car at gunpoint on Sept. 23, 1994, near Cali, Colombia - checks and deposit slips from his First National Bank of Rotan checkbook - and in two children's notebooks his first commander had given him. Hargrove had convinced him he needed them so that he could practice his Spanish.

Two factors - either strokes of luck or answers to prayer - ensured that the diaries survived: (1) When the first commander committed suicide, no one

else knew he had the notebooks, and (2) his teen-age captors never once did a body search after the initial capture, although they frequently went through his meager, scrounged belongings in his cell. Often they stole items just to add to the mental torture, Hargrove said.

"If they had ever gotten my diaries, I think that would have been it, the last straw," said Hargrove, who often considered suicide in his despair.

He was so concerned he made back-up copies of many journal entries just in case the guerrillas ever found one.

He learned later that the hundreds of letters he wrote to his family and friends - which the guerrillas had promised to mail - were actually burned. Copies of some unsent letters are in the book. Christmas as a free man

Tom Hargrove can remember some great Christmases growing up in Rotan, and with his family in other interesting places where his jobs have taken him.

But nothing will ever compare with this Christmas, he said. Below his signature on his Christmas cards he adds, "Christmas 1995, as a free man!"

Last Christmas season he was held in solitary confinement in a four-by-six-foot, windowless, bamboo cell for up to 48 hours at a time. The final humiliation was a 15-foot chain around his ankle that kept him from going to a stream to wash up during the two or three hours a day he was sometimes allowed outside.

"I was in chains for 2 1/2 months," he said.

He never knew for certain whether it was orchestrated mental torture or just a basic, cultural lack of compassion, but his teen-age guards might be friendly and helpful one day, menacing and vindictive the next.

During the early days of his captivity, he was allowed to exercise by playing soccer with the guards, and sometimes they even let him fish for trout in a mountain stream. Later

on the captors might dine on trout and give him only the meatless head, if anything at all. Sometimes he had only the bones to eat.

Early on he was allowed to bathe in the stream every week or so. But after he was falsely accused of being a colonel in the U.S. Army and a counterintelligence officer (he'd actually been a lieutenant in Vietnam and had been discharged from the Army 25 years before) he was not allowed to bathe for up to 4 1/2 months at a time.

If the guerrillas butchered a cow they might give him more steak than he could eat, but then would steal and throw away anything he tried to hide and save for the days they didn't feed him. When he was released, his gray hair and beard had turned orange due to malnutrition and vitamin deficiency.

Hargrove made it a point of never crying in front of his captors, but he admits sobbing many times privately in his despair.



Hints from Heloise

Dear Heloise: I recently got a cute little dog and was told to make sure he gets all his shots, including one for Lyme disease. I've heard about that disease but know nothing about how a dog can get it and what to look for.

I'd appreciate any information you can give me. -- Audrey Bauer, Elmont, N.Y.

Lyme disease is transmitted by ticks. A dog runs who runs around areas with high grass and trees may be at risk of getting Lyme disease, especially in the northeast. There is a vaccination for it, so check with your veterinarian to see what's recommended in your area.

The ticks feed on the blood of white-tailed deer and the white-footed mice. They're very tiny, pea-sized and very hard to spot, but their bite causes a small red, circular-type rash.

Check your dog's face, neck and around the ears, as they are the most common areas the ticks are found.

Some symptoms of infected animals are loss of appetite, fever, depression, pain or lameness. If any of these occur, take your pet to the veterinarian. A blood test is given to diagnose Lyme disease.

The American Veterinary Medical Association says after the initial vaccination, a booster and yearly vaccinations should be given. -- Heloise

Dear Heloise: Here's an excellent tip for young and old.

A friend mentioned how she prepares for visits with her doctor. Prior to the appointment, she writes a letter to her doctor, listing all the things she specifically needs to talk about at her appointment and the medications she is taking.

They discuss each item and then the doctor highlights each thing as they discuss her needs.

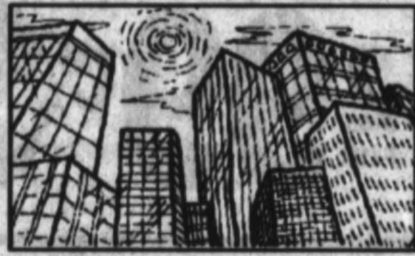

ANSWER: A quarter-cup of dry milk — which makes a liquid cup — has a tad less vitamin A and vitamin C than a cup of whole milk. Dry milk has about the same calcium content and a bit more potassium than whole milk.

ANSWER: Electrocardiography detects some heart problems, especially heart rhythm irregularities. Through interpretation of the graph patterns you might identify deficiency of coronary artery flow to the heart or heart enlargement.

You might look at the packages for details. I would not specify one brand over another. All should be created nutritionally equal in the eyes of those who check such things.

Other testing has been devised with great value in various applications. The stress test is a continuing electrocardiogram (EKG) reading taken while exercising to show things such as deficiency in coronary artery flow relative to the heart's demands.

New visualization techniques have emerged since X-ray technology. Echocardiography provides sound-wave pictures of the heart, making possible early diagnosis of such things such as abnormal valves.

The EKG remains to this day a reliable workhorse. You can find it in virtually every conceivable medical setting.

As to your husband's blood cholesterol: The 5.2 figure reflects a ratio of total cholesterol to high-density lipoproteins, the good kind of cholesterol. A good ratio is 4.5 or lower. But 5.2 is not something that should send your husband into orbit. He could stand some more HDLs, though.

He might initiate a regular exercise program. That's a good way to raise the HDL level and lower that 5.2 figure.

Had you furnished the specific numbers for total cholesterol and HDLs, I could have been a bit more precise.

MINDING YOUR OWN BUSINESS

GUT-WRENCHING FEAR

The room was nearly dark and I was scared. I might have made a run for it, but I wasn't sure I could get away. My heart was pounding and my hands were sweaty.

The voice held me riveted to the spot. I couldn't move. A shiver ran down my spine. My knees were weak. I whispered a silent prayer to God to ask for his help. "Please let me survive," I pleaded.

Then suddenly, the introduction was over and I was on. Yes, being a professional speaker brings high levels of gut-wrenching fear. According to communication experts, the fear of speaking in public is the No. 1 fear among adults.

For me the fear is real and so was the scene I just described. It happened to me just weeks ago as I made my

first keynote speech in the big-leagues. The crowd numbered in the thousands and I was using a brand new technology. I was the keynote speaker and fear filled my soul.

Why punish yourself?

Why would anyone subject themselves to fear or stress? Why not just avoid speaking situations and skip the hassle?

I can't answer for others, but I can tell you why I do it. There is a rush of adrenaline that wipes away all fear when "you're on." It's a natural, safe high that is a greater reward than the risk of making mistakes or the fear of failing. In addition, you get to meet wonderful people, it's clean work and it pays pretty well.

There's another reason I do it. Overcoming fear, learning to use stress in a positive way and building skills in this area is a long-time goal of mine. Doing what frightens you - overcoming your fears - builds character and strengthens your inner person.

How to speak like a pro

Here are four quick tips for overcoming your speaking phobia and building your skills:

• **Know your subject and believe what you say.** To be effective, you must know your topic. You must have lived it, been there and done that, or you must research it thoroughly. When you know more about any topic than other people do, you become the expert. Folks want to hear what experts have to say.

You also have to believe what you say. You can use clever quotes and catchy phrases, but if you don't know your subject and believe what you're saying, you may appear

insincere.

• **Know your audience.** If you are going to relate to your listeners you'll need to know all you can about them. What do they do, where do they live and work, what do they have in common and what are they expecting from you?

Whatever your goal is as a speaker - to entertain, inform or persuade - you'll only achieve success if you connect with your audience. You should customize every presentation with your audience's needs in mind.

• **Practice and time every presentation.** Nothing shouts "amateur" any louder than a speaker with no sense of time. If you are asked to speak for one hour, speak for an hour. If you are to present for 30 minutes and give the audience 10 minutes for questions, do just that.

Practicing your presentation will help you know the material, eliminate awkward phrases and transitions and allow you to time each part of your speech. Then as you present, you can check your timing as you go.

Using these four techniques will not make the fear go away. However, when you are ready and know you are, you can overcome the fear. Then one day you will reach your audience and the thrill will come. That's when you'll realize that the reward is worth the risk.

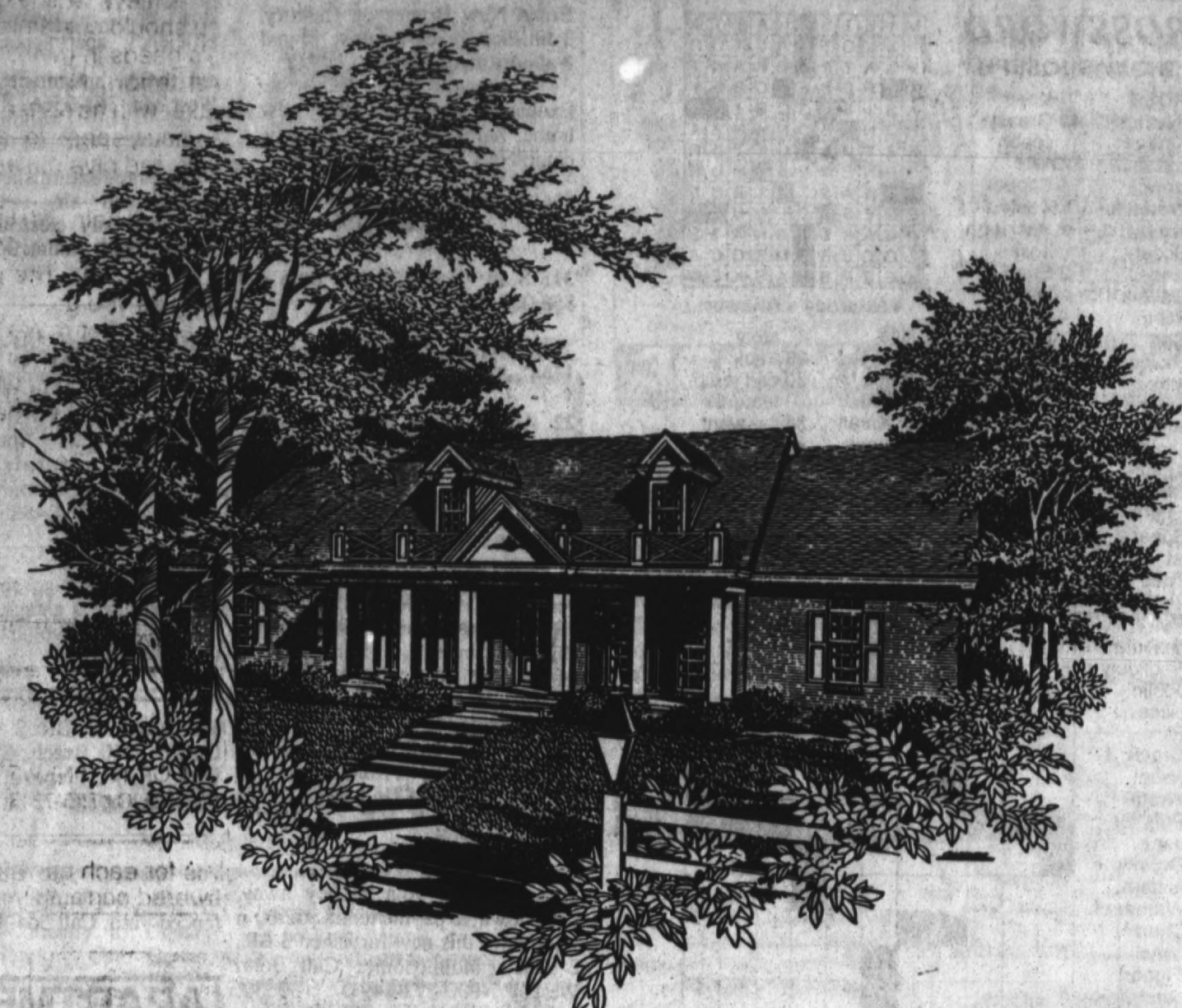

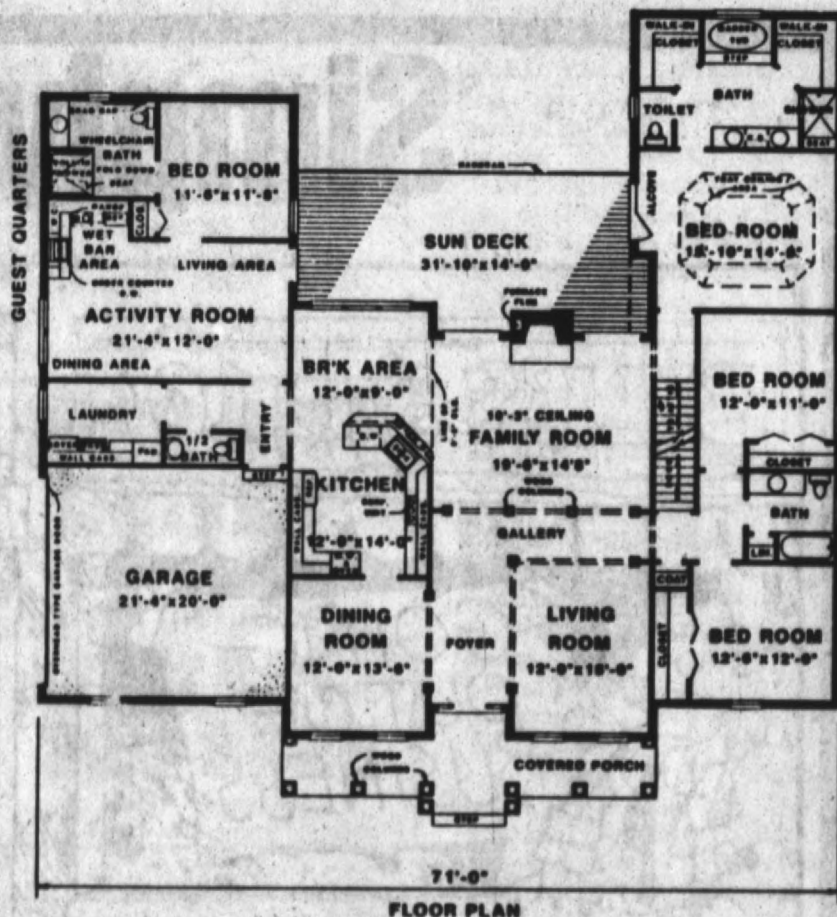

Hydronics heating system uses circulating hot water

Hydronics is an up-to-date heating system that uses hot water from a boiler to circulate through heating units to make all rooms in a home comfortable. The boiler may be steel, copper or cast iron. The heating units are usually baseboard, but sometimes radiators or convectors are used.

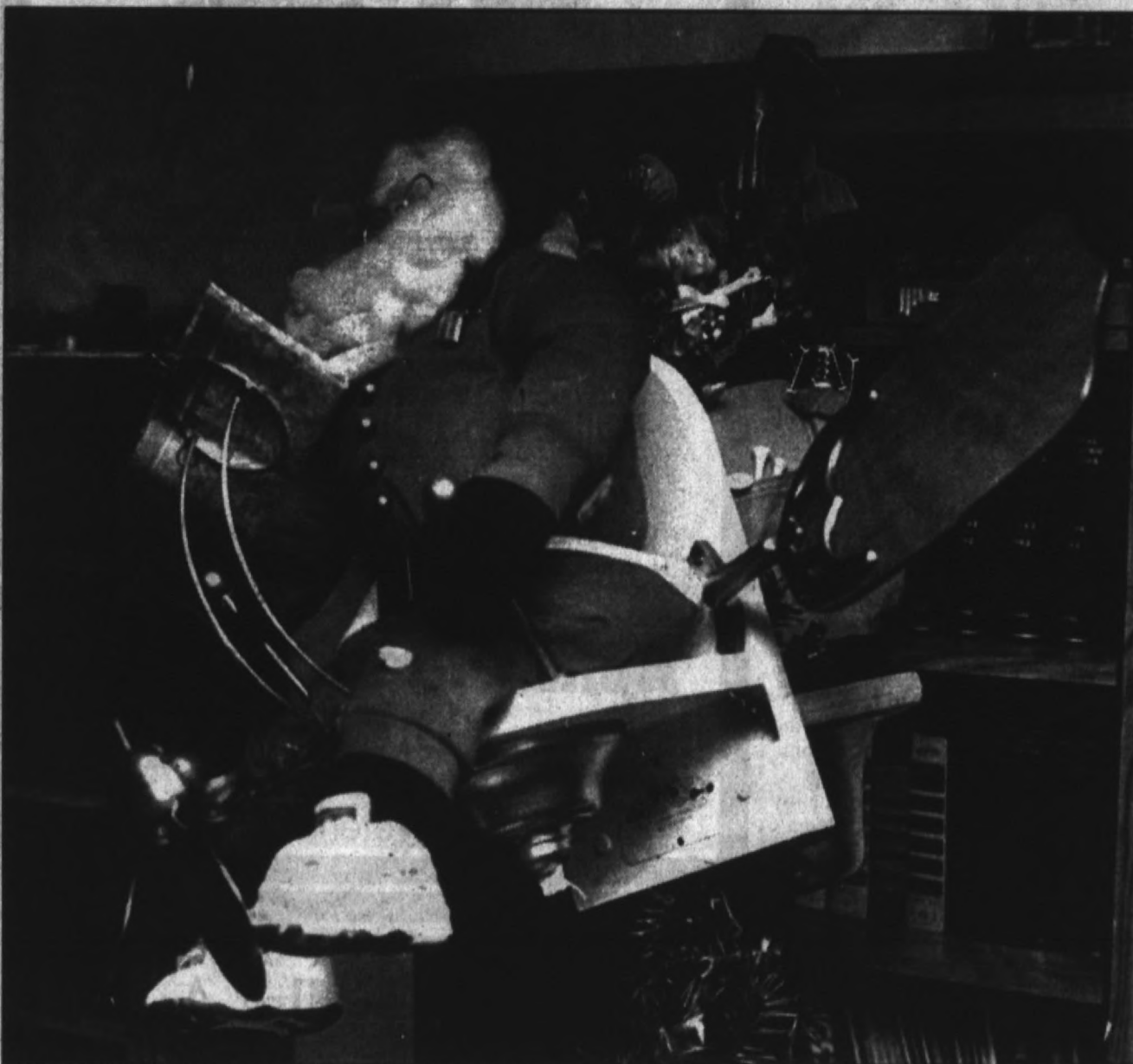

Best-selling Christmas Box becomes a TV movie

Beloved as Christmas is, there aren't very many real-life paradigms of Christmas stories.

Of course there are the biblical Nativity story itself, Charles Dickens' *A Christmas Carol*, Clement Moore's "A Visit From St. Nicholas" and O. Henry's "The Gift of the Magi."

To judge from the many film versions of *A Christmas Carol*, plus the countless celluloid variations on the conversion theme, such as *It's a Wonderful Life* and *Miracle on 34th Street*, audiences (those foot-weary shoppers who flop nightly in front of the television) are hungry for reminders of the holiday season's purer motives.

This year's rendition of the old theme comes in *The Christmas Box*, an adaptation of the current *New York Times* best seller by Richard Paul Evans. The TV movie airs Sunday, Dec. 17, on CBS. Richard Thomas and Maureen O'Hara (*Miracle on 34th Street*) star, with Annette O'Toole and Kelsey Mulrooney.

"Of course we hope this will become a twin to *Miracle on 34th Street*," O'Hara says, "and that you'll get this movie and *Miracle* every Christmas from now on." It's a plan any Madison Avenue marketer would raise an egg-nog toast to.

In fact, as conversion stories go, *The Christmas Box* sits one shelf above *34th Street*.

Box is the story of a struggling couple in Salt Lake City (Thomas and O'Toole) who answer a classified ad placed by a wealthy, elderly woman (O'Hara) looking for live-in companions to do light work around her house. After living in two cramped rooms with their growing daughter (Mulrooney), Richard and Keri are glad for the chance to occupy fur-

nished quarters in Mary Parkin's Victorian mansion.

In a house filled with treasures, Mary's most prized possession is an antique Bible, from which she reads every day.

Shortly after moving into the house, Richard begins to dream of an angel that turns to stone as it descends to earth, and during the night he thinks he hears music coming from a carved wooden box in the attic. But his small business in town clamors for his attention, and Richard tries to brush aside his nocturnal experiences.

O'Hara decided to play Mary as a kind of gadfly to Richard's complacency, rather than as the benign friend the book describes her to be.

"Well, in the book, she's very sweet and nice," the actress acknowledges. "But she's not, in the movie. She's a very domineering, wants-her-own-way, tough old girl. She's lonely - not nasty, but tough - and has instant likes and dislikes.

"And instantly I dislike Richard Thomas, in the story. And we have a great ongoing animosity between us."

That tension is resolved in the movie's climactic scene, which O'Hara promises is a bona fide tear-jerker.

"We tease everybody and tell them that when they see the movie they should have a box of tissue, too.

"The wonderful thing is," she says, "there's no rape, there's no murder, there's no incest, there's no killing, there's no wrecked cars.

"It's just a wonderful, warm, family story about love, love of each other and the acceptance of God. And after all, Christmas is the celebration of the birth of Christ."

And that, in a roasted chestnut shell, is the message of *The Christmas Box*.

Amazing Animal Facts

The animal kingdom is incredible. There are countless unique and interesting species. Here are just a few:

No Monkey Business: Apes are the closest living animals to humans. We have the same kind of skeleton, share the same kind of blood and catch many similar diseases.

Scientists believe that people and apes have evolved from the same ancestors millions of years ago.

Flights of Fancy: The albatross is a large seabird that spends most of its time in the air over oceans. They've been known to follow ships for hundreds of miles, picking up the scraps of food thrown overboard.

Man's Best Friend: Dogs are nearsighted and can only see a few colors, but their sense of smell is superior. It is thousands of times more keen than that of humans.

Mighty Mice: One mouse can have 40 babies a year, and when the young are just 12 weeks old, they themselves can breed.

Just Hanging Around: Sloths have a reputation as being very lazy animals. They sleep for about 19 hours a day, and when they do move, it is only at a speed of about six feet a minute.

Proper Pigs: Despite their reputation, pigs are clean animals. They wallow in mud to protect themselves from the sun's heat and from infestations by lice and other parasites to which they are particularly vulnerable.

Going Batty: Bats fly like birds, but are really mammals. In fact, they are the only mammals known to

fly. Their wings do not have feathers, but are made of a thin sheet of skin stretched between long bones.

Something Fishy: Most animals that live in the sea stay above 650 feet. Below this, there is little life because no sunlight gets down that far.

However there are some deep sea fish that have adapted quite well. The deep sea angler and the lantern fish, for example, give out light of their own!

Dieters' Delight: During a seven month period, the 132-ton sperm whale can lose up to 25 percent of her body weight nursing her calf.

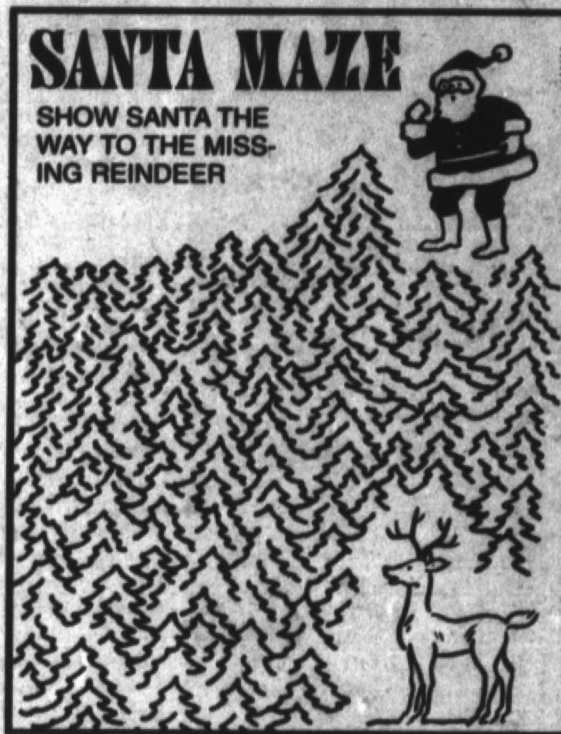
All Eyes: The Atlantic Giant Squid has the largest eye of any animal, measuring up to 15 inches in diameter.

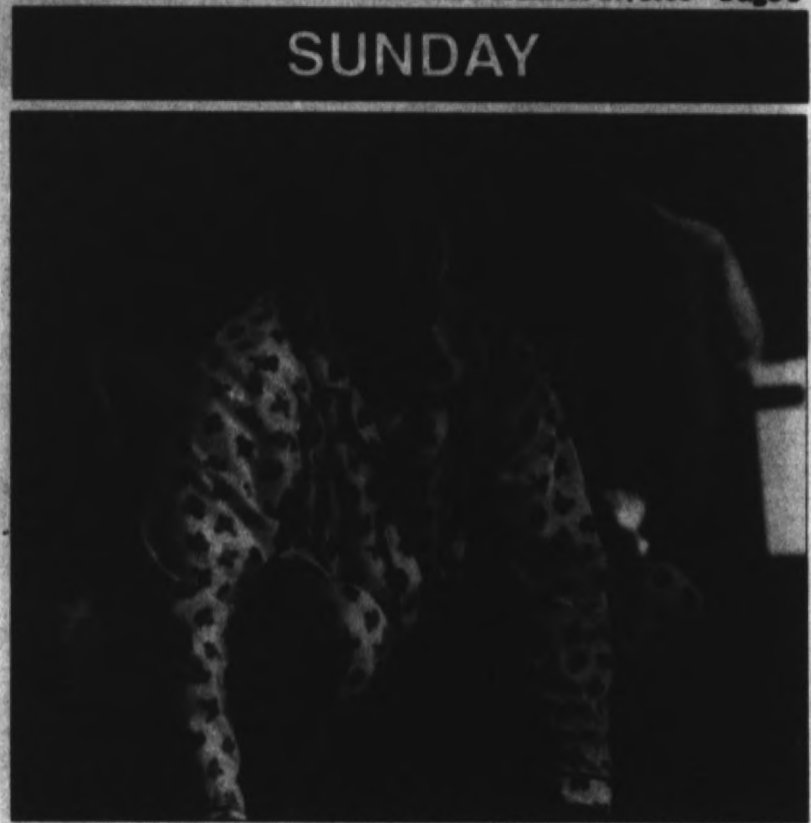

Holiday programs abound during Christmas countdown

Regardless of whether the weather outside is frightful, delightful holiday programming abounds on prime-time television during the last full week before Christmas. Here's an overview:

Maureen O'Hara makes a rare TV appearance playing a widow who - that's right - teaches a family the meaning of Christmas in *The Christmas Box*, a CBS movie premiering Sunday, Dec. 17. NBC takes a less sentimental approach that night with Chevy Chase's buffoonish antics in *National Lampoon's Christmas Vacation*, and A&E Network presents *Holiday at Pops!*, a live holiday concert by the Boston Pops Orchestra.

Beginning Monday, Dec. 18, The Family Channel airs Franco Zeffirelli's *Jesus of Nazareth* over four consecutive nights, while Nick at Nite offers holiday episodes of vintage TV series in its special weeknight *Nick at Night Before Christmas* programming. TBS offers a double bill of *A Christmas Story* and the 1992 remake of *Christmas in Connecticut*.

Kathie Lee: Home for the Holidays

makes its CBS debut Wednesday, Dec. 20, the same night that TNT gives another airing to *How the Grinch Stole Christmas*.
