Seven of the 11 components of the index advanced, led by slower business delivery times that usually are a sign of increasing orders. Other advances were higher raw material prices, a growing inventory of durable goods,
a higher index of consumer expectations, higher stock prices, more orders for consumer goods and more business orders for plant and equipment. On the negative side were more weekly initial claims for unemployment
insurance, a shorter average work week, smaller money supply and fewer insurance, a shorte.
