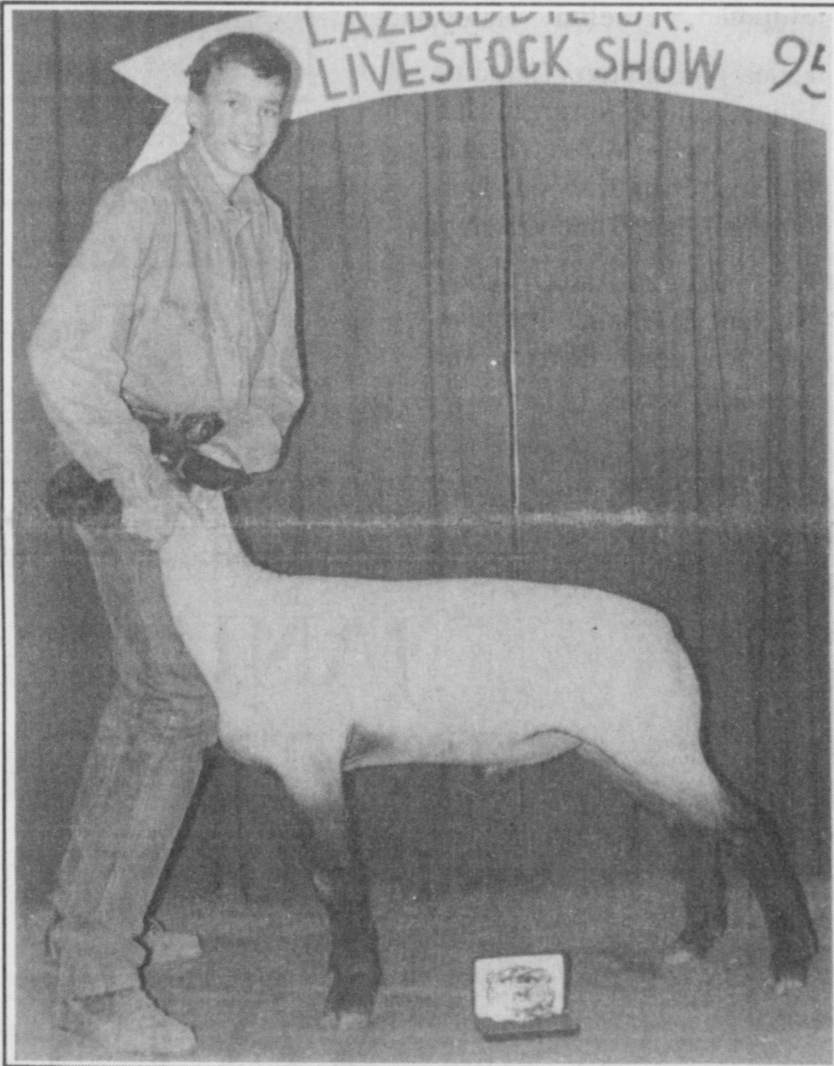

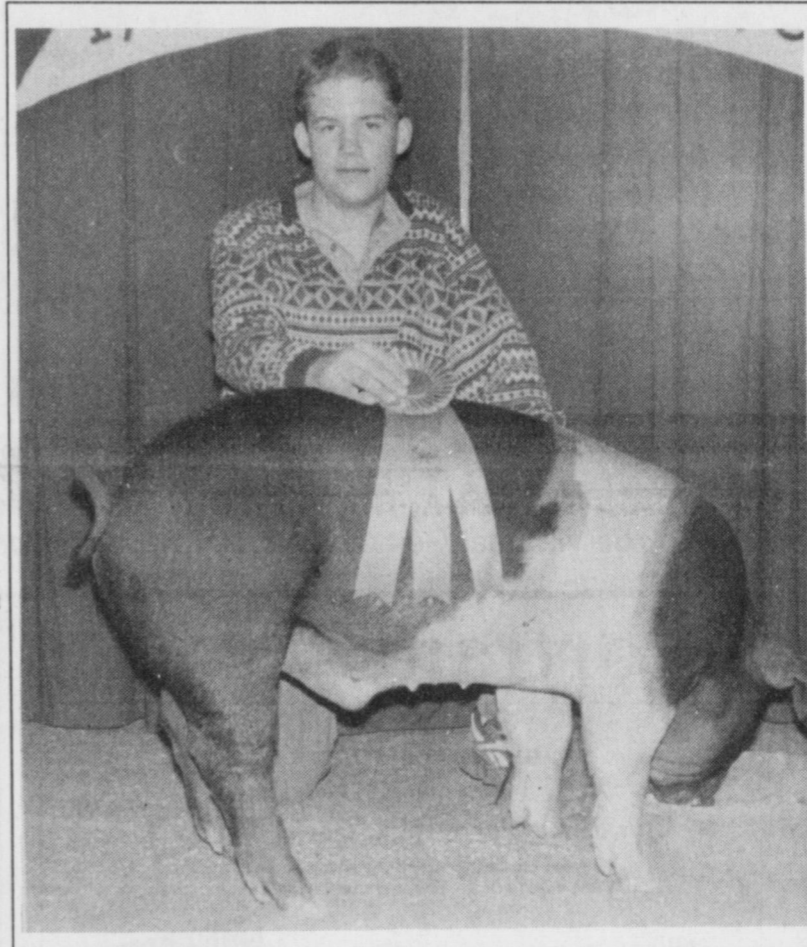

## MPD to issue citations for illegal, out-of-state, vehicle tags

The Muleshoe Police Department (MPD) has announced that beginning Wednesday, Feb. 1, there will be no more warnings!

The police department will begin issuing citations to offenders that they know, through investigations, live in Texas and have out-of-state license plate tags.

A program was started by MPD in September to get Texas residents with out-of-state license plate registrations to comply with the law.

The law states that "if a person resides in the state of Texas for 30 days or longer or is a legal resident of the state of Texas, they have to register their vehicle in Texas."

MPD decided to warn people, to give them time to change, since they know there would be some extra expense involved to properly register their vehicles.

There were numerous vehicles in the city belonging to residents that had lived

here for a long time that had out-of-state registration. After an article was published in the *Muleshoe Journal*, many people immediately registered their vehicles and complied with the law.

Some of the offenders were given warnings before they complied and some were

given citations after they had been warned, but still had not complied. The citations were dismissed when the vehicles were registered and

proof of registration was shown to the judge.

However, many of the people warned haven't complied!

Therefore, the MPD has announced that as of Feb. 1, there will be no more warnings! The MPD will be issuing citations to offenders. The

judge may or may not dismiss the citations, even after the vehicle has been properly registered.

The MPD thought that

people would comply with the law. But all that many

have done is to take advantage of the warnings and disregard the law.

Anyone who knows someone, either a friend or family member, that is operating a vehicle without a state license plate registration, is

encouraged to warn them to properly register their vehicle.

Failure to do so could get expensive. The fine is \$200.

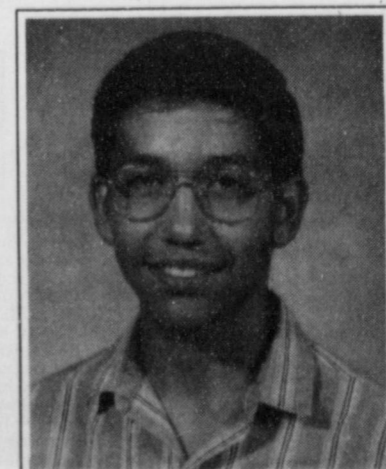

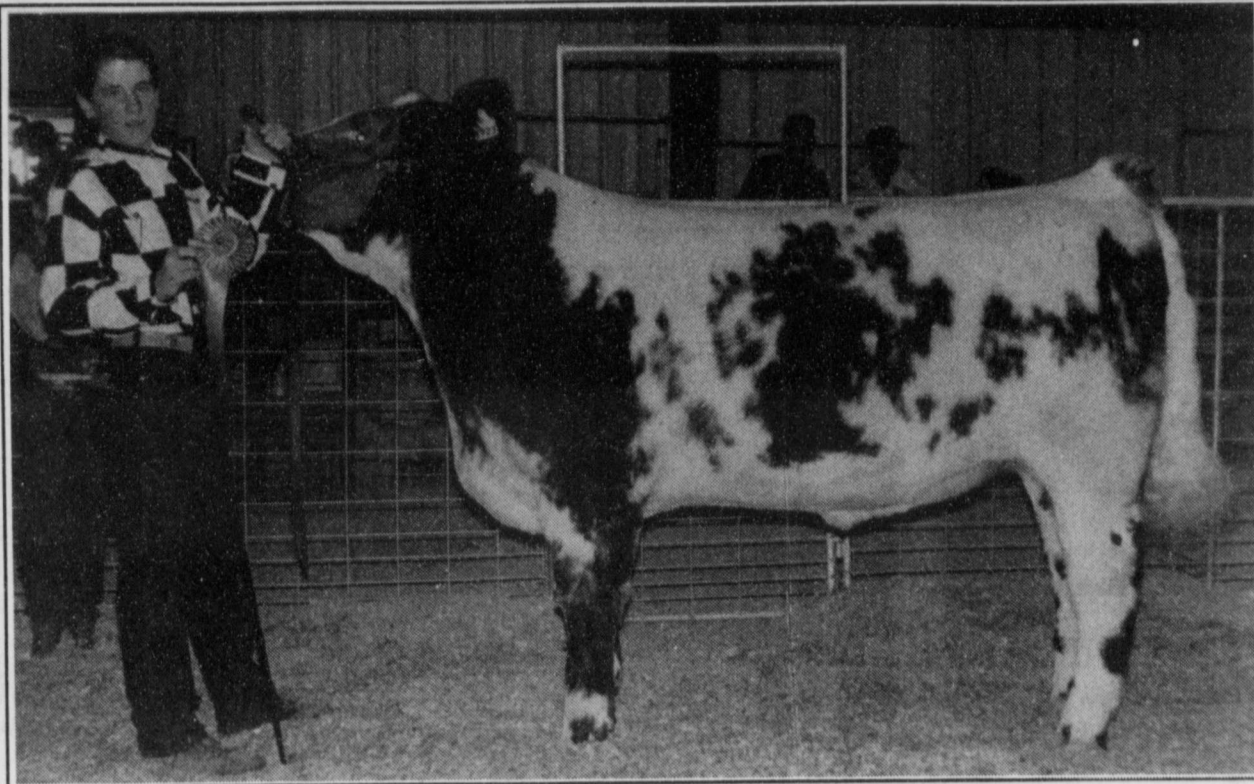
Students named to the Dean's Honor List must maintain at least a 3.25 GPA while carrying the minimum 12 semester hours.

## A variety of homestead exemptions could lower your property taxes!

A homestead exemption lowers the property taxes on your home by lowering its taxable value. If your home is valued at \$50,000 and you receive a \$5,000 homestead exemption, your home will be taxed as if it were worth \$45,000.

### Who qualifies for an exemption?

Anyone who owned a home on January 1st (and used it as their primary residence on that date) is entitled to a \$5,000 homestead exemption to lower their school taxes this year... and it doesn't matter if your home is a house, condominium or mobile home. (Counties, cities and special taxing districts may also offer homestead exemptions.)

### Are other exemptions available?

If you're disabled -- or if you're 65 years old or older -- you are entitled to an additional \$10,000 school tax exemption on your home. And if you qualify for the over-65 exemption, you're also entitled to a permanent, locked-in "ceiling" on the school property taxes on your home. (The ceiling does not apply to county or city property taxes, and those entities may offer other exemptions.)

### Do I have to apply each year?

No. If you had a homestead exemption on your home in 1994 you won't need to reapply for 1995 unless your chief appraiser requires it. However, if you haven't received an exemption on your present home -- or if you've moved to a new home -- you'll need to file for an exemption for 1995, and if you turned 65 or became disabled during 1994, you need to file for the additional exemption.

### When and where should I file?
