were stunned last week government lowered the peso' trading foor, triggering a devaluation that has shaved more than one-third
from the currency's value against the dollar.
The devaluation came nearly a year after the Jan. 1 launch of the Agreement, which represented a peak Agreement, which represented apeak Mexico.

But the NAFTA excitement coincided with an Indian uprising in the southern state of Chiapas that
continues to generate political unrest
