Highways blocked by ice, stranded vehicles

"Harvest" keeps city crews busy
City of Hereford crews were busy Tuesday clearing major streets in Hereford to make them the street, it was "harvested" by a special machine into trucks and dumped in various places. Most of the major streets were passable today, but side streets, especially in residential areas,

north of Hereford on U.S. 385 .
U.S. Highway 60 from Hereford
up to Canyon and into Amarill up to Canyon and into Amarillo was closed, blocked about three miles east
of Hereford. State Department of Transportation officials ordered the road closed here because they aren't
able to get U.S. 60 and Interstate able to get U.S. 60 and Interstate 27
open because of dozens of stranded vehicles that are preventing snow
plows from clearing the highways. plows from clearing the highways.
Members of the Texas National Members of the Texas National
Guard were called this morning to
assist with assist with helping find stranded
motorists, move stuck vehices from motorists, move stuck vehicles from
roadways, and help to clear roads. roadways, and help to clear roads.
They were expected to concentrate Their efforts along Interstates 27 and 40 today, then continue their work along other U.S. highways once the
interstates are clear. interstates are clear. Crews from the State Department

a.m. Tuesday in Deaf Smith County
and have coninued and have continued to work since.

BEAUMONT (AP)- Southwestern
Bell Telephone Co. officials say they are disapppointed with a judge's order allowing a lawsuit brought against the company by the city of Port
to proceed as a class action to proceed as a class action.
Beaumont state district judge Jack R. King issued the order Tuesday. Port Arthur sued Southwestern
Bell in March claiming the company Bell in March, claiming the company
for years has been underpaying in for years has been underpaying in a
franchise fee agreement with the city. The possible underpayments could total millions of dollars, the city said. The agreements grant the phone

## Soviet sub poses no threat

There appears to be little danger that radiation from a Soviei submarine that sank off Norway in 1989
will threaten human health, but a

Instruments will be lowered to the submarine and the surrounding area next summer to determine whether any leaking plutonium could contaminate, rich fisheries, said
Charles Hollister of the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution in Woods
Hole, Mass. Oceanograph
Hole, Mass.
Some radioactive cesium is
leaking from the corroding sumber leaking from the corroding subma
rine, butit's less than what is pumped into the sea by English and French nuclear-fuel reprocessing plants,
Hollister said Tuesday Hollister said Tuesclay. The submarine sank in 1989,
killing 42 of 69 aboard Russian divers who recently explored the wreck found its reactor
had been knocked loose and wr had been knocked loose and was
leaning againstthe hull, said Kathleen Crane, an oceanographer at the Lamont-Doherty Geological Observatory in Palisades, N.Y. "There was structural damage,"
she said. "There was almost no she said. There was almost no
leaking at present. But everyone does express a concern about the structural
integrity of inpegrity of the submarine and how
structurally sound the reactor is structurally sound the reactor is a She said she from Gennia Chenayov, a colleague of hers and a pilotof the Russian Mir research submersibles. She said she
spoke to him last sumer scientific dive south of Iceland. "I think the risk to humans through the food chain is very, very
low," said Hollister Nevert, low," said Hollister. Nevertheless,
he said, a study of the probe was he said, a study of the problem was
important because the submarine sank in a turbulent area "scoured by deep-sea storms."
Russian engineers said in an ABC News report broaccast Monday yhat
plutonium could begin bleeding from the submarine as early as 1994 . Spokesmen for Norway and the
Russian Navy denied that there was Russian Navy denied that there was any immediate danger but said they
were watching the submarine closely. At a briefing in Oslo on Tuesday, Norwegian nuclear experts said even
if the 28 pounds of plutonium in the submarine's reactor and two nuclear
torpedoes tradiation would be sodiluted it would do litule or no damage.
In Washington, Pentagon officials said they could not confirm any
radiation leak. "At this point, it's not a big concern, but it's something we save 10 keep an eye on," said
spokesman Pete Williams. The submarine is about 6,000 feet down about 150 miles north of Norway, Crane said. Others have
given slightly different estimates of its location and depth. Crane said the structural damage had blocked plans to salvage the
submarine, because it could break apart at the surface.
"That could be much worse than leaving it where it is," she said.
"Because then a lot of radioactivity could spill into the surface, whete couid spie a lot of fish that feed a lot
of people."
