the New Mexico State Constitution, Article IV Section 3 Under

"No act of the legislature shall affect the right or
evidence or procedure, in any pending case."
Did you read that carefully? Why would it be necessary to include a constitutional provision against the legislature changing the rules of evidence in a pending case? Well, according to the New Mexico Supreme Court:

This provision of the Constitution was inserted for the purpose of curing a well-known method, too often
used in the days when New Mexico was under territorial form of government, to win cases in the courts by legislation which changed the rules of evidence and procedure in cases which were the being adjudicated by the various courts of the state. Stockard v. Hamilton, 25 NM 240 (1919)
This practice was not unique to New Mexico. Article 3 Section 55 of the Texas State Constitution contains similar provisions. The (Texas) Legislature shall not, except as or special law, .
Regulating the practice of jurisdiction of, or changing he mules of evidence in any judicial proceeding or inquiry before the courts.

## (or) changing the venue in civil or criminal cases.

This adds a litule twist. In early Texas history, not only does laws parsed regarding whot evidence might or court, but also by getting laws regarding where a case could be heard. If a special law could be obtained requiring a resident of Texarkana to present his case in EI Paso, in the early days of horse and buggy travel his could have been the equivalent of winning the matter.

## DREAMS WITH DEADLINES

I 've never traveled the highway that connects the United States with Alaska, but I will one day. I've never written a f gold, but I will one day. How do I know that I will accomplish hese dreams? Because they are more than dreams, they are my goals.

Best selling author, Harvey MoKay said that goals are just dreams with deadlines. Most of the people I've met don't have goals, just dreams. Dreams that aren't well defined and have no time give us focus. Focus means to have a clear picture of your subject People who set goals develop sharp, long-term focus in their lives.

Do you know what you really want in life? Can you get a
clear picture of it in your mind? Are you willing tomake some sacrifice oachieve your dreams? If you can answer yes to those questions, yo are on your way to becoming more successful, However, to ensure that your goals are not just dreams, see if they pass the SAM tes The SAM tes

The SAM test says that all goals must be specific, achievabie and measurable. I have found that if these three characteristics are manifest in your goal executing strategy, you can accomplish what you desire.

Let's examine these three characteristics. Specific means well defined or limited to a certain kind or type. I believe to qualify as specific, you must put your goals in written form. No matter how good your memory is, it is better to have your goals in writing. Examples of
specific goals could include: "I will lose 10 pounds by April 1 . 1993 ," specific goals could include: "I will lose 10 pounds by April 1,1993, or "I will earn one million dollars by Friday.

While both of these examples are specific, ofly one of them meets the second part of the SAM test. The second elements is the A which stands for achievable. It is reasonable to believe that I could lose 10 pounds. in three months. This is certainly achievable.

It is not reasonable to believe that I can eam a million dollars in less than one week. In this case the dream is not impossible, but odd are against the deadline. That does not mean that you shouldn't think big. Goals should make us stretch and reach. Goals should make us venture out of our comfort zones.

The third step in the SAM test is that all goals must be measurable. If for example, I had said I want to lose some weight, how would we measure some? How much is some weight? Some is neither

specific nor measurable. Losing 10 pounds by April 1st is a goal that

You can plug into the power of goal setting by following uis simple process. First, set some realistc, achievable goals. Write hem down and break them into measurable steps.

Second, concentrate on the benefits of reaching those goals. Promise yourself a special treat or reward for hitting your targets. hird, continually rubelbows with high achievers. Nothing will increase your abiily to get motivated like associating with winners. Listen to them and learn from them.

Fourth, keep velieving in yourself. No matter how tough our present situation may be, you are still a worthwhile person who has something to contribute. Whether you're 8or 80, keep believing in your potential.

Finally, take some time to organize your life. You might make that one of your first goals. Take each letter of the word Always Leads to Success. Always Leads to Success.

Giloria Steinem is synonymous with the founding of contemporary feminism. Steinem has been named one of the " 25 Most Influential Women in America" by the World Almanac for the past nine years.
Steinem's beliefs were shaped in India, where she studied for two years. In that country's caste system, she found many parallels to gender and race relations in the United States.
Steinem's credits as a writer and journalist are wide-ranging. Already an established author by 1968, she helped found New York magazine, where she served as political columnist until 1972 Steinem has written three books (incloding Outrageous Acts and Everyday Rebellion) and co-founded Ms. mag azine in 1973, where she still serves as a consultant.
One of Steinem's more unusual credits is her stint as a writer on the historic mid-60s NBC news satire That Was The Week That Was.
Last fall, Steinem worked hard to elect Bill Clinton to the presidency She's also an admirer of the next firs lady, whom she describes as "a fine administrator and a keen legal mind ... think we got two for the price of one." Steinem has also involved herself in producing topical movies for television. Her first effort to reach the screen is Better Off Dead, a drama set to premiere Tuesday, Jan. 12, on Lifetime.

## What＇s cooking in CNN＇s＇Wolf＇pot

LOS ANGELES（AP）－Burt Wolf was curious about the tea in China． Not the price，but the way they drink it．

So he traveled to Taiwan，where among other things he learned why the Chinese drink tea from a cup with no handle．

Wolf shares such findings in＂Burt Wolf－Eating Well，＂a new PBS show that is more than just cooking and recipes．More than 250 stations televise the show on various days of the week．
＂I＇m a food．reporter，＂Wolf explains，＂and for the last 30 years my job has been to travel around the world and find out why people eat the way they do．In Taiwan I＇m served tea in a cup with no．handle and I want to know why．The rest of the world drinks tea in a cup with a handle．
＂I find that the tongue is one of the most sensitive areas of the body to heat．If you put hot stuff in your mouth you burn your tongue．If you pick up a cup with no handle your fingers instantly tell you if it＇s too hot．But if you＇re a sophisticated Westerner you pick up a cup with a handle，sip the too－hot tea and burn your tongue．＂
While in Taiwan，Wolf also finds out about the history of tea，how to make the perfect cup of tea and what is the relationship between tea and health．From Washington he talks about the bean soup served in the U．S．Senate．He talks about cooking U．S．Senate．He talks about cooking
halibut in Norway，lingonberry pancakes from Stockholm and Idaho potatoes from Boise．
Wolf is telling about his show， appropriately enough，over a late
breakfast．He occasionally pops into the kitchen to see what the chef is preparing．He picks up a tin of tea and notes it＇s called Stash．
＂The old sea captains who carried the tea kept samples to show the tea merchants，＂he says．＂The best tea was called the captain＇s stash．＂
Wolf spends 264 days a year investigating food around the world． He calls his New York apartment the world＇s most expensive storage container．
He＇s contributed a daily report to
CNN for the past 10 years．His series CNN for the past 10 years．His series ＂What＇s Cooking＂has been syndi－ cated for 12 years．The half－hour PBS
show was first seen last summer on some stations before it began reaching the full PBS lineup．
Each show covers four areas：the history and anthropology of a food， its nutritional and health value，how to prepare the food properly and why a society eats the way it does．

Wolf already has filmed 52 shows in such places as Taiwan，Canada， in such places as Taiwan，Canada，
Paris，Greece，New York，Hawaii， Paris，Greece，New York，Hawain，
San Francisco，Sweden and Denmark．

In collecting recipes，he says he looks for good food that can be easily prepared and have no more than eight ingredients．

Wolf，who brought his high blood pressure down by diet and exercise， stresses healthful eating．
＂Good food is essential to good health，＂he says，＂but I don＇t think you have to give up any foods．I think there are only wrong amounts．We know what we eat affects our health， so it＇s foolish not to eat according－ ly．＂

Although Wolf，with his white hair and beard，looks like he was born to wear a chef＇s uniform，he began his career as a lawyer．He went to work for an investment banking firm in Switzerland．

The banking group was interested in investing in food companies and asked me to investi－ gate it for them，＂he says．＂I did a lot of research on companies that make cooking utensils．Out of that came a book called＇The Cook＇s Catalogue．＇I edited it and did some of the writing．
＂The book（published in 1973） also looked into the history of food． For instance，why some countries serve single－crusted pies and why the English serve double－crusted pies．In England during the Tudor period they developed a＇surprise＇pie in which the surprise was hidden by a top crust．＂．
Wolf came to Los Angeles to promote the book on＂The Tonight Show＂and it was suggested he had the makings of a television show．Out of that came the syndicated program．
＂Later，Ted Turner said he wanted to carry the show on cable，＂Wolf says． ＂I talked to some of the station people and they laughed and said，＇CNN？You better get your money first．＇Little did

## HBO delivers＇Hamlet＇ trippingly on the tube

That schoolchildren will run headlong into William Shakespeare is inevitable． But to be or not to be comfortable with his legacy is a question mo；t often ineptly answered in English class．
Shakespeare：The Animated Tales， HBO＇s version of Classic Comics，has ably condensed several of Shake speare＇s great works to an entertaining half－hour and is a perfect introduction hair－hour and is a perfect introduction
0 his writings．Each of the shows is ntroduced by actor Robin Williams． Airing Wednesday，Jan．13，and hroughout the month，the Tales＇dark Hamlet conveys the play＇s powerfu hemes through visually arresting ani－ mation and fiery vocal readings．
Despite its brevity，Hamlet loses none of the unsettling moodiness of the original．The sketchy，dreamlike anim－ ation（produced by Moscow＇s Soyuz－ multfilm Studios）illustrates with chilling effectiveness the characters bushes with madness and the super－ natural．Shakespeare＇s poetic prose has never been easier for children to under－ stand than when Ophelia，insane with grief，sings a haunting tribute to her slain father in the echoing palace halls． t＇s one of many scenes impressionable minds won＇t soon forget
Making short work of Shakespeare is an invitation to disaster，but HBO＇s vivid，authentic Hamlet neatly sidesteps the pitfalls，It works，of course，because he play＇s still the thing．

## Benchley takes the plunge for ESPN

Peter Benchley＇s best－selling nove Jaws frightened many out of the wate 17 years ago．Now，Benchley goes in search of one of the sea＇s most mysten ous creatures，the giant squid，on the latest installment of ESPN＇s nature－ad venture series，Expedition Earth，on Saturday，Jan． 16.
While the giant squid may conjure up images of hapless seamen being snatched from the decks of their boats by long，powerful tentacles able to crush entire ships，the squid actually at－ tempts to avoid light and air，preferring to lurk at depths somewhere between 2，000 and 5,000 feet．
To track the elusive squid，Benchley sets out in the waters of Bermuda with guide Teddy Tucker．Benchley and Tucker put out bait and lower an innov ative underwater camera and lighting system 2，500 feet into the Atlantic Ocean by cable，monitoring the action from the boat through an elaborate video system．Back on land，giant－squid expert Dr．Clyde Roper examines a specimen Tucker recently found off the coast of Bermuda．
Later in the show，Benchley joins a eam of marine biologists documenting he behavior of the giant octopus off the Pacific coast of British Columbia．
Benchley ends his quest near the Caribbean island of Dominica，studying the bulbous－headed sperm whale，one of the few species large enough to feed on－of all things－the giant squid．
