There, on the left side of the road, stands the only remaining rural school in Deaf Smith County.

Located 30 miles northwest of Hereford, the Walcott School has served the educational needs of elementary students for 90 years.

When it was founded in 1905, it was one of many such schools.

They bore names such as Buttrom, Coker, Dawn, Day, Files, Higgins, Summerfield, Union, Walcott, Ward and Wyche.

One by one the rural schools fell remained in 1948. The Dawn School died in 1951.

Today, Walcott is the sole survivor

So is the setting -- one-piece tables and benches pull out from the walls at the side of the multi-purpose room that doubles as auditorium and gymnasium.

But the ambiance of the cafeteria is different on this day -- different diplomas -- a Bachelor of Science because just a week before, the switch was thrown on new lights that until only two -- Dawn and Walcott illuminate the room as never before. While most of the light from the

large halogen bulbs is directed down through shiny silver housings, some of its type -- founded in the middle leaks out to reflect off the brilliant

facility. "They toll us these lights will pay

for themselves in three to five years" in energy savings alone, McLaughlin said. "One of the teachers came in the lunch line and saw the lights for the first time and said, 'Let there be light!"

Bill McLaughlin's office is a tiny, dimly-lit cubbyhole in the front of the 45-year-old main building.

On the wall behind him are from Texas Technological College in 1958, a Master of Education from Tech in 1967 and a Doctor of Education from Arizona State University in 1972.

Water customers of the City of Hereford kept their taps turned on for 55 million gallons more during the first eight months of 1995 than they did during the same period in 1994.

The figures on consumption may be the bad news, but the good news is that more water flows into the system these days.

With peak usage of the summer months now past, Ted Coleman, water production superintendent, can heave a sigh of relief that the system could keep up with demand.

Since the city began a water development program two years ago, four new wells have been tied into the pipelines. Another well is nearing completion and probably will be putting water into a pipeline early next year.

The first completion in the program was a well drilled adjacent to the city's landfill site. Water is pumped from the Santa Rosa formation, providing 625 gallons per minute.

A new well into the Ogallala formation, drilled across the street from the Hereford Community Center, produces 70 gallons per minute.

The most recent wells, 100 feet apart, are located on city property in Veterans Park. A Santa Rosa is producing 600 gallons per minute and the Ogallala well puts 135 gallons per minute into water lines in Hereford.

The water development plan for Hereford is financed by a \$3 million revenue bond issue sold for that purpose. The plan calls for nine new Ogallala and three Santa Rosa Wells.

Coleman said the four wells add 1,430 gallons per minute, or two million gallons per day, for city water customers.

apparently will exceed the moisture recorded in 1994, water consumption still will be higher in '95, Coleman's records indicate.

Using three rain gauges and averaging the amounts, Coleman total rain in 1994 of 13.6 inches. Through the end of September, the amount was 13.1 inches and another .67-inch fell

In six of the first eight months of this year, water use exceeded the amount for the same months in 1994.

The dry winter here is reflected in water consumption in January, February, March and April.

May and June totals were below the 1994 levels but July and August were higher.

In 1994, the city's wells pumped a total of 1,155,702,000 gallons of water. For the first eight months, the total was 836,463,000 gallons.

If use continues at a similar rate for the remainder of this year, consumption very well may exceed the 1994 use.

Through eight months of 1995. customers drew 891,614,000 gallons through water lines.

Highest consumption so far this year was in July when 163,920,000

gallons were used, an average of 5,287,742 per day. By comparison, June was the

highest use month in 1994. The system poured out 157,909,000 gallons during the month, or an average of 5.093.839 daily.

Since Coleman began keeping complete records of water use, the heaviest use occurred in 1984, when the total gallons amounted to 1,484,213,000. It seems unlikely that the 1995 total will surpass that year.

Other high use years are 1983, 1,389,093,000 gallons; 1985, with 1,246,302,000 gallons, and 1990, 1,208,314,000 gallons.

Atkins Park is the second Hereford park to be named for community leaders. Earlier, a park at E. 15th and Avenue H was named in honor of the Earnest Langley, longtime city attorney before his death, and his wife, Helen Langley, an active civic worker. Dr. Atkins was one of the founders

of the Golden K Kiwanis Club and served as the club's first president and with a committee, began looking for a club project. At his instigation, Golden K undertook beautification of the park being named in his honor.

He encouraged participation by other Kiwanis Clubs and the noon. club assumed responsibility for a triangle park at Ninth and 25 Mile Avenue.

Before his death, Dr. Atkins received a pin signifying 57 years of membership in Kiwanis Clubs in Denton, College Station and Hereford.

Dr. Atkins came to Hereford in 1982 after a career as an agronomist, teacher, researcher and author of papers on seed.

He was born in Corning, Kan., and earned a bachelor's degree from Kansas State University. He began work as an agronomist at the A&M

## Gramm aide talks about welfare bill

Ed Hodges, state director for U.S. Senator Phil Gramm, R-TX., was in Dependent Children. Hereford Friday to speak with the employees of the Texas Employment Commission.

Hodges is on a 22 city tour to highlight the welfare reform bill.

Currently the House and the Senate have passed separate welfarereform bills but a joint conference said. "Gramm wants to give a helping committee must meet to reconcile hand and not a hand out. differences, Hodges said.

The major differences between the two bills is the Family Cap provision and the details on the definitions on the work provisions.

"Next week this will be hashed-out in the committees, and hopefully, many of the issues Gramm addresses will survive the conference," he said. After debate and resolutions both

In both the House and Senate bills all national entitlements would be eliminated, including Aid to Families

Those responsibilities would be taken over by the states. Each state would receive federal block grant funds to administer welfare programs, according to Hodges.

"This will be a dramatic change to the current welfare system," Hodges


Both bills currently include:

\* Ending of welfare funding for illegal immigrants.

Lifetime five-year limit on receiving welfare benefits. Individuals can move on and off the welfare program but after a cumulative of five years of benefits a recipient is no longer eligible.

This would exclude up to 20 percent of the hardship disability cases

\* Work requirements for welfare recipients. A recipient will have to

Had he stayed in Arizona, McLaughlin said, he would have moved up through the ranks and would likely be at the helm of one of the state's largest districts today.

But instead, he and his wife were homesick for Texas, so returned to the text in the classroom. the Lone Star State where, ultimately, they ended up at Walcott.

Dr. Atkins was an active member of the United Methodist Church.

He and Mary Loveless were married in 1932 in Denton. They had two children, Mary Lyles of Hereford and I. Milburn Atkins Jr., of Bartlesville, Okla. Mrs. Atkins died in 1982.



Water well for Hereford

Work is proceeding at the southeast edge of Hereford on a new water well, part of the water development program started by the city two years ago. Water Production Superintendent Ted Coleman is watching work underway.

### WATER -

dropped below the billion-gallon mark. In 1987, the total was 968,532,000 gallons and in 1992, 996,536,000 gallons.

Gallons pumped in January this year totaled 70 million, compared with 65.9 million in January 1994. The February totals were 77.9 million, 1995, and 65.9 million last

March use was 107.5 million this year and 99.6 million in 1994. For April the totals are 109.7 million in and 83.5 million in 1994. In May this year, gallons pumped amounted to 97.8 million. A year earlier, May's use was 115.6 million. In June 1995, Hereford used 127.1 million gallons, compared with 157.9 million in 1994.


"It's better water," he reminded. However, good blending of the Santa Rosa water with Ogallala has maintained a high quality for the city's water customers.

July this year was a high-consumption month with 163.9 million gallons while the 1994 total in July was 124.9 million gallons.


Gallons of water used in August added up to 136.9 million, compared with 122.8 million a year earlier.

The highest use on a single day was July 27, Coleman reported, when city water customers drew 7.2 million gallons of water. However, the high day in 1994 was June 27, with 7.4 million recorded.

Levels at which water is pumped are dropping consistently, said Coleman, by an average of slightly more than a foot.

The city produces from 35 wells and leases four wells from Holly Sugar from May 1 to Sept. 1. The contract expires, though, in 1998.

Coleman hopes that more production will be brought into the system from the Ogallala formation.







When my sister was about seven years old, she came down with a very serious case of pneumonia. The doctor knew there were no drugs in his cabinet powerful enough to treat her. But, he was pretty well informed about new medicines and realized a new drug might be her only chance.

He obtained a stock of penicillin and for three or four days, she was given a shot every four hours. No one knew at the time that less might be better in the long run. All Doc knew was my sister needed some strong medicine.

He was right! She began to improve and steadily shook off the illness but after about two dozen shots, she couldn't sit or lie down very comfortably. As it turned out, the dosage was pretty heavy. In later years, doctors shied away from giving her penicillin in any form for fear the early treatment created an allergy for her.

That's better than the alternative

Suddenly, my mother realized that her eyesight didn't seem to be damaged. They went to the nearer medical help.

By the time ol' Doc finished stitching, everyone knew that she was okay. Her glasses weren't even broken, just bent a little.

But, as time passed, Doc's wizardry with a needle and thread became even more obvious. There was almost no scar around the eye, through the eyebrow or on the eyelid.

In later years, Doc's foibles caught p with him. He invented an ointment that his supporters claim was a miracle cure for burns. But he also "helped" those who needed to stay awake for extended periods, by giving them the necessary medication.

When the law caught up with him, there were those who said it was about time. My family made no judgment. We were sorry for his troubles but, on the other hand, we had evidence that he had some real expertise in healing.

## Special class teaches deaf to be dental technicians

#### **By JEAN PAGEL Associated Press Writer BIG SPRING**, Texas (AP) - No

one spoke aloud in this dental classroom. Water drizzled from the

laboratory's taps. Tiny tools clinked against plaster. But no noise came from the mouths of students engaged in the intricate task of smoothing blemishes from models of teeth.

Dick Covell had to make big arm motions to grab the attention of his class at the SouthWest Collegiate Institute for the Deaf.

This program - led by a deaf instructor, in a laboratory remodeled for easier visual-based learning teaches the art behind dentures and

who cannot hear.

"There's no problem at all because we work independently," 19-year-old Marla Ramsey said in sign language. "We help each other. We normally don't talk a lot. We focus on our work."

Ms. Ramsey of El Dorado, Ark., said she doesn't expect trouble finding a job when she completes the

program in December 1996. She and other deaf students from across the country are drawn to the SWCID campus in Big Spring, a West Texas town about 90 miles south of Lubbock.

SWCID was established as a statesupported institution within the Howard County Junior College

## Splattering love bugs irk Climax residents

**By ELLIOTT MINOR Associated Press Writer** 

CLIMAX, Ga. (AP) - Love bugs, those romantic little flies that die at the peak of passion when they splatter on the fronts of cars and trucks, are swarming again from coastal Georgia to Texas.

"I think they're worse this year than they've ever been," said Dixie Hutto, owner of a restaurant in this farming community of 200 in southwestern Georgia.

Scientists say there's no practical way to get rid of the quarter-inch black flies, which swarm over Deep South highways every May and early fall

Love bugs get their name from their mating ritual. They link in flight while the male fertilizes the 200 to 300 eggs carried by the female.

Because love bugs are attracted to the heat and exhaust fumes of highways, the mating is often fatal. Millions of the bugs, still linked, end up splattered on windshields and bumpers.

'It's a rough way to go," said H.A. Denmark, a retired University of Florida entomologist who has studied love bugs extensively. "I don't recommend it, but they die happy, I guess."

Love bugs can clog radiators, causing engines to overheat. They can smear on windshields, hurting visibility. And the acids in their decomposing bodies can ruin auto paint.

Everyone agrees that love bugs are a nuisance. Some motorists cursethem. Others make jokes about them: "What is one love bug? An unloved

bugs," he said. "I've found a remedy for gnats. I smoke cigarettes. It keeps them away. But I can't find a remedy for love bugs.'

Love bugs came from Central and South America in the early 1900s and spread from Texas to Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Florida, Georgia and South Carolina.

They arrived in Climax in the 1980s. 'When they first came up, there

was a lot of cussing," said Dewey Logue, whose pickup was covered with bugs. "But I think we've learned to live with them. You scrub them off or wear them off."

Climax got its name in 1883 because it was the highest point on the railroad line between Montgomery, Ala., and Savannah. The town puts on a Swine Time festival in November, when the love bugs are gone

crowns to future dental technicians District in 1981. It sits on about 57 acres at the site of the former Webb Air Force Base.

The junior college's wide-ranging course catalogue offers a menu that varies from automotive maintenance and office administration, to elementary education and drama.

People who enroll in dental laboratory technology will find themselves immersed in topics such as ethics, business operations and anatomy of the head and neck. Students practice with ceramics and porcelains in learning to make appliances like false teeth and bridges.

"It does not require a lot of speaking or voicing or interacting with lots of people," said Ron Brasel, provost at SWCID.

"It's work that they could do on site without having to interact extensively with a large number of people who would expect them to communicate verbally."

Brasel said 40 students have graduated since 1982. Twelve current students have declared it their major, he said.

SWCID last year finished a lab emodeling project that cost about \$50,000, Brasel said. The lab - used as a hospital dental area back when the campus was a military base needed fewer walls, better lighting and lecture tables shaped like horseshoes to improve the line-of-sight for deaf students.

People familiar with the program call it unique.

"This is probably the only program in the United States that has a self-contained dental lab tech program for the deaf, with deaf students and a deaf instructor," Brasel said.

"It's just a neat opportunity for someone interested in pursuing dental technology to have that avenue that caters a bit, if you will, to their particular handicap," said dental technician Gary V. Box of Plano.

Box serves on an advisory committee at SWCID and said he has hired hearing-impaired workers.

Typical programs in dental technology take from six or nine months to two years, Box said. Entry-level pay is \$6 an hour, he said. Officials at SWCID said their program typically takes three years because students must bone up on reading, writing and math. Othersmust polish their sign language skills.

Covell said about seven of his current students already have found work.

"They ask, 'If I am deaf, will I be able to get a job?' My answer is yes, of course. Don't feel negative about this," he said through an interpreter. Covell reads lips and had spent 20


years working for a dentist in

Washington before becoming an instructor at SWCID. He said he tells his classes not to fear the struggles they will face.

'The deaf can do it," Covell said. "Please just give them a chance."







"Wilson has experience, poise and leadership and has played a long time and knows how the game is played," Holmgren said. "Besides, he is surrounded by some great players."





## Moon's, Oilers' reputations fell after trade

### **By RON LESKO**

AP Sports Writer MINNEAPOLIS (AP) - It's hard to say who has fallen further since the Houston Oilers traded Warren Moon to the Minnesota Vikings in April 1994

The Oilers reached the playoffs in each of Moon's last seven seasons, but they have lost 17 of their 21 games since his departure. That includes last week's loss to a previously winless expansion team, the Jacksonville Jaguars.

Moon, meanwhile, has had his once idyllic off-field reputation shredded. Once the NFL's Man of the Year for his charitable work, his image now is shaped by allegations he beat his wife, sexually harassed an ex-cheerleader and operates a financially irresponsible charity.

After spending 10 spectacular seasons in Houston, Moon will face his former team for the first time Sunday when the Oilers (2-3) visit the Vikings (2-2), who are coming off their bye week.

Moon wouldn't talk about it this week, keeping up his boycott of the local media, and others downplayed Moon arrived, and only 13 in his first three years. agency has made player movement normal.

"It doesn't matter how many years Warren played in Houston," said Minnesota coach Dennis Green. "In the NFL now, this is a very common thing. Very few guys stay with the same team.

Minnesota safety Charles Mincy, an offseason acquisition from Kansas City, practiced against his former teammates in preseason and played against them in an exhibition game. "It was a little weird," Mincy

said. "But now things change so much, half the dudes I didn't even know. There's still some unity there, but a lot of the guys I just wasn't familiar with.'

But Moon and Houston had a special relationship for the decade after the Oilers outbid several teams to lure him from the CFL in February 1984.

Moon restored excitement to a franchise that had languished since the late 1970s. Houston won just 10 games in the three seasons before

three years.

But the Oilers made the playoffs every year after that, finishing first in the AFC Central in 1991 and 1993 and tying for the division title in 1990. On the way, Moon became Houston's career leader in passing yards (33,685), attempts (4,546), completions (2,632) and touchdowns (196).

"Warren is still a very popular person here in Houston," said Oilers coach Jeff Fisher, who was hired as Houston's defensive coordinator two months before Moon was traded. "He had a lot of great victories and many successful games here. It's obvious to those that are watching film that he can still play."

Yet Moon never led Houston to the conference championship, winning only wild-card games in 1987, 1988 and 1991 on his way to a 3-6 playoff record. His postseason struggles continued last season, when the Chicago Bears upset the Vikings in the first round.

Moon will turn 39 on Nov. 18 and is in the final guaranteed year of his contract with Minnesota. This might be his last chance to prove he can win in the playoffs, but he'll first have to lead the Vikings there.

"I think Warren has only one agenda, and that's the best way to do it," Green said. "It's important right now, with us being 2-2, for him to put himself in a good groove."

The Vikings enter Sunday's game 9-0 before and after bye weeks since Green took over in 1992, the only team to go unbeaten in those games during that time.

After their disappointing 17-point loss at Chicago to open the season, they were playing well heading into the break. A 10-point victory over Detroit and a 20-point win at Pittsburgh were sandwiched around an overtime loss to Dallas.

With the toughest stretch of their schedule over, the Vikings hope beating Houston will start a winning streak similar to last season, when they won four straight at midseason.

"We feel like we can probably get something started here," said safety Harlon Barnett. "We actually feel like we did that at Pittsburgh. As long as you can keep piling up wins, the better off you'll be.'

The Oilers lost 14 of 16 last season with Billy Joe Tolliver, Bucky Richardson and Cody Carlson combining to do a poor job replacing

Moon. Fisher took over as head coach when Jack Pardee was fired after 10 games, and behind free agent quarterback Chris Chandler had the Oilers off to a respectable start this season until the final 2:27 last week.

That's when rookie Rodney Thomas, acquired with one of the two picks obtained in the Moon trade, lost his second fumble of the game, allowing Jacksonville to drive to the winning

touchdown. Al Del Greco was wide

left on a 52-yard field goal attempt as time expired, giving the Jaguars their historical win and Houston an embarrassing defeat.

"Our perspective here is that we are our biggest opponent at this juncture of the season," Fisher said. "It's up to us right now, since we let one get away that we should have won and could have won, we've got to step up and win some of those that people don't expect us to win."

## Marino making assault on NFL passing marks

By The Associated Press Almost overlooked in Dan Marino's assault on Fran Tarkenton's NFL passing records - Marino is four away from breaking the Tark mark of 3,686 completions - is the fact that he also is closing in on one of Dan Fouts' records.

Marino burned the Cincinnati Bengals for 450 yards last week, the 50th time he's passed for more than 300 yards in a game. That's one short of Fouts' record of 51, something the Indianapolis secondary should be thrilled to hear.





ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) - The dust hadn't even settled on another unfulfilled season for the Texas Rangers and manager Johnny Oates already was spewing the wait-'tilnext-year mantra that has become the franchise's motto.

"We've got a lot of work to do," Oates said, "but I think we have the nucleus for a very good ballclub." That nucleus of Will Clark, Juan

Gonzalez, Ivan Rodriguez and Dean Palmer also was there this year, yet all they could muster was a 74-70 record that left them in third place in the AL West, four games from first.

The Rangers were in first place as late as July, they remained in contention for the playoffs until the fourth-to-last game of the season and they had a winning record for the fifth time in seven years.

But these baby steps of progress won't cut it. Not in a town where the Dallas Cowboys are king and especially not when Seattle, Cleveland and Colorado all make the playoffs before Texas.

If Scattle defeated California in

their one-game showdown for the AL McLemore and Mickey Tettleton West title, the Rangers would be the ended up being saviors who kept the only AL team never to make the playoffs. Texas and Florida are the only teams never to reach the playoffs and the Marlins have been around for three seasons.







## Versatile laser celebrates 35th anniversary

birthday, behold the laser. It can repair a heart, enhance a symphony, peel a potato. It is not a ray-gun, as some feared at its birth. It is a boon. Its myriad benevolent uses please and astonish even its own creator, who has only one complaint. It costs too much.

SANTA BARBARA, Calif. (AP) -The man who devised the most ubiquitous invention of this generation lives on a rugged mountainside in this affluent town and wonders where all his brainchildren are.

They never cease to amaze him. It was 35 years ago that Dr. Theodore Maiman threw a switch that

turned on the world's first LASER. That pioneering beam of ruby red coherent light and its offspring now illuminate every nook and cranny of the world's life.

From CD music and pictures to speedy checkout counters, from smart bombs to intricate, bloodless surgery, from boosting the flow of information in fiberoptic cables more than a millionfold to tracking lobsters on the heal." ocean floor, lasers of all shapes and sizes are pushing back the horizon.

Perhaps more than any invention, it has shrunk an already shrinking although doctors are puzzled over world, powering Internet and World Net.

It even tracks speeders and peels potatoes.

When asked what's new in lasers, Ted Maiman, now 66, falls temporarily silent.

"I sort of hesitated," he says, "because lasers have become so broad and they're used in so many places, including the very first use which was in research. It's just too life-endangering in itself, putting the hard to keep up with all of these patient on the artificial heart-lung and

EDITOR'S NOTE - On its 35th fields. I read recently that lasers are taking him off again. used to speed up the germination of seeds."

He has yet to confirm that tantalizing tidbit. But what developments have surprised him most?

He gropes through his memory and says, well maybe the gyroscope on the Boeing 757 passenger jet for navigation, but maybe not. Maybe it's the enormous storage capacity for information, "the same way a CD rom works, because the wavelength of light is so small," or maybe, if true, it's that thing about the seeds.

In medicine, there is a controversial claim that a low-powered laser speeds up healing. It hasn't been established. Maiman says, "but there seems to be something to it because it keeps coming up over and over again. For example, a person can get a leg ulcer, especially a diabetic, and it just doesn't heal. They try all kinds of things ... and very often the patient has to have an amputation.

"They've found that by irradiating the ulcerated area a few minutes or so a day over a month or two it will

In one group of 100 patients who were amputation candidates, three out of four seemed to have been helped, why. There seems to be a speedup in bone healing, or maybe there is biostimulation of collagen production. No one knows for sure.

Maiman and his wife, Kathleen, watched a recent operation in which a heart patient in his mid-50's had his blocked arteries cleared with a carbon-dioxide laser without resorting to a heart-lung machine.

The machine can be

The surgeons in this case intended to clear the arteries while operating on the beating heart. No mean trick.

'The deck is stacked against them because they are not allowed to use any patient who has not already had a bypass or angioplasty," Maiman says. Kathleen adds that this patient, prior to the operation, was so weak he could not cross a room under his own power. In fact, as the operation was prepped, surgeons almost canceled it because they had trouble stabilizing him.

The doctors hoped to capitalize on the fact that for the briefest of moments, the heart rests, literally stops beating. That was the point at which the surgeons planned to zap the arteries with the minilaser beam.

Timed to a computer, the laser activates about every three minutes, and a minigeyser of blood erupts from the target site. The entire procedure takes about an hour.

Meanwhile, a standby surgeon is on hand to initiate a heart-lung procedure should the plans fail.

But they didn't. Kathleen watched as the progressive surgery did its work. She says you could see the patient was getting the benefit of the procedure even before it was completed "because the blood was now flowing into all of these places. You could see and feel the heart literally getting stronger. That was very dramatic.'

Maiman says, "The surgery takes about a third as long as a bypass and runs about a third of the bypass cost as well."

They almost lost the domestic rights ... Then when I left Hughes, they gave me the original laser which I still have." Their attitude, Maiman says, "was sort of

like, 'Here, you might want this.' Now I find there is not only historical interest; it's become valuable. I might end up selling it."

Maiman says the Smithsonian had him on the phone for two hours. His own disappointments in mind, he says he told them he said he'd sell it to them "but I'm not going to give it to you.

Even the late Bette Davis accosted him at a cocktail party with the question: "How does it feel to have invented something capable of bringing such destruction to mankind?"

For a man of gentle demeanor, it was a terrible burden to carry when was patently false from the beginning.



Because inclusion in the Paceseters Division is tied to donations, Mrs. Sherrod said, there may be changes each year.


For this year's campaign, West Texas Rural Telephone was added, having raised \$1,515 last year in employee contributions.







## Extension **Agent's Notes**

#### **By DENNIS NEWTON County Extension Agent**

These last two weeks have been a critical time in the development of cotton here in the Texas Panhandle. With the near freezing temperatures that we had just two weeks ago, most of us thought that the cotton crop in Deaf Smith County was going to be history.

It appears however, that we got a break, thanks to natures ability to fix many of the things that we as humans consider broken and hopeless.

Basically what happened is that we got lucky. Chilling injury in cotton, which occurs at temperatures below 40 degrees, causes cellular damage to the leaf tissues. The four days following the cold temperatures were

overcast ad the humidity was above normal.

This time allowed the healthy leaves on the cotton plant to repair themselves. Leaves that were damaged by the drought or insect damage for the most part did not heal and continued to degrade, dry up and eventually fall from the plant.

When the sun finally came out, the healthy leaves stayed green to some extent. Dr. Dan Krieg, Professor of Agronomy at Texas Tech University, has determined in the past week that these green leaves and even leaves that were purple were still contributing to boll development. The higher the percentage of green, the higher the photosynthetic activity.

We were lucky in that the fields that were the latest planted and needed to mature the bolls the most were also those that had the healthiest leaves, thus the greater the potential for continued plant development.

Kater, Hake, cotton specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service in Lubbock says the producers who have fields that have immature bolls and green or purple leaves should be left alone to allow the bolls to mature as much as possible.

He further stated the Dr. Kreig will continue to monitor the leaf activity of cotton and will be reporting to County Extension Agents weekly.

For producers with fields that had a majority of mature bolls on the plant at the time of the cold temperature, harvest aid treatments to prepare for harvest might be considered. This will affect very few fields.





## HRMC participates in cancer awareness month

As part of National Breast Cancer Awareness month, Hereford Regional Medical Center is offering women a 10 percent discount on mammograms during the month of October, according to Jim Robinson, administrator. Examinations may be scheduled Monday through Friday between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.

The purpose of National Breast Cancer Awareness month is to encourage millions of American women to receive, sign up for, or make a commitment to get a mammogram screening," Claudia Smith, RT, manager of the radiology department said. "Each year 46,000 women will die from breast cancer. A mammogram is the best way of finding breast cancer when it is most treatable.

"Hereford Regional Medical Center is a certified mammography facility," Mrs. Smith said. "That means that our equipment and our mammography program has been tested and certified by the American College of Radiology, the Texas Department of Health, and also approved by the Federal Drug Administration. Our technologists have received special training, and are credentialed as qualified technologists to perform mammograms," she said. The mammographers on staff include Claudia Smith, RT; Carrie Shirley, RT; and Cori Watts, RT.

"Hereford Regional Medical Center is one of the few facilities in the area with a qualified program that was recognized by the American College of Radiology," Robinson added. "We have been certified by the American College of Radiology since 1990."

Guidelines from the American Cancer Society, American College of OB/GYN and the Academy of Family-Practitioners recommend that women have their first mammogram between 35 and 40 then every one to two years from women 40-49, and yearly after age 50.


"A mammogram can reveal small cancers several years before they can be felt in a physical exam," Mrs. Smith said. "It is recommended that a mammogram be combined with a physical exam by a physician," Mrs. Smith added.

Women are also encouraged to practice monthly self-examinations of their breasts which is an extremely important measure in cancer detection," Mrs. Smith added. "The breast self-examination is very easy and only takes a few moments once a month and since the American Cancer Society states that one in nine women will develop breast cancer this year, it is a very important part of the health care routine recommended for all women.'

Women may have their mammograms scheduled by their doctor's office or may self refer by calling the Hereford Regional Medical Center Radiology Department at 364-2141, ext. 248.







## SWCD to hold election

An election of a soil and water conservation district directors to serve in Zone 3 on the Tierra Blanca Soil and Water Conservation District is scheduled for October 10, at Roy Carter Seed and Fértilizer at Milo Center, announced Bill Walden, chairman of the board.

The election will be held at a.m.

State law decrees that to be eligible to vote in a soil and water conservation district director election, a person must own agricultural land within the district where the election is being held. The person must also live in a county all or any part of which is in the district and the voter must be 18-years-old.

Legal qualifications state that a candidate for the office of a soil and water conservation district director must own land in the zone he represents, be 18 years of age and be actively engaged in farming and ranching. He must also live in a county all or part of which is in the district.

Soil and water conservation district directors serve four year terms of office.

Zone 3 of the district includes an area north of FM 1058, east of Highway 214, south of FM 1412 and west of Highway 385.

Current members of the board of directors of the Tierra Blanca SWCD are Bill Walden, chairman; Jerry Homfeld, vice chairman; Carl Kleuskens, secretary; and members Nick Yosten and David Wagner.

The purpose of the Tierra Blanca SWCD is to promote sound soil and water conservation programs on agricultural lands within the district and to serve as a voice for farmers, ranchers, and local community entities on conservation matters.





## Annual frost may bring problems to area cattle

#### **By SHELLY SCHILLING** Staff Writer

With Deaf Smith area's average annual frost upon us, cattle grazers should be aware that prussic acid poisoning and cyanide intoxication in livestock grazing on grain sorghum, forage sorghums, or in areas where cattle have access to Johnsongrass can be a big problem. Deaf Smith usually receives its

first frost around October 28.

Cooler weather and scattered rains are great for growing wheat.

However, it may cause some problems for livestock producers, according to a recent news release by Dr. Ted McCollum, beef specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service and Dr. John Haliburton, head of veterinary toxicology at the Texas Veterinary Medical Diagnostic Lab in Amarillo.

When extremely low temperatures and moist conditions continue over several days followed by warmer temperatures forages may begin to initiate new growth.

Any new growth has the potential to contain toxic levels of prussic acid or cyanide. The problem starts when any

forage is hit with early frost or some other mechanical damage, Haliburton said.

That can also include quick changes in temperature or anything that can cause the forages to be stressed.

The same plants will also accumulate nitrates. It will be necessary to determine whether the cause is nitrates or prussic acid.

Nitrates accumulate in the stalk of the plant and prussic acid levels are highest in new growth following the cold weather, or new tillers will sprout from the base of the plants.

Because prussic acid is in the leaves, grazing livestock are at greater risk than usually occur with nitrate accumulations alone. McCollum said that forage

being harvested for hay should not cause problems since prussic acid

will dissipate as the hay is field cured.

Testing laboratories can determine acid levels in forages.

Dr. Cliff Skiles, a Hereford veterinarian, said that prevention is the best form of cure.

"The poisoning has a quick onset and kills the animal sometimes before a producer even

knows it," Skiles said. "There are some antidotes if it is caught early enough.

A cattleman should be aware that there may be a problem and take measures immediately.

"A cattle grazer should take cattle off of the pasture if there is potential for a frost," he said. "If there is a freeze, cattle should be removed immediately and kept off the field for about two weeks."

The forage can be tested for the prussic acid or the cyanide intoxication if a producer wants to be sure the field is free of the poison.

The upper Texas Panhandle doesn't see as much of a problem with the poisoning as does Central Texas.





Musician Wynton Marsalls introduces viewers to different styles of music while teaching basic music theory In the four-part series Marsalls on Music. Premiering Monday on PBS (check local listings), the program continues the following three Mondays.

Since he was very young, multitalented Wynton Marsalis has had a love of music.

This passion for the art has influenced Marsalis to educate others in music appreciation while sharing the joy he has found in music.

His dedication is clearly visible in his latest project, a four-part series that teaches the fundamentals of classical and ja7 z music. *Marsalis on Music*, debuting Monday, Oct. 9, on PBS (check local listings), explores all aspects of music – from music theory to the history of jazz bands. Presented by Thirteen/WNET, the special continues Mondays, Oct. 16, 23 and 30.

"I wanted to bring the joy of music to people and their kids and make it as painless as possible," Marsalis says. He also wanted a show that would

"make people more aware of music, what it is, what goes into playing it and make listening to it more fun."

In Part 1, "Why Toes Tap: Marsalis on Rhythm," the musician effectively teaches elements of music theory and brings terms such as tempo and syncopation to life through examples.

"Sometimes you have to do something – not to compromise the material, but to give people something else to catch on to that will lead them into a greater understanding of what you're "saying," Marsalis says.

He uses such innovative graphics as a basketball and a skyscraper to illustrate these technical points.

"The best way to talk about music and bring it to those who are not musicians is to draw good analogies," the musician adds.

Marsalis also uses variations of the same music to show how different rhythms create distinct sounds, such as the music from Tchaikovsky's ballet The Nutcracker, and Duke Ellington's jazz variation on the same theme.

With conductor Seiji Ozawa leading the Tanglewood Music Center Orchestra and Marsalis conducting his jazz band, viewers are better able to hear the differences and understand the ideas conveyed by the program. Cellist Yo-Yo Ma also joins Marsalis

Cellist Yo-Yo Ma also joins Marsalis in the final episode to talk about the importance and benefits of practicing. Since he was a boy, Marsalis has been surrounded by music, both at home and at school.

His father, a dedicated musician, was a positive role model for Marsalis and his siblings as they were growing up. "We (children) would see him prac-

"We (children) would see him practicing," Marsalis says. "We understood that ... whoever would get up at 6 in the morning and practice that hour, and then practice an hour in the middle of the day and an hour at night, that was going to be the person who became a better musician."

Marsalis also found good role models in his music teachers.

"I had many really good band directors and trumpet teachers who really took a lot of concern with me as a student," Marsalis comments. "I never had to feel that they were looking at their watch. And they opened the world of music to me."

Marsalis gained an interest in educating others about music from watching both his teachers and his father.

"Always being around my father, seeing him teach classes and trying to help teach youngsters," he says, "that always gave me the feeling for education in music."

Marsalis has grown into a gifted performer, a composer and an educator. That's a lot of hats to wear, but Marsalis looks at the positive side. "You never get rained on," he says.







## Two mothers share a journey filled with hope in NBC film

Although they are almost completely different, two mothers have one thing in common: their children are missing. Trail of Tears, debuting Monday, Oct. 9, on NBC, is a touching drama based on a true story about two women who join forces to search for their missing children.

Katey Sagal (Married... With Children) sheds her bouffant hairdo to star as Annie Cook, a blackjack dealer in Reno, Nev., separated from her husband and raising her two sons alone.

Pam Dawber portrays Cheryl Harris, a loving Nebraska mother of two who also is having marital problems.

Tragedy strikes both women when their children are taken by their husbands. This is fairly common, according to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children: More than 350,000 children are abducted by a parent each year.

Cheryl, wanting to help speed up the search for her children, decides to travel to the places where the children have been sighted last. Joining forces with Annie, the women start a journey filled with tears, joy, hope and disa pointment.

Although they have hardly anything in common (Cheryl likes show tunes, while Annie prefers blues music), they nevertheless build a bond of friendship that becomes a platform of support and love for each other during their travels.

They learn a lot from the experience and from each other. Cheryl comes to realize she can't control her husband, while Annie gains a better understanding of family and begins to rebuild her relationship with her mother (Eileen Brennan).

Sagal and Dawber deliver poignant performances as the mothers. The women's hardship is apparent, but equally visible is the strength and determi-

Sagal effectively sheds her Peg Bundy image for this more intricate role. Sagal's powerful performance makes her character's pain and frustration distinctly visible.

And while the film shows the mothers' physical journey, it clearly emphasizes the emotional voyage the two mothers take as well.
