## Notes on the Law

Concern for safety in the workplace has led to more and more random drug testing of employees. The procedures to be followed when an employee tests positive may be effected by the decision in Kerr-McGee Chemical Corporation vs. United Steelwo

The suit arose when Kerr-McGee arranged for drug testing of its employees on October 9, 1989 by Emergicare facility workers at the Kerr-McGee plant. Employees Kevin Wells and Gerond Sanders were in the group tested on the 9 th at the plant. Employee Robert Robinson
was out ill on the 9th and thus was tested the next day at the was out ill on the 9th and thus was tested the next day at the Emergicare facility. These three employees tested positive for
and were discharged by Ker-McGee immediately thereafter.

The employees claimed they were entitled to "due process," meaning that they were entitled to some procedure for a hearing at meaning that they were enuited to some procedure for a hearing a
which they could explain the circumstances around the positive test results. Kerr McGee did not feel obligated to provide any hearing because the contract with the employees provided:
3.1 Management prerogatives and the exercis in the management, and shall include withou limitation all matters not covered by this Agreement as well as the following, except to the extent that the
following are limited or modified by the terms and following are limited or modifit
(a) The right to hire, lay off, promote, demote (a) The right to hire, lay off, promote, demote, discipline and efficiency, and discharge and discipline all employees for just cause
Another section on "Safety and Health" includes a provision on periodic drug testing. This section states:
12.8 In order to maintain a safe work environmen all employees shall be subject to periodic drug testing without advance notice. Refusal to submit to such a test shall be just cause for discharge. Should an employee test positive for one or more illega drugs or controlled su
Immediate discharge. to arbitration. The arbitrator ruled that the return of a positive drug test lo arbitraion. The arbiurator ruied unat une reum of a positive drug tess The arbitrator's ruling resulted from his interpretation of the language in the contract which provided that "refusal to submit to" a drug test was equivalent to "just cause for discharge," but that a positive result only caused the employee to be "subject" to discharge.

The arbitrator reasoned there were certain circumstances that might cause a drug test to be positive even though the employee had not illegilly used controlled substances. Thus, the employee became subject to being discharged upon the return of a positive test result, but the provide a legitimate explanation for the positive test result.

The employees were ordered to be reinstated with backpay The case may influence the approach that employers should take or may indicate that the contract with an employee should be very specific about the consequences of a positive test result. On the other hand, there appear to be certain limited situations where positive test results
miay not be based on the illegal use of controlled substances situations should also be provided for in the contract, so as to eliminate the costs of litigation and re-instatement with back-pay

"How the deficit is reduced is crucial," Greenspan told Congress. Greenspan said he could no commit the central bank to specific actions, such as cutting interest rates because of uncertain economi

But the central bank "recognizes that it has an important role to play in this regard," he said. That comment, coupled with his strong endorsement of Clinton's

In my more than 40 years of selling experience-for the record I started selling my mother on the concept that cookies were good for me when I was 4 years old - I've learned a few good selling basics I'd like to share with you.

- Always tell the truth.
- Sell the benefits - not the features.

Don't underestimate the value of produet knowledge -it is important - Don't argue with a potentiat customer - you may win the argument, but you'll lose the sale.
Put yourself in your customers shoes - even if they don't fit. - Look for "Im ready to buy" signals - then ask for the business. Don't laugh at your competitor's selling errors - there is a lesson to learn if you're alert.
The sale isn't over when you get the money -give follow-up service and sell them again.
Don't bet the farm on customer loyalty - you're only as good as your last sale.
Don't wait until you're in trouble to start selling - dig the well before you're thirsty.

## Will TV be the same?

 CAMBRIDGE, Mass. (AP)-What will television offer at the turn of the century?A combined menu of junk food and three-star meals, said Michael Fuchs of HBO. New opportunities to educate and enlighten, said Jennifer Lawson of PBS. Too many choices, said singer-actor Ruben Blades.
All wrong, said W. Russell Neuman, a Tufts University professor. "It won't even BE professor.
television."
Even the word will sound as dated then as "horseless carriage" does now, Neuman predicted at a recent now, Neuman prity University conference on the farvard University co
It isn't clear what we'll call America's favorite pastime. But, Neuman said, "it will be an entirely new medium." Two-way fiberoptics will replace one-way cables, letting former couch potatoes and channel-surfers take a more active role.
"The number of channels becomes completely meaningless in the year 2000 because you've got as many channels as you want," Neuman said. "If you want to watch a particular episode of the 'Mary Tyler Moore Show,' you call it up.'

Advertiser-supported programming and the network structures will eventually become "wonderful historical anecdotes," said Neuman, also a research fellow at the Massachusetts Institute of Technolo${ }^{\mathrm{gy}}$ In

Instead, he said, viewers will pay program fees; say, $\$ 2$ for a show with ads, $\$ 4$ without. "Television will really be in your control," Neuman said.

No one questioned the eventual arrival of some sort of interactive television, a concept that got wide public attention last year with Ross Perot's call for the "electronic town meeting." But not everybody embraced the idea with enthusiasm.
"We run the risk of the technology dehumanizing television, outstripping
the content of television," said Fuchs, chairman and chief executive officer of HBO, which co-sponsored the conference.
The plethora of program choices will be "a wonderful thing," Blades said, but he questioned whether viewers would actually watch everything available - or even understand how to access it.
"I think that we risk becoming the best-informed society that ever died of ignorance," the two-time Grammy Award winner said.

The medium's next stage will reflectits surroundings, Blades said. "The future of television is going to be defined by the type of society we evolve into," he said
Retired New York Times columnist Tom Wicker took issue with that prediction, saying the relationship between television and its audience already resembles a revolving door more than a mirror.
I Idon't think I quite agree that we have the power to shape the instrument as we wish," Wicker said. "Because, you see, that instrument also shapes us. ... As television changes us in ways we don't fully understand, then we feed back into television."
Lawson, an executive vice president at PBS, said the new technology could create "a place where the voices we don't hear are heard - loud, clear, in ways we've never heard before.

But she said those expanded choices must be made available to everyone, including those who can't afford to pay for them.
"As we look out at this new landscape of telecommunication possibilities, we must create a vision of what our non-commercial needs are, what our education needs are, that can be served by that technology, and try to build that into the creation of new systems," she said.
In an earlier discussion, author and sociologist Todd Gitlin noted that, despite a growing supermarket of choices, current television viewers face acurious "video uniformity."

## Alongside, or beneath, whatever

 diversity is emerging, there is also something of a common style that carries across television in general from the sitcom to the news, the commercial to the late-night chat, from Arsenio Hall to David Letterman," he said.And even with the much-lauded technological miracles, don'texpect much improvement, Gitlin warned.
"For all the abundance of delivery systems, under foreseeable circumstances, the small screen is unlikely to transform the possibilities of culture for the better," he said.

A: That version of Alice in Wonderland was made in 1933 and starred many of Paramount's top stars of that era, including Grant, Fields, Gary Cooper and Edward Everett Horton. However, it was Charlotte Henry, not Anna Lee, who played Alice in the film, which is not on video according to my sources. # Anti-gay policies to be documented on television

 AP Television Writer LOS ANGELES (AP) - Allan Berube and Arthur Dong think the highly charged debate over the U.S. military's ban on gays lacks perspective - about 50 years and a world war's worth.Berube, author of "Coming out Under Fire: The History of Gay Men and Women in World War Two," and Dong, an Academy Award-nominated filmmaker, have teamed up to create a TV documentary based on Berube's book.
They have $\$ 310,000$ in funding. including one of the few National Endowment for the Arts grants given in 1992 to a gay-themed project. They have a wealth of material drawn from Berube's 10 years of research. And they have a year of work ahead for a
project they would like to see finished proje
"The media doesn't deal with the history of (the ban). It deals with emotions and hysteria, the sensationalism of the issue. What we'retrying to do with the film is to bring that history but," Dong said.

Gay soldiers' letters, rare film footage and government documents will be woven together to re-create the era of those caught in the anti-homosexual crusade and those who pursued it, said Dong and Berube.

Estimates put the number of gay men who served in the U.S. armed forces during World War II at between 650,000 and 1.6 million, with a smaller number of lesbian enlistees.

It was an uneven, sometimes surreal course the military and soldiers found themselves navigating. Medical examiners administered a test to try to uncover homosexuals,

asking searchingly, "Do you like girls? ${ }^{2}$

Gay and lesbian purges were conducted, Berube said, but the voracious wartime demand for troops saw the military keep homosexuals in by trying to reform them, segregate them in certain jobs or just turn a blind eye.

Effeminate" draftees were viewed skeptically as a potential detriment. But militarr-sanctioned shows featuring soldiers decked out indrag were popular and high-profile.
The troops themselves generally were tolerant, Berube was told by gay veterans. They recalled taking more heat for being New Yorkers, Southerners, Jews or blacks than being homosexual.

Dong and Berube began work on their film for public television on Jan. 19. That was, ironically, the 50th anniversary of the military's first official anti-gay policy, notes Berube.
"It was a radical departure from the previous policy," said the San Francisco historian. "There had been no procedure to deal with homosexuals."

Instead, it was behavior - acts of sodomy - the military targeted, and a conviction meant imprisonment. Then, says. Berube, medicine intervened in 1940 as the United States teetered on the brink of war.
"Psychiatrists were beginning to have much more influence. They said homosexuals were mentally disturbed, not criminal, and therefore shouldn't be punished," he said. "It was kind of a humane gesture. But the military only bought half of the idea, that they were sick."

Instead of prison, gays were punished with dishonorable discharges that stigmatized them. Benefits also were denied.

The total number of men and women discharged as homosexuals between 1941 and the late 1980s approached 100,000 , Berube said. The impact is greater than the numbers reflect, he and Dong contend.

1950s based their anti-gay policies on the story we re telling." Dong said. Dong, who received an Oscar nomination for his 1982 film "Sewing Woman," is directing "Coming Out Under Fire." He and Berube, who began fund raising two
years ago, are sharing producing and writing duties.
In addition to $\$ 50,000$ from the NEA, the project received a $\$ 250,000$ grant from the nonprofit Independent Television Service, created by Congress to fund innovative TV programming. The city of Los Angeles pledged \$10,000.

Medley and Hatfield joined forces again in 1974 and scored another hit with "Rock and Roll Heaven." This reunion proved to be short-lived, however, and the duo split up once more. Yet the Righteous Brothers' legacy proved too vital to leave to the pop history books. The appearance of "You've Lost That Lovin' Feeling" on

Jennifer Wames from the Ditty Dancing soundtrack album.

When "Unchained Melody" became one of 1990's biggest hits after its inclusion in Ghost, no one was more surprised than Medley and Hatfield. "I feel that the popularity of the song is just a miracle," Hatfield told The ChicagoSun-Times in an interview last year. "I've always loved it, but never expected the public's reaction to it to expecuite this feverish and strong."

As they performed together las year the Brothers found that "Unchained Melody," featuring Hatield's sead vocal, drew ecstatic response. Combined with the airplay that the original version of the song was receiving, it seemed the perfect time to reunite the Righteous Brothers as a recording act once again. They went into the studio together for the first time since 1974 with medley producing. The sessions, which resulted in the tracks heard on Reunion, show that Medley and Hatfield's powers as singers remain unique and undimmed.

The 1990s have seen anew gencration of fans discover the magic of the Righteous Brothers. "Considering how long we've been in the business, this is a real treat," says Medley. "It's a wonderful thing to have happen." With "Unchained Melody" spuring them on the masters of blue-eyed soul have stil more musical history to make in the years to come.
