## Fed cattle numbers way up

BY SPEEDY NIEMA Deaf Sditor-Publisher Deaf Smith County increased its
lead in 1989 as the No. 1 catle-
feeding county in the nation feeding county in the nation, makaing Hereford the undisputed Cattle Feeding Capital of the World.
The "Golden Triangle" area of Dea Smith, Parmer and Castro counties Smith, Partmer and Castro counties
accounted for 40 percent of the fed
catte in the Panhandle, according to the 1990 Fed Cattle Survey released
Saturday by Southwester Public
Service Co.
The survey revealed that Deaf Smith County fed 885,563 head of over the previous year. This recor total helped set a new mark for the SPS service area. Parmer County was second in th
area with 492.088 head and Castro was third with 489,142 , That's a total of 1.86 million head of fed catte for the three counties. Parmer County Castro's numbers dipped by just Castro's numbers dipped by just
13,956 head.
