## Local Man Killed In Freak Accident

Earl M. Ladd, III, 25 died apparently instantly Thursday afternoon in a freak welding accident 15 miles northeast of Muleshoe in the Pleasant Valley Community in Lamb County.

According to officers, Ladd was on a tank welding, when chemicals in the tank apparently exploded, inflicting massive head injuries to the Muleshoe resident.

He was pronounced dead at the accident site by Beulah Newton, Justice of the Peace from Earth, fol-

## Chrismons Decorate Tree At Local Church

'Chrismons' is derived from parts of two words, 'Christ' and 'Monogram'.

Chrismons are tree ornaments to take the place of the familiar balls, bells, and miniature toys, and are reminders of the various biblical names, titles and attributes to Christ.

The Chrismon tree which decorates the sanctuary of the First United Methodist Church in Muleshoe, features ornaments which are symbols of the early Christian Church. On the tree in the sanctuary at the church here, the Chrismons were handmade by the women of the congregation. All the decorations on the approximately 12 foot tree are gold and white.

Traditional Chrismons are always made in combinations of gold and white. White is the liturgi-

cal color for the Christmas season and illustrates Christ's purity and perfection, explained a spokeswoman for the church. She

## Muleshoe Protest Fails Water Permits Issued

### Approval Expected For Water Studies

### School District Hires Teachers

Three new teachers for Muleshoe schools were approved for employment Monday night during the regular monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees for the Muleshoe Independent School District.

James Taylor was approved for the position of vocational agriculture teacher at high school. He is a

native of Seagraves, and will be a mid term graduate from Texas A&M University. Taylor and his wife are the parents of two children, five and one year of age.

Also employed was Kathy Jo Carr as kindergarten teacher at Richland Hills primary school. Kathy is a native of Springlake and attended Texas Tech University. A resident of Springlake where her husband is a farmer, she did her student teaching at Littlefield.

Sherry Leach was employed to teach an Early Childhood Class in Special Education at Richland Hills. Mrs. Leach is a graduate of Andrews High School and San Angelo State University. She taught in both the Odessa and Monahans Schools. Mrs. Leach is married to Cont. Page 6, Col.3

Despite a protest by Muleshoe City Officials who attended a hearing conducted by the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District Board Thursday morning, 12 water well permits for the City of Lubbock were approved by the board.

The 12 controversial water well permits are adjacent to the city's south water fields. City Manager Dave Marr made a statement to the Water Board and read a formal statement to the group.

Part of the statement mentioned, "In a recent issue of THE CROSS SECTION, the powers and functions of the district were outlined. To quote from this article, "However, the law specifically directs districts to: (1) make and enforce rules to provide for conserving, preserving, protecting, recharging, and preventing waste of the underground water... (3)... develop comprehensive plans for the

most efficient use of the underground water... (2)... enforce its rules by injunction, mandatory injunction, or other appropriate remedy in a court of competent jurisdiction."

The statement went on to say that despite years of inaction by the City of Lubbock in developing water wells in Bailey County, in 1979, the City of Lubbock did drill 12 wells in the county, and have just asked for permits to drill 12 more wells. Also, the City of Muleshoe has been informed an additional 55 water wells are planned for Bailey County.

"We are also concerned about the location of these wells on Lubbock water rights. All of these recent wells have been drilled on the extreme north boundary of Lubbock's well field and many are adjacent to water rights owned by the City of Muleshoe which we had not planned to develop in the short term. We have no economically feasible alternative source of water for agricultural or municipal purposes in Bailey County, so any activity which we feel may accel-

## DECA Plans Paper Drive For Project

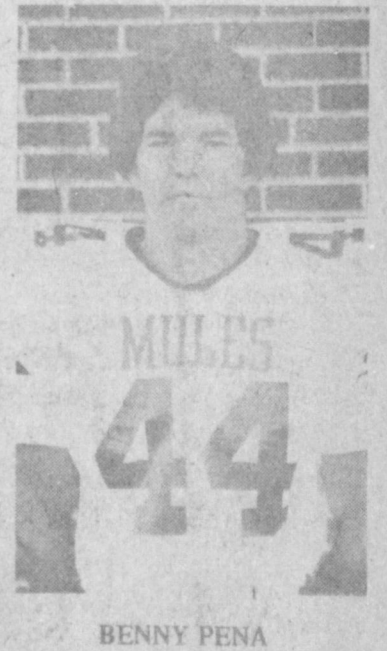
The DECA Chapter at Muleshoe High School will be conducting a newspaper drive, seeking old newspapers as a fundraising project.

They are asking that all persons save their old newspapers and other paper for the DECA students to pick up when the drive begins on December 18.

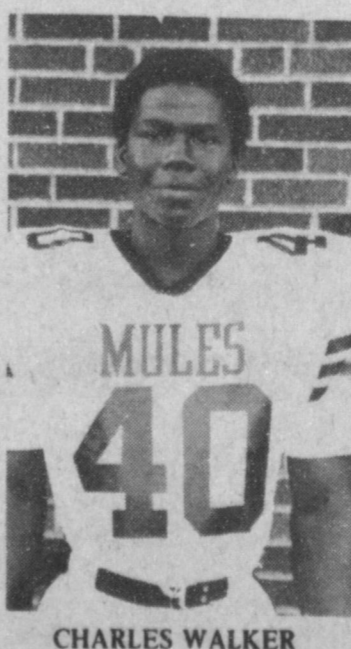

#### TINY RAISIN APPLE LOAVES

- 1/4 cup butter or margarine, softened
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 3 tablespoons milk
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 2 cups flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon soda
- 1 1/2 cups peeled grated apple
- 1 cup chopped raisins
- 1/2 cup chopped nuts

Cream together butter, sugar and eggs until light and fluffy. Beat in milk and lemon juice. Sift together dry ingredients; stir into creamed mixture just until moistened. Stir in apple, raisins and nuts. Spoon batter into 3 greased 6 x 3-inch loaf pans. Bake at 350 degrees 40 to 45 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Makes 3 mini-loaves. Note: Batter may be baked in 1 (9 x 5-inch) loaf pan. Increase baking time to 1 hour.

Chrismons used today in designs are copies of those used by the earliest Christians, many were carved or drawn on the walls of catacombs or buildings identified with the early Christian movement.

Many of these monograms were used as identifying marks by the early Christians in greeting each other, or to show a place where an early church would meet. They are symbols of the early Church which reminds worshippers of the Christian faith and the birth of Christ she added.

First United Methodist Church in Muleshoe is one of the local churches to include the Chrismon tree in its seasonal decorations and symbolism. The ornaments were handmade as a project of the women of the local church in 1979, and the women continued to make the decorations again this year to decorate this special tree for the sanctuary. The women plan to set aside a monthly workshop, starting in January, to work on the Chrismons to add to their collection.

The Chrismon tree was decorated by members of the church on Wednesday, December 3, and presented to the congregation on Sunday, December 7. At this time, the Chrismons were explained, the meaning and history of the decorations were outlined, and some of the Chrismons were described as they annually appear on the church tree.

It was explained to the church membership:

The jeweled crown which tops the tree, symbolizes honor, sovereignty, and victory over death.

ICOYC are Greek letters for the word 'fish', an acrostic on the first letters of 'Jesus Christ, Son of God, Savior'.

The shepherd's crook with alpha and omega illustrates the shepherds role of Christ and letters stand for eternity.

The cross and the chi-Christmon join the first letter of the word Christ, and the symbol of the cross.

The butterfly is the symbol of resurrection.

Wheat and grapes symbolize the bread and wine of the Last Supper.

A variety of crosses are included in the designs of the Chrismon, the Cross of Glory, the Celtic Cross, the Jerusalem Cross, the Cross of Triumph, the Cross of Constantine are often featured in Chrismons, along with the classic Latin and Greek Crosses.

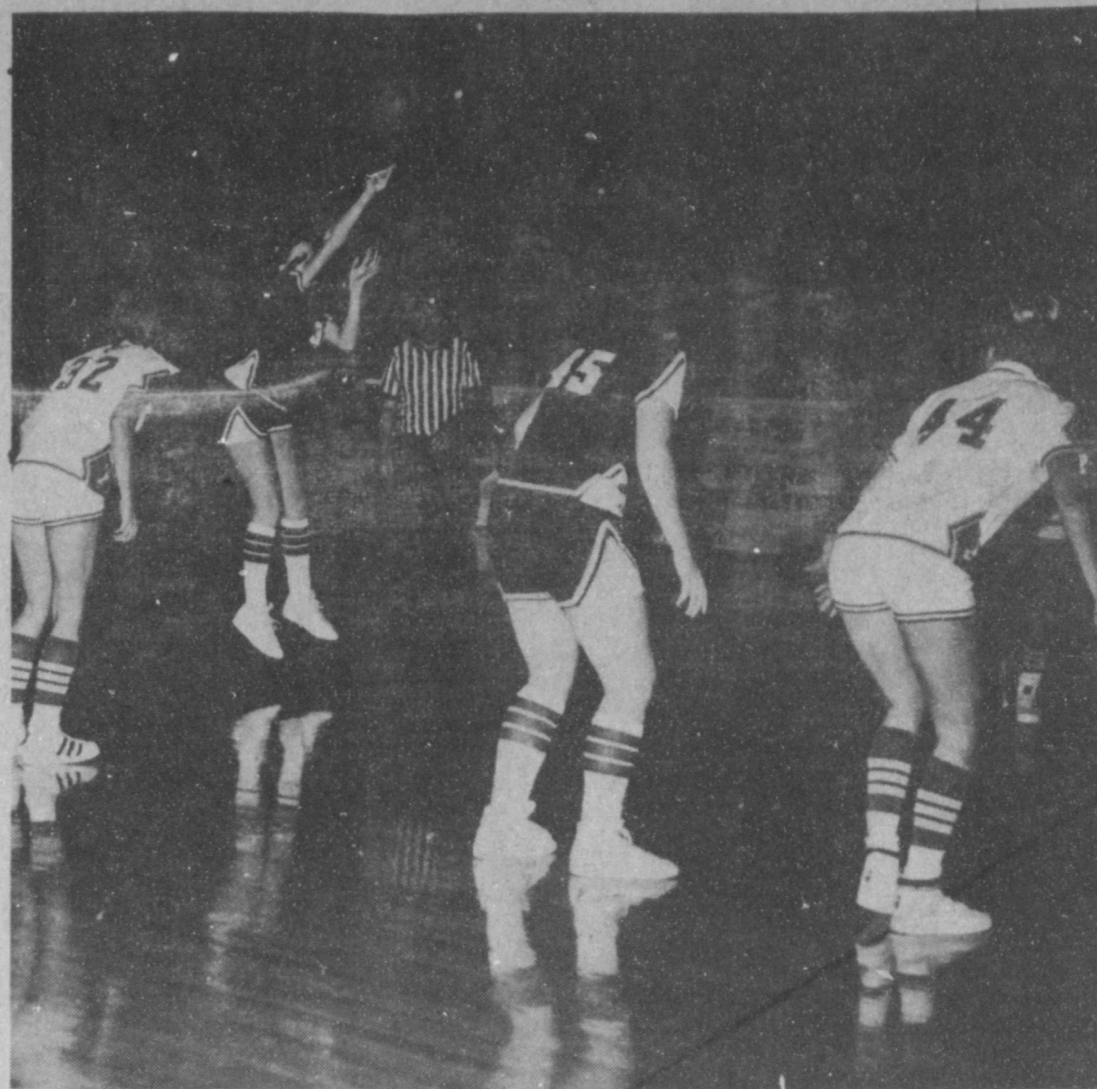
### Lazbuddie, Three Way Split Games

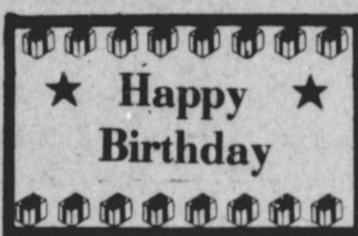
## Art of teaching to be focus of two-day conference

COLLEGE STATION — The art of teaching and administrative approaches and strategies to facilitate and encourage superior teaching will be spotlighted here in a two-day conference for faculty and staff from all four academic units of The Texas A&M University System.

Chancellor Frank W. R. Hubert, who initiated the concept for the unprecedented session now set for Jan. 8-9, said the general topic will be "quality in teaching."

In emphasizing the teaching function, Hubert pointed out that TAMU institutions — Texas A&M University, Prairie View A&M University, Tarleton State University and Texas A&M University at Galveston (Moody College) — combine to have 43,125 students and approximately 2,500 faculty engaged in some 1.2 million semester credit hours at the present time.

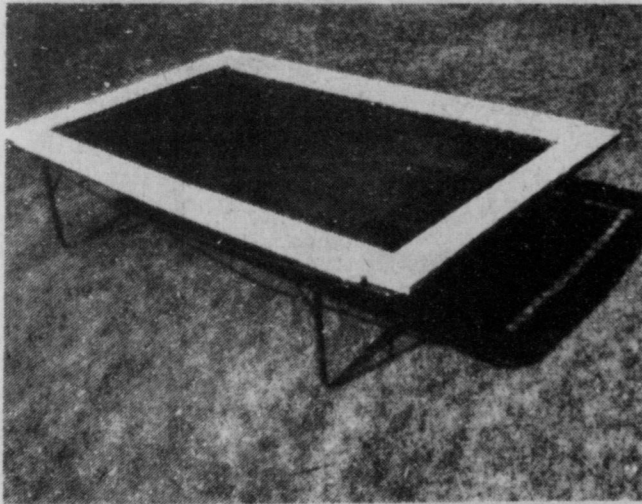

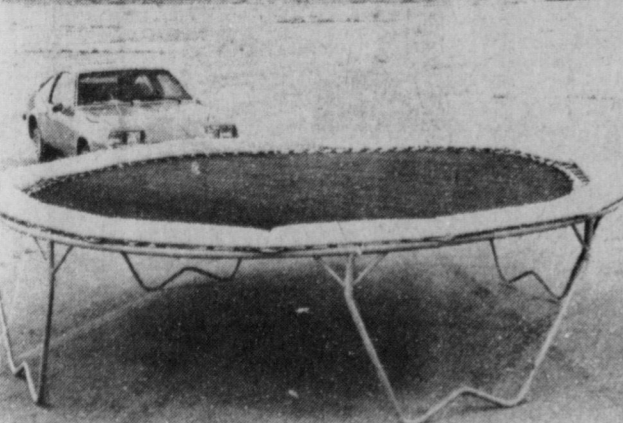

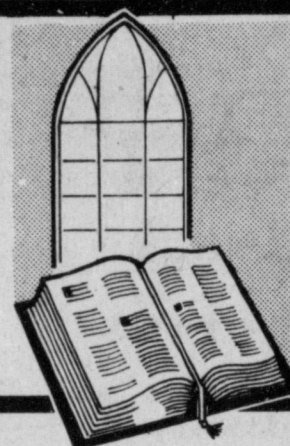
