HOUSTON (AP) - Ralph Sampson, the top pick in last year's National Basketball Association draft, had little the Year award. All 76 sports writers and broadcasters voting Thursday cast their ballots for the Houston Rockets' 7 -foot-4 center, making Sampson the
first unanimous winner since Kareem Abdul-Jabbar in Kareem
1970.

scoring, rebounding and blocked shots and averaged 21 points per game to lead all first-year players.
He will receive the Eddie Gottlieb Trophy, named after
