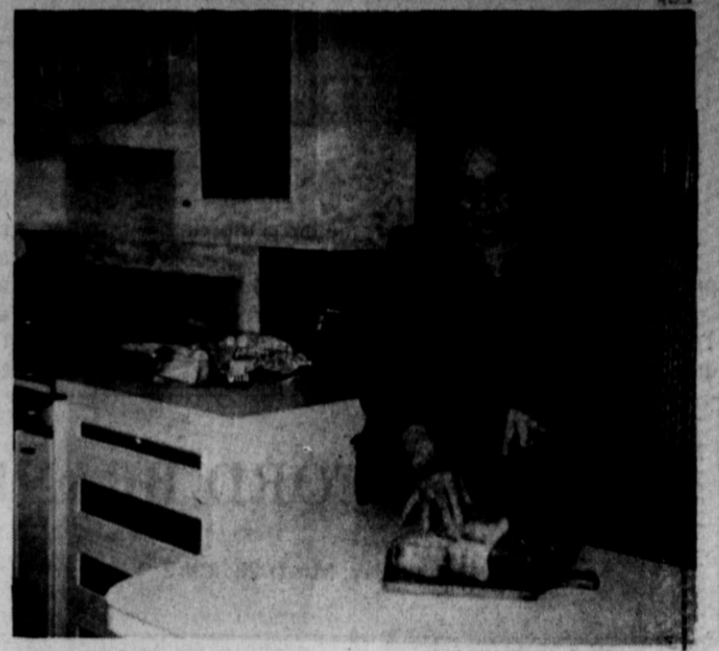
#### Postponed
