children. Brittle plastic and sharp metal in other toys, and inappropriate labeling for the intended age group, add to the possibility that a
child may be hurt or killed child may be hurt or killed. In 1987 , some 647,000 children
less than is ycars old were injured by hazardous or defective toys in This year, with some reports not died. This year, with some reports not yet
complete, another seven fatalities occurred between January and September.
So, far in 1988, nearly 150
different toys have been found different toys have been found to be
unsafe, and their manufacturers were ordered to recall them. Forrest Bumham, chief of the
TDH Hazardous Substances TDH Hazardous Substances Branch, said, "The majority of toys
recalled as safety hazards each year are imported. American manufacturers adhere more closely to safety regulations than some
overseas toy makers. Some foreign overseas toy makers. Some foreign
manufacturers are known for making toys that have had to be recalled, and the U.S. Customs Service has begun alterting CPSC to the arrival of those products.

mean it's cooked. In addition, all meat-cooked or uncooked--should be shipped with an ice source to
keep it at or below 40 degrees keep it al or beisheit, just like a refrigerator, he said.
Consumers should also check the label to see if the product contains
preservatives, said Wagner. When a product is cured, such as a cured ham, the preservatives will aid in protection against spoilage if it is
left out for a shor lengt of left out for a short length of time.
"Thorough re-heating before "Thorough re-heating before
serving is an added safeguard, but serving is an added safeguard, bu
no guarantee against the bacteria no guarantee against the bacteria
that cause food-borne illness. If you have any doubt about a fresh or a cured food, discard it," he said.
