is the time to pile up on firewood But if you don't know what may be left out in the cold Firewood is often sold by the cord, which measures eight fee
long, four feet wide and four fee high. Some sellers may promise a full cord, yet only deliver one--third
or one-half a cord. This is more or one-half a cord. This is mor likely to happen if the wood
simply dumped, rather than stacke on your property. So if you're no familiar with the seller, it may be a good idea to pay an extra charge to
have the wood stacked. The fee may actually save you money.
If you do buy a cord, keep in mind that the four feet wide pieces
may be too big for your fireplace stove. Decide if you want to cut the wood yourself, or pay someone to
do it for your. Or, ocnsider buying face cord, one-third of a cord, Look for dry, seasoned wood. will have cracks or splits in th least sixd should have been cut at leas six monus carlier, preferably year. Remember,
wood will not burn. heating purposes, buy frewood for instead of softwood. Hardwoods include oak, most fruit trees (such as
apple and cherry), ash, apple and cherry), ash, maple and
birch. These woods generally cost more, but may be well worth it since they have a greater density and weight and generally give off more
heat. Also, consider fnitwoods yeu'd like to fill the home with pleasant aroma, especially around the holidays.
Soltwoods, such as pines, gener-
ally leave more ash. They also have a higher moisture content whic causes a popping sound when the
burn.
On the other hand, kiln-dried and construction wood have a very low moisture content and bum quickly. It is recommended that these woods not be used in the fireplace or stove

back to England where many American Christmas traditions have their roots.
"Nog" is actually an old English word meaning ale. The English, however, actually made egg nog
with red Spanish wine, and American seulers substituted rum and other spirits, bourbon being the
favorite in the South. To this they favorite in the South. To this they
added prodigious amounts of eggs and cream for a rich, calorie-laden and cream One old recipe called for 32 eggs, 32 heaping tablespoons of
powdered sugar and two-and-a-half quarts of whipped cream spiked amply with brandy and sherry or Madeira wine.
Less well-kn
Less well-known than egg nog, syllabub dates from 16th century
England. There is speculation that the last syllable of the word may have come from "bubble," which makes sense. The drink, originally
was made by milking a cow directly was made by milking a cow directly
into a bucket of wine, producing a great deal of froth. Syllabub varied from region to region but was always some combination of milk or
cream and wine or another acid such cream and wine or another acid such
as cider. In the Southem states it was so thick it had to be eaten with a spoon. Webster's Dictionary, in fact, defines the mixture as a dessert
that when thin is served as a drink that when thin is served as a drink
and when thick is often poured over fruit or cake.
Alcohol, an ingredient in most recipes, can be omitued without
harming the flavor of either drink. -Though the drinks may have come here from England, their
major ingredients are produced right here in Texas. The state ranks
eight in eighth in both egg and dairy produc-
tion. It is also among the top four tion. It is also among the top four
producers of honey in the country. A word of caution about eggs. With such fragile shells, eggs can be
easily damaged between farm and
