## Assessments help, but vandals damage parks

Utility customers of the City of Hereford are dong their part to upgrade the city's park system.
In three months' time, the park development fund has grown to
$\$ 12,720$ $\$ 12,720$ through a $\$ 1$ voluntary
assessment program on city water assessment program on city water
bills.

"It's hard to justify spending the money if it's going to be torn up," said City Manager Chester Nolen after the Veterans Park damage was
discovered. discovered.

been very successful. "We have better than 80 percent participation," he said, observing that the last billing nctted \$4,043 for the
fund, from 5,023 city water custom-

In the three months since the fee was put on water bills, Hereford $\$ 12,720$, almost equaling the amount earmarked for park development in
the current budget, $\$ 15,000$.

## Book details Lucas' murderous roots

all this is over, everyone will know who's really stupid" - Serial killer Henry Lee Lucas recanting his cla
hat he commited 360 murders.

as "America's most notorious serial as "America s most notorious serial
murderer,", Henry Lee Lucas was
also one of history's least toncerned also one of history's ieast conce
and utterly remorseless killers. And surely its most pathetic and
pathological. Less monstrous than moronic, Less monstrous than moronic,
Lucas, a one-eyed drifter, killed his
mother, his teen-age wife, an old mother, his teen-age wife, an old
woman who befriended him and perhaps another hundred or so
innocent victims. No one knows. for sure, although
a new book by Texas author Mike N new book by Texas author Mike
Cox suggests that Lucas killed more Cox suggests that Lucas killed more
than many believe and less than he than many
claims. claims.
In a paperback original, "The
Confessions of Henry Lee Lucas," Cox offers a new dimension to the
bloody misadventures of Lucas and his equally disordered and deranged traveling companion Ottis Toole.
Cox, who first encountered Lucas Cox, whofirst encounteredLucas American-Statesman, provides a
chilling account of the homicidal odd couple's quest for sex, money and
blood and their random choice of targets, usually women in the wrong place at the wrong time.
They included Luca Viola, a woman with the societal graces of a viper, and his wife Becky
who, if not evil, was misguided. That's not to say either deserved That's not to say either deserved
killing, but innocent hey were not.
Not surprisingly, Lucas is on death Not surprisingly, Lucas is on death
row in Texas. Tooce is in prison in Florida and likewise bound for
execution, a fate neither seems overly execution, a fa
upset about.

Both men readily admitted crime and killing sprees conducted jointly investigators no end by confessing to
ind misdeeds he apparently did not commit.
The mystery in cases such as this is not so much what happened as

sumbled into Otis Toole, whom he'd met once in a Pennsylvania bar. Toole mot only was a psychopathic mental
Unlike Lucas, who mostly killed omen, Toole's victims usually were men.

Toole introduced his one-eyed drinking buddy to his 12 -year-old niece, iresistible. They ran off and later wed Lucas swears he loved Becky, even hough he butchered her.
Crisscrossing the country, Lucas surfaced in the early Eighties in Montague County north of the Dallas-
Fort Worth area, where he killed

But outside the courtroom, Lucas denied killing "Orange Socks." One who believed him was Hugh Aynnesworth, then a reporter for the
Dallas Times Dallas Times Herald. Aynesworth

designed to show that much of the Lucas affair was a sham.
That story soon appeared under a headline that implied as much: or Massive Hoax?"
The page-one story maintained that Lucasconfessed tof ar more slayings
than he committed and that the DPS task force "ignored or failed to pursueleads igat would or have proven the deceit of his confessions."
Lucas told Aynesworth and others Lucas told Aynesworth and others
that all but three of his confessions that all but three of his confessions
were lies designed to "show that law enforcement doesn't do its job." Cox writes that the revelations and subsequent controversy unfairly cast
the Texas Rangers and the DPS in a bad light by implying DPS in a ambraced some purported fraud. At the very least, however, itdoes appear that state police permitted other law enforcement agencies to use
Lucas as a convenient if sometimes illogical solution to their homicidal illogical
puzzles.

## Garner returns to series

LOS ANGELES (AP) - After a
12-year absence, James Garner, a good-natured actor who can't seem to avoid crises of body or spirit, is returning to series television.

The new show is NBC's "Man of the People," set to premiere Sunday, Sept. 15 at 8 p.m. The main differ ence between it and "The Rockford Files," "Maverick," or even "Nichols" is in length - the new show is 30 minutes long, his previous efforts were an hour.

And the fact that it's a comedy. Do not, however, say this to Garner. He considers all the above mentioned TV roles comedic.
${ }^{\text {"I I keep getting interviewers }}$ saying 'How do you like doing comedy?" he says, exasperated between takes of his new series "This is not a three-wall, three-camera sitcom. I's a little story, with some people and stuff."

The people in this series include Stuart Margolin (his infuriating screw-up friend from "Rockford"). The stuff is Garner's portrayal of Jim Doyle, acon man ne'er-do-well who inherits his dead ex-wife's City Council seat.

Why has Garner, with myriad aches, pains, bum knee and repaired ticker, returned to series television a dozen years after health problems forced the cancellation of "Rockford"?
"I've been playing golf for 10 years," he said. "I really enjoy

he was nominated for an Emmy for the Hallmark Hall of Fame presentation "Decoration Day."
In it, Garner plays a retired judge who comes to the aid of a black childhood friend given the Medal of Honor 31 years late.

There also was "Promise," in 1986 and "My Name is Bill W.," both made with actor James Woods and both produced for Hallmark. For the former, Garner earned an Emmy for producing the TV movie.

In Garner's 35-year career, there have been more than a few unpleasing, highly publicized moments.
There was the $\$ 1.5$ million breach-of-contract suit filed in 1980 by Universal Studios for his failure to finish "Rockford" episodes before NBC canceled the series because of Garner's poor health.

In 1988, he underwent quintuple bypass heart surgery, a procedure whose necessity Garner blamed on 45 years of smoking.

And so it is that the man who now returns to television wants to take life a little easier.
"I needed a rest," he said of his absence. ""Rockford" just about killed me. I always said that if I did another show, it would be 30 minutes. The hour-long action series is a killer."

As for his new show, Garner said he hopes it succeeds. If it doesn't. that's fine, too.
"I do my job. I know what I'm doing. I've been doing it a long time and if they don't like it, well, that's the way it goes."

LA FEMME NIKITA:
(1991/French with English subtitles) Starring Anne Parillaud. Don't be misled if you have not heard of this one. It is a French film that many distributors considered an art film and, as such, was only in limited release in the U.S.
The story concerns a tough French street girl (Anne Parillaud) who has a flair for killing. She is recruited by the Government to be an assassin. (You will be happy to know that, this time, the dirty deeds are being blamed on the French.) In order for her to carry out the assignment she is totally made over into a wily, sleekly turned out- operative (an XXX chromosome James Bond) who then, somewhat incongruously, falls in love with a supermarket clerk.
Luc Besson's film is best appreciated for the taut, high-gloss effectiveness of its pumped-up violence and the sumptuousness of its settings - as well as for its star, Anne Parillaud.
While the script is contrived and somewhat forced, Miss Parillaud does a fine job playing a nimble and dangerous looking assassin. Sh also has a pair of great-looking

COME SEE THE PARADISE: (1990) Starring Dennis Quaid and Tamlyn Tomita. Most of the film deals with the forbidden (by her family) love between an American labor organizer, Dennis Quaid, and a young Japanese-American girl (Tamlyn Tomita), in the early 1940s. The couple defies family and convention, and marries- only to be separated by World War II. Carrying what's left of their possessions, the JapaneseAmerican Kamamura family, along with the now married daughter and her young child, board a train and roll off to the internment camp where they will spend the rest of the war. Dennis Quaid is drafted into the army.
While the story tells only one side of the internment, leaving no emotion untouched in order to condemn the U.S. for this action, it is fairly well told, with a certain tension just below the surface that will capture your attention.
The film did very poorly in theaters but should find a good video audience. The story is a provocative subject at best and should spark some lively debate.

WAITING FOR THE LIGHT:
(1990) Starring Shirley MacLaine and Terri Garr. This is another film that did not fare well on the big screen but will find its audience in video. It is not a bad script actually - it just has the feel of being hastily made from a combination of several scripts.
Shirley MacLaine (overdoing it just a bit) plays an eccentric exmagician living with her straightlaced niece (Terri Garr - definitely cast against character) and the niece's children. The children are supposed to be impish, but on screen their charm is a little less evident.
After the children are kicked out of school for a number of reasons - the paramount one being their mitation of their ex-magician aunt the family moves to a small town where no one knows them
As a prank, the children decide to scare a less-than-thrilled-they-moved-next-door neighbor by dressing up as ghosts. They are, however, mistaken for angels and suddenly the town is in an uproar. When tourists by the droves start coming for the angel sighting, Shirley MacLaine has to get out her bag of magic tricks. Rated PG. It's a nice night home at the movies.

"The show's not to tell the story of a crime, but to have an insight into the emotional and legal aspects of a specific incident," Wolf said.

Not really, Wolf said, because advertisers know the kind of show they're getting - and that it airs in the final hour of prime time, when the wee ones presumably are asleep.

At that hour, he said, "people are not going to turn off their television because they know they're going to get explicit language or explicit story lines."

The Network Television Association, funded by $A B C, C B S$ and NBC, last month sent letters to $\mathbf{7 , 0 0 0}$ advertisers asking them not to yank their ads from shows that pressure groups deem inappropriate. The association. also pooh-poohed the impact of product boycotts by such groups, saying such boycotts don't work.
