## Furor over furloughs

JESSUP, Md. (AP) - A rapist
charged with attacking a woman
while on furlough from Patuxent In-
stitution may help doom the
maximum-security prison devoted to
treating violent offenders rather
than punishing them.
Coming on the heels of reports that
a Patuxent review board had
granted unsupervised furloughs to a
triple murderer, legislative headers
are threatening to abolish the
therapeutic institution, believed to
be the only one of its kind in the coun-
"I just don't think that it works,"
said R. Cl\&yton Mitchell Jr., speaker of the Maryland House of Delegates,
who has called for the firing of the prison director, Norma Gluckstern Furloughs and that sort of thing for
those types ought to be abolished."

furor over Patuxent's early releases and furloughs epitomizes a national
