ANAHEIM, Calif. (AP) - Cesar
Chave, leader of the United Farm Workers, has pulled out of a schedul ed speech to the League of United lap over a contribution by the Adolph Coors Co .
Several groups, including Hispanic
students and the AFL-CIO in ngeles, announced arlan in to day to set up informational pickets putside the league's national convenon here on Friday.
The AFL-CIO has longstanding brewer's non-union hiring practices and Hispanic students lashed out at
what they termed Coors what they termed Coors
"hypocritical" donations to Hispanic groups.
Chavez told organizers of the con ention, which began Wednesday a he Anaheim Marriott Hotel, that he ould not cross picket lines to ad
dress the convention Saturday dress the convention Saturday
About 7,000 members are expected to attend the sth Annual league con-
vention that ention that runs through Sunday.
"This protest will hurt," said the "This protest will hurt," said the
nvention chairman, Manuel Marquez.
However, Marquez said he parcipated in a two-year effort to find or this week's convention. Coors, which gave about $\$ 80,000$, was among,

"It's very hard to raise money," Marquez said. "These people (progot turned down by many, many cor decided to sponsor us." Organizers of the protest sharply
attacked an agreement reached las October between Coors and six Hispanic groups, in which Coor
agreed to invest $\$ 350$ million in the Hreed to invest $\$ 350$ million in the
Hispanic community over the next five years.
After the After the agreement was signed some Hispanic groups dropped their
support for a boycott organized by
the AFL-CIO in 1977 because of alleg. the AFL-C1O in 1977 because of alleg. The league was not. The league was not a part of the
agreement, however, and at the everal Orange County chapters nounced it as a sham. Stephanie Lopez, a spokeswoman California State University Fullerlon, said the protest is intended to rebut Coors "hypocrisy" and
"sleight of hand" agreements that sleight of hand" agreements that
she said have served as corporate public relations tools.
She said her coalition also opposes Coors' labor practices and the Coors family's support of right-wing
political causes that hurt minorities polical causes that hurt minorities,
