## Brand To Receive School Bell Prize

The Hereford Brand has been announced as winner of a Certificate of Merit in the Second Annual School Bell Awards Program sponsored by the Texas State Teachers Association.

I. P. Sturgeon, executive secretary of TSTA, told the Brand, "This award recognizes the outstanding contribution which you and your associates have made in significantly advancing community understanding and support for public education through quality interpretation of issues facing public schools in our state."

Sturgeon reported the Deaf Smith County Chapter of TSTA had submitted the Brand's nomination "for recognition in the category of outstanding continuous coverage of education news, increasing public understanding of school achievements, problems, and programs for a twin or semi-weekly newspaper."

One of four classifications for statewide newspapers, this category was listed as number one. Others included feature stories, editorials, and outstanding pictures as separate qualifications.

The only means for a newspaper to be considered for an award is by being nominated by a TSTA local association within its circulation area. Deaf Smith County Texas State Teachers Association had to present documentation of all stories, then compile and mount the individual clippings in such a manner as to facilitate evaluation by the

### Readers Are Asking

**WHAT is infantile eczema? Can it be prevented? How is it treated?**

This type of skin condition is known as atopic dermatitis. It occurs particularly in infants and almost always is considered to be an allergic reaction.



The word eczema is derived from the Greek meaning "to boil." This is exactly the appearance of the skin that is affected. The face is the most common site, but the under surface of the knees, armpits and buttocks may show the characteristic red, angry appearance.

Itching is frequently severe and distressing. It has been noticed that breastfed infants almost never develop infantile eczema. Cow's milk may, therefore, be the offender. Children with this condition frequently show other evidence of allergy. The skin should be lubricated with the gentlest preparations, creams and lotions in order to avoid further irritation of the sensitive areas.

It takes a great deal of combined effort by the parents and the doctor to find the offending substance and to bring relief from the skin infection and to avoid its recurrence.

**SPEAKING OF YOUR HEALTH**—Exposure to constant noise can do the sensitive hearing mechanism a great injustice. Many factories now protect against it.

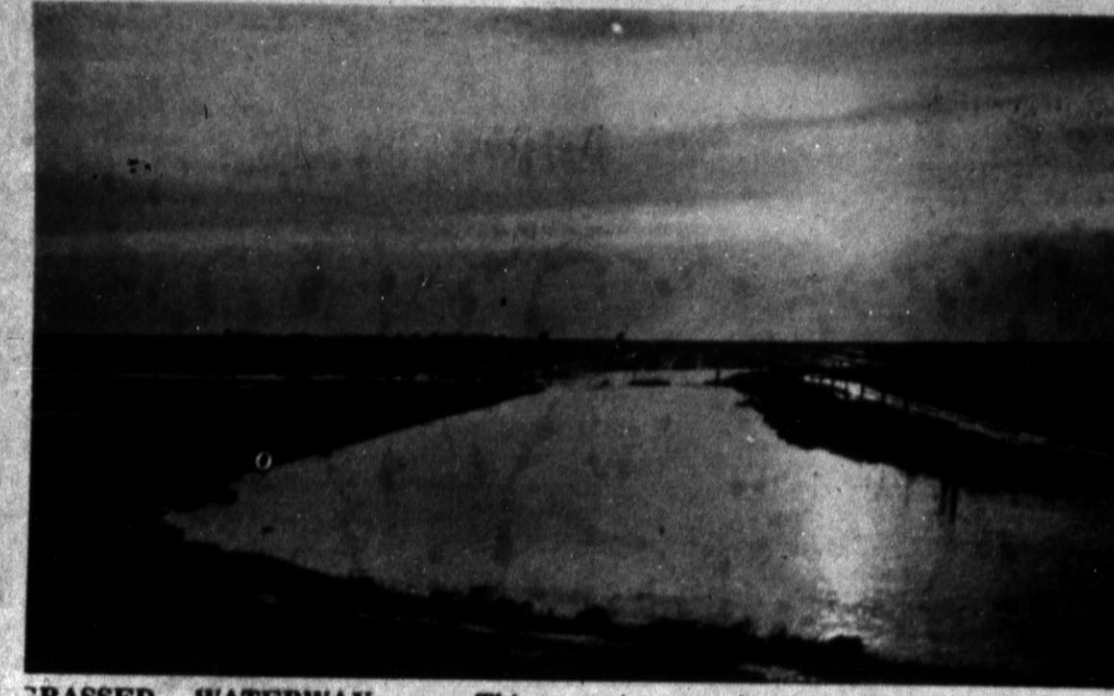

# Grassed Waterways Need Established

The rains that we have received here in Deaf Smith County recently have probably created a need for some grassed waterways. A grassed waterway is a natural or man-made watercourse protected against erosion by a grassed cover, Ed Blackwell of Soil Conservation Service explained. Waterways may serve as safe outlets for terraces, diversions, contour rows or they may serve as passageways for water that enters a farm from other land. If there is no native grass on which to outlet water, the whole water erosion control system may depend upon the establishment of a grassed waterway, Blackwell said. If you do not have them, or if you do have and they do not work, all other parts of the water erosion control system for the field or farm may fail too. The area in the grassed waterway may seem expensive, but considering the entire acreage it is serving, it is relatively cheap. "The most satisfactory location of a waterway is in a natural drain. Usually these are the flattest slopes. Here the soil and moisture is usually favorable for good grass growth. If it is not practical or desirable to locate the waterway in a natural drain, location will probably be next to a field boundary." The size of a waterway should be wide enough and deep enough to hold the largest flow of water from the heaviest rain expected on an average of about once in ten years. It should not flow onto bare, unprotected soil. After the waterway is shaped, the seedbed should be prepared in a way to resemble that of a field ready for planting to wheat or grain sorghum. Some of the better grasses to plant in a waterway are Midland Bermuda, Western Wheatgrass, Buffalograss, and Sideoats Grama. These

are sod-forming grasses with a deep, dense root system. Where there is a danger of outside water (tailwater) damaging the waterway before the grass is established, the outside water should be diverted out of the waterway, Blackwell said. A grassed waterway is not a waste area. It is an essential part of the soil and water conservation treatment of your farm. Grassed waterways can be used for hay, grazing, or seed production.

# Taxpayers Ask IRS

This column of questions and answers on federal tax matters is provided by the local office of the U. S. Internal Revenue Service and is published as a public service to taxpayers. The column answers questions most frequently asked by taxpayers. Q — I've got an opportunity to get a better job, but it will mean moving to another city. If my moving expenses aren't paid by my company, can I deduct them? A — If you move to take a job with a new employer or are transferred by your present employer, moving expenses are deductible when certain conditions are met. These conditions are the 20-mile distance and 39-week employment requirements. The first requires that your new place of employment be at least 20 miles further away from your old home than your previous job was. If your old job was eight miles from your old home, your new job would have to be at least 28 miles from that residence to qualify. The second requires that you work full time in the new area at least 39 weeks during the 12-month period following your move. Q — If I itemize, can I deduct the cost of hunting and fishing licenses? A — No, these are not deductible for Federal income tax purposes. Q — What's the deadline for paying my maid's Social Security? A — Taxes for the third quarter covering July, August, and September are due October 31 and should be paid by filing a Form 942, Employer's Quarterly Tax Return for Household Employees. Q — I've been taking a tax deduction for the cost of clearing out the drainage ditches on my farm while my neighbor has been capitalizing his costs for doing the same thing. Who's right? A — Soil and water conservation costs such as these may either be deducted within limits or capitalized depending on how you decide to handle them the first year. Once this decision is made, continue to handle these expenses that way or obtain the written permission of IRS to change. Q — When a person dies, what happens if there had been income tax withheld on his salary during the year? A — An income tax return must be filed for the deceased taxpayer if his gross income for the year was \$600 or more (\$1,200 if the taxpayer was 65 or over). The withheld taxes you asked about will be applied against whatever tax liability may exist for the decedent. Any excess will be refunded. For more information sent a post card to your District Director and ask for a free copy of Publication 559, Fe-

deral Tax Guide for Survivors, Executors and Administrators. Q — I'm back in school after working in a department store for the summer. Can I get a refund now on the taxes withheld from my pay? A — No, you will have to wait until after the end of the year before you can file your return. To avoid delays when you file for your refund, check now to make sure you have the W-2 statement of wages paid and taxes withheld your employer gave you when you left. A copy of this statement must be filed with your return. Q — Will enough be taken out of my pay to cover the surcharge? A — Withholding rates have been adjusted to take care of the income tax surcharge. For most people, withholding should be sufficient to satisfy their tax liabilities this year. Q — The IRS auditor who examined my return says I owe \$65 more. Can I get a further hearing on my case without getting involved with legal fees and the like? A — Yes, you may request a district conference and present your side of the dispute to an impartial third party. It will not be necessary for you to engage legal counsel to represent you at the conference. It also is not necessary to file a formal written protest to obtain a conference since the tax involved is less than \$2,500. Procedures for requesting a conference are outlined in a letter you will receive from IRS setting forth the results of the examination of your return. Q — I found an expense I overlooked when I filled out my tax return this year. Is it too late to make this change? A — No, you may still claim this expense by filing Form 1040X, Amended U. S. Individual Income Tax Return. As a general rule, you have three years from the date your return was due to claim items you forgot about. Copies of the form and instructions for completing it may be obtained by writing to your District Director. Q — My son worked on my farm this summer and I paid him regular wages. Can I deduct them just as I do wages paid to my other workers? A — Yes, reasonable wages paid to your son are deductible if there is a true employer-employee relationship. "Does that Internal Revenue employee know what he's talking about?" is a common question that taxpayers ask of their accountant, attorney, or friend. The best insight into how much the tax man would know would come from a look at the (1) kind of education required, (2) type of training received after they are employed in Internal

Revenue, and (3) experience required. (1) Ordinarily Internal Revenue Agents, Revenue Officers and all of the professional and technical employees in Internal Revenue Service are required to have a college degree or the equivalent of a degree in experience at a professional level. (2) When Internal Revenue recruits the young accounting graduates upon finishing college they are required to go to school for 13 weeks before they audit any cases. Then the young man or woman receives additional on-the-job training for another 13 weeks. Most Internal Revenue Agents are required to take additional advanced tax training of three to six weeks every few years. Constant on the job study is necessary since each case report prepared by an Agent must be supported by law, regulation, court decisions, or other applicable rulings. Internal Revenue has one of the better training programs for their professional and technical employees out of all the public and private training programs for comparable large organizations. (3) Finally, in looking at the experience of the Internal Revenue employee, each employee works only cases for which he is fully qualified. The new college graduate would not be assigned to audit a billion dollar conglomerate. This type of case would be worked by a highly competent, senior, fully experienced taxman that knows how to get additional professional and technical support from the specialists such as engineers and the Counsel. Of course the man working your case could make a mistake and could be wrong, but it is safe to say he should know what he is talking about. # Price Says He Does Not Advocate Low Farm Price

I have been disappointed this week to have received some letters and telegrams from Panhandle residents who believe I have advocated lower prices for our farm products. I assure you that nothing can be further from the truth. I hope partisan poli-

tics is not being played in this problem in order to discredit my efforts on behalf of the farmers of the district.

I have made no statement or implied threat that the Commodity Credit Corporation would sell its grain to drive down pri-

ces on grain sorghum. (As a matter of fact the disposal of this grain is entirely in the hand of the Commodity Credit Corporation which has sole responsibility for disposing of their stocks under the law.)

In answer to my inquiry re-

garding the method the Commodity Credit Corporation is required to use in disposing of its commodity holding under the present law and how it might affect our district and the State of Texas, the Department of Agricultural has advised me that:

"With the beginning of a new marketing year on October 1, 1969, CCC has lowered its grain sorghum sales prices by the amount of carrying charges for storage and interest costs. However, sales of-

ferings are being confined to port positions during October and CCC will not be competing with new crop farm supplies in West Texas or other interior locations."

I also have always felt that the members of any farm or commodity organization have the right to take any lawful action they desire to obtain a fair price for their products. I have worked with all these organizations in order to find an equitable solution to the farm problem. I did

not leave my farming and ranching operations in the Panhandle to come to Washington to work against the farmer.

We are in a unique position in our area because of the expansion of feed lot operations creating a local demand for our grain as well as livestock. I hope we will not jeopardize this expansion by fighting among ourselves.

This is a local problem between local businessmen, and I will not take sides. However, I stand

ready and willing to do anything I possibly can to find an equitable solution to this problem.

I am also sorry to hear that some remarks I made recently in the district were misconstrued. I said at that time I have confidence that the proposed grain withholding action by some farmers will not result in violence as it has in other areas. I believe farm organization leaders and members can agree on a fair price for their products with the consumer without caus-

ing extensive damage to our local economy.

# Residents Spend \$30,000 Per Day

NEW YORK — What portion of Federal government spending, which now totals about \$190 billion a year, is borne by Deaf Smith County taxpayers?

How much does it cost local residents, through income taxes and other taxes, to meet their share of the spending for national defense, education, interest on the national debt, space research and the gamut of other programs?

The \$190 billion total is too vast to be meaningful to most people. It becomes somewhat more comprehensible, however, when it is shown that it amounts to \$6,000 per second.

The calculation was made by William V. Roth, Jr., a Delaware congressman, who has been concerned over the steadily-rising cost of government.

Deaf Smith County's share of this spending is estimated at \$1.54 per day for every local resident. For the local population as a whole, it adds up to \$30,000 a day.

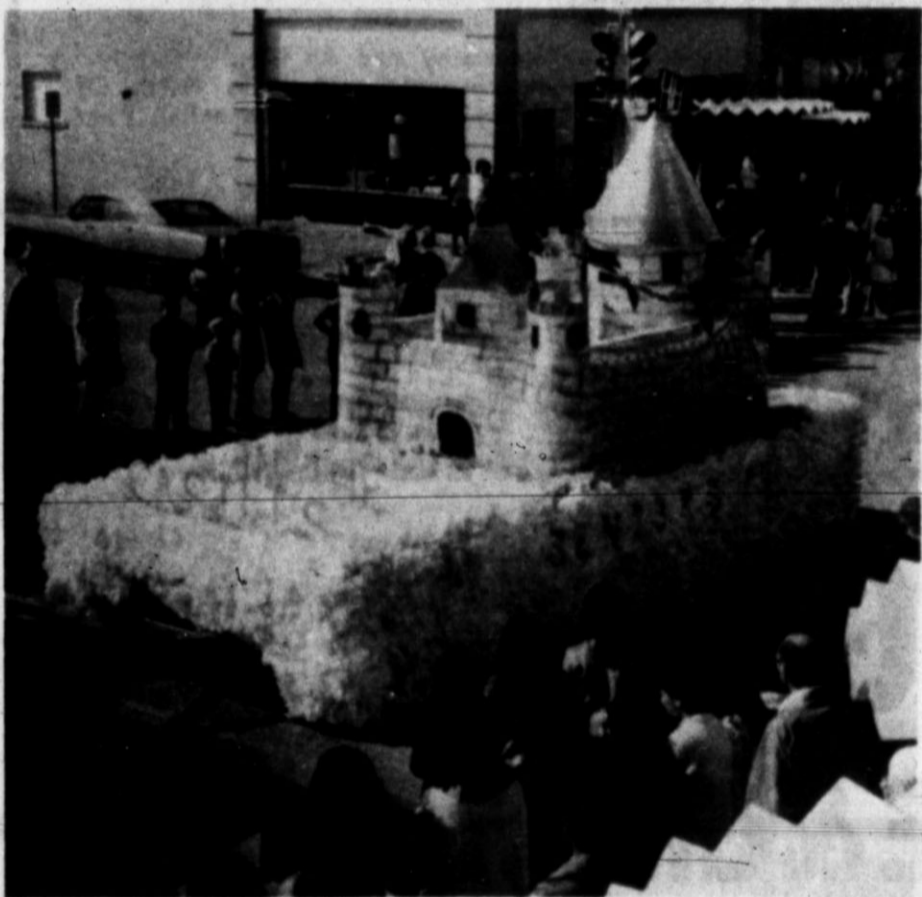
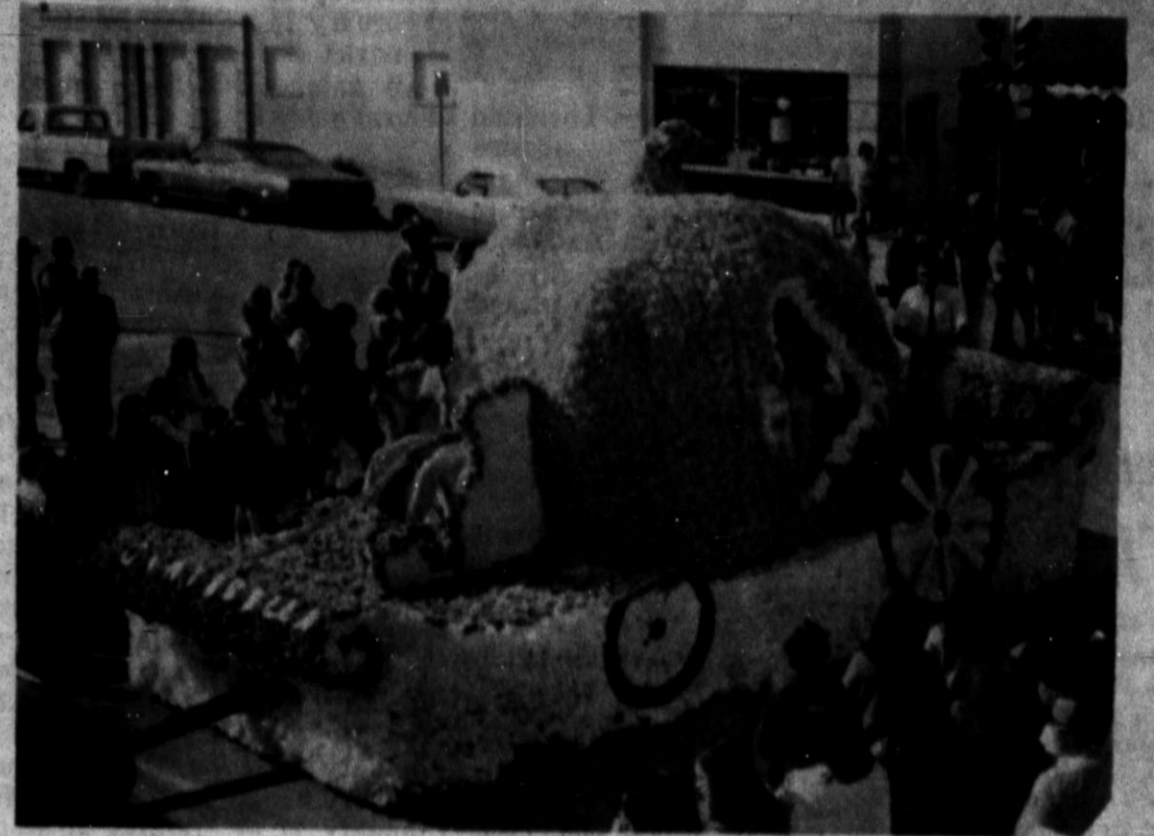






# 1969 Homecoming

# Rains Halt Area Cotton

**LUBBOCK** —The South Plains cotton harvest was just getting under way when heavy rains halted all operations, according to W. K. Palmer, in charge of the Lubbock Cotton Classing Office of the USDA.

Samples received at the USDA's Lubbock, Brownfield, and Lamesa Classing Offices had reached a seasonal high last Monday when the adverse weather halted the harvest. The three offices classed approximately 4,300 samples during the week ending Friday. This brought the total classed at the three offices this season to 9,500. Through October 24 last year 45,000 samples of the 1968 crop had been classed. Strict Low Middling was the predominant grade at Lubbock last week with 49 per cent of all cotton classed. Middling made up 4 per cent, Middling Light Spotted 12 per cent and Strict Low Middling Light Spotted 26 per cent.

Seventy-three percent of the cotton classed at the Lubbock office last week stapled 1-inch and better. Most of the early harvested cotton from the Lubbock and Brownfield areas has been machine picked and most of the Lamesa area cotton has been stripped. Micronaire continued very high. Ninety-six per cent "milked" in the premium category of 3.5 to 4.9.

Prices offered for these early bales indicate a strong demand for South Plains cotton. Prices, as reported to the Consumer and Marketing Service of the USDA, ranged from \$2.50 per bale over the loan for high grade cotton to \$15 per bale over the loan for the lower grades.

Average prices paid for the most predominant qualities in the 3.5 to 4.9 micronaire range were: Strict Low Middling 15-16 — 18.50, Strict Low Middling 31-32 — 19.10, Strict Low Middling 1-inch — 20.05, Strict Low Middling Light Spotted 15-16 — 17.75, Strict Low Middling Light Spotted 31-32 — 18.25 and Strict Low Middling Light Spotted 1-inch — 18.90.

Prices paid farmers for cottonseed ranged from \$37 to \$45 per ton.
