

## Dog Gone? Yours May Be

Dog gone!  
That's exactly what your dog might be — gone — if it isn't properly tagged.

Due to the amended animal control ordinance passed by the Hereford city commission in May, the running-at-large of dogs, as well as poultry, rabbits and livestock is prohibited within the city limits.

THE AMENDED ordinance provides a means of levying and assessing an annual tax on dogs kept or maintained within the city limits. The ordinance calls for a \$1 per annum tax on every dog kept in the city limits.

At the time the tax is paid, the dog owner is issued a tag with a permanent identification number. The tag must be permanently attached to the collar or harness of the dog at all times. Before the issuance of the identification number and tag however, the owner must provide proof of vaccination. Dogs must be vaccinated every year.

City police officers have had several calls from Hereford residents this spring complaining about loose or stray dogs.

Residents have also reported several times of three or four dogs running stray in a pack.

UNDER THE new ordinance Hereford city police or animal control officers can take into custody any dog found running at large. If the owner wants his dog back, he must pay a \$3 impoundment fee, pay the \$1 dog tax for the year, unless it has already been paid, and furnish proof of vaccination.

The city dog tag also serves as identification for dogs lost from their owners. City personnel who pick up a loose dog can identify its owner by the number on the tag.

IF THE OWNER has not claimed his dog within a certain period of time, the dog will either be sold at auction, or destroyed. If the dog is sold at auction, the purchaser must pay the dog tax and get the proper vaccinations within 24 hours of the time of purchase.

Under the ordinance any person who refuses to restrain his dog or to have it properly vaccinated is guilty of a misdemeanor and can be fined up to \$25. Each day's violation constitutes a separate offense.

## Governor To Head Celebration Parade

Texas Gov. Dolph Briscoe announced this week he has accepted the invitation of Hereford's 75th Diamond Jubilee Celebration committee to be Parade Marshal August 25 at the opening parade of the city-wide celebration.

Hereford officials of the celebration had invited Briscoe several months ago, but were notified only this week after the governor turned down other invitations for the last week in August to accept the invitation as head of the local parade.

OTHER state officials who have already accepted invitations to be here sometime during the celebration are State Rep. Bill Clayton and State Sen. Max Sherman.

Officials of the Jubilee corporation said other invitations to the celebration are being considered by U.S. Cong. George Mahon, U.S. Sen. Lloyd Bentsen and U.S. Sec. of Agriculture Earl Butz.

In other action surrounding preparation for the celebration, men's clothing garments designed for the theme of "Then and Now" are now on sale at various locations in downtown Hereford and in Sugarland Mall, according to Dale Lawrence.

TOP-HATS, arm-bands and ties, with garters, vests and coats to be included soon, are now on sale downtown at Gastons, Anthonys, McDowell Drug and Perry Bros.

In Sugarland Mall the items will be on sale at The Brogue and at Gastons.

Lawrence said many of the top hats, which come in four different styles, have already been sold and several ties are already being worn by men in town.

DALE YOUNG general chairman of the celebration, said the commemorative coins for the celebration will be sold out within a few days and said he expects the few saved to be auctioned during the celebration will bring high prices.

The coins, of which only 200 are being minted, show the Hereford Whiteface on one side, and will be numbered from 1 through 200 with the first 1-6 and numbers 73 and 75 being withheld. Number 6 will be given to the governor with the others to be auctioned during the celebration in August.

Price for the silver and bronze coin set is \$20 for advance orders mailed to Box 75, Hereford.

ALSO, A souvenir historical booklet for the Diamond Jubilee celebration will

be published containing much of the historical background of Hereford and many of the early residents.

SEVERAL chapters of "Brother of the Brush" are beginning competitive activities with others organizing into entertaining groups. "Brothers" chapters contain 10-15 local men who grow either a beard or mustache in observance of the historical aspect of the celebration.

Membership into "Brothers of the Brush" is \$1 while membership into "Smoothies" chapters, for men who do not grow beards or mustaches, is \$2. Each man must wear either a "Brothers" or "Smoothie" button or be subject to a "Kangaroo Court," which is expected to prosecute violators with various punishments including dunking into a horsetank.

Young said about 250-300 Hereford residents will be needed soon as volunteers for a play-pageant to be held in Whiteface Stadium during the celebration. Young said the spectacle is being written now and will involve many aspects of Hereford and Deaf Smith County history.

HAROLD WHEELER, parade chairman, said many groups have already been committed for the parade with many area bands, color guards, Kiva Shriners band and motorcycle groups. Several Army marching platoons and army equipment exhibits are also planned during the parade and celebration.

## Bank Affiliation Set

Harlan D. Vander Zee, president of Hereford State Bank; Jeff R. Carille, executive vice president of Hereford State Bank; and Walter F. Johnson, president of First Abilene Bankshares, Inc., Abilene, jointly announced this week the signing of a letter of intent from First Abilene Bankshares, Inc. for the acquisition of the outstanding shares of the Hereford State Bank.

The transaction contemplates that the shareholders of the Hereford State Bank will exchange their stock for stock in the First Abilene Bankshares, Inc. and an agreed amount of cash.

According to the letter, the transaction is subject to the approval of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System and an effective registration of the stock with the Securities Exchange Commission.

In a joint statement, Vander Zee and Carille said that they are most enthusiastic about the prospects of benefits to be derived from this affiliation. They added that no changes will be made in the bank's policies or in its Board of Directors, officer staff, or employees.

The Hereford State Bank has 15,000 shares outstanding at the present time, was organized in 1947, and reported assets in excess of \$20,000,000 at the end of 1972.

First Abilene Bankshares, Inc. is a registered multi-bank holding company.

Its principal subsidiary is the First National Bank of Abilene, organized in 1889, which reported assets in excess of \$103,000,000 at the end of 1972. In addition to First National Bank of Abilene, First Abilene Bankshares, Inc. owns 28.57 per cent of the stock of the Bank of Commerce, Abilene.

Walter Johnson, President of the First Abilene Bankshares, said that he had been most impressed by the strong and sustained growth of the Hereford area and that he welcomed the opportunity for First Abilene Bankshares to have a strong affiliate in the Hereford area.

Johnson also said that upon consummation of the acquisition it is proposed that Marvin Carille, who is

chairman of the board of the Hereford State Bank, chairman of the board of Kress National Bank, and president of the First National Bank of Tulsa, will become a director of the Board of First Abilene Bankshares, Inc.

"We are delighted at the prospect of having Mr. Carille as a member of our holding company board. He is recognized as an outstanding banker and his counsel and advice will be most meaningful to our board," Johnson said.

Johnson, president of the Abilene bank, is highly regarded among Texas Bankers and is a past president of the Texas Bankers Association, having served in that capacity during the term of 1966-67.

### County Action Postponed

Deaf Smith County Commissioners met for only a few minutes Monday at a regularly scheduled court meeting, recessing until next Monday at 10 a.m. due to the death of commissioner Bruce Coleman's son.

The county commissioners meet the second and fourth Mondays of each month. The Monday session lasted just long enough for commissioners to ap-

prove monthly bills, then a motion was made to recess until next Monday.

County Judge H. C. Williams also announced the courthouse offices would be closed during the Coleman funeral services Tuesday afternoon.

Business on the county agenda next Monday will include a conference with the architect on the plans for the new county library.

## Funeral Held For Jeff Coleman, 13

Funeral services for Jeffrey Bruce Coleman, 13, son of Deaf Smith County Commissioner and Mrs. Bruce Coleman, were conducted Tuesday afternoon in First Christian Church, where the youth was a member active in youth programs. Young Coleman was killed in a motorcycle-car accident about 6:45 p.m. Sunday on FM 214 near the family home 24 miles west of Hereford.

The youth apparently had just turned

his motorcycle onto the farm road when the collision occurred with the car driven by Irl Jack, a neighbor of the Colemans. The Jack vehicle went off the road to the right and into a field and the cycle traveled just less than 100 feet from the impact.

Young Coleman was carried to Farmer County Community Hospital in Friona where he was pronounced dead on arrival.

Born July 13, 1959, in Hereford, the youth had lived in this county all his life and had just completed the eighth grade in Hereford schools. He was active in 4-H Club and school events.

In addition to the parents he is survived by a sister, Cindy, of the home, a brother, Gary, of Hereford, and his grandmother, Mrs. Josie Busby of Lubbock.



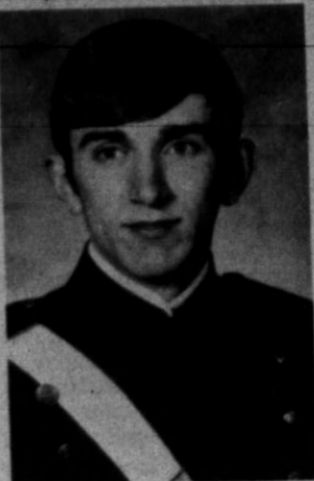
# New Pastor Named

After graduating from high school, he attended Hardin Simmons University, Oklahoma Baptist University and received a master's degree from Southwestern State College.

Previous pastorates include the First Baptist Church of Custer City, Okla., and the First Church of Weatherford, Okla. Manning was selected to deliver the annual sermon at the Oklahoma Baptist State Convention in 1969, and was a member of the Tulsa Youth Council in 1969. Manning participated in the Billy Graham follow-up meetings in the Philippine

Islands in 1963 and held a revival in Ewa Beach, Hawaii in 1966. He was the state college oratory champion in 1956.

The new Hereford minister has been a frequent speaker on college campuses and at various high schools throughout Oklahoma, and has also been engaged in an active program of Marital and personal counseling.

# Theft Reported To Police

Theft of \$64 in cash from a money bag in a Hereford business was reported to Hereford police over the weekend in addition to numerous other complaints and accidents.

B.B. Noyes told Hereford police officers Saturday the money was taken sometime Friday night from B.B. Noyes and Sons Steel Company office. Noyes said someone apparently pulled the screen loose from a window on the east side of the building to gain entry to the office where the money was taken from a money bag in a desk.

In other action over the weekend officers arrested four local men on charges of drunkenness, three for disorderly conduct, one for driving while intoxicated and also arrested an alien from Mexico.

Six vehicle accidents were investigated by officers with the majority happening Friday.

About 8:30 a.m. Friday an accident was reported in the 700-block of Avenue K in which a 1973 Ford station wagon driven by Janice Meador Vines, 236 Elm, was in collision with a 1973 Chevrolet station wagon driven by Frances Andrews Zetsche.

The Vines vehicle had apparently stopped in front of a church on Avenue K heading north and was pulling back onto the street as the Zetsche vehicle was heading north on Avenue K and attempted to turn right into the church parking lot.

A 1963 Chevrolet driven by Jimmy Boggs, 606 Stanton, collided with a 1971 Hornet driven by Frances Funk Eddy of Rt. 3, Box 16. Both cars were headed east on 15th Street when the Hornet attempted a left turn onto Stanton and the Boggs vehicle apparently collided with the rear of the Eddy vehicle.

Billie Faye Manion, Rt. 5, Box 153, was apparently backing from a private driveway about 5:30 p.m. Monday when the 1967 Chevrolet she was driving was involved in an accident with a 1970 White truck-tractor driven by Jimmy Neal Barchers of Plainview, who was driving west on U.S. 60.

## Two Fires Reported

Two fires were reported to Hereford firemen this past week involving a fire in a kitchen at Blue Water Garden Apartments and a truck engine fire.

The fire in Blue Water Gardens occurred about 1:57 p.m. Saturday in an apartment of Charles Digby. Digby was found lying on the floor when firemen arrived and he was carried to the hospital for minor injuries

and treated and released. The fire at the apartment involved food on the kitchen stove which had caught fire. Considerable smoke damage was done to the apartment, but no other injuries or apparent major damage done.

Firemen also responded to a reported truck-tractor engine fire about 10:30 p.m. Monday nine miles west of the city on U.S. 60. The air breather had caught fire on the truck but the driver had the flames extinguished before firemen arrived.

## Burned Victims Transferred

Tom Timberlake, 21, and Chris Kemp, 11, who suffered second and third degree burns in a butane explosion west of Hereford last week, were transferred to Galveston hospitals this week for more intense treatment.

Both had been treated at Deaf Smith General Hospital before being transferred to High Plains Baptist Hospital in Amarillo.

Young Kemp, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Glenn Green, was transferred to the Shiner

Hospital in Galveston and Timberlake was placed in John Sealey Hospital. Both were still listed in critical condition.

The two were injured along with Timberlake's brother, Paul, 17, while the three were working with the butane on a farm 23 miles west of Hereford. Paul, who received only first-degree burns when the flames

engulfed the other two, called for an ambulance and then drove toward Hereford to meet the coming ambulance.

Paul was treated and released from Deaf Smith Hospital shortly after the accident.

# School Trustees Study Budget, New Building

Hereford School Trustees discussed at length Tuesday night the tentative proposed budget for next year, plans for a new elementary building, and heard an in-depth concerning the Vocational Adjustment Class for retarded children.

Little major action was taken during the six-hour meeting which lasted into Wednesday morning, but trustees and Supt. Roy Hartman expressed satisfaction at the progress made in discussion of the budget and new building plans.

Administrative Asst. Bill Phillips went over the entire proposed budget for next fall with trustees and explained that the school system should be much better financially than in recent years. Phillips said the school's capitalizing on special programs of the state and federal government helps the financial picture.

Total estimated revenues for the 1973-74 school year are \$3,708,175, or \$100,175 over the last year's receipts.

Total expenses are expected to be about \$3,703,650 and

\$118,795 above last year's expenses.

Architect Herb Brasher presented three floor plan schemes for the proposed new elementary school building to be located on West Park Avenue and to replace the present Central School building. Brasher discussed the preliminary schemes with trustees in order to get ideas for more concrete plans for the new school.

Trustees generally agreed on a modified open-space classroom building with seven learning centers around a media center. Six of the centers would be for the different grade levels in elementary with the seventh for a kindergarten level.

An all-purpose room for eating and recreation purposes was included with an auditorium stage at one end and a music room joining the stage.

Trustees decided to schedule a special meeting of the board for 6 a.m. next Wednesday at the Caison House for further plans on the building and to view more advanced schemes of the floor plan by Brasher.

Gene Brock, instructor in the Vocational Adjustment Class (VAC) addressed the trustees concerning the VAC program and its purpose.

"We are very proud of the program," Brock said. "We feel we have provided jobs in the community for persons who might never be able to hold down a job without this training."

Brock said he and Byron Terrell work with the retarded children of the school in an effort to teach them skills of jobs and then try to locate a full-time job for the youth.

"We work mostly with the mentally handicapped although we are also here to help any handicapped person in adjusting to a job."

"We try to determine the ability and maturity of each of the students and teach them everyday math of payroll deductions and budgets so they will understand why their paycheck is not as large as it should be."

Brock said his job has not been just an 8:30-3:30 job, but he enjoys it because he feels he is helping the kids.

"We get calls for the kids

because they have problems with their family or employer and then employers call us to help work out some problem on the job," he said. "These calls may come after 5 p.m. or on Saturdays or Sunday and we try to counsel with the kids then to help them keep their job and feel they are doing a good job."

Brock also said a few of the students are so retarded to probably ever hold down jobs, but that they are working to create "closed conditions" jobs for these people so that they can feel they are doing something constructive and that they can get paid for."

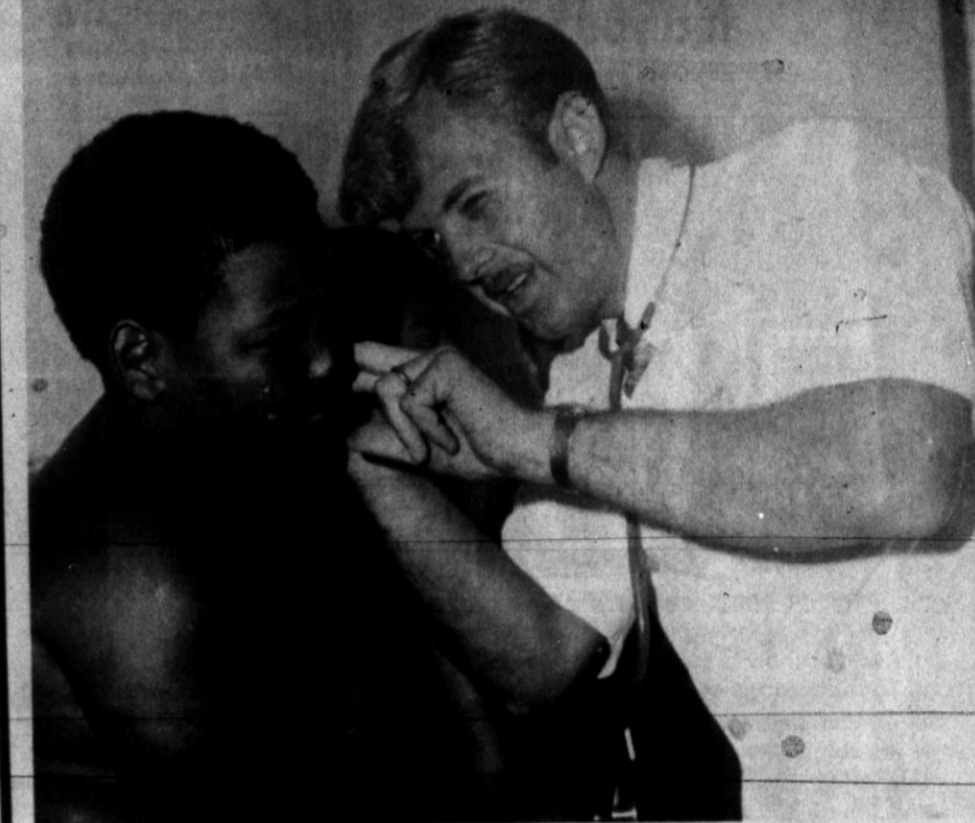
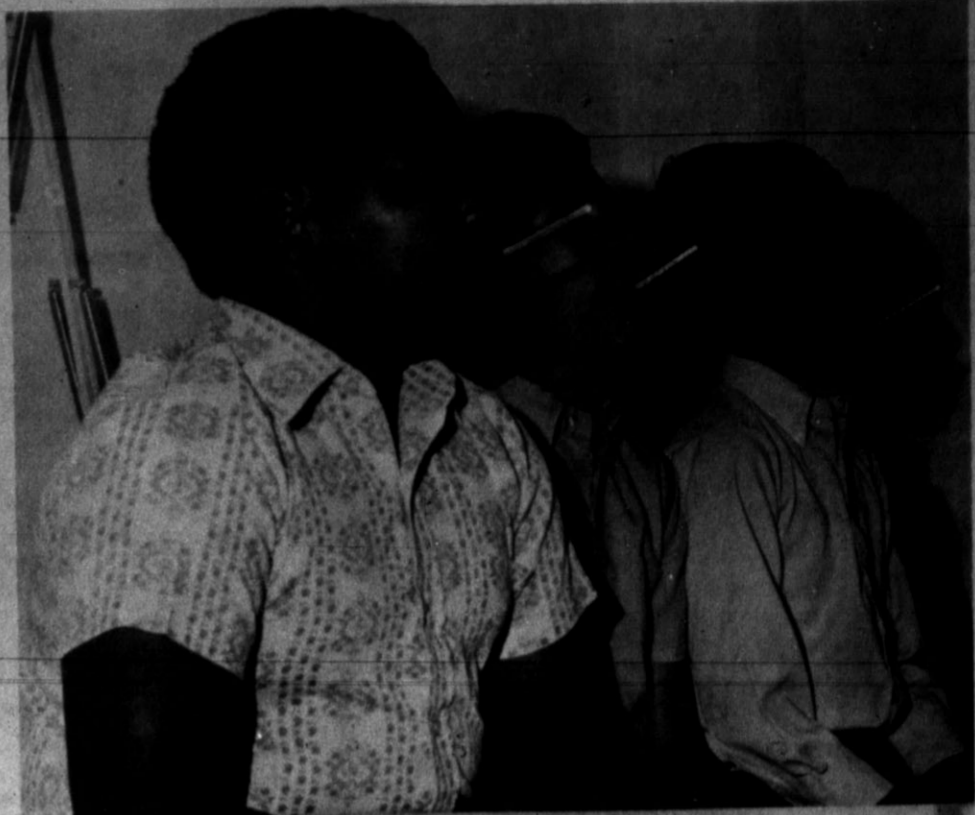

## Library Gets Grant

Deaf Smith Library in Hereford has received a grant of \$1,250 from federal Library Services and Construction Act funds administered by the Texas State Library.

It is one of 188 libraries in the state with local support that qualified for the LSCA grants.

In discussing the LSCA program, Dr. Dorman H. Winfrey, director of the Texas State Library, pointed out the importance of the grants as incentive for improved local support. In 1964 Texas public libraries had funds of \$9,640,565.

In 1972 funds totalled \$2,837,191. In 1964 there were 32

counties without service. By 1972 the number had dropped to 23.

"Also important," he continued, "is the experience in cooperative activities that was gained under the Title III program." The Texas Library Systems Act of 1969 gives Texas libraries the authority to develop cooperative programs and gives the Legislature the authority to appropriate funds for certain statewide programs. Having already gained experience in cooperation, the libraries should be able to take full advantage of the State program when funds are available.

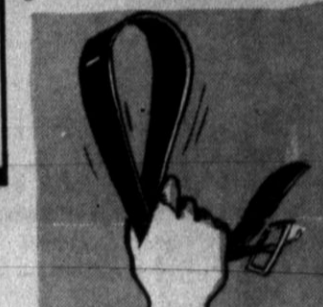

**Right to Spank**  
 "The right of parents to chastise their children is so necessary to the government of families and to the good order of society that no moralist or legislator has ever thought of interfering with its existence."  
 So said the Supreme Court of Tennessee a century ago. And it is still true today that parents have the basic legal right to spank their children.  
 But if the right itself is still recognized, the extent of the right has been steadily narrowed.  
 For example, it used to be said that parents could be as brutal as they pleased, so long as their motive was "for the child's own good." But no longer.



Thus, a father was found guilty of assault and battery for beating his 10-year-old daughter with a cane, hard enough to leave permanent scars. The court said it was no excuse that he was trying to teach the child good manners. One parent's harsh views about discipline, said the court, could not outweigh the humanitarian standards of the community.

Not only may an offending parent be punished by the criminal law, but in a growing number of states he may even have to pay damages to the child.

In one case a woman pummeled her small stepson so viciously that he suffered internal injuries. When a damage suit was filed on the boy's behalf (by a guardian), she said it would be "bad for family harmony" to allow lawsuits within the family circle.

But the court held her liable anyhow.

"While it may seem repugnant," said the court, "to allow a child to sue his parent, we think it more repugnant to leave a child without redress for the damage he has suffered by reason of his parent's malicious misconduct."

"A child, like every other individual, has a right to freedom from such injury."

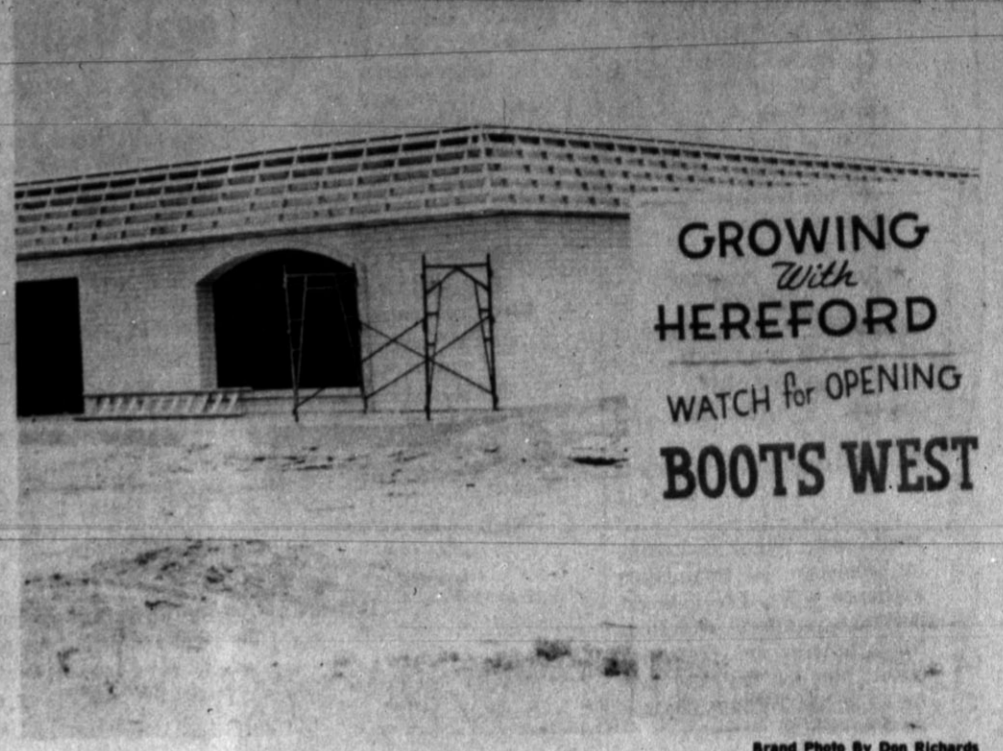
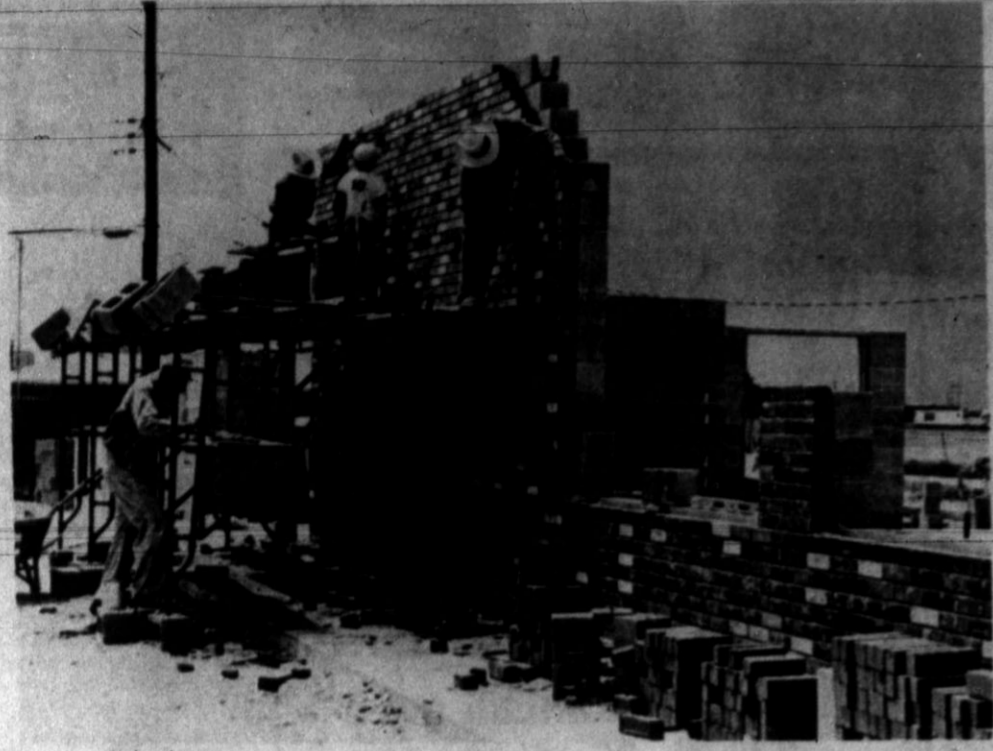

# Rotarians Learn Of Needed Local Support For BBB

A Better Business Bureau official said here Monday his office was having a "long, hard look" at continued service for Hereford in view of needed financial support from the city.

"We received 32 calls from Hereford residents last month and we feel we helped each one of them concerning some business or business practice they had questions about," said Frank Huxtable of the BBB in Amarillo.

"We have provided a telephone line in Hereford free to customers while we have to pay the regular toll charges to Amarillo. But at the same time our support from Hereford businesses had dwindled to almost nothing and we are having to take a long, hard look at our service provided to Hereford."

Huxtable made the talk before local Rotarians during regular meeting Monday noon in the Civic Center. In his talks he described the duties and formation of the BBB and gave several humorous examples of the problems the bureau attempts to solve for its customers.

Introduced by Rotarian Bud Snyder, Huxtable told of many consumer frauds and advertising that has lured many dollars from innocent people over the years.

The business official said the BBB got its start in the early 1900's when a committee was formed to study advertising to check what ads were frauds and keep businessmen from advertising in newspapers that published fraud ads.

Huxtable said the actual beginning of the BBB began in Milwaukee, Wis., with a firm that set up an office for consumers in the Milwaukee area only.

The consumer-protection official said the BBB answers to main questions: inquiries and complaints.

"People call and inquire about businesses and we check our files and tell people if we recommend the business or not. If not we give a reason why we don't recommend businesses."

Huxtable said reasons for BBB disapproval of a business range from the fact a business won't answer complaints or that they have practiced questionable sales techniques.

"We don't tell you to deal or not to deal with a business," Huxtable said. "We just give you facts we know about a business and let you know if it meets our guidelines for recommendation."

The official said the complaints received by the BBB are normally sent to the head man of the business, "who generally doesn't know a thing about it and gets it corrected."

Huxtable gave various

examples of advertising fraud schemes and one recently involving a wig for women in the Hereford area.

"We received about 50-75 calls about the wig ad and this man behind it was later convicted of mail fraud," he said. Huxtable said the man would send a postcard telling persons they had just won a wig free for only a minimal fee for mailing. He said that takers would then

receive the wig C.O.D. for about \$35 to take care of "styling and design."

Huxtable also told how he is now an ordained minister and produced a certificate proclaiming him one. He had applied for the certificate through an ad that cost him BBB. He then gave examples of many fraudulent ads he had answered in an attempt to catch fraudulent dealers.

Huxtable then explained about the BBB local telephone line in Hereford which he said cost the BBB about \$15.20 each month with "little if any return

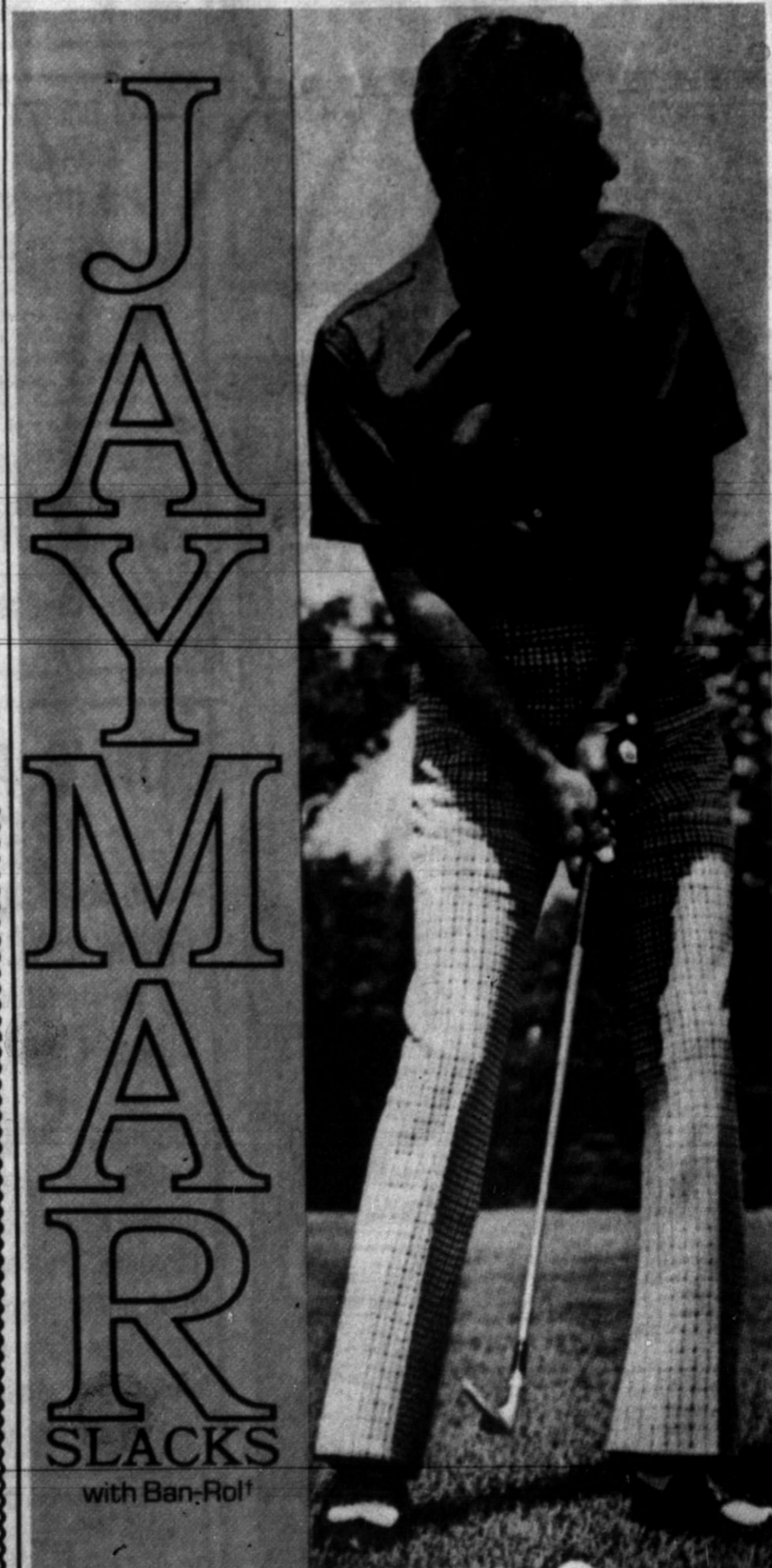
financial support from the Hereford area."
