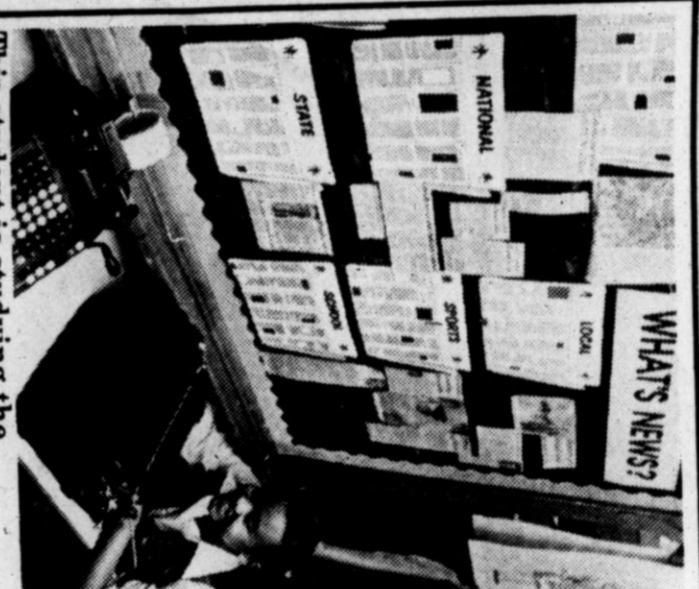

Read Everything in Sight



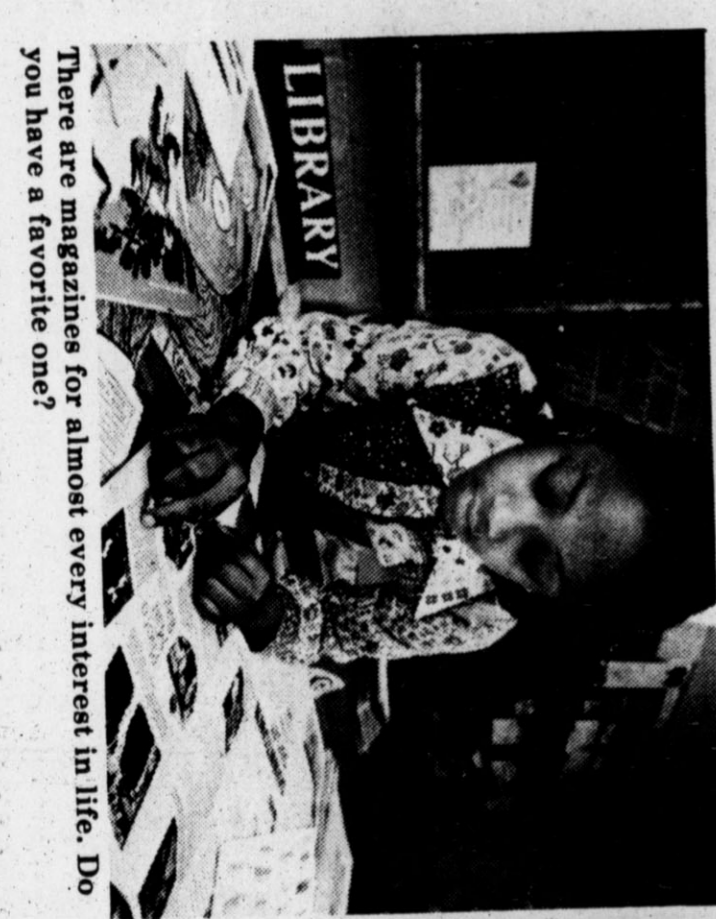

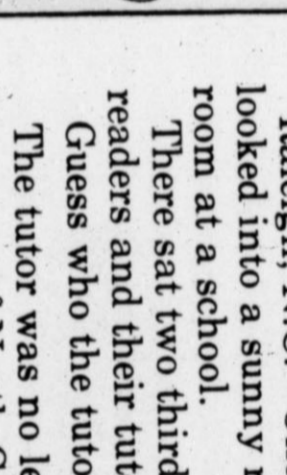

G-r-r-r-r! Jason Thompson is a dangerous Tiger. Just ask the pitchers who face the Detroit slugger.



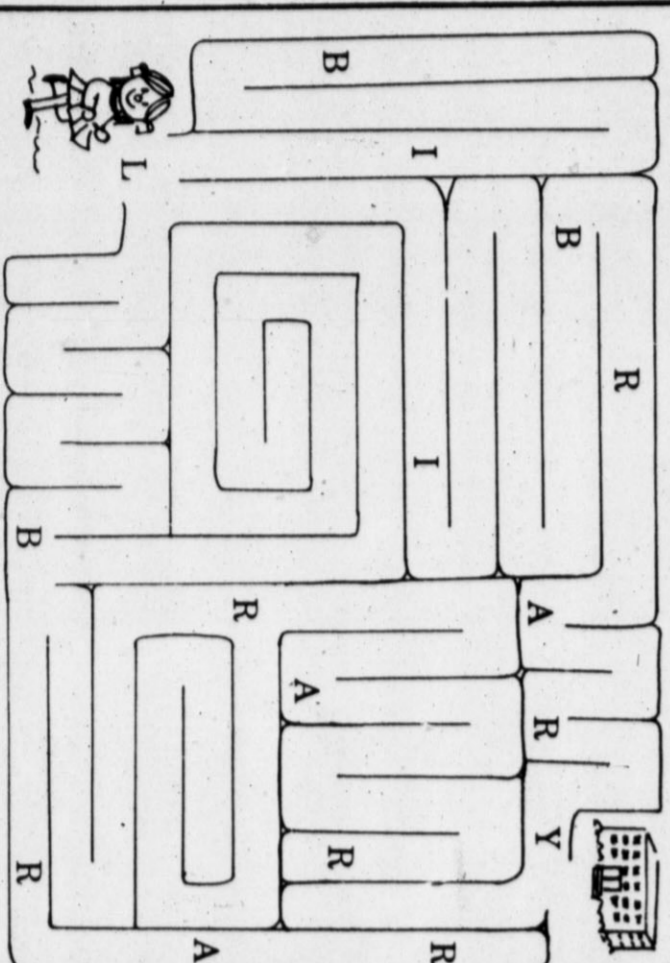
Last season, Jason hit 31 home runs and drove in 105 runs. It earned him a spot on the American League All-Star team.

Raleigh, N.C.—One morning we looked into a sunny reading room at a school.

There sat two third-grade readers and their tutor.

Guess who the tutor was?

The tutor was no less than the governor of North Carolina, Jim Hunt.

"I was very surprised when our teacher said we were going to have Governor Hunt as a volunteer," said one student.

"He comes to our school on Mondays. If he can't come on Monday, he comes on Tuesday. He calls all of us 'my kids,'" said another.

"Governor Hunt liked to read books when he was a little boy," added another kid.

"I want every child to learn to read," the governor told The Mini Page.

He gave us some reading tips for kids.

"Find books you enjoy.

"Show your parents the new books you read.

"Learn to read like you learn to

play baseball. Try something harder instead of reading easy things.

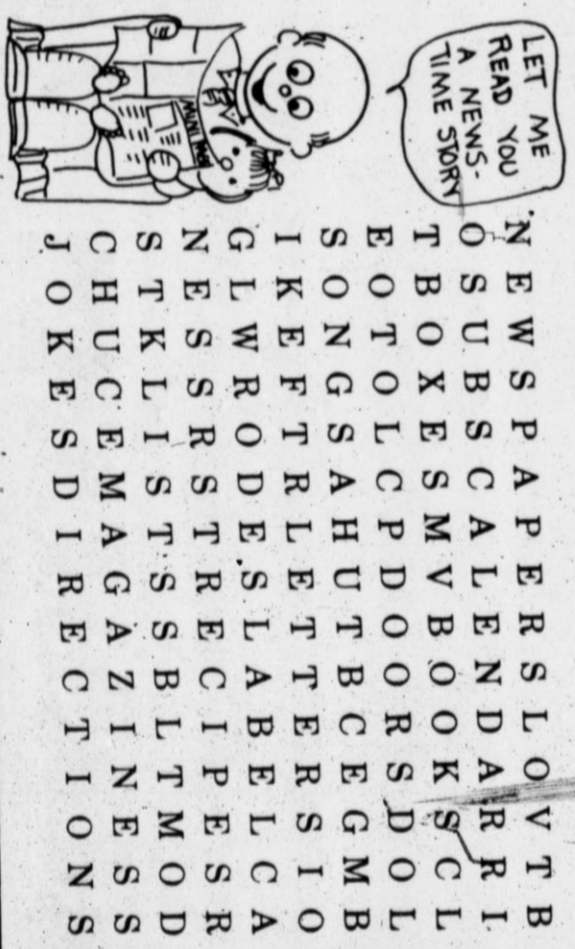
