CASH, CIGARETTES, CIGARS, CANDY, COOKIES, Art Names To TAKEN FROM STORE BY NIGHT PROWLERS

Sheriff Price and County Attorney Crawford Work Night and Day Until Entire Group Are Lodged In Jail

GROUP OF YOUNG FOLK RIDING IN OLD FORD IALOPY ALL SIGN CONFESSIONS TO THE CRIME

Last Sunday night at approximately ten thirty the W. H. Hand Grocery in Meadow was entered by burgiars, who carried off all the loose change to be found in the cash register. several cartons of cigarettes, candy, peanuts, etc. beside other articles which Mr. Hand had no way checking on. He estimated the loss at twenty-five doliars or more.

Entrance was made through the back door. A hole, large enough to reach in with a hand, was cut out of the glass and one of the culprits reached in and removed the bar, as well as taking the key out of the lock. Twice during the raid they were disturbed from their action. Once a group of boys and girls drove by there, causing the raiders to drive off a few blocks until things quited down a bit. At a few minutes until eleven four boys, who were leisurely riding around town, happened to drive by the store and noticed the goings, on, and immediately went to Mr. Hand's house and awoke him. But before Mr. Hand

back to the store bunch made their exit. Sheriff Price was called, as well as an identification expert from Lubbock.

Tuesday afternoon, as no clues of importance had been uncovered, and there being other matters that needed investigated as well, A. E. Richards, Justice of the Peace of Precinct two, called a Court of Inquiry, and called in County Attorney Crawford and Sheriff Price to help conduct the investigation. Afrer questioning several parties, some of whom were eye witnesses to the event, others who had heard casual remarks pas sed around town, some very important clues were uncovered, and Price and Crawford really went to work in a hurry. Price got his big deputy, Mon Telford, who is an old veteran in the matter of law enforcement, and they all went to Lubbock, taking one suspect with them whom they already had under arrest, and made a desperate hunt for a group of boys and girls there who were under suspision-When they arrived in Lub. and the boys could get they got Lubbock county

officers to go with them, and started combing the town in an effort to find their parties. They stayed there all night and practically all day Wednesday before they found the ones they were looking for. They were taken into custody, and after lengthy questioning every one of them signed confessions.

In the group was one Meadow boy sixteen years old, one former Meadow boy, nineteen, and a Lubbock boy and three Lubbock girls, all about eighteen or nineteen years of age. In their confessions, we are informed, they all admitted taking part in the robbery, and stated that they divided the money and other loot equally among the six comprising the party.

The six of them have been confined to county jail in Brownfield, to await further action. We are informed that two of the boys, and perhaps one of the girls already have police records.

Mr. Crawford says although the burglary has been solved and the proper persons taken into custody of the law, that will not end his investigations here in town; that he intends to have a thorough investigation and put a stop to those who have been prowling around town late at night after every thing is closed, and engaging in the willful destruction of property. He urges the parents to see that their boys are at home at a reasonable time at nights, and not be allowed to prowl around in town at night after all the lights are out.
