Another Honest Man Reports

Somewhere in this land of ours lives another honest man, and the Santa Fe Railway is \$595 richer for it. This sum, inclosed in a letter, was received at the railroad's offices in Galveston last week by treasurer W. D. Sawyer. An unsigned note read, "Enclosed find \$595 for which I was not due. It was received years ago. As my life has changed I want to clear all things up." Postmarked Fort Worth, Texas, the letter is puzzling to Santa Fe officials. "We often receive sums of money through the mail from persons swho wish to make restitution," Sawyer said, "but in nearly fifty years with the railroad this is the largest amount I have ever received."

The money consisting of four 100 dollar bills, three fifties, a twenty, two ten and one five will be turned over to the Santa Fe's "conscience and dry \$1.00. fund." Hundreds of dollars have been contributed to this 50c. fund over the years, by con science stricken persons, all of whom have remained anonymous," Mr. Sawyer said
