Apparently he just slumped down to the floor of the truck, and the truck rolled slowly across the street, striking a pole, and a tree on a lawn. Firemen from the nineteenth Street fire station picked him up and summoned an ambulance, but he died before reaching the hospital. He had been in ill health for some time, but was naturally a hard working man, and continued to drive one of his trucks.

He is survived by Mrs. Avary, a son, J. D. Avary, a student at the University of Texas, two daughters, Mrs. Herman Chesshir of Brownfield and Mrs. D. C. Flowers of Meadow, his mother, Mrs. E. D. Avary of Seymour, and numerous other relatives.


