#### WTU VP Becomes Chief **Executive Of CP&L**



W.P.(Bill) Sayles, vice-president and director of customer services for West Texas Utilities Company, Thursday morning was elected chairman and chief executive officer of Central Power and Light Co. in Corpus Christi, effective March 1.

He will succeed Durbecome chairman and chief executive officer of the Central an South West Corp., parent company of WTU and CPL. Chalker has been president of WTU before moving to the Corpus Christi position last July 1.

Sayles is a native of Taylor County and has been with WTU since April, 1955. He graduated from Tuscola High School in 1942 and from Texas A&M University with a B.S. Degree in 1947.

He served in the Army Air Corps as a sommissioned officer during World War II, flying C-47s with a troop carrier squadron in the European Theater in 1944-45.

Sayles ranched in southern Taylor County from 1947-55, and also taught vocational classes for veterans from 1947-52.

He worked as area development representative for WTU from 1955 until 1964, then

was named manager of Area Development. He also represented the company on legislative matters in Austin.

He was named an executive assistant, reporting to the president, in 1975, and in March, 1976, was elected vice president in charge of operations. His area of responsibility was expanded and the title changed to vice president in charge of customer services in 1977. He has been a memebr of the Board of Directors since 1976.

WTU president Glen D. Churchill, who returned to Abilene last July after serving three years as executive vice-president of CPI, praised Sayles for his service to WTU.

"While this means a substantial loss to our company, it presents a good opportunity for Bill," Churchill said. "We wish him every success in his new position and look forward to working closely with him as head of a sister compnay in the Central and South West System."

> Of course, more than anything else, we hope that the hostages have been released before the cards are even mailed. But if they are not, delivery of the cards to the American Embassy in Iran will be a strong indication to the Iranian government of our support.

In his resolution, Stenholm said both the Iranian government and the students il-legally holding the hostages "do not believe the government of the United States currently enjoys the support of the American people in its

dealings..."
I can't think of a better Christmas present for the Ayatollah Khomeini than an avalanche of cards being sent to our embassy people," he concluded.
