NOTICE is hereby given that the City Council of the City of Rising Star, Texas, will convene at its regular meeting place in the City Hall of Rising Star, Texas, at 100. M. on the 8th day of October, 1979, and will consider the passage of an ordinance and the taking of such action as may be deemed necessary to authorize the issuance of revenue bonds in the aggregate principal amount of \$140,000 in order to provide funds for the following purposes, to wit: \$110,000 to refund an outstanding obligation of the City (described more fully as a note held by the First State Bank of Rising Star in the original principal amount of \$125,000, dated the 18th day of April, 1978) incurred in connection with the improvement and extension of the City's Natural Gas System, and \$30,000 for making improvements and extensions to the City's Natural Gas System. Such bonds shall mature not later than January 1, 2019, and bear interest at the rate of 5% per annum, and shall be payable from and secured by a lien on and pledge of the net revenues derived from the City's Water, Sanitary Sewer and Natural Gas System.

The holders of such bonds shall never have the right to demand payment out of funds raised or to be raised by taxation, and such bonds shall not be a debt of the City of Rising Star, Texas.
