## WHAT IS POOLING?

Texans aren't rich. Relatively few of them have even one oil
All Texans have a stake in the oil business, however, be cause it makes jobs, puts money into circulation, and pays taxes.

Texas oil operators have to compete with those in other states and foreign countries. This competition is tough and growing tougher. Improvements in production methods for greater efficiency are necessary in Texas. It is a question as federal government do it.

Many of the most responsible people in the oil industry believe the Texas Legislature can solve some of the most troublesome problems by passing House Bill 510, an oil and
gas pooling bill. "Pooling" in oil field language simply means gas pooling bill, "Pooling" in oil field language simply means putting separately-owned pieces of acreage together, sharing
costs of drilling a well, and splitting any income proportioncosts
ately.

A fair pooling law would create drilling blocks of uniform and proper size (according to the spacing pattern of the field). ment drilling and thus free capital for more "wildcat" drilling. It would provide a legal way for landowners to divide their minerals in proportion to their holdings.

An outcry has been raised against House Bill 510 by the professional "small-tract drillers," who for many years have enjoyed the legal sanction to produce oil and gas which right
fully belonged to someone else. Advocates of pooling do NOT fully belonged to someone else. Advocates of pooling do NOT
think that property rights should be confused with the "right" think that property rights should be confused with the "righ
to take another man's property-or that free enterprise should cover the FREE CONFISCATION of another's oil and gas.
Contrary to claims of persons who, for reasons of their Bill 510 does NOT tie up large blocks of acreage with one well; it does not affect any wells already drilled or reservoirs already
developed; it does not take away the landowner's bargaining power or change the terms of any lease except to the extent necessary to form a drilling blocik. House Bill 510 would merely
give all landowenrs an opportunity to have their properties de give all landowenrs an opportunity to have their properties d
veloped when some owners cannot be located or one owner seeks to obtain an unfair advantage. The rights of all would be EQUALLY protected.
Ask your Senator and Representative at Austin to support House Bill 510 - so Texas, too, will have a reason
way to assure each landowner his FAIR SHARE.

C. Greer, state highway engineer. "But the potential is far greater. <br> "Before our state can command this potential, however, we must avercome some unfortunate misconceptions about Texas. This new brochure is dedicated to this end." <br> One of the most prevalent misunderstandings is that Texas is all a vast desert, arid and highly uninviting as a vacation land. The new brocinure, coupled with | posters and the holiday-oriented 1963 highway map, pictures this idea. <br> Together they emphasize Texas as a land of infinite variety with its roots in gaiety and excitement. The concept is em bodied in the theme that yester- day's frontier bas yielded to "today's fun-tier." <br> The new line was adopted by the Highway Department's Travel Division after scores of sug. gestions had been studied and re-studied. <br> By the same token the promotion campaign was built around findings gleaned from a nationwide survey. <br> The study asked prospective visitors what they would least expect to find in Texas.
