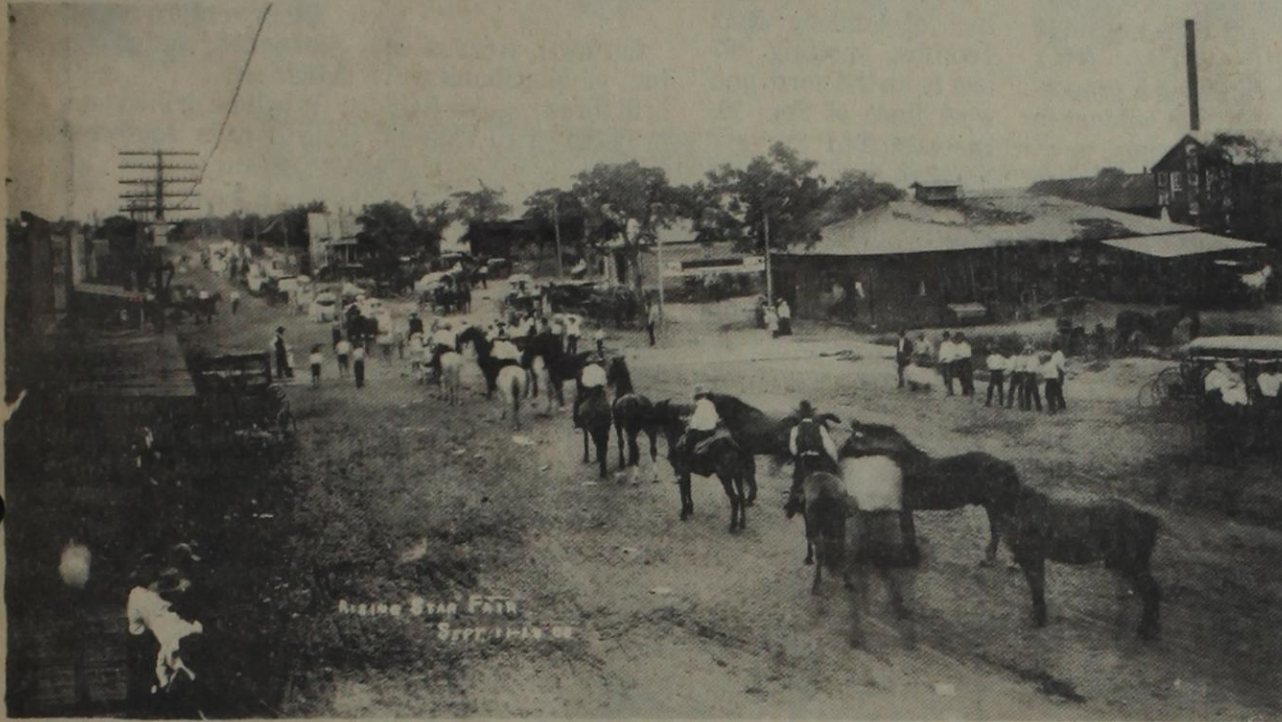

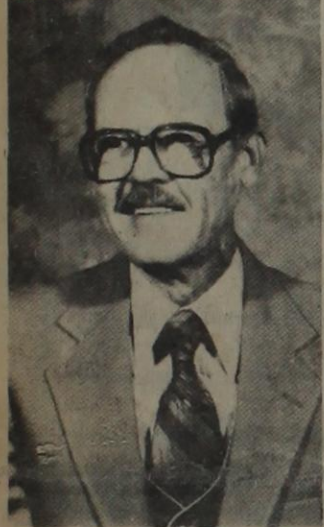

May Tigers Romp Over Mullen 48-24

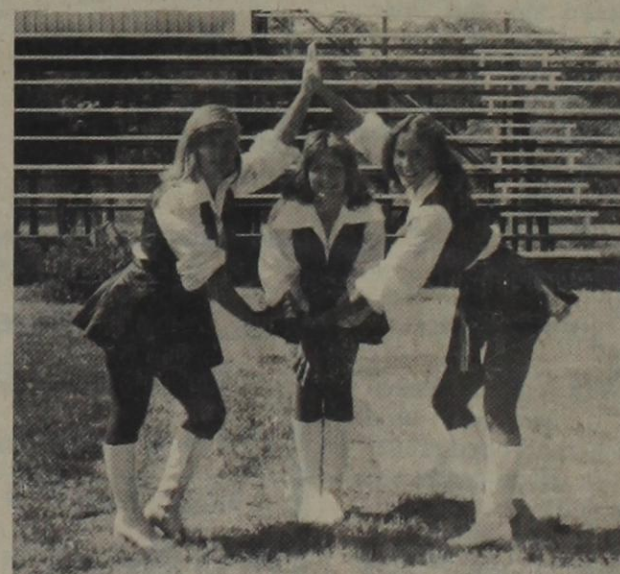
The mighty May Tigers romped over Mullen Friday night scoring a 48-24 victory.

May takes on Star Friday night there.

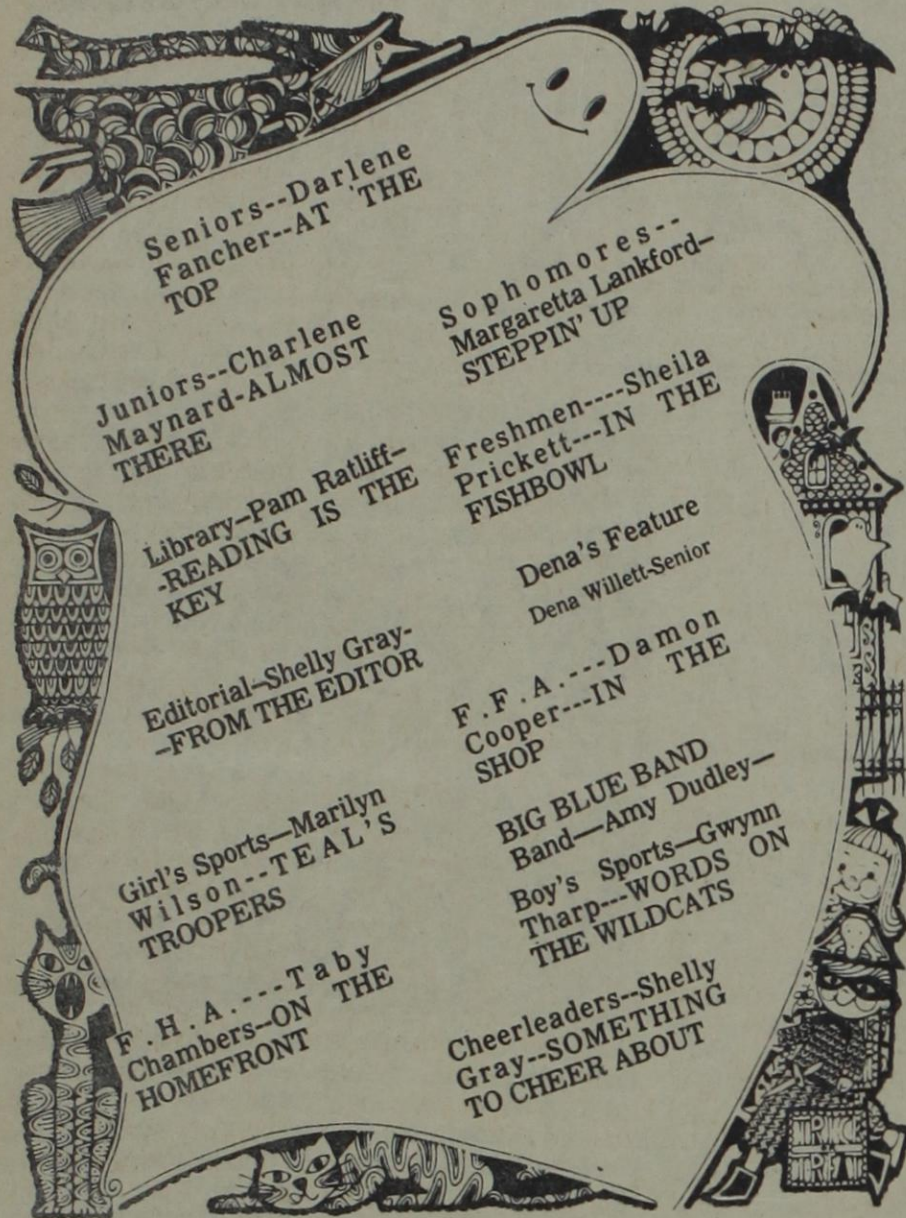

N.L. Dillard of Cross Plains will drill No.3 Davis Tract 3 in the regular field four miles east of Brookesmith.

Having a proposed depth of 1,600 feet, it spots 1,930 feet from the northwest and 56 feet from the southwest lines of Leverett & Thomas Survey 150.

The lease is composed of 160 acres.

Another regular field project was staked four miles southeast of Bangs as A.E. Richmond, Bangs, No.1 Mrs. Lola Hill.

The planned 1,000-foot venture is **The Light Touch**

located on a 132-acre lease.

It spots 357 feet from the north and 1,923 feet from the west lines of C.J. Carrier Survey 60, A-177.

Tri-Mor Production Co. of Breckenridge will drill No.1 Lowrance as a proposed 4,500-foot wildcat in Eastland County.

Location is 2 miles north of Eastland on a 166-acre lease.

It spots 467 ft. from the N. and 850 ft. from E. lines of Sec. 13, Block 4, H&TC Survey.

Staked as a wildcat three miles southeast of Eastland was H.B.P. Enterprises Inc. of Ft. Worth No.1 Poff Meazell.

The planned 4,200-foot test is located on a 40-acre lease.

Drillsite is 467 feet from the south and 900 feet from the east lines of Subdivision 56, Leagues 3 & 4, McLennan CSL Survey.

Adobe Oil & Gas Corp. of Midland will drill No.1 ManiFlint in the Joe Kiel(Caddo) Field 10 miles southwest of Cisco.

The proposed 4,020-foot venture is located on an 80-acre lease.

It spots 330 feet from the south and 2,310 feet from the east lines of Section 129, Block 3, H&TC Survey.

Tinewal Oil Co. Inc. of Odessa will drill two projects two miles northwest of Rising Star in the Waldrop(Strawn) Field.

Each venture is located on a 74-acre lease and slated for 1,120 feet.

No.2 Wilson will be drilled 2,190 feet from the north and west lines of Section 25, Block 2, ETRR Survey. Site for No.3 Wilson is 2,190 feet from the north and 1,470 feet from the west section lines.

A reentry project was completed as a producer in the regular field nine miles southwest of Noodle.

It is Fisher-Webb Inc. of Abilene No.2 Toombs, spotting 467 feet from the north and west lines of Sec. 20, Block 19, T&P Survey.

It had a daily potential of 10 barrels of 40 gravity oil, plus 100 barrels of water. The well is pumping from perforations at 2,517-23 feet, treated with 500

gallons of acid.

C.R. Gallagher Jr. of Lubbock will drill No. 2 Williams as a proposed 2,000-foot venture in the Duster, Northeast (Marble Falls 2,750m) Field one-half mile south of Gorman.

Drillsite is 3,013 feet from the south and 948 feet from the west lines of Section 48, Block 2, H&TC Survey.

Cordova Resources Inc. of Monahans will drill three regular field projects in Eastland County.

No.1-A Alexander is slated for 2,600 feet one-mile southwest of Pioneer on a 135-acre lease.

Drillsite is 330 feet

from the north and east lines of H.C. Rea Survey, A-856.

No.14 A.E. Cook is also slated for 2,600 feet. It will be drilled one mile north of Pioneer on a 105-acre lease.

Drillsite is 2,318 feet from the south and 620 feet from the east lines of C.L. Lewis Survey.

Other venture No.1-C Alexander, slated for 3,600 feet.

It will be drilled one-fourth mile southeast of Pioneer on an 86-acre lease.

Site is 467 feet from the south and 1,600 feet from the east lines of W.O. Grimes Survey, A-676.

Crop & Livestock Reports Needed

From mid-November to early January, thousands of Texas farmers and ranchers will receive a crop or livestock questionnaire from the Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service or will be personally interviewed by the Service's field staff. The information gathered through the questionnaires and interviews provides the basis for determining the final acreage, yield, and production of crops and end-of-the-year livestock and poultry numbers for the State of Texas and for each county.

All of the estimates published by the Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service are

based on the data provided by Texas farmers and ranchers, County Extension Agents, ASCS offices, and many others in Agriculture. This cooperation provides the necessary data which is, in return, returned to farmers and ranchers and others in the form of accurate estimates, which are so essential in making the wisest production and marketing decisions. Accurate estimates are also essential to farm organizations and legislators in promotion, planning, and enacting wise legislation and are used in establishing acreages and payment levels to producers under

various commodity programs.

The collection and publication of agricultural statistics are a cooperative effort between the Texas Department of Agriculture and USDA. This cooperation avoids duplication of effort, promotes economies, and increases the effectiveness of statistical reports. All individual farm and ranch information is kept confidential, and only state and county summaries become part of the final published estimate.

County estimates for 1978 and January 1, 1979, are available on Livestock, Poultry, Dairy, Field Crops, Small Grains, Cotton.

Touch Calling Is Coming To RS

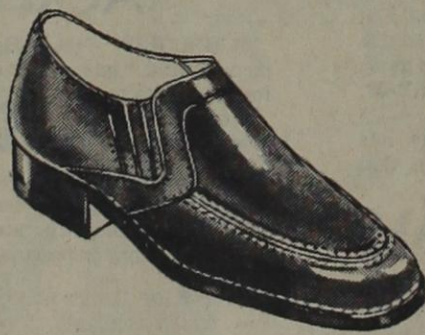

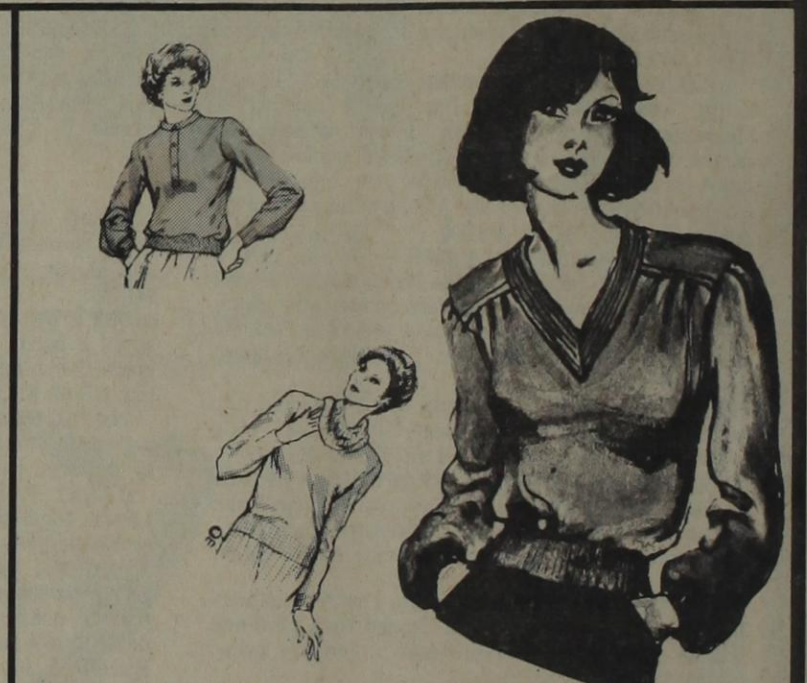
