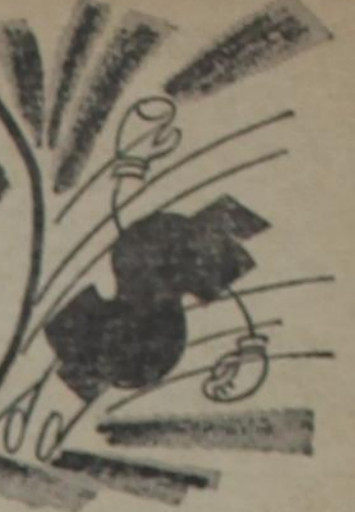

Visits Sister Beaten In Robbery of Store

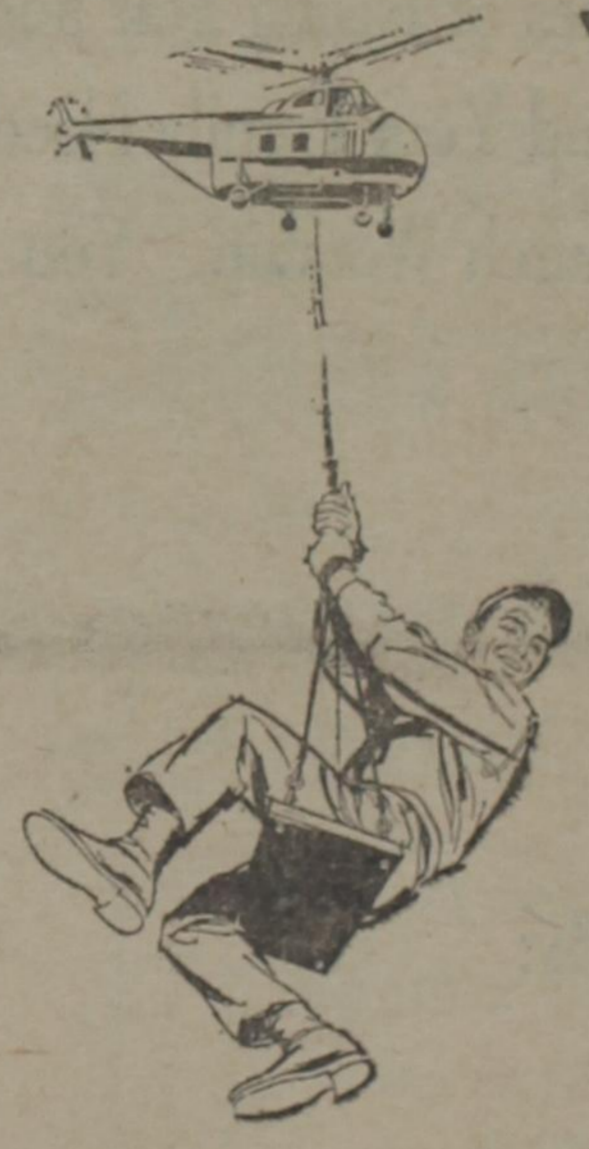
