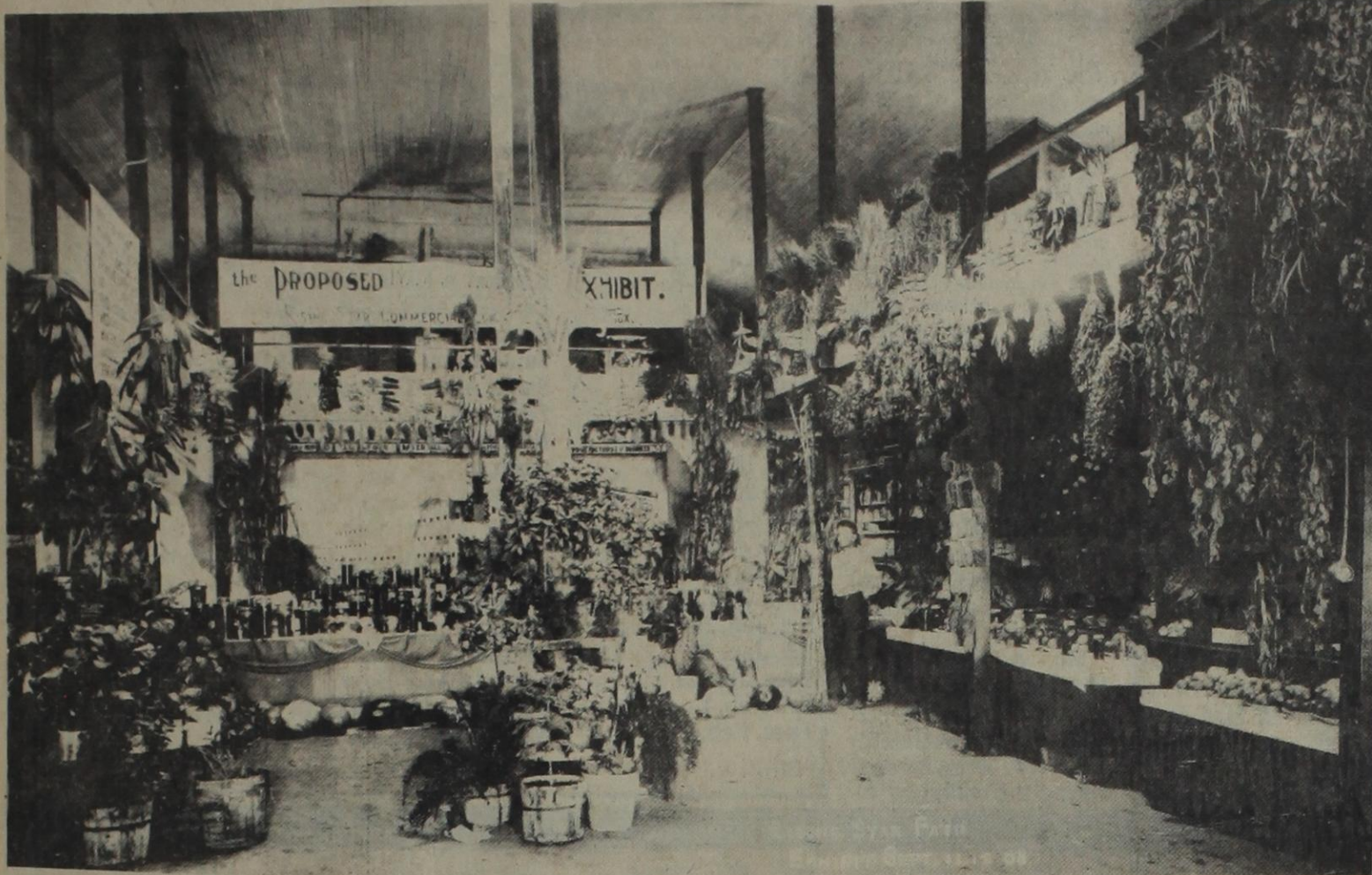

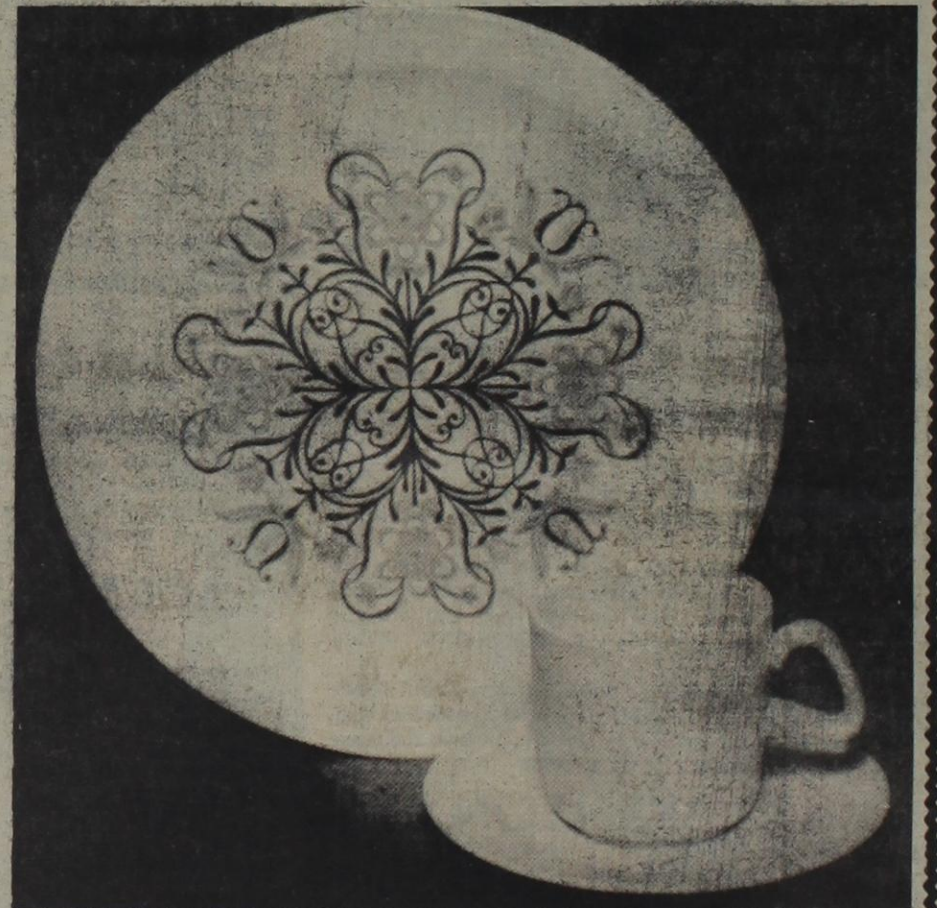

Here is the recipe for an easy and delicious holiday cake. Blend well 1 box butter cake mix, 4 eggs and three-fourths cup crisco oil. Add and mix well, 1 can (11 oz. size) mandarin oranges with juice. Bake in 3 layers 25 to 30 minutes in a 350 degree oven. Ice with one 9 oz.
