## REA Observes Anniversary Of Rural Telephone Loan Program

Excerpts from remarks of Under Sec'y of Agri culture True D. Morse at opening of REA Telephone Loan Program's Tenth Anniversary Ce lebration at Washington, D. C., Oct. 26, 1959: "It is a great pleasure for me to join in observing the TENTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE TELEPHONE LOAN PROGRAM of the Rural Electrification Administration.
"It is no exaggeration to say that a new era of rural communication began on that day. * * *
"Ten years ago, most farm telephones were of the old-fashioned magneto or common battery variety.
"Today, REA telephone borrowers serve more than 900,000 rural subscibers, and 85 per cent of these have dial telephones
"Ten years ago only 38 per cent of all U. S. farms had telephones. $* * *$
"Thus far, REA has approved loans totalling more then $\$ 610$ million to 679 borrowers. When all this money has been translated into telephones, lines and other facilities, it will have meant new or improved service to more than 1.2 million rural subscribers over 328,000 miles of lines. ***
"It is not the Federal government elone whic's is doing this job. REA IS NOT IN THE TELEPHONE BUSINESS. REA neither owns nor operates any telephone facilities. REA is the lender. Its borxowers ore privately-owned local systems-a part of our free enterprise. ***
"The real credit fcr the progress echieved during the past decade, therefore, goes to the 469 commercial companies and 210 telephone cooperatives who have availed themselves of REA financing. Several thousand rural people connected with these organizations have contributed a great deal of time end effort to help themselves and their neighbors obtain up-to-date telephone service.
"The administrators and employees of REA also have made an important contribution. They have set consistently high standards fôr rural telephone construction and management, and they have never lost sight of the objective of the act-to help rural people get good telewehone service. ***
