employees. employees. Adversely affect the tion of a high quality work force immediately and in the years ahead. Further confuse the tentions of a timetested and proven retirement program with those of a welfareoriented social insurance program.

dent which could lead to erosion of retirement benetits as a vital
sonnel management. Delay needed reform of the social security system at the expense of Federal employees
