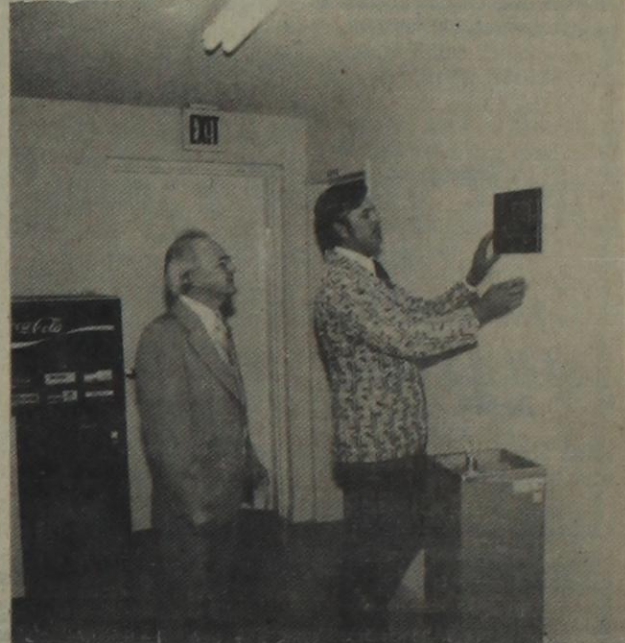
### Carroll Lanier Addresses Saturday Club
