| Lunker Committee Change <br> Bass Release Rule Officials of the "Operatio Share a Lone Star Lunker" committee have decided to rescind the requirement fo returning bass alive to thei lakes of origin after comple tion of hatchery work. <br> Bill Rutledge, hatcher chief for the Texas Park and Wildlife Department said the decision was mad because several anglers wh were otherwise willing to loan their 13 -pound-plus bas to the department did not d so because they wanted to retain final ownership of th fish. <br> One of the objectives the lunker program is to pro mote catch-and-releas fishing," said Rutledge. "It will continue as an objective but the release requiremen was causing us to lose fish that could have helped us i our bass genetics program." <br> Any angler loaning a fis to the lunker program wil receive a fiberglass replic of the fish. If the fish dies in the hatchery, it will be give back to the angler.
