## Rains alter road work schedules

Recent rainfalls have forced the Texas Department of Transportation to reschedule construction in some areas, according to a news release from the City of Rockwall.

The following projects were affected:

- Alternating lanes of southbound and northbound SH 205 just south of the eastbound frontage road to just north of the westbound frontage road, 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. through Friday to accommodate painting on the I-30 bridge. Painters will begin on the west side of the bridge Monday and move eastward as they paint, closing and opening lanes as needed.
- On eastbound SH 66 at Alamo Street (southbound couplet) the two left lanes will be closed from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. daily Tuesday through Friday.
- On westbound SH 66 at Alamo Street (southbound couplet) the two left lanes will be closed from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. daily Tuesday through Friday.

**Katy Ray**

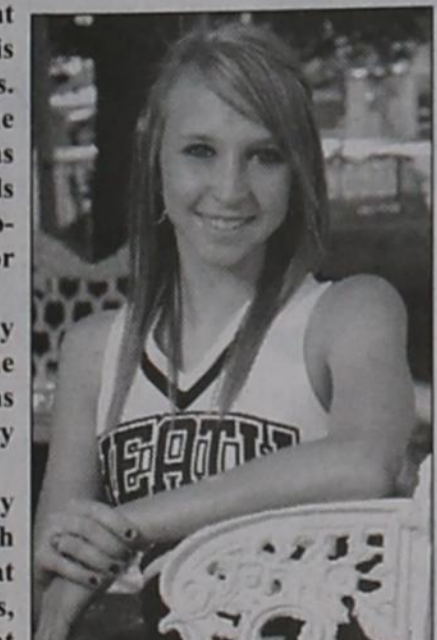
