The boat hishing third was Cuttin' Up, a Sonar 24 owned and skippered by Jeff Willis of Dallas (second from left with the white spinnaker with blue horizontal center stripe). August Blaze, a Beneteau 305 owned and skippered by Jeff Greenwood of Terrell (center with the purple, red, green and white spinnaker) would finish fourth. Three Sheets to the Wind, a Hunter35 owned and skippered by Roy Kuipers of Chandlers Landing (left without spinnaker) would finish DNF (did not finish) as she dropped out of the race to assist another sailboat who had run aground after coming too close to the shore just south of The Harbor. Behind August Blaze, barely visible, are the white sails of Island Venture, Catalina27, owned and skippered by Keelan Manuel of Dallas and the first B fleet boat rounding the mark at The Harbor. Island Venture would finish first in the B fleet.

Contest registration and information is available online at mainstreet.rockwall.com. Rib Rub is sanctioned by the International Barbecue Cookers Association.





Reduced-cost animal shot microchip clinic set Sept.

A reduced-cost shot and microchip clinic will be offered by Rockwall Animal Services from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. Sept. 11 at the Rockwall Animal Adoption Center, 1825 Airport Rd.

Veterinarians from the Rockwall County Veterinarian Clinic will administer the shots. All dogs will be required to be on leashes and all cats in carriers.

All dogs and cats residing within the Rockwall city limits are required to be vaccinated against rabies at either one-year or three-year intervals, depending on the type of vaccine used. Rabies shots will be offered as one-year, \$8, or three-year, \$24. Cats may also receive a FVRCP and FELV combined shot for \$24. Dogs may receive a DHLP plus Parvo shot (two shots in one) at a cost of \$16 and a Bordetella SQ only shot (no nasal vaccines) for \$10.

Also offered while supplies last will be microchipping for cats and dogs.

Microchipping provides advanced pet identification and retrieval. A microchip with a unique identification code is implanted under the skin between the shoulder blades of the pet, then the pet owner enrolls the animal with a pet recovery service that maintains a national database. When a lost pet is found, the animal can be scanned at a shelter or clinic and the animal's identification number can be called in to the pet recovery service, allowing the pet owner to be notified immediately.

Fee for microchipping will be \$20, which includes the chip and the procedure to administer the chip.

City of Rockwall animal registrations also will be available at the clinic.

For each spayed (dog or cat registra \$5 per single year o three-year registratio spayed or non-neuter the fee is \$20 per sir \$30 for a three-ye: tion.






