# Bond election seeks to preserve the past, improve for the future

## by Kathy Williams

When City of Rockwall voters head to the polls for the May 12 bond election, they will make choices that could bring the past to life while continuing to move the ever-growing area into the future.

The \$59.4 million bond packages, five in all, include a new sports complex, improvements to historic downtown, a heritage park at the site of the original rock wall formation from which Rockwall gets its name, plans for downtown fire safety measures, and improvements to roads.

According to the city's bond information brochure, the total estimated tax impact is 15.6 cents per \$100 valuation. The chart below illustrates the increase based on a home's value.

The city's brochure states, "These projections are considered a worst case scenario, where there is no growth in the local tax base and all bonds are issued in a single year rather than phased as the projects are completed over a five-year period."

The brochure also states that City of Rockwall property taxes for senior citizens' homesteads will not be affected by the bond. Taxes are frozen for senior citizens who have filed their homestead and Over 65 exemption applications with the Rockwall County Appraisal District. 


# City, REDC team up to develop airport plan

The City of Rockwall and the Rockwall Economic Development Corporation are partnering to develop an Airport Development Plan for the Rockwall Municipal Airport.


The goal is to design a long-term enhancement plan that will allow the airport to be a viable asset to the city and to allow it to achieve its potential economic vitality, according to a city news release.

The study is eligible for reimbursement at a 90/10 split. The city has asked the Texas Department of Transportation to add this project to its capital improvement program for reimbursement in 2012 or 2013.

After conducting a site selection study, it was decided in 2001 not to pursue a new airport but to enhance and maintain the current facility. Of the \$653,310 in enhancements over the last five years, 19 percent of the costs were paid by the city and the remainder by TxDOT aviation grant funds.







# **On God's Word**

# Jesus Christ's last meal...teaches about love, and more

Last week we stopped at Jesus Christ's teaching about the symbolism of food and drink related to his body and blood. The accounts continue with Luke 22:21-22 where Jesus once again referred to his impending betrayal, "'But, behold, the hand of him that betrays me is with me on the table. And truly the son of man goes, as it was determined: but woe unto that man by whom he is betrayed!' And they began to inquire among themselves, which of them it was that should do this thing."

This was the third time Jesus brought this subject up. The first time he mentioned it, his disciples wondered among themselves. The second time, they each asked him "Is it I?" This time they inquired among themselves as a group concerning which of them it should be. Also, strife arose over which of them should be accounted the greatest (Luke 22:23-30).

He taught them a great lesson by saying "The kings of the Gentiles exercise lordship over them; and they that exercise authority upon them are called benefactors. But you shall not be so: but he that is greatest among, let him be as the younger; and he that is chief, as he that does serve. For whether is greater, he that sits at meat, or he that serves? Is not he that sits at meat? But I am among you as he that serves.

You are they which have continued with me in my temptations. And I appoint unto you a kingdom, as my Father has appointed unto me, that you may eat and drink at my table in my kingdom, and sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel.' Next we come to the accounts starting in John 13:18-38. Here again, Jesus mentioned his betrayal two more times, "I speak not of you all. I know whom I have chosen, but that the scripture may be fulfilled, 'He that eats bread with me has lifted up his heel against me.' Now I tell you before it come, that when it is come to pass, you may believe that I am he. Verily, verily, I say unto you, he that receives whomsoever I send receives me, and he that receives me receives Him that sent me. When Jesus had thus said, he was troubled in spirit, and testified, and said, 'Verily, verily, I say unto you, that one of you shall betray me.' Then the disciples looked one on another, doubting of whom he spoke."

It continues with the record of one disciple asking Jesus who would betray him. Jesus answered, "'He it is, to whom I shall give a sop, when I have dipped it.' And he gave the sop to Judas Iscariot, the son of Simon." Then according to verse 27, after the sop was given to Judas, Satan entered into him, and Jesus told him to do it quickly. Judas then left. The others thought he left to give money to the poor. After Judas left, Jesus boldly said, "Now is the son of man glorified in him, God shall also glorify him in Himself and shall straightway glorify him." Jesus went right back to teaching his disciples. He told them that where he was going, they could not come. He then taught them a new commandment in verse 34, "A new commandment I give unto you, that you love one another, as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this shall all men know that you are my disciples, if you have love one to another."

The first epistle of John covers this love in detail. It is about showing God's


# Heath radiologist named in Iowa murder-suicide





# Rockwall High School ladies enter playoffs after 2 tie

The Rockwall girls' soccer team hasn't lost in its last 12 games heading into its Bi-District playoff match against Dallas Hillcrest.

However, when the Lady Jackets meet Hillcrest at 6 p.m. Friday at Garland's Homer B. Johnson Stadium, they won't have won in two games either.

RHS played a 1-1 tie Tuesday night in a warmup game at Waxahachie. Their previous game had been a 2-2 tie Friday, March 23, at Wylie. The Lady Pirates wearing trying - in vain, as it turned out - to capture a playoff berth that night. Rockwall had clinched the District 21-4A championship 3 days earlier.

# **Jackets back in 1st place** after eventful week

What an up-and-down week it was for the Rockwall baseball team and pitcher Brewer Money.

It began Wednesday, March 21, a day after RHS had been scheduled to play at Rockwall-Heath, with both teams undefeated and in a first-place tie in District 10-4A.

Rain had made the Hawks' field unplayable. A day later, it still was wet, so the game was moved to RHS' Campbell Complex.

That meant a home-field advantage for the Yellowjackets, right? Not really, unless at RHHS they would have lost by more than the actual 9-0 score at home.

Money started that night for the Jackets, and lost for the first time this season. Rockwall pitchers' wildness and seven Hawks hits made the game virtually no contest. Meanwhile, Rockwall-Heath's Jake Thompson was pitching a one-hitter with 16 strikeouts to improve his record to 5-0.

The loss dropped RHS into a second-place tie, a game behind Rockwall-Heath. That situation didn't last long.

On Friday, March 23, while the Jackets were whacking Wylie East 11-1, RHHS was losing 7-0 at Wylie. That restored Rockwall to a three-way tie for the lead with Rockwall-Heath and Wylie. Despite the loss to the Hawks, RHS had remained second in the Texas High School Baseball Coaches Association's 4A state poll. RHHS (17-6, 4-2) was seventh.

The tie didn't last long either. Tuesday was a night for tight, tense games. Wylie lost to Richardson Pearce 7-6. The Jackets had to go into extra innings at McKinney North, where a six-run eighth inning helped them escape with a 9-4 victory. And, finally, Highland Park wore down Rockwall-Heath for a 3-2 upset in 11 innings.

Just like that, Rockwall was in first place - alone - with a 5-1 district record (16-3 overall).

The star of their win over North? Brewer Money, who struck out 10 batters in seven innings and hit a three-run double in the eighth. He built his won-lost record back up to 5-1.

RHS head coach Jeff Payne said, "Money threw strike 1. When he's ahead, he's effective. When he's behind, he's hittable. I never question him being tough and ready to fight, though. I love him on the mound in a big game."

Neither team scored for the first four innings, during which the Bulldogs didn't even have a hit. The Jackets scored two runs on pinch hitter Carson Childers' single in the fifth, and Josh DeLoach hit a solo home run in the seventh. Both times, North tied the score, sending the game into extra innings.

Niki McKnight, the Lady Jackets' scoring leader, put in both goals against Wylie.

A night before, in a match that had been postponed 2 days because of rain, RHS won 8-0 at Quinlan Ford. McKnight had two goals in that game, too, along with Avery Talley. Rockwall's other scorers were Kayla Smith, Lauren Garrison, Regan Gilstrap and Abby Grand-Lienard.

Now it's playoff time for an RHS team that reached the Region II-4A semifinals in 2010, and the Regional final last season.

The next logical step would be winning the two Regional games at Standridge Stadium in Carrollton, where the Lady Jackets' season ended each of the last 2 years, to advance to the State tournament.

The Lady Jackets have a chance. They're 18-3-3 overall. But just to go to Carrollton, they'd have to win four matches - beginning with Friday's game.

RHS head coach Melissa Garcia said, "I don't know a lot about Hillcrest. They lost to TJ (Dallas Thomas Jefferson) 2-0, and we beat TJ 2-0 at the beginning of



# infringes property rights

#### By Wesley W. Burnett

Rockwall property owners are faced with potentially significant higher taxes if the majority rules in favor of the proposed \$57 million May 12 bond election.

There are a number of reasons to oppose this bond election, beginning with the notion that government be allowed to borrow money, with payment to investors guaranteed by property owners.

Government doesn't repay loans, property owners pay government debt. If the bond election limited payment to those who vote in favor of the debt, then we'd find no major opposition. As long as the debt is not forced on property owners who vote against the measure, or don't vote at all, then who could be against the measure?

It is essentially an issue of who pays the debt. Those who want to borrow the money must be held accountable for payment of the debt.

Allowing the majority (those who favor the debt) to steal from the minority (those who oppose the debt) is a direct violation of the fundamental right of property ownership.

Using the power of government to force payment for its debt against the will of individuals also ignores the American principle defining the role of government as securing the rights of individuals.

A defender of our constitution must ask those who favor this bond election a simple but profound question: how does this election secure the right of property ownership?

Of course, proponents of bond elections are loathe to consider such

It is disappointing that the majority of the Rockwall City Council placed this matter on the ballot for a majority rule decision. It is a ballot potential burden on property owners, many who oppose the increase taxation and will be forced against their will to pay the debt ... or lose the property. Of the seven council members, Michele Smith was the lone w against the ballot measure.

Now property owners are left with the task of mounting a campaign defend their rights against this grand theft program.

It's discouraging to realize that so few elected officials accept the of government envisioned by the founders of this great nation and bold proclaimed in the founding document.

Their oath of office requires allegiance to the American Declaration Independence and to the Constitution of the United States of America

Secure the rights of individuals ... not the power of corport government.

It's time we stop stealing from one another, even if the theft is for good cause.
