Library offers reading

# **Rockwall**, Harbor splintering

The Rockwall City Council unanimously voted Monday night to require any request made by the Harbor for any event to come before the council for approval during the regular meeting.

"I want these folks that are operating this Harbor to be in a position that they'll do any dad-gum thing they can to be more business friendly and to work to lease the Harbor. That's my level of encouragement, period. I'm not going to get in the way of that," Mayor David Sweet said.

The mayor suggested that any events hosted by the Harbor be brought to the city staff for approval. Sweet also requested that any waivers for cleanup or police be brought to the council.

City manager Rick Crowley agreed that the mayor's suggestions were appropriate.

Crowley also voiced concerns about the vacant storefronts at the Harbor.

"It is definitely cause for concern about the management of the Harbor because of that," Crowley said. According to Crowley, there is talk about intent to sell and put into the hands of someone who could better

manage it, but current management at The Harbor has not been cooperative.

"We would like better understand what the strategies are and what the plan is to get the Harbor back into the hands of someone who is going to get things done and make the Harbor a successful venture," Crowley said. Council member Dennis Lewis subsequently voiced concerns about the business plan that the Harbor has taken on.

Lewis said the calls to ownership have not been returned and requests for them to be present at council meetings have been ignored.

"Hopefully we can start getting some answers one way or another," Lewis said.

Other members of council shared the same viewpoint.

"The City of Rockwall has gotten a black eye because of the state of The Harbor and it's not the city. I think we need to let the citizens know that it's not the city, it's the current owners of The Harbor that's running it into the ground. We need to start telling that story," council member Scott Milder said.

In other business during the meeting, a motion was made by Mayor Sweet was passed to install signs advising the public that there is no lifeguard on duty will soon be going up at all city ponds and other bodies of water.

The park board was surprised there was not an ordinance already in place, but did make a unanimous recommendation to prohibit recreational swimming, Andy Hesser, Parks and Recreation manager, said

"Some discussion revolved around wading, fishing, kayaking, canoeing, those types of things. I know we operate a program for kayaking and canoeing. Their purpose was not to reduce the recreational use that we have of our ten ponds that we have in city parks," Hesser said.

The Park Board expressed concerns about proposed ordinance that would not eliminate valuable recreational activities on lakes or ponds such as kayaking, canoeing or fishing. The Park Board voted unanimously to recommend to City Council that the Code of Ordinances be amended to "prohibit recreational swimming" only.

"We see some recreational swimming, but not a lot," Hessler said, "It's been years, but I have seen BMX bikes put on a ramp and jumped into the pond. We didn't have an ordinance at the time, but they complied when I simply walked up and asked them to stop."

"It's going to be really hard to say no swimming, but you can have your kayak in the pond, so that's why we're asking for direction from council," assistant city manager Brad Griggs said.

Griggs suggested at least signs at ponds and lakes.

Currently, Parks and Recreation Department operates supervised canoeing during special events and programs where lifeguards are on site. A kayak launch site also has been approved to be built at Phelps Lake as a part of the city's capital improvements plan.

The project is expected to be completed in August. The project will connect Raymond Cameron Lake to Phelps Lake with a trail tie two premier outdoor recreation destinations together with a trail connection.

"The City of Dallas prohibits swimming in Lake Ray Hubbard, and you see how well that works. You can prohibit it, but people are still going to do it," mayor pro-tem Jim Pruitt said, "Did they do it for liability reasons?

The first post office in Royse City was a frame building located at the northeast corner of Main and Arch Streets. A new brick building was built in 1899 on the south side of Main Street thought to be where the Los Piños Mexican Restaurant is located. Service remained at that location until 1962, when the present post office was built at 217 E. Main St.

Free city delivery service was established by the U.S. Postal Service in 1863, but not until 1896 was free rural service (RFD) implemented. One of the first rural routes in Texas began in Fate. Some rural route services were began in Rockwall County in the beginning years of the 20th century, but Royse City did not begin the service until October 1901. With the communities being so small at the time, only a name and city were required for postal delivery.

In the early 1900s, the Royse City News-Times published that the first post office in the area was a county office in Collin County. That office was closed in 1886 when the Missouri-Kansas-Texas (MKT) railroad came through Royse City and a permit was granted for the opening of a new post office here. The first postmaster was Martin Peterson.

The son of Homer Pierce was Homer ("Toogie") Pierce, who died a few months back at the age of 92. Toogie was a decorated World War II veteran, loved by all who knew him.

Roy Sisk and his wife, Ruth, had a daughter named Carolyn. Their old home place on Live Oak Street is still in use.

Not much information is known about M. O. Flemmons except that he had a daughter named Marie.

Tom Dowell lived near where the Zaner Robison Historical Museum is located and had a daughter named Tommy Clinard. His home place is also still occupied.

Tom Bailey was the grandfather of Lucille Bell and Glenda Smith, both well-known, respected citizens of Royse City. Both now live on North Houston Street. Glenda lives on the same lot where her grandfather's home stood, but the original house is now gone, and another was built there many years ago. In fact, Glenda was born in the front room of the home where she now lives.

Tom Bailey was the rural mail carrier and in 1922 the postmaster of Royse City. He held that position for 15 ve Bailey was Tom's daughter and the assistant postmaster.

An interesting fact about Tom Bailey was that back postmasters were appointed by the President of the United s thought that Bailey was appointed by President Herbert House was an honor beyond words. Bailey also served as Royse City and on the Royse City Council.

Orpha Bailey was the daughter of Tom and the mother of and Glenda.

A large mural of Orpha and Tom Bailey can be seen in the City American Bank of Texas along with several other beautiful depicting the late 1800s or early 1900 small-town living de cotton era.



## primary disinfectant

The North Texas Municipal Water District began using ozone as its primary disinfectant at its Wylie Water Treatment Plant on June 26, according to a news release from the agency.

As a result of the change, consumers may notice an improvement in the taste and odor of their drinking water.

The district began using ozone in the treatment process as a result of changes in regulatory requirements set by the EPA's Safe Drinking Water Act.

Now operating the nation's largest water treatment facility using ozone, the NTMWD implemented extensive planning efforts, modification, construction and project management at the four water treatment plants in Wylie. In addition to the Wylie location, the Bonham and Tawakoni water treatment plants also produce ozonated water.

The NTMWD has the capacity to treat and deliver 806 million gallons per day of quality, safe drinking water to the region served, according to the news release.

In recognition of the \$123 million ozone project, the NTMWD Board of Directors visited the newly construction ozonation facilities at the Wylie water treatment plants. The City of Rockwall's representatives on the board, Larry Parks and Bill Lofland, were on hand for the event.

## Spay/neuter shuttle services to be delivered in on-site but

Three years ago, Rockwall PAWS arranged for the KCAAP monthly low-cost spay/neuter shuttle to come to Rockwall and helped establish the service in Royse City in January. Now known as the Spay Neuter

Network, the same services now will be provided on site in Rockwall. Under the new arrangement, the Hope Mobile, a 45-foot spay/neuter bus, will park in the I-30 Wal-Mart parking lot for one day a month.



Spay/neuter shuttle services that once were provided to local pet owners will be changed to provide on-site services in the 45-foot spay/neuter bus pictured above. A pet owner who makes an appointment will have his/her pet spayed or neutered aboard the bus, which will be located in the I-30 Wal-Mart parking lot July 23 and Aug. 20. Procedures will be offered at discount prices. For more details or to make an appointment, call 972-472-3500.

The surgical procedures now will be performed on site inside the bus. Previously, animals were dropped off at the SNN shuttle in the same parking lot, then taken to Crandall for surgery and returned to their owners that evening.

The SNN will offer low-cost surgery packages, with prices ranging from \$30 for male cats to \$80 for large (80 pounds) female dogs. The goal of the effort is, according to a news release from Rockwall PAWS, to "reduce the City of Rockwall shelter intake and to help people get their pets vaccinated."

government that will subject moral convictions to its bureaucratically directed control.

People have legitimate differences of opinion about the appropriateness of various forms of birth control, which is something most reasonable people on both sides of the political ledger understand. However, legally requiring the side opposed to a form of birth control to be financially responsible for its distribution to any employee who wants it is distinctly un-American and abusive to the concept of freedom of religion.

A major problem is that many people in our entitlement society see nothing wrong with forcing others to provide for their desires. In a free and open society, anyone should be able to purchase anything he or she wants that is legal. It really should be no one else's business. Common sense dictates, however, that it immediately becomes my business if I'm being forced to pay for it.

Wouldn't it be fairer and make more sense for people wanting some form of birth control to pay for it themselves? This is exactly what would happen if everyone had access to his or her own health savings account. A woman and her health care provider would decide on a birth control method, and the cost would be deducted from her account with no involvement of anyone else in any way. It's so simple and upholds privacy and freedom.

Health savings accounts can be funded in a variety of different ways and give people total control of where, how and with whom they wish to spend their health care dollars. Most people will want to get the biggest bang for the buck and will independently seek out both value and quality. That, in turn, will bring all aspects of medicine into the free-market economic model, thus automatically having an ameliorating effect on pricing transparency and quality of outcomes.

Many corporations and communities already have very positive experiences with health savings accounts. Those experiences could be further enhanced by allowing family members to shift the money in their accounts among themselves. For instance, if a family member was \$500 short for a procedure or test, another family member could provide the money by authorizing its deduction from his account. This provides a whole other level of flexibility to the concept of health savings. The overwhelming majority of encounters with the medical world could be handled through this type of system,

monstrosity realized that a well-functioning savings system would be easy to understand, much less expensive and give people control of their own health care. It would also eliminate two-tiered systems of health care, making every patient equally desirable from a business perspective. There should be no limit to the amount of money that can be contributed to and managed in an account. Money unspent at the end of the year should simply continue to accumulate without penalty.

If accounts are established at the time of birth, they will be even more potent, because the vast majority of people will not experience catastrophic or major medical events until well into adulthood. By that time, a great deal of money will have accumulated. Since bridge or catastrophic insurance will not be drawn upon for routine medical expenses, its costs will plummet, very much like homeowners insurance, which costs vastly less when there is a high deductible.

Somehow over the past few decades, we as a society have wandered away from the concept of using health insurance only for major medical issues and paying for routine services ourselves. This is largely responsible for the tremendous spike in medical costs. By using the health savings account system, we can return to a semblance of rational thinking.

The 5 percent of patients with complex pre-existing or acquired maladies would need to be taken care of through a different system, similar to Medicare and Medicaid but informed by the many mistakes in those programs from which we can learn. Even this kind of system should have elements of personal responsibility woven into it.

The bottom line: Health care for all of our citizens is the responsibility of a compassionate society and is well within our grasp, if we don't make it into a political football. The majority of Americans are unhappy with Obamacare and would prefer something that is simple, effective and under their own control. We do not have to settle for something imposed upon us for reasons other than good health care.

## Royse City's Hearn hoping to sign pro contra

It's still possible that Taylor Hearn's favorite major league baseball team could draft him, but Hearn would prefer signing a contract with the Minnesota Twins now.

A 2012 Royse City High School graduate, Hearn is in the unusual position of being drafted by three different teams in each of the last three years.

It's even more unusual in his case because he didn't pitch at all in his senior season for the Bulldogs and had his 2013 season at San Jacinto Junior College-North end early because of elbow surgery. He pitched more frequently this spring, compiling a 3-2 record and 5.16 earned run average for San Jac.

"We're still negotiating a bit," he said of his relationship with the Twins. "Right now it's just waiting for them to call me back."

Meanwhile, he has been throwing and working to build up his legs and lower body.

"I'm at 215 pounds now," the left-hander said. At that weight, he's capable of throwing a fastball up to 96 miles per hour, a curve in the lowto-mid 70s and a low-to-mid-80s changeup.

Hearn began playing baseball at age 4. His interest in the sport as a possible career began when he started pitching at age 8. He became a fan of the Tampa Bay Rays and left-handed pitcher David Price, who is of a similar size and pitching style.

Unlike Hearn, Price was the first choice in the entire draft when he signed with the Rays.

The Royse City lefty has been used to seeing pro scouts since they starting noticing him at showcases and tournaments during the summer after his junior year.

"I was throwing 88 to 90 in high school, but my off-speed pitches were good. That's what got me noticed," said Hearn


