were not able to reach all of them due to the heavy smoke that quickly engulfed the boat.

"We had one big extinguisher in back, a small one in the kitchen and a big extinguisher in front. I ran and got the one in the front because I couldn't get to the back and gave it to him (Tom), but I couldn't get back in the boat because of the black smoke. I couldn't get my purse, my driver's license. I lost everything." Mrs. Madison also lost her wedding rings in the fire.

Mr. Madison said he was having a quick look at the boat before taking it out for the evening. "I tried to start it and it started to backfire and overloading with gas. Instead of stopping to check what was possibly wrong, I throttled up, hit the starter again and it blew."

"It was like a bomb," Mrs. Madison said. "It wasn't like an explosion, it was like a bomb."

Although the Madison's were the only ones on board at the time of the explosion, they were not seriously injured, nor were their neighbors on nearby boats. Mr. Madison said, when the explosion occurred, he was thrown against the dash and was dazed."I was kind of like semi-conscious for a second, then my ears went like this (vibrating). Then I turned around and saw the stray black and white cat that we feed jumping up and down almost hit-

ting the ceiling of the boat trying to find a way out. Everything on that boat was strewn out on the floor. It blew it all out," he said.

Mrs. Madison said, "When I looked in it there, it was like a tornado went through."

"I had a pistol on there and a box of shells that we used for personal protection and those shells started going off," Mr. Madison said. He said there was no danger of the bullets hitting anyone; they simply exploded from the heat.

The Madison's are mourning the loss of the pistol as it was one of their sons' first service revolvers as a member of the Dallas Police Department.

Mr. Madison said they can only speculate what caused explosion, although he thinks a spark may have ignited the gasoline as he tried to start the engine. He said the fire department was not able to come to a definitive conclusion as to the cause.

The Madison's had owned their renovated boat, a 43-foot Burns Craft house boat, for eight years. Mrs. Madison said, "When then the fireman heard the brand of boat, Burns Craft, he said, 'are you joking?' He thought Tom was trying to make a joke."

Mr. Madison, who retired five years ago at age 62, and is now 67, said, "We sold everything that we owned. We gave away our possessions that were in our

After they gave away the things they didn't need or couldn't use on the boat, their remaining possession, clothes, personal papers, household items, kitchen ware, etc. were moved onto the boat. The

Madison's lost all their worldly possessions in the fire.

"It's a weird feeling when you loose everything in one swipe," Mr. Madison said.

The couple has been married for 48 years. Mr. Madison said they started dating in junior high

school. He said, "She could recognize a catch when she saw







Keff and Starr Johnson's children, Skylar (third grade), Kasja (second grade) and Jamal (eighth grade), have participated in Boys and Girls Club activities in Rockwall after school and during summer since their move from Richardson two years ago. Because of their previous good experience with the club in Dallas, they searched for the Rockwall BGC.

"It's definitely a positive place," said Keff Johnson, "and a great place for our kids to be active and learning until we get home from

Rockwall Christian Academy, administrator earn awards

The Rockwall Christian Academy received the 2010 School of the Year Award of Excellence from the Oral Roberts University Educational Foundation in conjunction with the International Christian Accrediting Association.

The awards were given at the annual ICAA convention conducted earlier this month in Tulsa, Okla.

The RCA and Zakem were selected from an international group of 125 schools accredited by the ICAA.

In a ICAA news release, its chairman, Carolyn DeSalvo, said, "The school has continued to remain abreast of educational developments in its classes resulting in a strong academic program.... The school meets the needs of individual students both through remediation and a gifted and talented program.... Finally, the school's athletics include a strong sports program that has resulted in state champion-

ships in baseball, football and softball." DeSalvo noted that the RCA has "a very strong sense of family and community that has been developed under the leadership of the current administration.

He and his wife appreciate the fact that "the club creed reflects the values we support in our home, such as respect, responsibility and leadership."

They would like to see Boys and Girls Club gain more of a presence in the community because of the programs it offers.

"It's worth supporting," Johnson said.

The Johnsons have shown their appreciation for the benefits their children receive at BGC-Rockwall by assisting with fundraising efforts for the nonprofit. They also are working with the director to plan future soccer and basketball training and competition for Boys and Girls Club members.

Eldredge said that with similar community backing, the sky is the limit for the local club and the youth who benefit from it (and subsequently become adults prepared to give back to the community).

That backing may take the form of "volunteers who can hand out flyers, or maybe teach a class in something they're good at," Dana Billingsley said.

"Sometimes people think they're going to get overextended, especially if they have other obligations, but Boys and Girls Club is really willing to work with your schedule and what you want to do. Even if not sure, they can give direction as to the kind of help they need," she said.

The Boys and Girls Club of Rockwall is a youth development organization open to all students in grades 1-12. It offers adult-supervised recreation and academic tutoring, as well as several leadership development programs from 7:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. Monday through Friday during the summer and from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. during the school year.





damage to a houseboat berthed alongside the Madison's. Miller said the damaged boat, which belongs to his mother-in-law, sustained broken windows, fire damage to the rear left side, and the canvas shade covers were partially burned.

The Madison's said their boat insurance had recently lapsed but Mrs. Madison had contacted the insurance company to let them know that she would be renewing the policy. The boat caught fire before she could file her paperwork.

Miller said the insurance would only have covered the boat, not its contents.

In order to help the Madison's with the financial burden of their loss, Miller and his wife, Jeannie, are organizing fundraisers to help their friends. A fish-fry/brisket dinner held last Saturday at the marina has so far netted in excess of \$5,500, with donations still being received, Miller said.

Stephen Bull and his wife, Melody, have donated a boat which will be raffled, with proceeds from tickets sales going to the Madisons.

"The Bells are good friends. We were on the dock together (at Bay View Marina) for years and then they move to another marina," Miller said. "When Steve heard about the fire, he said he had a boat to donate and Tom said, 'What?' Steve said 'I've got a 28-foot Wellcraft and I'm just going to give it to you.""

Tickets for the drawing to win the 1988 28-foot Wellcraft boat are \$20 for a single ticket or \$100 for six tickets. The drawing will be on Saturday, Aug. 14. The Millers are coordinating the drawing.

The Wellcraft needs some work, Miller said, but in its current condition could be worth \$3,000 or \$4,000 dollars. "Somebody can get into it for 20 bucks or 100 bucks, it's a good deal for somebody," Miller said.

The Madisons and the Millers have been friends for seven years. Mrs. Madison said the Millers have helped assisted them in many ways, in addition to organizing the fundraisers, since the fire.

"John and Jeannie have helped us hold our composure. They have been our rock, otherwise we would have probably collapsed," she said.

Mr. Madison smiled at his friend and added, "They are our human Prozac."

Mrs. Madison also said the community support has been overwhelming. "People from the marina and the community came to the fish fry. Everyone has been so sweet and caring. People we don't even know have been coming up and introducing themselves," she said.




He received several medals for his dedication above and beyond regular duty. In August he was sent to Afghanistan following a visit with family and friends.

"We are closely monitoring this situation, and we will continue our efforts to find a buyer for the property. It is hoped that the course will not stay closed for an extended period; however, the city has received no specific timeline from the owner."

Citing numerous ongoing instances of contract breach, the city recently notified IRI Golf Group that the contract leasing land to them for operation of The Shores Country Club was cancelled. The situation was

related to upkeep of the golf course under the lease agreement entered into in 2001, which included minimum standards for maintenance of the golf course. That action followed numerous complaints from Shores' homeowners and golfers about the condition of the golf course.

Although the city had terminate its lease with IRI, the municipality had taken no action that would have caused the golf course's closing, Couch said.

Portions of the course - primarily the back nine holes - are on land owned by the City of Dallas, which entered into various agreements with

the City of Rockwall and the owner of The Shores Country Club to make the land available for use as a golf course. The lease agreements regulate nine full holes on the course and portions of another four.

The remaining course and the clubhouse and other amenities are on private land owned by the owner/operator of The Shores Country Club. As a result, the City of Rockwall has no ownership in the public land and no oversight over the general business practices of the Shores' owner, according to the news release.

Rockwall sweeps 7-on-7 league, reaches championship brack

Rockwall finished a busy, and successful, 7-on-7 football season by reaching Saturday's championship bracket in the state Division I tournament at Texas A&M University in College Station.

The team representing RHS had qualified for the state tournament by winning its own I-30 State Qualifying Tournament two weeks earlier.

Returning for the first time since 2007, Rockwall swept past Spring Branch Stratford 48-40, Stephenville 40-33 and Whitehouse 34-33 in three hardfought games Friday, July 9.

That put the local team into the 32-team championship bracket against Pflugerville. The teams were tied 28-28 at the end of regulation play, but Pflugerville scored to pull out a 35-28 overtime victory.

Earlier that week, Rockwall had completed an unbeaten season (8-0) in the RHS 7-on-7 league by winning its final two games.

Alan Reed threw seven touchdown passes in a 63-14 victory over the Garland Naaman Forest junior varsity, and Reed Loftis caught four TD passes as Rockwall clinched first place by defeating Rowlett 32-13. Second-place Rowlett, which finished 6-2, could have tied for first place with a win over Rockwall.

The Rockwall junior varsity finished with a 2-6 record.

Royse City's varsity was fifth in the eight-team league at 3-5. The Royse City JV finished 0-8.




