The men might be sitting on the front porch in the rocking chairs, whittling, chewing tobacco and talking about old times. The kids were in the yard playing push the stick, chase or a multitude of other games that required little or no money.

Over the years as times, economy and the nation has changed, the things people appreciate also have changed. Holidays have become more commercial. Gifts are no longer made by grandmother's hands, and even the special meal, including the turkey and the pumpkin pie, can be bought at the grocery store for \$49.95. A television in several rooms will probably be blaring with football games or other types of sports, the women might be sipping spiced ginger tea in the kitchen, awaiting for that chosen member to bring the Thanksgiving dinner, and the kids are probably lying in the floor playing with their electronic games.

As I spoke with friends this last week about how the holiday had changed, I got several good answers from a variety of ages of people.

Sherri McMillan of Royse City shared her thoughts.

"Thanksgiving is stepping back to a simple, less cluttered, un-commercialized life of gathering, preparing traditional fare, sharing dreams, touching and learning. It is family and friends remembering past, celebrating present and glimpsing future," she said. "Ultimately, it bathes all our senses in love."

Lori Wright said, "I am so very thankful for my family, my health,

and my dear friends. But I am most thankful that I can enjoy all of these important facts of my life because I live here-in a Christian community like Royse City in the United States of America".

Sheridan Trette a 14-year-old Royse City Middle School student and the daughter of Frank and Sally Trette, wrote, "Thanksgiving is being with family, sharing love, and thankfulness. I'm so blessed for having the supportive family that I do. I am very thankful for the sacrifices that they make for me."

Jim Sladek, a military veteran and member of the Tri-County Veterans Honor Guard, said, "As I have grown older, Thanksgiving is every day. God blesses my family and me every day."

Now I would like to share one of my finest blessings that I am thankful for every single day. My son-in-law, Davy Murphy, had been ill for 11 years with virally induced dilated cardiomyopathy. He had been in and out of the hospital many, many times to save his life for various reasons pertaining to heart failure.

Two years ago, he lay in the intensive care unit at UT Southwestern Hospital in Dallas for three months. The doctors had told my daughter, Wendy, and him that in six months there would be nothing they could do for him.

was actually looking when I stumbled on pottery. I guess it was just right place, right time," Gibson said.  
While visiting an art gallery in New Mexico, seeing the pottery on display sparked something in him.  
"I had already been thinking about it, but I can't remember if that's what made me think 'You know what, that'd be fun,'" Gibson said.

He decided to take continuing ed classes at Eastfield College and pursue pottery further.

"After our teacher taught us the basics, it was just basically open lab, which was nice because you could practice and he was there to ask questions," Gibson said.

His technique of choice right now is layering a black clay and a white clay and sculpting the bowl or platter or whatever strikes his fancy at the time, and then after applying the appropriate procedures so that the piece is dry enough, he then uses an appropriate tool to shave off some of the sides to expose a unique pattern that the two different

colors of clays have made.  
With this technique, each piece is a one of a kind.  
"I guess it's a way to be artistic and not be a painter," Gibson said, "Although it could be considered just craft to some people."  
Gibson has had multiple wins at a local juried art shows and a judge even bought one of his pieces that placed second in the show.  
"There are no specific shows I plan on entering in the near future, but I do hope to start getting out there in the public eye as I build a more cohesive body of work," Gibson said.

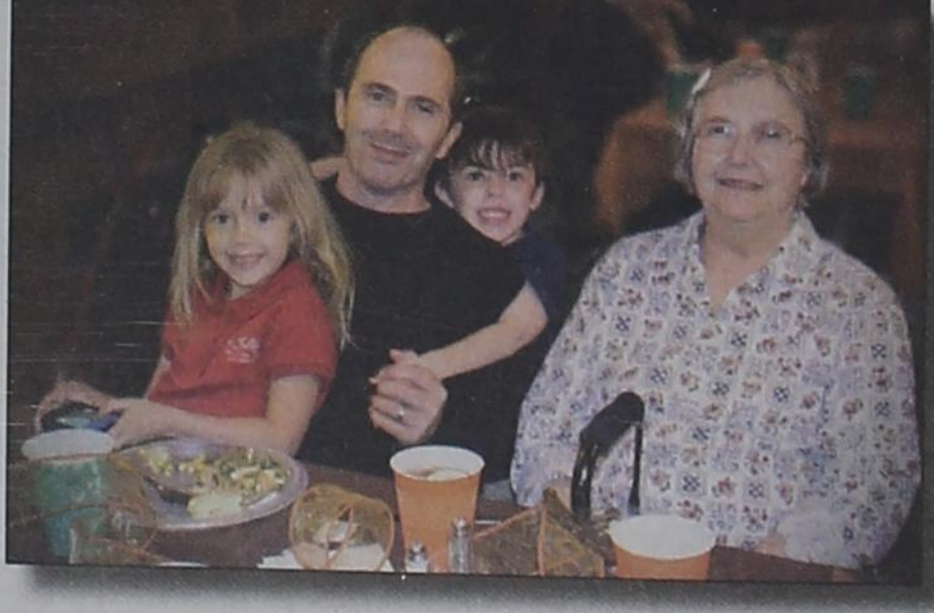

# On God's Word

## Rightly Dividing God's word ...

### Baptism of water? or holy spirit? Part 2

During this time of the year when many people focus on thankfulness, let's dive into God's rightly divided word about the most important subject to be thankful about. The baptism of holy spirit began on the day that is referred to in Acts 2:1-4, and continues to be available to this day.

Romans 10:9-10 shines light on what was the mental repentance that resulted in being filled with holy spirit, with the heart it is believed that God raised Jesus from the dead unto righteousness. When the day of Acts 2:1-4 came, the disciples were already believing with their hearts that God raised Jesus from the dead. Therefore, when the holy spirit was poured out, they were immediately filled with holy spirit unto righteousness.

Even after several years, there was still confusion about baptism. There was a Jewish teacher named Apollos, who was fervent in the spirit and diligently taught about the things of the Lord, yet knowing only the baptism of John (See Acts 18:24-25. While teaching in

Ephesus, Aquila and Priscilla "expounded unto him the way of God more perfectly." Keep in mind that the Apostle Paul met Aquila and Priscilla while in Corinth. They worked closely together both in their mutual trade and in the ministry (Acts 18:1-3).

Paul later came to Ephesus after Apollos left to Achaia (Acts 18:27 and 19:1).

Notice the discourse between Paul and the Ephesians, "Have you received the Holy Ghost since you believed?" To "believe" referred to the "repentance." Both involve mental processes. Together, the terms referred to a change from believing one thing, to believing something else.

Once again, please notice the chronological order in Paul's words: first believe; second receive the Holy Ghost. He asked if they had received the Holy Ghost since they believed.

The Ephesians said they only knew about the baptism of John, which involved water. After Paul opened up God's word more perfectly, they believed and were immediately baptized with holy spirit. Once again, this event did not involve water.

True righteousness and cleansing does not come through liquid water. Nor is water the manifestation of being baptized with holy spirit. There is a manifestation of holy spirit that is available for all Christians, which will be discussed in the near future.

One extremely important benefit from God's baptism of holy spirit is God's forgiveness through our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the day that holy spirit was first poured out into the world, some of the people present either played a role in the murder of Jesus, or

were in some way supportive of the act and covering according to Matthew 28:12-15, the soldiers who were paid to spread a lie. They must have known the disciples could not have arranged for them to fall in time while on guard. They must have known that the grave was too massive and heavy for the disciples to move without waking them up.

How much money would it take to convince people to believe from their hearts what is known to be a lie?

The soldiers who scourged, mocked, and hung no doubt had dark secrets to carry with them, especially that massive earthquake occurred soon after Jesus had heard Jesus ask his Father to forgive them.

The cover-up of the resurrection of our Lord Jesus many people, and was more extensive than even the well coordinated secret military special operation.

Witnesses on the scene and close to the suspects extremely vulnerable to powerful threats and schemes designed to implicate an innocent person.

After God's holy spirit was poured out, all people with their hearts that God raised Jesus from the dead were immediately baptized with holy spirit.

Even the soldiers who were paid large amounts of money to spread a lie could have believed the truth with their hearts and been immediately baptized with holy spirit.

They could have been absolutely forgiven and their righteousness and the burden of carrying their dark secrets removed.

Moreover, all people who are baptized with holy names written in the book of life. They can walk in the hope of the resurrection and everlasting life.

Let's praise God together with thankful hearts for us through His faithful son Jesus Christ our Lord!
