Downtown construction to begin in Rockwall

The Downtown renovation project is short, but city work, estimated to will not obstruct traffic.

City officials said the project will include parking areas, streets (18 new streets) and 10 new parking lots to be installed to provide visitors to the city once the added work is completed.

Mayor David Sweet said the project will be limited to the streets that directly border the downtown square, although there will be some work

on the streets approaching and departing the square.

Throughout the project there will be some lane restrictions and intermittent road closures; however, pedestrian access will be maintained to all businesses at all times during construction. Also, the city will provide temporary directional signage on the roads approaching the square to direct downtown visitors to the various satellite parking lots.

When completed, the \$8.625 million voter-approved capital improvement project will provide accessible sidewalks, more parking spaces in and around downtown, enhanced areas for visitors to gather and new landscaping, according to the news release.

After the first of the year, Phase 2 construction is scheduled to start and should be completed in about 18 months. The second phase of the project will include work on sidewalks, parking, walls, a pedestrian plaza, roads, accessibility issues and the San Jacinto Court House Plaza, according to the news release.

Mayor to step down from Fate City Council

Mayor David White will not run for re-election to the Fate City Council in November. White, 57, has served on the council since 2004 and has been mayor since 2008.

White said he has already formed a committee and announced he will not run for re-election to the council in November. He said he will submit a press release by the end of the week.

White said there are 85 percent of the district are

Republicans, so it should be an exciting race.

Stacy will run against Republican Ralph Hall, who first was elected to Congress in 1980. Hall was originally a Democrat, but in 2004 switched to the Republican Party.

"I was only 7 months old when Hall was elected the first time," Stacy said following his announcement.

Shortly into the council meeting, Capt. Jim Simmons of the Fate Department of Public Safety announced that one of the Fate's DPS officers had been slightly injured and had been taken to the emergency room for treatment only about a couple of hours before the city council was scheduled to meet.

Simmons said officers were responding to an alarm in the Williamsburg subdivision. The suspect, still in the residence, refused to respond to the commands of the officers, force had to be used to subdue the suspect, at which time the officer was slightly injured. At the close of the council meeting, no further information was available on the condition of the officer. The suspect was arrested for burglary of a habitation and assault on the officer, Simmons added.

Councilman Loren Megyes, Place 1, remarked that since the Fate DPS became official in October, officers have responded to more than 700 calls. He

complimented them on their work and diligence in carrying out their work.

Three action items on the agenda involved resolutions of the ongoing situation concerning the Nelson's Fireworks Outlet, Alamo Fireworks and By-Lo Fireworks. All three resolutions passed unanimously, essentially giving the businesses more time to meet the city's demands concerning the sales of fireworks.

The new interim city manager, Rod Hogan, reviewed the plans that building the new \$2.5 million elevated water storage tank near the Williamsburg housing addition will take at least 27 months to complete and nine months for the designs to be completed. The resolution, No. R-680, authorizing the city manager to execute an agreement for engineering design and preparation of construction documents for an elevated storage tank in or about the Williamsburg development," passed unanimously.

Mayor Bill Broderick praised the DPS for doing a good job. He also asked the city manager to check into having programs at the city hall and in any way making the building available for the senior citizens. He said the city needs to make better use of this building rather than having it set vacant so much. Hogan said he would do some research and get back with the mayor on the matter.

All members of the city council were present except Cameron Cowan, Place 5.

The next council meeting will be Nov. 18.

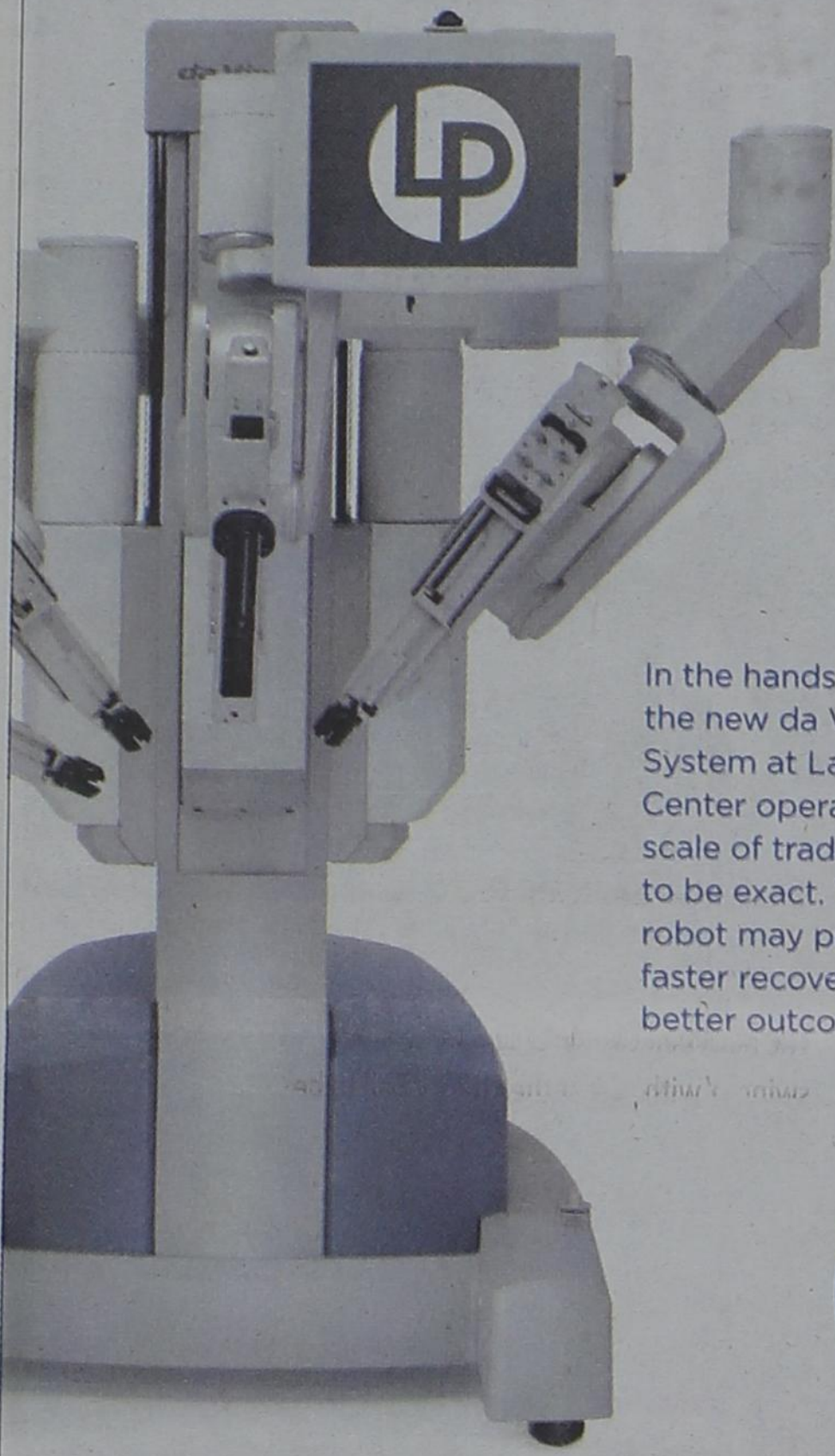

County voters follow state

Fewer than 7 percent of Rockwall County voters turned out for the Nov. 5 Constitutional Amendment Election, according to the county's elections administrator. The county recorded a total of 3,313 ballots cast, or 6.73 percent of the 49,239 registered voters. An overview of each of the items voted on follows:

- Local Option McLendon-Chisholm: 90 votes for, 1,249 votes against
- Proposition 1: 2,955 votes for, 325 votes against
- Proposition 2: 2,980 votes for, 254 votes against
- Proposition 3: 1,998 votes for, 1,137 votes against
- Proposition 4: 2,909 votes for, 351 votes against
- Proposition 5: 2,129 votes for, 1,042 votes against
- Proposition 6: 2,610 votes for, 685 votes against
- Proposition 7: 2,425 votes for, 745 votes against
- Proposition 8: 2,370 votes for, 630 votes against
- Proposition 9: 2,785 votes for, 356 votes against

Rockwall implements new watering schedule

Ongoing drought conditions have prompted City of Rockwall officials to implement new water use restrictions.

According to a news release issued earlier this week, the city now is under a once-every-two-week watering schedule. Landscape watering with sprinklers or irrigations systems should be limited to once every two weeks, if needed, until March 31. Water use should be limited to avoid runoff or other waste.

Foundations, new landscaping, first-year shrubs and first-year trees may be watered up to two hours on any day by a hand-held hose, soaker hose or dedicated zone using a drip irrigation system. ET/smart irrigation systems and drip systems also must comply with the once-every-two-weeks watering schedule.

The only exception to the new restrictions, according to the news release, are locations that utilize water sources other than the City of Rockwall.

The new restrictions went into effect Nov. 1.

The City of Rockwall is among municipalities served by the North Texas Municipal Water District, which is under mandatory water restrictions because of low lake levels.

The goal of the restrictions is to reduce water consumption throughout the city by 10 percent, according to the release.

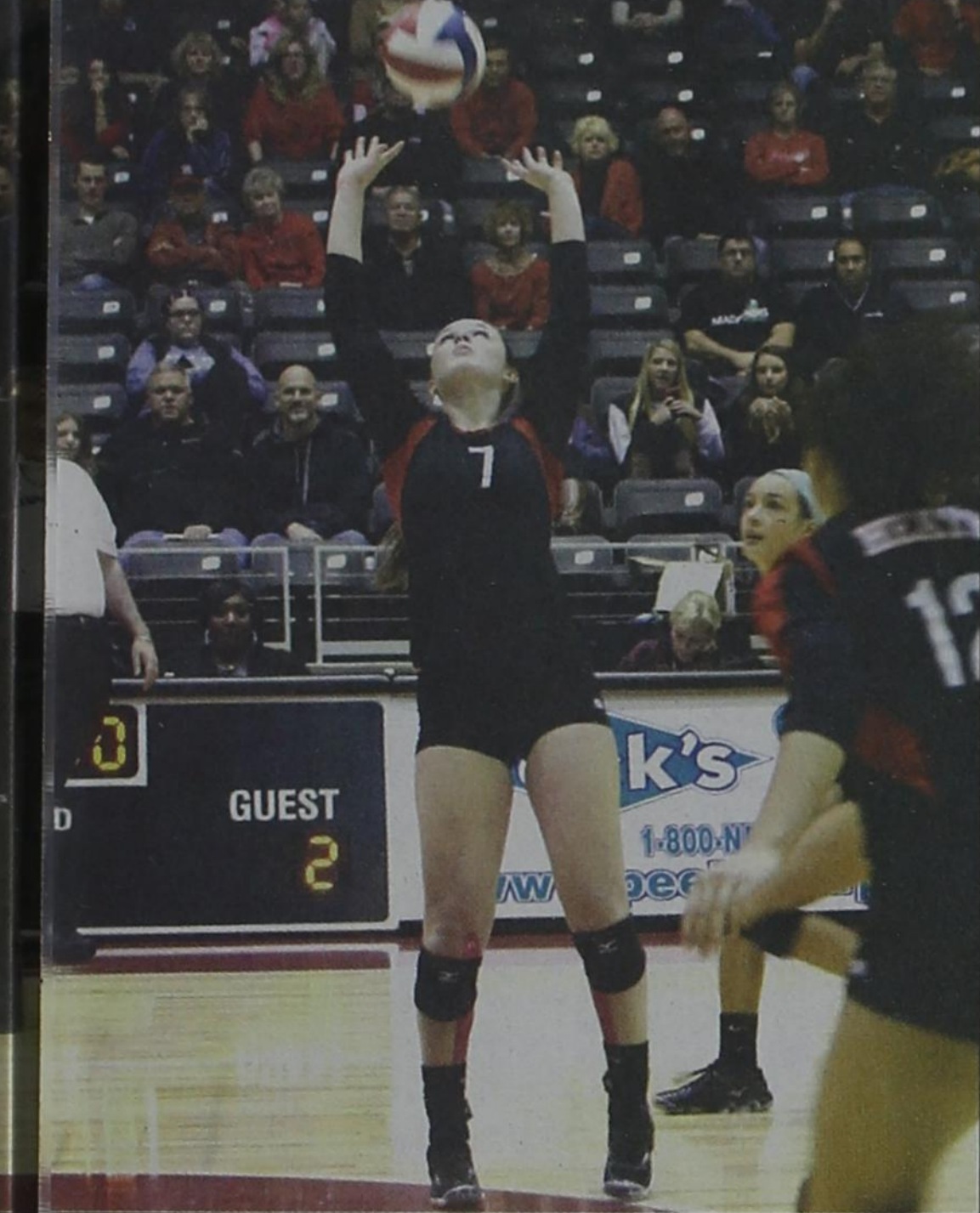

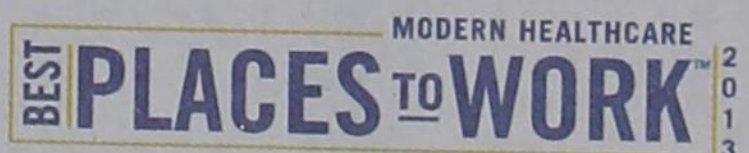
