#### Statement issued by DA on flagpole situation


The Rockwall County Criminal District Attorney's office issued a news release March 14 regarding what was described as the "flagpole situation at the Rockwall County Courthouse."

The statement was brief and read as follows: "Because the Rockwall County District Attorney's Office advises the Commissioners Court on this and other matters, we are conflicted out of this case," reads the statement that bore the DA's name, Kenda Culpepper. "We have already reported to the Judicial Region Judge that we will need a special prosecutor appointed to review the evidence. That prosecutor will determine what, if







#### On God's Word

#### Jesus Christ's last meal...teaches about the communion, and more

Before we continue with the records of Jesus' last meal with his disciples, a correction should be noted from last week's column. It was speculated that the disciples did not eat the passover meal in the room because they would have been hiding from the Jewish leaders or staying close to Jesus during his crucifixion. This is an example of private interpretation. There is no record of what all the disciples did following his death except that they ran away, or stayed close to him, and later hid in a room for fear of the Jewish leaders. This may or may not have been the same room.

Last week we stopped at the point after Jesus washed his disciples' feet and gave his first prophecy that one of them would betray him. Next we come to Luke 22:14-15, "And when the hour was come, he sat down, and the twelve apostles with him. And he said unto them, 'With desire I have desired to eat this passover with you before I suffer. For I say unto you, I will not any more eat thereof until it be fulfilled in the kingdom of God." What a touching moment this must have been. After washing the feet, they all reclined to eat, and Jesus told them how he

desired to eat the passover with them before he suffered.

He then prophesied that they would not eat together until everything is fulfilled in the kingdom of God. He may have been talking about the joining together of Jesus with his Bride as recorded in Revelation 21:1-2, or when he rules with certain saints during the thousand year reign as recorded in Revelation 19:4. There will be a day when they will be together again. Next we come to Matthew 26:21-25, "And as they did eat, he said, 'Verily I say unto you, that one of you shall betray me.' And they were exceeding sorrowful, and began every one of them to say unto him, 'Lord, is it I?' And he answered and said, 'He that dips his hand with me in the dish, the same shall betray me. The son of man goes as it is written of him: but woe unto that man by whom the son of man is betrayed! It had been good for that man if he had not been born.' Then Judas, which betrayed him, answered and said, 'Master, is it I?' He said unto him, 'You have said.'" Remember that earlier Jesus told them that he would be betrayed, and they pondered on it within themselves. This time each one asked him "Lord, is it I?" The same occurrence can be found in Mark 14:17-21. Sometime after his second mention of his betrayal, Jesus taught his disciples about the symbolism of his body and blood as related to food and drink. This record can be found in Matthew 26:26-29, Mark 14:22-25 and Luke 22:17-20.

Having been recorded in three different gospels, God completely established the importance of this teaching. There should be no doubt that when Christians eat food it should be done in remembrance of Christ's body that was broken for complete healing, and when they drink with the meal, it should be done in remembrance of his blood that was spilled unto the forgiveness of sins.

We find this also in 1Peter 2:24, "Who his own self bare our sins in his own







heart of each county government is the commissioner's court. Each ounty has four precinct commissioners and a county judge who serve on t. Although this body conducts the general business of the county and financial matters, the Texas Constitution established a strong system ss and balances by creating other elective offices in each county. The dependently elective offices found in the counties are county court at rict attorneys, county and district clerks, county treasurers, sheriffs, tax -collectors, justices of the peace and constables. As a part of the checks nces system, counties have an auditor appointed by the district courts. tey here is the county is a part of state government so the State Flag ould take precedence. 




