



Volunteers needed to aid nursing home residents

least 18 years of age.

Volunteers are required to complete a free training course comprised of both classroom study and training of up to 34 contact hours at local nursing homes. Following the completion of training, each volunteer will complete an internship, working two to three hours per week in an assigned facility. Hours will be flexible and determined by the volunteer.




