    During the month of September 2010, the I-35 Corridor Segment Committee 1 (CSC 1) will host a series of public planning workshops in North Texas. The purpose of the workshops is to present to and gather feedback from the public on the Committee's proposed long-range transportation solutions for the I-35 Corridor.

    CSC 1 is one of four committees established by the Texas Transportation Commission in March 2009 to develop a needs-based citizens-directed plan for the I-35 Corridor. These committees are comprised of
    -epresentatives from local cities, counties, Metropolitan Planning Organizations, and community organizations. Over the last year, the committees have identified goals, needs, and potential solutions in their respective segments, and have reviewed traffic modeling analyses to determine the effectiveness of each proposed solution. They have used this information to develop draft I-35 Corridor Segment Plans that reflect the unique transportation needs and planning approaches within their respective areas.
    All interested citizens are encouraged to attend a public workshop to discuss the draft plan, ask questions, and express their views to the CSC 1 members. The draft plan for Segment 1 proposes roadway and rail solutions within the geographic area including and north of $1-30$ in the $\mathrm{D} / \mathrm{FW}$ area to the Texas/Oklahoma
    border in Cooke and Grayson counties. Because of the overlapping transportation networks and issues in the D/FW area, the draft plan for Segment 2 , which covers the area including and south of $I-30$ to the Bell/Williamson county line, will also be available for public review at the Segment 1 workshops.
