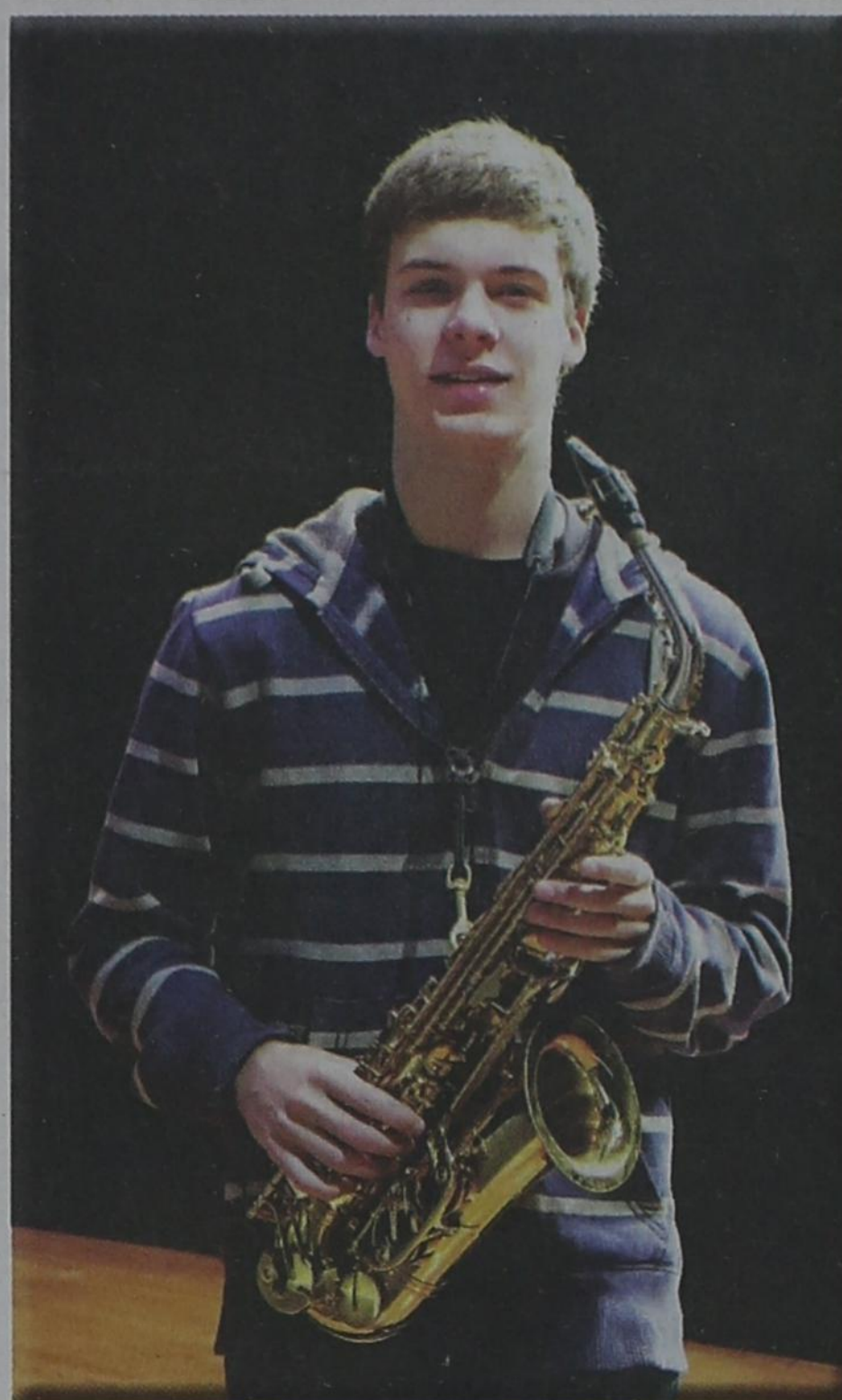

Rockwall High School culinary arts team wins at state competition

Restaurant Management Team, one of two Rockwall High School culinary arts teams to compete at the state level earlier this month, earned first place and will represent Texas in Baltimore, Md., in April at the National ProStart Restaurant Management Competition. Team members collected more than \$100,000 in scholarships from various hospitality and culinary arts schools. Team members include Alexis Catinchi, April Nash, Morgan Reynolds, and Ryan Tsadesky and Clay Honeycutt.

The second team, comprised of both RHS and Rockwall-Heath High students, finished in third place and collected received \$31,000 in scholarships. Team members included Zachary Granis and Demetria Coleman of RHHS and Maddy Meyer, Chris Rivera and Fernanda Arzola of RHS.

"I could not be more proud of them," said chef Cody Hayes. "I am honored to teach these young people every day. I am blessed beyond measure."

Spencer Sosnowski, a Rockwall-Heath High School senior band student, was one of two students selected from across the U.S. to perform with The President's Own United States Marine Corps Band in Washington, D.C. Voters to choose school board, city council seats on May 11

Voters will cast ballots in the May 11 city and school election for city council members only in the City of Fate and for the boards of trustees in the Rockwall Independent School District (RISD) and Roysie City Independent School District (RCISD).

Roysie City, Rockwall, Heath, and McLendon-Chisholm will not have council elections as candidates who filed for seats in those cities are unopposed. Residents in those cities will still vote for school district board members in their respective districts.

Glenda Denton, Rockwall County Elections Administrator, said the City of Fate sits in both the Rockwall and Roysie City school districts. Voters there will have two school ballots. Voters will get one of two ballots based on the school district in which they live.

All other Rockwall County voters will get either a RISD or RCISD ballot, based on the school district in which they live.

The family has operated the stand each year since that time, with all proceeds benefitting the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society.

During the past nine years, the family has raised more than \$14,000 for the organization.

Mary Kate recently was awarded the Honored Hero of the Year award from the North Texas Chapter of the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society.

Fate to establish in-house Department of Public Safety

The City of Fate is in the process of establishing a Department of Public Safety. At this time, the City Council and city manager are preparing to begin the process of selecting a director and will begin application reviews on April 1.

City manager Philip Rodriguez may be contacted at the Fate City Hall at 972-771-461 for more information on the position or a resume may be submitted to jobs@cityoffate.com.

At the March 18 City Council meeting, Fate's Fire Chief Sean Fay introduced two new employees to the council, staff and those in attendance. The officers joining the force are Tyler Young from the Heath Department of Public Safety with five years of experience and Casey Northcut from the Rockwall County Sheriff's Department with 10 years of experience.

The goal for the new department is that eventually each officer is to have a triple certification, that of certified peace officer, firefighter and emergency medical technician (EMT).

Fate is one of the fastest growing cities in the United States. The community had a population of 497 in 2000 and now has about 10,000.

Also discussed at the Fate City Council meeting was the annual Fate Cleanup Day, which is scheduled for April 20. Director of public works Bobby Clay updated the council about the event. The free disposal of bulk household items will run from 9 a.m. until 2 p.m. This service will be residential only; no commercial disposal.

Items accepted include furniture, brush, old carpet, metal, wood, old fencing and recyclables. Anyone wishing to dispose of paint is directed to pour kitty litter into the can and let it dry three to five days. Visit the Annual Fate Clean-up Day website for more information. The disposal site located on the frontage road of I-30 going west (a map is on the website), will limit the visits to three per household.

Clay noted that there were items that are considered as hazardous

materials and will not be accepted, including computers, batteries, televisions, pesticides, household cleaners, tires and vehicle fluids. Any Fate residents wanting to participate must bring a valid driver's license showing residency and a current water bill.

Council members in attendance at the meeting were Mayor Bill Broderick, Mayor Pro Tem Sheri Garber-Place 4, Steve Skipworth -

Place 2, John Stacy Place 3, and Forest Murley -Place 5. Staff present were Philip Rodriguez-- City Manager, Jean Dwinney Secretary, Richard Ball- Finance Director, Sean Fay- Fire Chief, Messer-City Attorney, Justin Weiss-Assistant to City Manager, and Community Development and Bobby Clay-Public Works Director. The next Fate City Council meeting is April 1 at the Fate City Center, 104 South W.E. Crawford, Fate at 6 p.m.

Ada Karine 'Kay' Curran



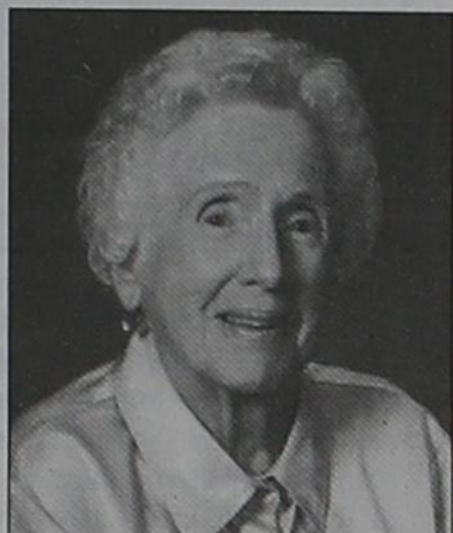

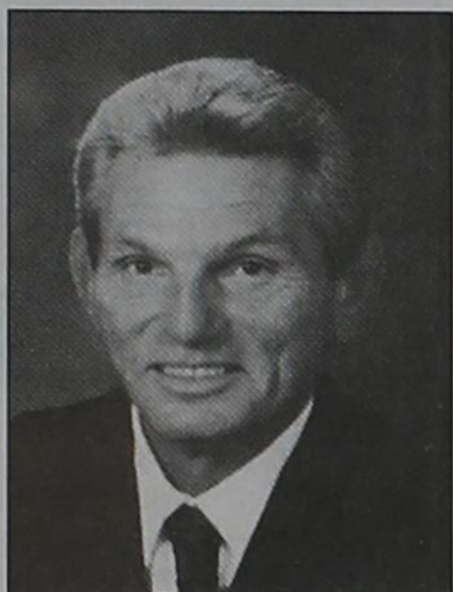
Flora Marie Packer

Everett J. Pearce



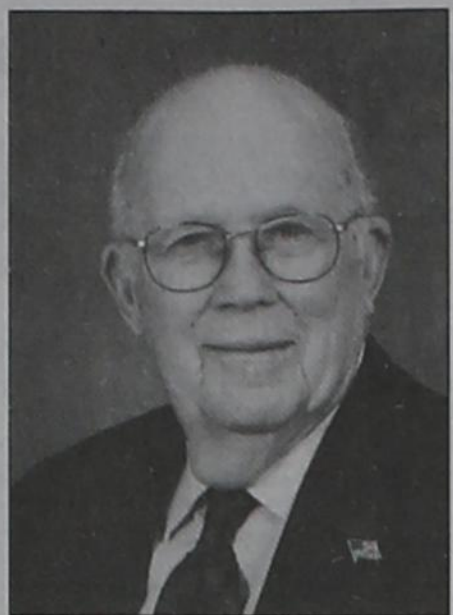

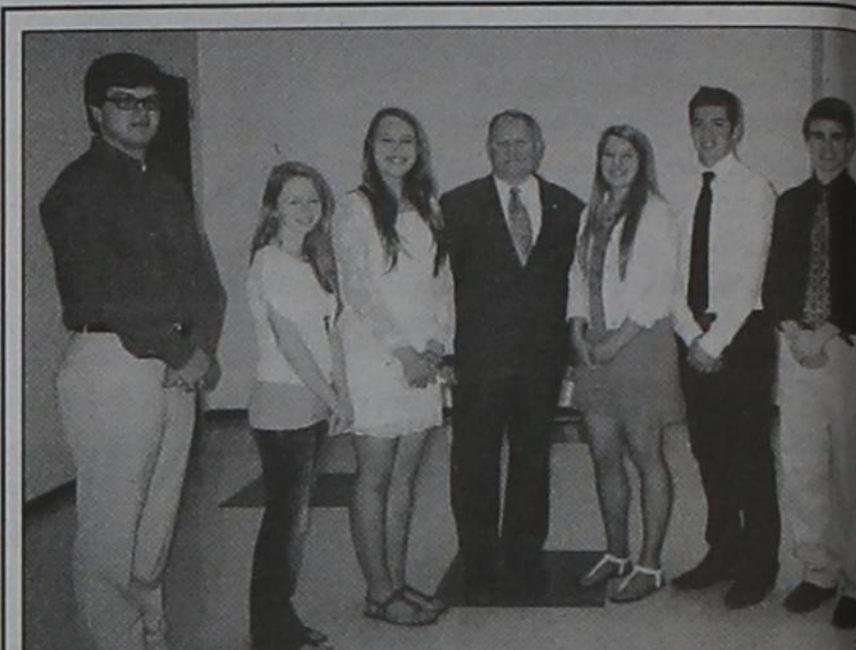
