Zebra mussels prompt city to ask for voluntary water conservation

The City of Rockwall, at the request of its water supplier, is asking residents to comply with a volunteer water conservation plan.

Initiation of Stage 1 of the water plan is intended to raise public awareness of potential drought contingency and water emergency problems, according to a City of Rockwall news release issued Saturday.

The city's current Water Conservation Plan is as follows:

- Watering between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. is prohibited from April 1 to Oct. 31
- Outdoor watering of impervious surfaces is prohibited
- Watering during rain or freezing temperatures is prohibited
- Lawn and landscape irrigation is limited to twice a week unless irrigation systems are installed with an evapo-transpiration controller; a water hose with a shut-off valve is used; or if needed for establishing new lawns or landscaping for a period of 30 days or as approved by the city
- Rain and freeze sensors and/or evapo-transpiration controllers must be properly maintained
- Fundraising and at-home car washing are permitted only when using a water hose with a shut-off nozzle

The goal for water use reduction this stage of the plan is 2 percent, according to the news release.

Stage 1 of the conservation plan was implemented as a result of invasive zebra mussels found in Lake Texoma, which supplies a quarter of the North Texas Municipal Water District's water supply. Zebra mussels do not contaminate water and are not harmful to humans, but they do attach to water facilities and pipes that pump water, causing increased operating and maintenance costs, said Jim Parks, NTMWD executive director.

The infestation of zebra mussels in Lake Texoma has resulted in a loss of 22.5 percent of the NTMWD's total raw water supply, according to the news release.

The NTMWD, which supplies the City of Rockwall's water, is working on a solution so this does not become a bigger issue for other water sources in the state, Parks said.

April 19 is the target date for the plan to be in force.

Zebra mussels were discovered in North America near the Great Lakes in 1988. They typically are transferred from one river basin to another by boaters and anglers and are considered to be the most problematic polluting organism in North America because they are difficult to eliminate. They not only clog water pipelines, but they can also cause declines in fish and bird populations.

The groundbreaking ceremony for the Rockwall County Veterans Memorial has been scheduled for 5 p.m. April 26. The memorial will be located at I-30 at 1111 E. Yellow Jacket Lane adjacent to the new courthouse currently under construction.

On God's Word

The church dynamics...1Corinthians 12:7-10

by Timothy W. Burnett

After 1Corinthians 12:4-6 the subject changes to the manifestation of the spirit from God. Verses 7-10 list all the ways that people can profit from the manifestation of the spirit. It is impossible to perceive the existence of the spirit with our senses. We can't see, smell, taste nor touch it. God is the one who gave His spirit, and only by His word can we learn how to manifest the same spirit. He did not leave His people ignorant concerning these things. "But the manifestation of the spirit is given to every man for profit. For to one is given by the spirit the word of wisdom. To another the word of

knowledge by the same spirit. To another the faith by the same spirit. To another the gifts of healing by the same spirit. To another working of miracles. To another prophecy. To another discerning of spirits. To another different kinds of tongues. To another the interpretation of tongues." (1Corinthians 12:7-10). The ability to manifest the spirit from God is given to every man for profit. The word "man" refers to all people in the category of mankind and includes women. It is given to everybody who is filled with holy spirit.

One of the popular beliefs in many churches is that different people are gifted with certain abilities.

It is said that one person has the gift of speaking in tongues, while another person has the gift of discerning spirits. The general belief is that other people will not have the capacity to do what they are not gifted with. If the word says that the manifestation of the spirit is given to every man, then that means everyone who is filled with holy spirit will have the capacity to profit from the manifestation of the spirit in all nine ways. There are nine ways that Christians can profit from the manifestation of the spirit of God.

The verses use the word "another." There is a minute detail that must be addressed in this study. The word "another" was translated from two different Greek words. They are allos and heteros. Seven of the nine are joined with allos and refer to another of the same kind, where as two of the nine are joined with heteros and refer to another of a different kind (The Companion Bible, Appendix 124 1&2).

The two that are joined with heteros (another of a different kind) are faith and different tongues. These two are a different kind because they are unique to the administration of the grace of God that we currently live in. Speaking in tongues was not available prior

to the events of Acts 2:4 when the spirit of God was poured out in the launching the beginning of the new spiritual administration. The word referred to the faith of our Lord Jesus Christ. It was not possible to have faith of our Lord Jesus Christ prior to the Administration of grace. Jesus had not yet ascended to sit at God's right hand of all authority in Romans 3:21-22, "But now the righteousness of God without the law is manifested, being witnessed by the law and the prophets.

Even the righteousness of God which is by faith of Jesus Christ and upon all them that believe. For there is no difference." This fits with the above reference to the manifestation of the spirit being given in 1Corinthians 12:7-10 destroys all confusion concerning what God's people are spiritually capable of during this fantastic administration of the God.

Hungry Harry talks tipping and service with a good restaurant

I would guess one of the most asked questions during a lunch or dinner is, "So, how much do I tip?" From the acronym, "To Insure Promptness," tipping originally came from England in the 1700s. It did not take root in America until after the Civil War.

The idea of tipping for some is considered an unnecessary and unfair practice. In fact, in 1904, a 100,000 member group called the Anti-Tipping of America was formed. It was such a big deal that in 1909 the state of Oregon made tipping against the law, only to be repealed in 1926.

So how much should one tip? My answer is a radical one not popular with the server bringing you the food. The industry suggests 15-20%. It is based on the service provided. Did you receive drinks quickly and often? Was the food served quickly? Did the server provide attentive service? How much time did you spend at the establishment? Finally, get the bill quickly?

Tipping between 10 and 20% is acceptable. However, I am not a fan of tipping and believe it should be based on the service provided. The Harry method is this: Good service with a bill of \$10 dollars or less is less than \$2. Great/Excellent service on \$10 is usually no less than \$3.

Grandpa Hungry told me that you should avoid not giving tip but giving dirty, nasty pennies for poor service or two shiny pennies if the service is good. I do not feel that you are obligated to give ANY set amount but ever you feel the service was worth, my numbers are just examples. If the service was good, I believe you should let your server know and an excellent, let the Manager know as well. The truth is service can make a dining experience.

My restaurant review is for the brand new Mi Cocina (pronounced meena, not Cochina or you will be calling it 'nasty' in Spanish), which is located in the former TGI Friday's location on the I-30 service road.

Mi Cocina has created a strong visual dining experience. The menu is simple but all selections seemed fairly priced and provided a good value. I ordered the Business Lunch Fajitas as I believe you can learn much from a Mexican restaurant with their fajitas. The food was excellent and the service was light in some ways but plentiful with the guacamole. The guacamole does stand out and is a great meal accompaniment. Mi Cocina is very popular in the D-FW area and overall is a great addition to Rockwall.

My issue comes down to service and in this case I don't necessarily recommend this as a place to eat. The restaurant. Service was after the lunch rush and there were many patrons, maybe three tables at most. Beverage service took 10 minutes to get another five minutes to order. My overall experience would have been better if the server was attentive. Mi Cocina is a good add to any eating establishment.

Atmosphere: Business, slightly upscale Mexican; Service: Slower than usual; Food: Great; Plate presentation excellent; Good Flavor; Price: Reasonable. Overall: Three of four smiles.

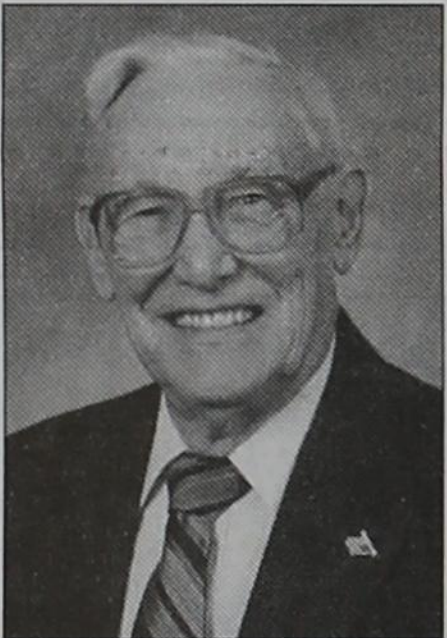

17 Uses for Baking Soda

Going green often translates to making subtle lifestyle changes to improve prospects for the planet. Limiting the use of chemical products and other harmful materials in everyday life can vastly reduce harmful impact on the world. ...

There are many items that can replace harmful chemicals for cleaning and other purposes. One of the more versatile is baking soda. Commonly found in the kitchen pantry, baking soda can be put to use in that room and beyond. ...

In a traditional sense, baking soda, or sodium bicarbonate, is a leavening agent used in baking. Baking soda is used in recipes where an acidic ingredient, such as buttermilk or lemon juice, will be used to generate the chemical reaction that releases bubbles of carbon dioxide. ...

However, beyond cookies and cakes, baking soda has a number of useful purposes. Because it is all-natural and can be ingested, it can be used safely and without concern for toxic interactions. ...

1. Mouthwash: Mix a glass of water with one teaspoon of baking soda. Swish and spit out the solution, then rinse. Mouth odors will be neutralized.
2. Deodorant: Pat baking soda under the arms for a natural body odor deterrent.
3. Antacid: Use baking soda as an antacid or to combat sour stomach. The box usually will give directions for making a solution to drink to ease stomach discomfort.
4. Itch remedy: Shake baking soda onto the hand and pat it on damp skin after a shower.
5. Deodorize: Sprinkle baking soda on carpets before vacuuming. Keep a box in the refrigerator or a closet to absorb foul odors.
6. Water treatment: Use baking soda to neutralize water pH. Add it to bath water or to the washing machine to improve soap's efficacy.
7. Hair improvements: Mix a small amount of baking soda with traditional shampoo. The baking soda will help remove the residue that styling products leave behind.
8. Soft scrub: Sprinkle baking soda on a clean, damp sponge. Use it to scour tiles, sinks, tubs, and counters. Rinse and wipe dry.
9. Microwave cleaner: Baking soda on a sponge can also clean the inside of the microwave without leaving a harsh smell behind.
10. Stainless cleaner: Make a paste of baking soda and water to remove rust stains from a stainless steel sink.
11. Coffee pot cleanser: Remove bitter tastes and stains from coffee pots or tea pots with a solution of 1/4 cup baking soda to 1 quart of warm water.
12. Gentle baby clothes cleaner: Soak baby items in water and 1/2 cup baking soda for a gentle cleaner.
13. Grease fighter: Sprinkle baking soda on light oil and grease spills in the garage or in the driveway. Scrub with a wet brush.
14. Freshen litter box: Sprinkle baking soda in kitty litter to neutralize pet odors.
15. Septic care: Regular use of baking soda in drains is the natural way to realize proper pH in septic tanks.
16. Vegetable wash: A food-safe way to clean dirt and residue off of fresh vegetables and fruit is to sprinkle baking soda on a clean, damp sponge, scrub and rinse.
17. Fire extinguisher: Baking soda can be used on grease or electrical fires to smother flames. TF115772

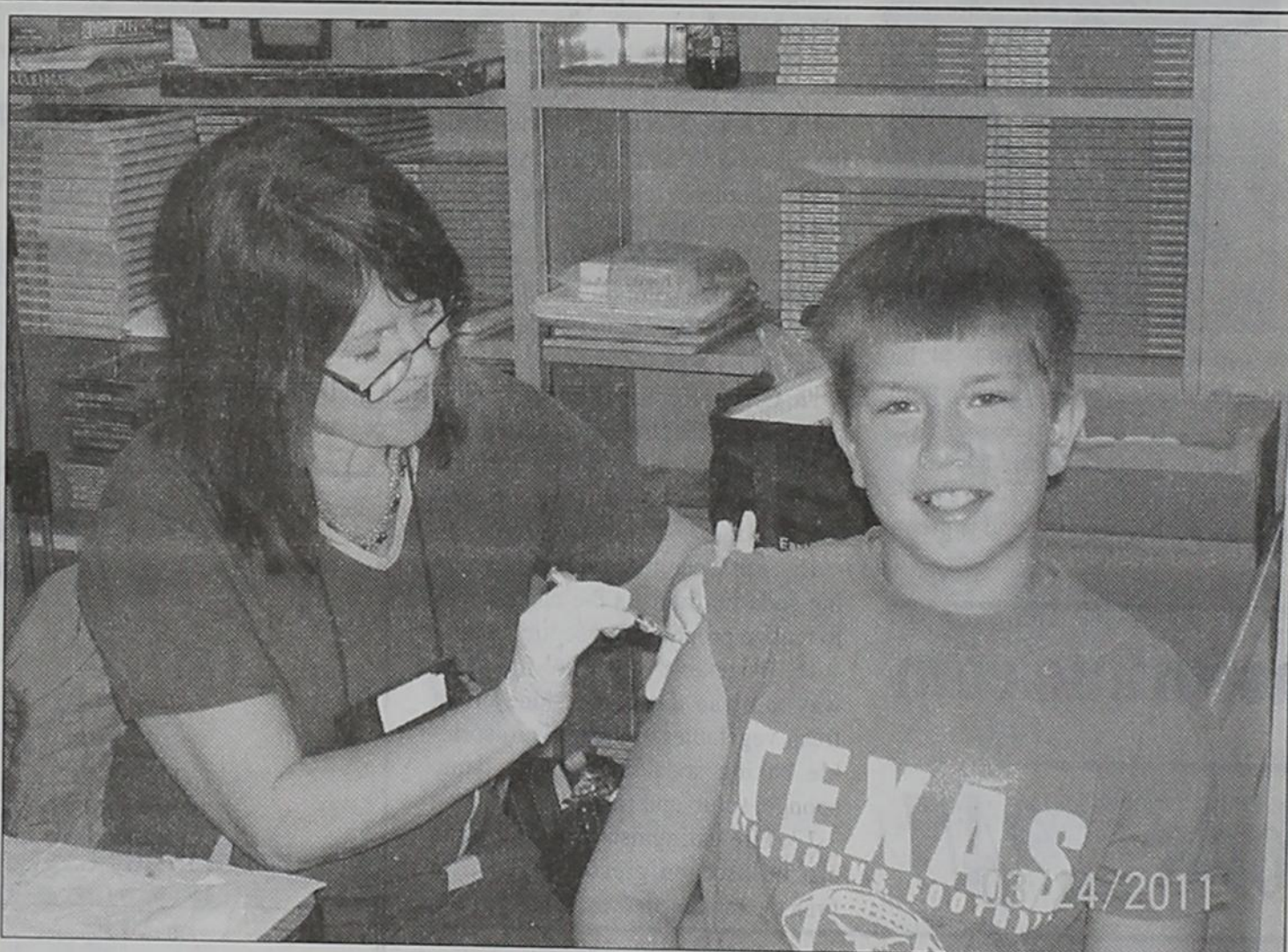

Rockwall County Hospital Auxiliary delivers TLC

Amy Conner is the clinical coordinator of Employee Health and Volunteer Services at Texas Health Presbyterian Hospital Rockwall. The hospital's focus is making sure that its patients have an exceptional experience by anticipating their needs and exceeding their expectations in the service and quality of care they receive.

Volunteers enhance the patient's hospital stay by making them feel more comfort-

able. Being in charge of patient health care is a perfect fit for Conner. The idea of forming the Rockwall County Hospital Auxiliary arose from her practical experience as a registered nurse and from her love of her community.

"The auxiliary is my passion," said Conner. "I love working with volunteers of all ages, especially the elderly who want to give of their time."

One such volunteer is Prudy Arnold, who moved to Rockwall to be near her son and his wife.

"I didn't know anyone in town, and I needed a way to fill my time. I enjoy the staff at Texas Health Rockwall, and I like meeting people," Arnold said.

Her favorite job is selling popcorn in the lobby on Mondays.

"That day goes by pretty fast," she said. She loves meeting the patients as they arrive in the ER and directing them to the triage. She also gets prepares rooms, changes linens and helps with wheelchair transport.

"I tell my volunteers that their job is to spread a little bit of sunshine," said Conner. "They serve as an extension of the patient's family members. Since the family cannot be with the patient 24 hours a day, seven days a week, our volunteers are there to offer comfort. They may be straightening a patient's linens, helping them with their meals, or just being a caring presence."

They also deliver muffins and juice to family members in waiting rooms so they feel taken care of as well.

During the holidays, the hospital invited small groups to sing carols and deliver treats. For Conner and the staff at Texas Health Rockwall, all this extra TLC is an important part of the healing process.

In addition to the volunteers who work with patients, there are also those who work behind the scenes. Many auxiliary members help by performing clerical tasks like: data entry, filing, copying and auditing files. Others stock supplies, run specimens to the lab, sort mail and answer phones.

Auxiliary members at Texas Health Rockwall are dedicated men and women, teens through seniors, from all kinds of backgrounds who share a common desire to help others. Volunteers undergo a thorough screening process including background checks and drug testing to ensure the patients' safety. Once they are accepted into the program, they typically work a three-hour shift once a week.

Their green polo shirts or aprons, ID badges and their welcoming smiles easily identify auxiliary members.

Volunteers are required to give a six-month commitment and are asked for a one-time payment of \$25 in dues, which is deposited in the auxiliary fund. The money is used to make purchases that will add to the comfort of patients. For example, newborn babies are given receiving blankets, care packages are made for nursing home residents and stuffed animals are available in the Emergency Room for pediatric patients. This year, in addition to offering support services to the hospital, the auxiliary also will provide two \$500 scholarships to deserving high school students interested in pursuing a career in the health industry.

A new addition to the hospital is the Junior Student Volunteer Program, who are 16 years of age by June 1 of the program year commit to working 10 hours during the summer months. Applications for the Summer 2011 Junior Student Volunteer Program are available at the front desk in the hospital lobby and at phrtexas.com.

There are many benefits to being a hospital volunteer. In addition to helping patients, volunteers have the opportunity to meet new friends, learn new skills, gain insights and achieve a sense of accomplishment. Volunteer achievements are recognized once a year with an awards dinner or luncheon.

RHHS student tapped for Achievement Scholarship

Darara B. Borodge, a student of Rockwall-Heath High, has been selected to receive the National Achievement National Merit Scholarship Corporation Scholarship, according to a news release issued this week by the National Merit Scholarship Corp.

Borodge was one of approximately 800 black American high school seniors singled out to receive Achievement Scholarship awards through the National Achievement Scholarship Program. She was one of 700 recipients of a National Achievement scholarship of \$2,500.

More than 160,000 students entered the 2011 National Achievement Scholarship Program by requesting consideration when they took the 2009 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test as high school juniors. The NASP is a privately financed academic competition designed to honor scholastically talented black American youth.

Dallas, Garland police join locals in April 4 water search

Rockwall Police were involved in a water search shortly after midnight April 4 when a motorcyclist abandoned his vehicle during an attempted stop by authorities.

Police were attempting to stop what was described as a speeding motorcycle westbound IH-30 when the incident occurred, according to a news release from the Rockwall Police Department. After accelerating to speeds in excess of 100 mph, the driver stopped the motorcycle on IH-30 approximately one mile west of Horizon Road and fled on foot down an embankment toward the shoreline of Lake Ray Hubbard.

A foot search was conducted; however, officers were unable to locate the cyclist.

Based on information obtained at the scene, authorities believed the suspect fled into the water in an attempt to evade capture. Search and Rescue teams from the Garland Fire Department, Dallas Fire Department and Rockwall Police Department were used to conduct a thorough land search for the suspect. Additionally, personnel from the Dallas Fire Department's Swift Rescue team conducted a search from a boat, again with no results.

At approximately 4:45 a.m., the missing motorcyclist contacted his family. Authorities determined they could call off their search after an on-duty police officer confirmed the suspect was OK by contacting the suspect's family.

No information pertaining to any possible charges related to the incident was made available by police.

Lady Hawks qualify for state gymnastics again

The Rockwall-Heath girls will be returning to the Texas High School Gymnastic Coaches Association state meet.

The Lady Hawks placed second in the Region 1 meet March 30 and 31 at Rockwall High School. The host school took the regional title with 232,450 points to 228,425 for Rockwall-Heath.

RHHS' boys were third after the Tuesday Compulsory competition

but were nosed out by Highland Park after Wednesday's Optionals. The Hawks totaled 305,100 to 309,800 for Highland Park. Rockwall's boys won with 325,200, and Garland Lakeview Centennial was second at 322,500.

Three Lady Hawks finished among the top 10 in the all-around competition. Carolyn Sherwin placed fourth at 77,650, Jade Bowerman was sixth with 76,725 and Jacquelyn Doughty was 10th at 73,475.

Bowerman had RHHS' top placing in an individual event - third in the floor exercise at 19,475. She also was eighth in the vault (19,150) and tied for ninth on the balance beam (19,400).

Sherwin was among the top six in all four events. She best in the vault (19,500) and floor exercise (19,400), finishing fourth in each. On the balance beam, she tied for fifth (19,600), and on the uneven bars tied for sixth (19,150).

For the boys, Trevor Newell placed highest all-around, in 10th place at 100,700. He was seventh in the vault (18,300) and ninth in both the parallel bars (17,200) and pommel horse (17,000).

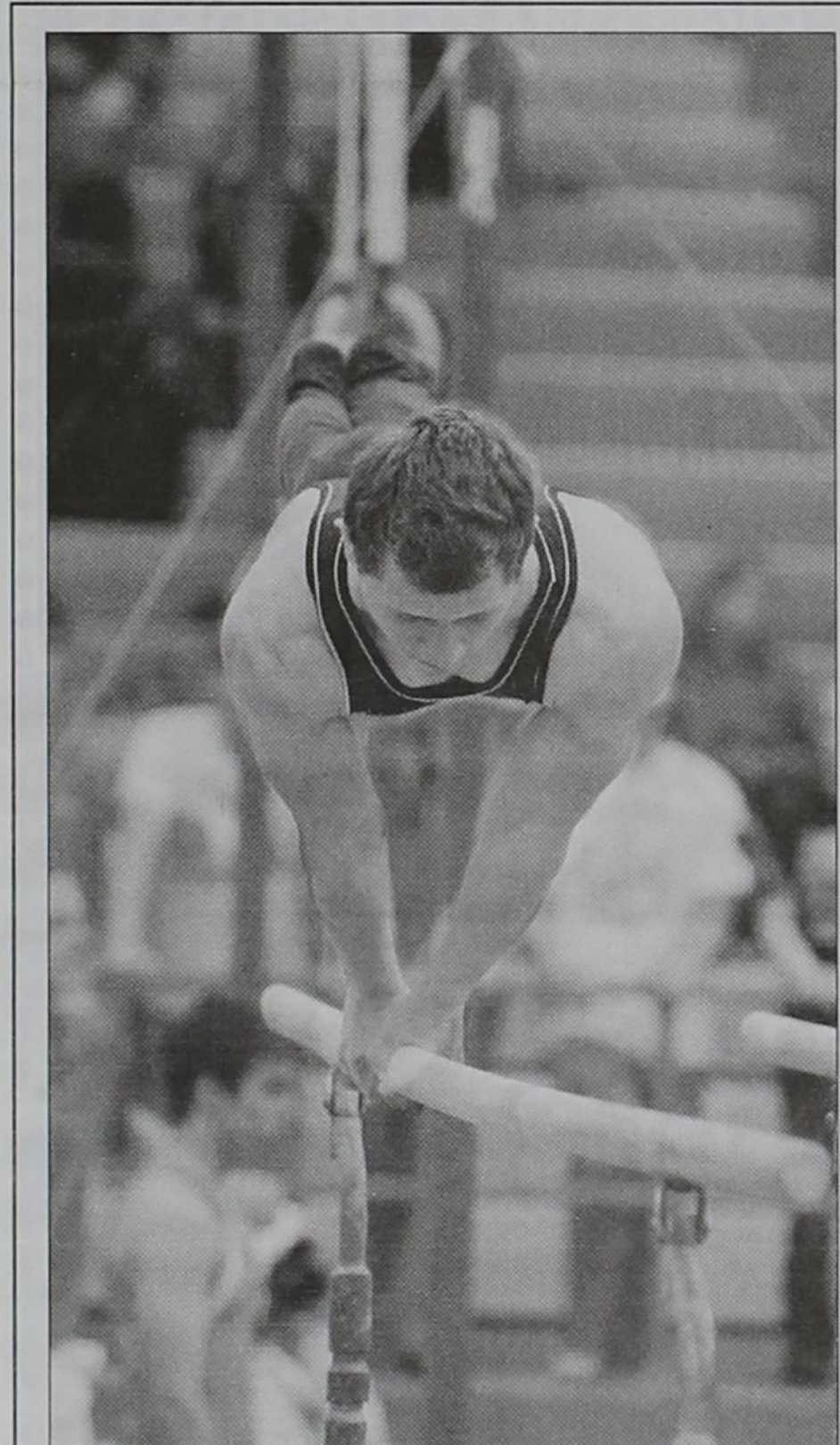
Alex Milner was a major contributor, with a fifth-place finish on the rings (18,000), seventh on the horse (17,100) and 10th on the parallel bars (17,100).

RHS boys, girls take Regional titles to State meet

Rockwall won both the boys' and girls' Region 1 gymnastics championships and the Texas High School Gymnastic Coaches Association state meet Friday at the University of Texas at Arlington.

On its home floor at RHS, Rockwall used depth and balanced scoring to finish first in a field of 13 girls' teams and eight boys' squads.

Lakeview Centennial's Johann Handdszger was the boys' individual all-around champion, and Highland Park's Arielle Iola took the girls' all-around title, countered by having four of the top seven boys and the second-place finisher all-around.

Senior Kenzie Hedges – who finished second, just .3 behind Iola (19.700) – won two events. She took the vault with 19.675 and uneven bars with 19.500. Hedges also tied teammate Kailea Coles for third place on the bal-

ance beam (19.650) and placed ninth in the floor exercise (19.125).

RHS finished with a team total of 232.450 to 228.425 for runner-up Rockwall-Heath and 222.875 for Highland Park. All three teams, along with the top 10 finishers all-around and in individual events, qualified for the state competition at Arlington Martin High School.

Coles also finished seventh in the vault (19.175). Other top finishes were by teammates Jenna Jeffrey, fourth on the bars (19.250) and fifth on the floor (19.375); Lindsay Loy, eighth on the floor (19.200) and tied for ninth on the beam (19.400); Sarah Beasley, eighth on the bars (19.050), and Kara Miller, tied for 10th on the bars (19.000).

For Rockwall's boys, Bradley Meyer was third all-around at 111.000. Handdszger's winning score was 114.100. The Yellowjackets overcame his performance to outscore Lakeview Centennial 325.200-322.500. Highland Park qualified for state as the third-place team at 309.800.

Close behind Meyer were RHS' Craig Brannon, fifth all-around at 103.700; Michael Weidman, sixth at 102.900, and Zach Bennett, seventh with 102.600.

Brannon, the defending state champion on the rings, finished first in his specialty at 18.900.

Meyer finished between second and fifth in each event – second in the vault (18.900) and on the parallel bars (18.700); third on the pommel horse (18.700) and high bar (17.500); fourth on the rings (18.600), and fifth in the floor exercise (18.600).

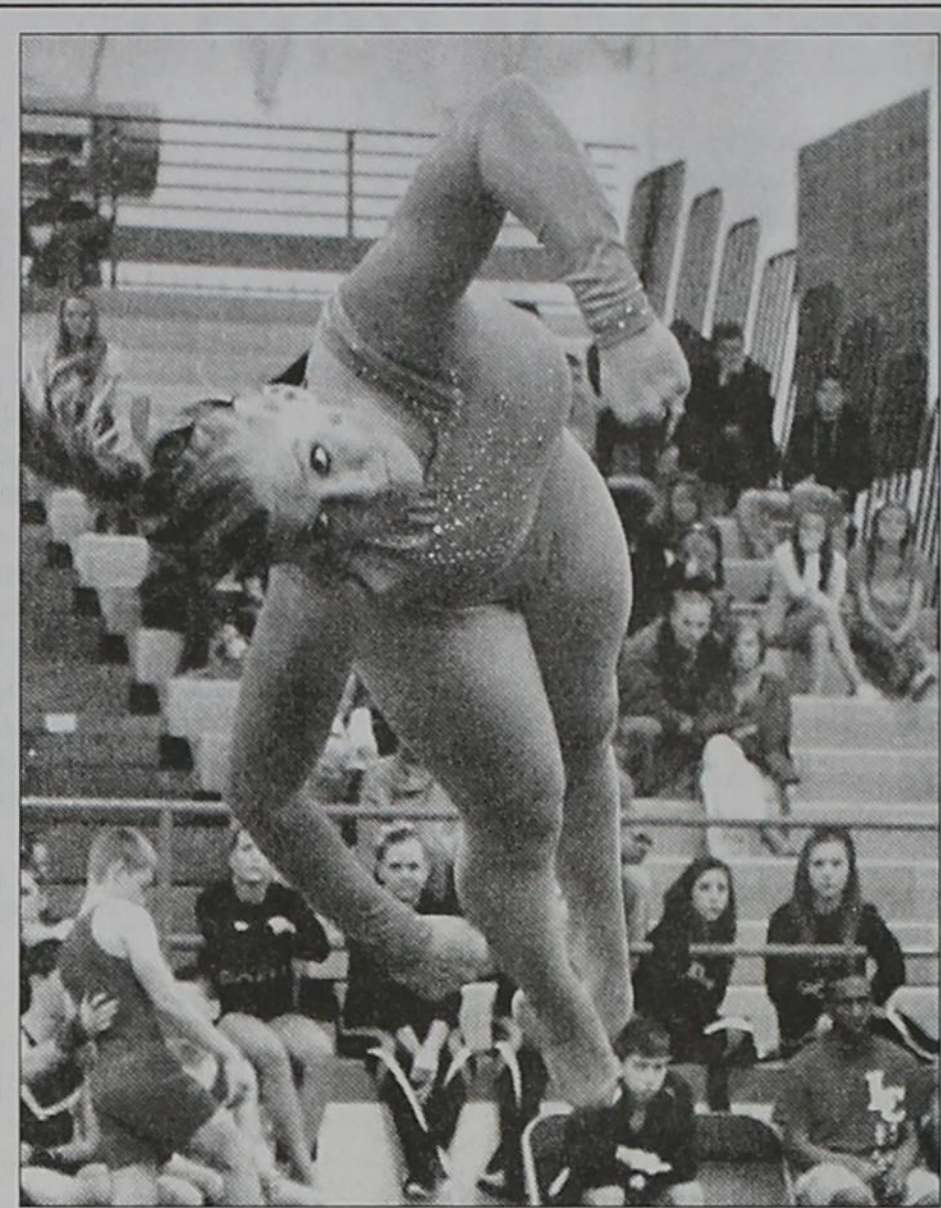
Brannon's other top finishes were fourth in the vault (18.600), sixth on the parallel bars (17.900) and eighth on the horse (17.200).

Weidman placed sixth on the floor (18.500) and the horse (17.600), tied for seventh on the parallel bars (17.400) and was ninth on the high bar (15.400).

Bennett tied for third on the floor (18.700), finished fifth on the horse (17.900) and tied for seventh on the high bar (15.500).

Also contributing to Rockwall's victory were Jeremy Scott, fifth on the parallel bars (18.300) and Payton Larman (sixth, 17.800) and Caleb Walker (10th, 16.800) on the rings.

At the state meet, the boys' competition will begin at 10 a.m. Thursday and Friday, with the girls in afternoon sessions beginning at 4 and 4:30 p.m. The top 10 regional finishers in each event will compete Saturday beginning at 10:30 a.m.

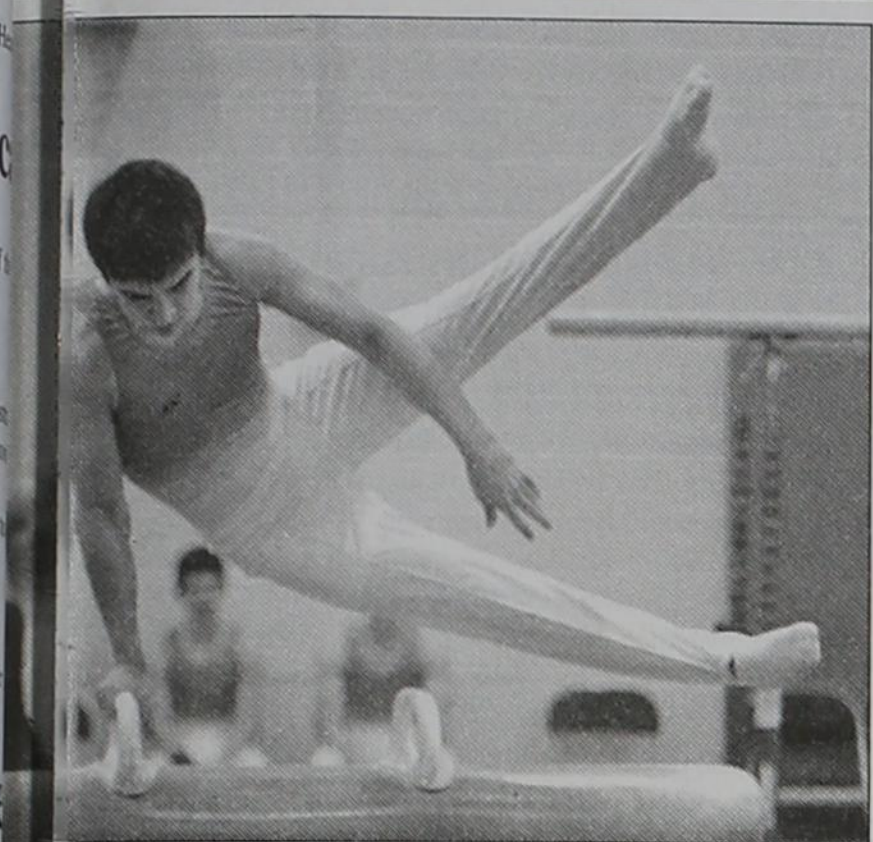
The RC girls' 2 points came on Laswayze Riley's fifth place in the shot put at 33 feet, 7 inches.
