THE BIRTH OF WORDS

A WEALTH OF EXPRESSIONS FROM THE HUMAN BODY.

More Than Four Hundred Words in Our Language Are Related to the Hand Alone and Almost as Many Are Derived From the Head.

The human body—its limbs, fingers, toes, mouth, nose, ears, head and some of the internal organs—has originated hundreds of words. In one of the large dictionaries more than 400 are found related to the hand alone and almost as many to the head.

Index, indicate, predicate, from a Greek word for finger, mean that which points out. So oracle and orator refer to what comes out of the mouth. Audience, audible, auscultation, the auditing of accounts, originally after a "hearing" of the officials, are traceable to the ear. Spirit means the breath and is also found in conspire, "to breathe together;" inspire, "to breathe in," and even in perspire, "to breathe through." Impediment is something against the foot. Ell, the cloth measure, is the length of the forearm. The hair in capillary attraction means the power exerted through the capillary or hairlike tubes.

The heart (cordis) is to be observed in a cordial, or heartening, drink; a cordial, or hearty, manner; the core of an apple. Dents in wood or metal get their name from their resemblance to tooth marks. The tongue sticks out in several words, like language and linguist.

In some countries anybody may rise by his efforts to be somebody, even the "head" of the nation or of the church; he a head master of a school, head a revolution, take up "arms" and prove to be a capital—that is, a headmost—soldier and the chief (head) of the army.

Corporal punishment is bodily punishment; capital punishment is punishment by decapitation, or taking off the head. A corporal—that is, a corporal—means the same as captain—that is, the head of a body of foot soldiers. A colonel is one who has been crowned. The commander in chief, or head commander, compels the chieftains, or headmen of the enemy, to capitulate—that is, surrender according to an agreement that is divided into capitulas, or little heads, or chapters.

A heady and headstrong ruler sometimes makes people wish he was headless. To make headway against his foes he may have to rush headlong into difficulties or take a header into the unknown sea of politics. Among some peoples one with the big head is likely to lose it. Under some the headship of the ship of state does not make headway against the head winds of events or around the "caps," or headland, just ahead. He may plunge into trouble over head and ears, and his opponents have to put their heads together—head his off, so to prevent a head-on collision with their nation. Storm Along Gulf Coast.

The tidal wave and hurricane that swept the gulf coast country from Pensacola to New Orleans, last week, resulted in the death of about 200 people and a property loss of many millions of dollars, the greater part of which was among the shipping. At Mobile, where the force of the wind and water was mostly felt: the flood was 7 to 10 feet over the entire business section of the city, and many of the fine buildings were wrecked. Hundreds of craft in the bay went down, but the crews of most of them were saved. The beach for two hundred miles was strewn with wreckage, showing that loss among the fishing fleets was very great.

This land of mockingbirds, hummingbirds, shady dells, luscious fruits and cooling gulf breezes, so far outclasses the ten-foot soil of the grasshopper and cyclone section, that comparison is a sin. —Huntsville Post-Item.

It all depends on whether a man wants to raise cotton and corn or listen to mockingbirds and to bumblebees, while lying in shady dells eating luscious fruits. There are many thousands of people who had rather do the latter than the former. As an impartial person, State Press admits that he would prefer the shady nook and peaches to working in a corn field, particularly when the plant is about chinch-high, and "thinning" is the character of work to be done—Dallas News.

Yes, it was The Record that started all the trouble and yet it told only the facts. The Colorado country does not depend on mockingbirds, bumblebees nor shady dells, yet for all that, one can stand on the rock-ribbed cliffs of the scenic Colorado listening to the gurgling waters while the wild western winds, as they sweep over the flower-bedecked prairie, fans the rose-colored cheeks of the once east Texas invalid. Thus one can inhale the exhilarating ozone until the old is made young again; so invigorating is our atmosphere that it will "make a prairie jack rabbit stand on his hind legs and spit in a bull dog's eye."

Your shady dells are poisoned with malaria and mosquitos, and a good deal of the luscious fruit is shipped in from the Colorado country.

Come where the 2700-foot altitude restores life, where the light atmosphere is heavy laden with the perfume of flowers, where the American Beauty roses are painted by nature on the cheeks of fair maids, where all nature is at peace with the world, and the shrill notes of the mocking bird would be a discord on the scene.

A letter comes from McLennan county (which reads: It looks like half our people are under canvass and on wheels moving west." The wonderful tide of immigration westward distresses those editors; so much so, that T. E. Streight, editor of the McGregor Mirror, could stand it no longer, so last week he boarded the train and came out to see. He returned home convinced and wrote a splendid west Texas boom article, but he spoiled it all with his closing remarks, as follows: "But as to giving advice to my friends relative to moving there, I must decline. Take no man's word for it; if you must move, go first and see the country and its conditions; then wait till Spring and then go again. "Be sure you are right; then go ahead."

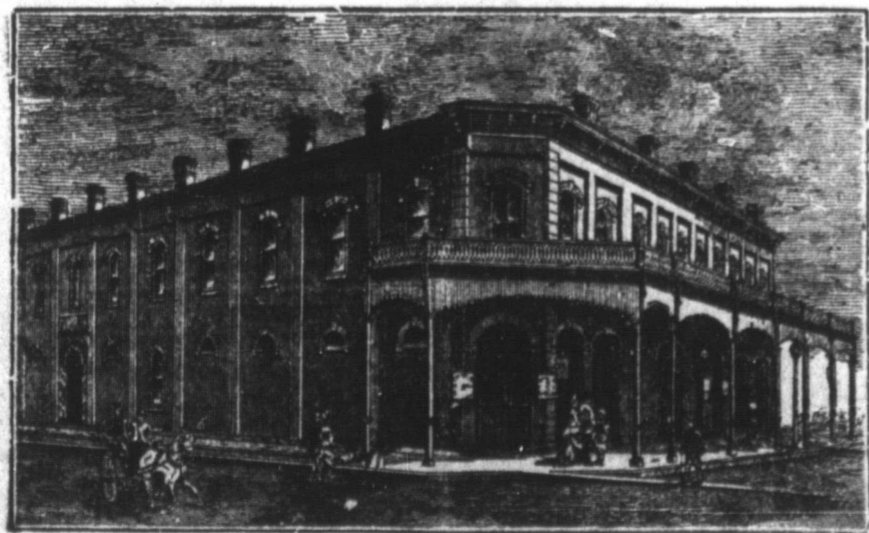


