lishmen of a state printing plant. 5. Fixes the salary of mem-

bers of the Legislature at not exceeding \$1,000 a year and mileage not to exceed 3 cents a mile each way.

6. Provides for levying a road tax of 30 cents on the \$100 of real estate or may issue bonds not to exceed 20 per cent of the assessed valuation of realty.

This paper goes on record as opposed to every one of the above amendments.
